## "Fired Up About Reading!" Poster Contest Official Rules

**ELIGIBILITY:** The contest is open to any **K-8<sup>th</sup>-grade students** enrolled in public, private or home school in *The Missourian's* circulation area.

**DEADLINE:** Posters must be **received** by the Washington Missourian, 14 W. Main Street, **by 5 p.m. on Friday, Feb. 22**, 2013. Winners will be contacted by telephone no later than Tuesday, Feb. 26, 2013.

The following must be on the **back** of the poster in the upper left-hand corner: **Name, Grade, Teacher and School**.

**PRIZE:** The winning poster will earn the student's school a visit/presentation from author/illustrator Kenneth Kraegel at **1 p.m. on Friday, March 1,** 2013. The student will receive a copy of Kraegel's book and will be photographed with the author/illustrator for the newspaper. **All posters received will be displayed during Family Reading Night, Friday, March 1 at Washington Middle School**. Prizes will be awarded from all entries received on or before Friday, Feb. 22, 2013, at 5 p.m. Entries received after this date will not be considered.

**CLAIMING POSTERS:** ALL students may collect their posters at Washington Middle School at the conclusion of Family Reading Night on Friday, March 1, 2013. Posters will not be returned after that time.
