BRIDGE

Q 1 - Neither vulnerable, as South, you hold:

♠ A K J ♥ J 9 7 6 2 ♦ A Q 5 4 3 ♣ Void

Right-hand opponent opens one diamond. What call would you make?

A - It is usually right to pass when an opponent opens in your best suit, but this hand is an exception — you have another suit. It is a poor suit, but your hand is quite good and you may benefit from a diamond lead. Bid one heart.

Q 2 - North-South vulnerable, as South, you hold:

♦ 5 4 ♥ J 6 ♦ K Q J 7 3 **♣** Q 9 4 2

The bidding: NORTH EAST SOUTH WEST $1 \heartsuit$ 2.

What call would you make?

A- It's tempting to bid two diamonds or two no trump, but you are just short on values. The "correct" bid is pass. We once knew a scoundrel who would slide a diamond in with his hearts and bid two hearts on a hand like this. He writes a bridge column these days.

Q 3 - East-West vulnerable, as South, you hold:

♠ K J 7 2 ♥ A K ♦ 10 6 5 **♣** 9 8 6 3

As dealer, what call would you make?

A - A minimum requirement for opening the bidding with only 11 high-card points is a five-card suit. There are other requirements as well, but this hand fails that test. Pass.

Q 4 - Both vulnerable, as South, you hold:

♠ A K 5 ♥ A Q 7 6 5 4 ♦ Q 9 **♣** 10 8

The bidding:
SOUTH WEST NORTH EAST
Pass 1NT Pass

What call would you make?

A - It's close between two hearts and three hearts. The poor heart spots and the isolated queen of diamonds should cause you to go slowly. Bid two hearts.

Q 5 - Neither vulnerable, as South, you hold:

♠ A K J 6 ♥ J 9 8 5 4 3 ♦ K 6 **♣** J

What call would you make?

The bidding:
SOUTH WEST NORTH EAST
1♡ Pass 2♦ Pass
?

A - Your heart suit is poor, but it's long. You can still get to spades (or diamonds) later. For now, bid two

hearts.

Q 6 - North-South vulnerable, as South, you hold:

♠ 9 8 7 5 4 2 ♥ K 3 ♦ 10 9 8 ♣ 8 4


The bidding:
NORTH EAST SOUTH WEST
2NT Pass ?
What call would you make?

A - Playing Jacoby transfers, bid three hearts. Should partner jump to four spades, showing a good fit with a maximum, you should have play. Pass if he bids just three spades. Not playing transfers, you must choose between pass and four spades. Three spades would be forcing.


