

ZOA Leaders Take Part In D.C. Emergency Meeting

Ziona Kadis and Evelyn Weiner of Cleveland participated in an emergency meeting of the Zionist Organization of America's National Executive Committee in Washington, D.C., designed to counter "diplomatic pressure which seems to be crystallizing against Israel" according to Milton Gold, NEC chairman.

The weekend conference held on March 7 and 8 featured a keynote address by former Israel Ambassador to the United Nations Yosef Tekoah.

Topics discussed at the meeting included the organization's Zionist membership recruitment drive, overseas programs in Israel, public opinion on the Arab-Israel conflict and briefings with congressional representatives.

Mrs. Kadis is the first woman to be elected national vice president of the ZOA and is active with the local region. Mrs. Weiner is a member of the Cleveland Region of the ZOA executive committee.
