## Four large objects detected in search

Biggest piece appeared to be part of jet's body

PANGKALAN BUN, Indonesia (AP) — Indonesian officials said Saturday that they were confident wreckage of AirAsia Flight 8501 had been located after sonar equipment detected four massive objects on the ocean floor.

The biggest piece, measuring 59 feet long and 18 feet wide, appeared to be part of the jet's body, said Henry Bambang Soelistyo, chief of the National Search and Rescue Agency.

## New life for Harriman Springs

Historic Southern Oregon resort remodeled, reopened this year

**ROCKY POINT** — Better than it's ever been.

Given its history, that's pretty impressive.

The Harriman Springs Resort & Marina, which has a history that dates to the late 1800s, reopened last month after three years of reconstruction that, according to owner John Pratt, cost "millions" of dollars.

"It was so run down, so dilapidated," Pratt says of the property, which during the 1930s was known locally as "The Millionaires Lodge." The 147-acre property is at the headwaters of clear, cool Harriman Creek with access to Upper Klamath Lake.

Pratt was raised down the road from Harriman's at Rocky Point Resort, which his parents, Kenneth and Lela, owned for about 15 years. A 1975 Henley High graduate, he attended Oregon Tech for a year before dropping out and moving to Southern California, where he was a pipeline contractor for 22 years.

"I kind of grew up there," he says of living and vacationing at the Rocky Point Resort. "It was a dream come true. I've been fishing the lake (Upper Klamath) for about 50 years. Every day I was gone, I wanted to be here."

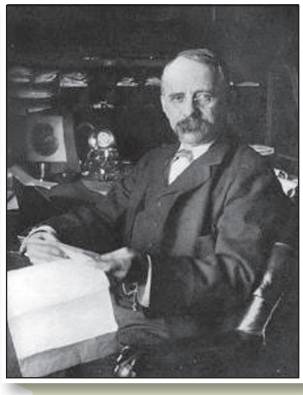

Harriman Springs Resort & Marina in Rocky Point is open 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Wednesdays through Sundays. Once it receives its liquor license, the gourmet restaurant will serve nightly dinners and have a full-service bar.

## GOP focus for Congress: Cut deficit, don't stumble

Republicans will run House and Senate starting Tuesday

WASHINGTON (AP) — In the first Republican-dominated Congress to confront President Barack Obama, GOP leaders will focus on bolstering the economy and cutting the budget — and oh yes, avoiding self-inflicted calamities that make voters wonder if the party can govern competently.

When the new Congress raises the curtain Tuesday, Republicans will run both the House and Senate for the first time in eight years. GOP leaders want to showcase their legislative priorities, mixing accomplishments with show-downs with Obama but shunning government shutdowns and other chaotic standoffs.
