

East-West vulnerable. North deals.



The bidding: EAST NORTH SOUTH WEST 14 3♦ Dbl* 4◊ **4**9 Pass Pass Pass Pass Pass *Negative, usually both majors

Opening lead: Two of ◊

Today's deal is from a Ladies Team event played in Asia earlier this year. West was Julita Grace Tueje, of Indonesia. Defenders usually try to avoid giving a ruff-sluff, but Ms. Tueje found a way to use this play to her advantage.

East won the opening diamond lead with the jack and continued with the ace, South ruffing. Declarer crossed to dummy with the ace of spades and then led a heart to her king, which Tueje allowed to hold in order to keep control of the trump suit.

Declarer continued with a low trump toward dummy's nine. West won with her jack and paused to consider her next move. She found the excellent play of a third round of diamonds, giving declarer a ruffsluff! It didn't matter in which hand declarer chose to take the ruff, she would be down to one trump in that hand and two in the other. When declarer next played a trump, West won and played a fourth round of diamonds and declarer was finished. Declarer was now out of trumps and West's eight of trumps had been promoted into a winner for the setting trick! Nice defense!


