Corn Festival returns to downtown Shippensburg

Corn eating contest, photos with Corny highlight 2015 event

SHIPPENSBURG — With an attendance that last year topped 30,000 and a list of food and craft vendors that has grown to more than 250 this year, Shippensburg's Corn Festival has become quite a success since its beginning 35 years ago.

Debbie Weaver, president of the Corn Festival committee, says the event — which this year will run from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 29 — is so popular that applications start coming in a year in advance.

"I'm still getting requests (now) from food and craft vendors (for this year), but we're full," she said. "We have a waiting list. We'll start a list in October for next year."

She said her biggest con-

cern each year is that the event runs smoothly.

"There are a lot of people, and a lot of things that could go wrong," she said.

Held rain or shine in downtown Shippensburg, the festival will feature crafts, food and entertainment for people of all ages. Among the featured events will be a corn eating contest and photos with Corny the Scarecrow.

"We've had the corn eating contest for about five years ... and it's very popular," said Weaver. "But this is the first year of taking pictures with Corny."

Weaver said Corny will continue to stroll along the streets throughout the day, and as always will be happy to have his photo taken with visitors he meets. But this year he will also be available for more formal pictures at the gazebo from 1:30 to 2:30 p.m.

"We just thought we'd do something different this year because of it being our 35th," Weaver said. "People have always liked taking pictures (with Corny), and of course they can always take pic-

tures, but we thought we'd have a place for them to sit down on bales of hay and put up corn shucks."

The corn eating contest will begin at 11:30 a.m. at the main stage. Contestants may register beginning at 11 a.m.

The festival will also feature a variety of entertainment, including the Mid Life Cowboys, who will perform during the corn eating contest, and the Shippensburg University marching band, which Weaver said is also popular.

The Corn Festival was originally held as a two-day weekend event to raise money for a survey of downtown buildings that would eventually create a historic district in Shippensburg. Today, according to the Corn Festival website, the Pennsylvania Festivals Association calls it the best one-day festival in Pennsylvania.

Weaver said proceeds from the festival go back into the community.

By 2006, the Corn Festival had raised some \$296,000 for community projects like the Historic District Sur-

vey and historic marker signs, as well as period street lights along King Street and preservation of the historic Dykeman's Spring Hatch House.

Most recently, the Corn Festival Committee donated \$15,000 toward the purchase of a new gazebo in a pocket park in Shippensburg Borough.

"We'll start getting some requests (for funding of upcoming community projects) in January," Weaver said.

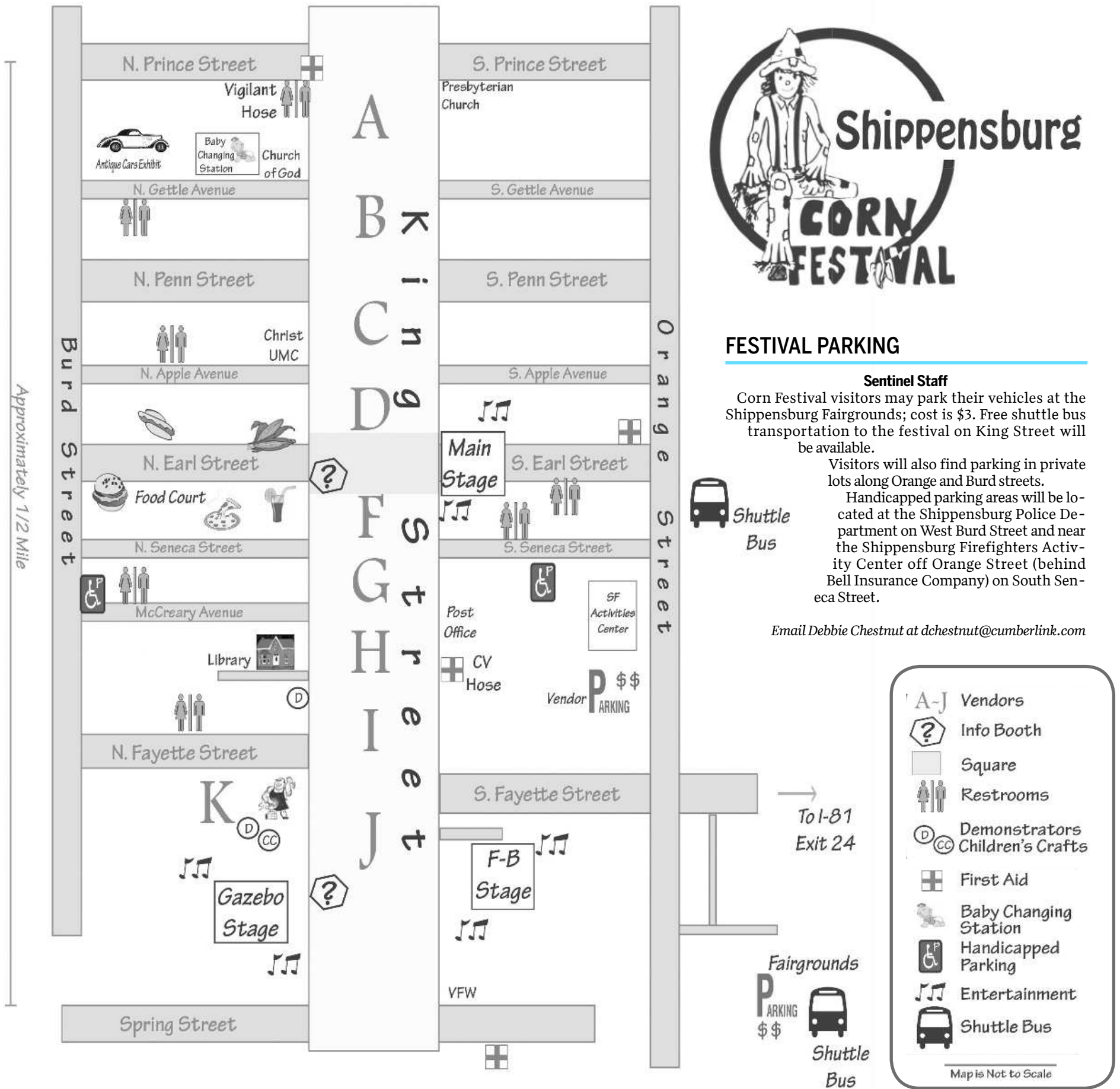
