


Opening lead: Jack of ♡

Today's deal is from the recent Bermuda Bowl, in a match between Australia and the eventual winner, Poland. South was Michal Nowosadzki from Poland.

Four spades would have been an easier contract for North-South, but it's hard to get there. Had North made a very light overcall of three spades, it's doubtful that South would have settled for just four spades.

South won the opening heart lead with dummy's ace and led a diamond to his queen. He continued with the ace and another diamond. West won with his jack and shifted to the nine of clubs. A low club was played from


dummy and East overtook with his 10 of clubs. Declarer made the far-sighted play of allowing this to hold the trick. East shifted to the queen of spades and South, with a good picture of the hand, displayed perfect technique. He won with his king of spades and ran every one of his diamonds, leading to this position with East still to discard on the last diamond:



East chose to discard a spade, so South led a spade to dummy's ace, a club back to his hand, and cashed the eight of spades, which was now high. A club discard would have been no better. Well done!



UNIVERSAL Sudoku Puzzle


