

Less is more—more or less a headache
Our dysfunctional multifunction tiny-living experience

It's no secret that I love houses and everything to do with them. Over the years, I've owned eight homes in every size and style imaginable. I earn my living in residential real estate, and I wisecrack about home and life for *Inspired Home*. I am known to change room colors just for fun or to see if it's really true that a rich, dark wall color makes a small bathroom feel grand. (It does.)

Recently, I've been intrigued by those TV shows that talk about tiny living environments and how the virtue of living and doing with less can, in fact, be more.

I'm of the mindset that anyone who thinks less is more never had quite enough more.

We live in a comfortable home that has more bathrooms than people, but I was curious about this humble home culture. Clearly these compact, multifunction spaces have something to offer.

I'm as adventuresome as the next guy. I enjoy spontaneity in small, controlled doses, so our scheduled trip to Paris was the perfect opportunity to live in one of those humble homes.

After contacting a real estate rental professional and reviewing a few properties, we committed to leasing "Casa Claustrophobia."

Our leasing agent Picoletta demonstrated the gate code and the interior lobby door pass card and opened the door to our humble home.

It was breathtaking!

It had an "Iseeya"-brand component kitchen in a cool tangerine orange. The fridge and the dishwasher were cleverly integrated into the lower cabinets. It had an induction cooktop with a glass range hood and a microwave/convection oven mounted on a shelf over a foldout multipurpose ironing board/cutting board/dining table combination.

That was my first clue the whole "multipurpose" concept may take on a whole new level in the humble home. I've done a quick shirt pressing with a towel placed on the kitchen table rather than dragging out the ironing board.

But ironing on the same surface I use to prepare food and eat dinner?

Then there was the bathroom.

Even though the space was markedly smaller than I'd anticipated, after years of staying in hostels and modestly priced hotels, I knew we could make this microscopic space work.

After Picoletta did the walk through—which wasn't really a walk through because with three people in the home, there was no place to walk—we signed the 10-day lease and began to settle in.

It never occurred to me that a one-room house would not have a closet, but that was the case with Casa Claustrophobia. Clearly that must be what those hooks all over the wall were for, and I ended up creating an interesting textile collage wall art from my suitcase full of khakis and polos—a vertical laundry pile, if you will.

Speaking of laundry, I know humble homes pride themselves on being self-contained, and I was curious about laundry facilities, as there was clearly no washer-dryer unit in the space. Turns out, keeping with multipurpose uses, the

dishwasher had kind of a removable cage inside to hold laundry.

I'm as much into saving water as the next guy, but there was no way I was going to wash my dinnerware with my underwear. However, the thought of this dishwasher/clothes washer was intriguing, so I decided to put my travel clothes through the wash cycle.

What about the dry cycle? As I feared, the clothes cage baking in the dishwasher heat-dry cycle yielded a steaming orb of apparel with a faint smell of Jet-Dry and scrambled eggs.

Like every guy on the planet, I think instruction manuals are for someone else but decided maybe I should look into exactly how clothes were supposed to dry. It seems the hooks on the wall were part of the plan—and so was the range hood, induction cooktop and exhaust fan.

The instructions said to drape smaller items over the range hood, turn on the exhaust fan, heat up the cooktop for five minutes, turn off the cooktop, and then let time and the exhaust fan be your friend in drying your unmentionables.

Modern textiles seem to be designed to go through an actual heat and tumble-drying process, because the next morning when I put on my newly clean socks, it was like putting baggy, shapeless pillowcases on my feet.

At least the bathroom was not going to be an issue. I've used down-the-hall bathrooms in U.S. hostels and down-the-hall, down-the-stairs and across-the-street bathrooms in Europe. A private bath, albeit humble, was going to be just fine. The entire room was the shower, and rinsing off the soap while trying not to get my towel and bathroom tissue wet was kind of a challenge, but I made it. The real issue was when I bumped an \$80 bottle of wrinkle cream into the composting toilet

All told, I do have a newfound respect for these pioneers who are up to the challenge of doing less with more. Many of the couples on those cable network programs indicate that they live small at home so they can enjoy living big in the city. I know we sure did. **



When Designing a New Kitchen, Form Should Follow Function

Q: Tim, what should we consider when designing our new kitchen?

A: Whether you're a gourmet cook or a master of the microwave, everyone enjoys a kitchen that looks great and functions efficiently. But what makes some kitchens remarkably appealing while others just seem to be lacking? Certainly the quality of the materials will have a profound effect, but adding a few thoughtful design ideas can make your kitchen both functional and dazzlingly beautiful.

1. Design Wide Walkways

Paths throughout a kitchen should be at least 36 inches wide. Paths within the cooking zone should be 42 inches wide for a one-cook kitchen and 48 inches wide for a two-cook configuration. When planning, adjust kitchen islands and peninsulas accordingly.

2. Find the Right Height for the Microwave

The best height and location for a microwave oven depends on the chef and the degree of kid-friendliness desired in the kitchen. For adults, 15 inches above countertop level is a good microwave height. For kids, a below-countertop setup might be safer and more suitable.

3. Plan Landing Space

When designing your kitchen, allow 15 inches of countertop on each side of a cooktop and refrigerator. Landing space is also important near the microwave.

4. Cut Cleaning Time

Careful design decisions make cleaning easy. Glass refrigerator shelves catch spills that wire shelves let through. Flush-set or undermount sinks don't have a crumb-catching rim to worry about. Matte finishes don't show dirt as much as glossy ones do.

5. Store Small Appliances

Avoid an overly industrial look in your kitchen by hiding the microwave oven, toaster, blender and other tabletop appliances in an appliance garage with a door.

A kitchen is more than just a stunning backsplash and gorgeous cabinets. By integrating a few thoughtful tips when planning your new kitchen, it can become a beautiful space that also serves your family's needs for many years to come. **

Winston Place Combines Stunning Architecture and Casual Living

teve and Liz Nelson make up the construction and design team of Providence Homes. Many of their signature projects are showcased at a development called Winston Place, 3.5 miles off Three Springs Road in south Warren County where large lots surround a natural lake and life seems to slow down a little. Here, neighbors still wave, and Liz jokes that streetwalking is encouraged.

Most of the development's 24 lots are occupied, and each of the finished Providence homes features custom blueprints and architectural details. "There are no cookie cutters here," says Liz. "We are a 95 percent custom builder throughout our 13 years."

For this project, the couple decided to test the old adage of "build it, and they will come." This 4,200-square-foot spec home is a blend of Steve's love of traditional detail and Liz's ability to guide design decisions. They not only "morphed" a blueprint to include a beautiful master "quadrant," but they also adapted architectural details to give that blend of traditional craftsmanship with contemporary design.

"We rarely get to feature our own taste and our own abilities," Liz says of the process of building a spec versus a custom home. "And this is a great house in a wonderful location."

Steve prefers a formal aesthetic, and for this project, Liz wanted a contemporary vibe, so the challenge was to incorporate both elements.

For example, above the doors throughout the home are finely mitered transom windows that speak to Steve's love of trim carpentry, but Liz believed they would

A flex room can be used for a workout space, a nursery, or a home office, and the connection from the garage through the utility room and pantry into the kitchen gives it great functionality. The laundry room is also conveniently located. And custom closets are signatures of a Providence Home. Throughout the entire home, chamois wall paint is offset by prism white trim and dark walnut flooring.

be unique if they were shaped more like squares than rectangles, and instead of the traditional trio of glass panels, there are only two. This seemingly small detail combines with other finish decisions to lift and lighten the spaces.

Another example of that intersection of formal and contemporary is the blueprint itself. The home has traditional elements like a formal dining room, a sweeping staircase and a study with finely crafted built-in bookcases. But instead of walls, large-cased openings and a drop ceiling define the footprint of the dining room, and the study has a glass transom for an airy, open ambiance. From there, the open-concept kitchen with breakfast dining area and a large family room transform the circulation into a much more contemporary, family-friendly design.

One of the home's finest features is the master suite. Liz calls it a quadrant.

It is positioned on the back side of the kitchen and connects in a closed loop. The quadrant includes a master











bedroom complete with privacy windows, a stunning custom closet space with tons of room, and a master bath with a freestanding flat-wall tub positioned directly in front of a glassenclosed shower with custom tile detail. In addition to the traditional design of a master bath and bedroom, the quadrant incorporates a large flex space that could serve as a nursery or a home gym or a second office, depending on the needs of that family who occupies the home. A pair of pocket doors connects to the laundry room, which makes for easy access both for dirty clothes on their way to the wash and clean clothes on their way back to the closets and dressers of the master suite.

The entire space connects in a circle through a pantry with easy access to the kitchen. The garage is close by, which makes unloading groceries a breeze and creates a functional flow from one space to the next.

On the opposite end of the house are two additional bedrooms and a Jack and Jill bathroom, which Liz has decorated to showcase her design skills and give potential buyers some ideas.

Upstairs, the home offers a second large living area that includes a

kitchenette and a family game room with large custom media closets. Adjoining the space is a guest room to relax in privacy and also a full bath. Back downstairs, Steve is busy adding a few minor furnishings to the new model home. The couple's 13-year-old son, following in his father's footsteps, has begun woodworking and building furniture, so Steve is busy positioning a pair of handmade, reclaimed wood, wall-mounted candleholders that his son designed and built specifically to complement the framed artwork in the formal dining room.


As Liz walks down the wide staircase, she can see him trying to hold the piece far enough away and against the wall to eyeball the positioning and keep the balance on opposite sides. From her perspective, Liz can see it better, so she directs him to move a little left, a little right before finally giving him the thumbs-up.

"It's too close to the window, but the height is perfect," she advises as Steve repositions the piece.

"Yep, back it up, and that looks about right," she continues as he gently eases it across the wall before drilling it into place.

ne of the hallmarks of those participating in the WKU Society for Lifelong Learning is openness to new experiences. Going to prison to see a play proved to fit the bill. Joanne Wallace introduced the idea to the Lifelong Learners because her son, Matt Wallace, is the director/facilitator of a unique program here in Kentucky called Shakespeare Behind Bars.

Every spring at the Luther Luckett Correctional Complex near La Grange, Matt Wallace works with a group of male inmates to prepare a Shakespeare production that is presented in the prison but is open to the public. While there is no charge for attending the play, a security clearance and a reservation are required, and the popularity of the program means the seats fill quickly.



perform those moments when an unruly character loses control? Where is the line between mischief and malice? And how would the prisoners portray the scene when Malvolio is wrongfully incarcerated and no one will believe his innocence?"

The Luther Luckett Correctional Complex La Grange is a men's maximum security facility and has a similar facility for women close by. Our visit was to the men's prison. Metal detectors, pat downs and personal property confiscation greet you immediately upon entering the front

doors. Then, standing in a small room, you watch as the outside world disappears behind a wall of sliding iron bars. The bars on the opposing wall would open into the world the actors in the play we were there to see spend each and every day.

"The actual prison was bright, clean and rigidly organized. After an additional screening, we assembled in an interior

area of firmly anchored chairs and tables where friends and family could meet with inmates. Interestingly, there was a large courtyard outside with similarly anchored furniture and a play area, where the same interactions could take place, weather permitting.

"After a short wait, our group was escorted along a long, wide walkway to the chapel. On the walk, we caught our first glimpse of prisoners in the distance, adding weight to the chain link and cantina wire that fully surrounded us.

"The audience filled most of the available seating for what was to be the first performance of the play for the public. Many of those present appeared to be friends and family of the inmates. This performance was opening night for the 21st year of Shakespeare Behind Bars.

"The production began with a procession of the entire cast through the audience. This first close contact with the convicts that were to entertain us was exhilarating and sobering. These men were so normal.

"This select group of inmates spends an entire year preparing for very few actual performances. They are introduced to next year's play only after the final performance of the current year's play. Each inmate studies the play to determine the roles that they would like to have, and then they audition and negotiate among themselves for that role. Interestingly, every inmate actor learns and rehearses multiple roles in the event that someone is released or is unable to participate for some other reason.

"It is apparent from the start that the inmates take this very seriously. Their lines are well memorized and presented, and their actions, sets and costumes reflect their pride in the program. The preparation we had in our classroom made it easier for us to catch and understand the occasional scripted aside written into the script that allowed them to relate what was happening in the play to their current incarceration.

"Following the performance, we were introduced to the cast members and encouraged to participate in a questionand-answer period with the cast. The

humanity of the inmates was difficult to dismiss, and you couldn't help but wonder what had led these men to a life behind the bars and barbed wire that surrounded them.

"Our exit from the facility was as our entrance: checkpoints and sliding bars leading to the return of our personal belongings and to our release from Luther Luckett."

What impact does this program have on the inmates who participate? Matt Wallace, who facilitates the SBB program, reports, "The Shakespeare Behind Bars program currently has just a 5.1 percent recidivism rate compared with the 29.5 percent Kentucky rate and the 67 percent national average. The program works to transform inmate offenders with an ultimate goal of them becoming contributing members of society, developing empathy and preventing future crime."

a kite, but regardless, he was right. Walk through a farmers market in the summer and revel in the wonders of nature's garden and the wonderful brilliance.

We put out bowls of vibrantly bright red apples on our counters at home. Why? Because those rosy reds make us feel good. Even a meat counter loaded with fresh-cut steaks is more appealing to the eye than the cooked product. Sushi's darling, ahi tuna, is our favorite not only for the lush texture and mouth appeal but for that rich, deep, red luster, which is far more appealing than its over-cooked counterpart.

The saying goes "we eat with our eyes first," and this was never more true than in the 1970s when a group of French chefs broke from the norm and started a culinary revolution known as nouvelle cuisine. This revolution shook off the notion of heavy, flour-laden sauces and meals based on copious amounts of rich food. It returned to freshness, quality and the true taste of the food. Food was stylishly plated, emphasizing form and color. This was the culinary equivalent of getting a color television over the old black-and-white box.

As a young chef, I embraced this movement. The clean lines and vibrant colors excited the senses, from your eyes to your palate. The real taste of the food rested lightly on your tongue and stomach as portions were lighter and smaller. This revolution would spawn "spa cuisine" and years later influence every aspect of how we approached cooking and eating, right down to today's farm-to-table movement.

The French have always had enormous

respect for food and take great care in maintaining the integrity of the ingredients. Nouvelle cuisine brought this to the forefront of how chefs now approach cooking. Influenced by the clean, simplistic approach of Japanese cooking, the ideals of the cold kitchen merged with the hot side. Or as Carlin might have said, baseball made football nice.

And it wasn't just the Japanese influence. Vibrant spices brought to France by Algerian and Moroccan immigrants found their way into the flavors, textures and colors of the times. It was indeed a culinary revolution, and it was not just being led by young upstarts. These were respected, seasoned chefs. The Godfather Paul Bocuse along with Michel Guerard and Louis Outhier were bringing something new to the table, and it wouldn't be long before it went global.

France has always been the mothership when it comes to cuisine, but Italy refused to be left on the sidelines. As American chefs made their pilgrimages to the gastronomic temples of Europe, they discovered a whole new approach

and respect for food. Nothing came from farther than a few miles away from where it was consumed; this was farm to table before the phrase existed. Like every good revolution, nouvelle evolved into a drive or cause to put the freshest, most vibrant foods on our plates and in our mouths. Cooking became simpler in a sense, more honest.

Meyer lemon vinaigrette replaced heavy cream reductions. Exotic spices such as turmeric, saffron, smoked paprika and chiles brought flavor and color to our palates, and chefs were ecstatic. Not to be outdone, Scandinavia was about to take this new approach to a whole new level. Enter Noma.

The clean lines of Scandinavian cooking have always been about farm freshness and enticing natural flavors, all with a respect for the natural beauty nature provides, whether it is from the sea, farm or forest. Noma is a restaurant in Copenhagen, Denmark, and its chef, Rene Redzepi, would turn cooking as we know it upside down. He is a forager chef. His approach to food is so simplistic; his use of items is stunning and shockingly simple. And the culinary world took notice, voting Noma the number one restaurant in the world two years in a row.

This playfulness would influence and help evolve how we look at food in a rather tongue-in-cheek manner. Menus started using language that had never been seen before as chefs took liberties to entertain their guests. Steak and eggs conjures a nice strip steak and fried eggs, but in today's new world, it could be something else entirely. Molecular gastronomy was a revolution not unlike nouvelle as it changed our perception of food in a way no one could have imagined.

The most recent movement brings us closer to the sources of our food. Whether it is the way plants are nurtured from the ground or through humane animal husbandry, our farm-to-table revolution is the most important revolution for our time. I am sure those giants of the French culinary world that started the nouvelle revolution would agree. Keep it fresh, simple, light and above all, colorful. **




