PEBBLE CREEK SKI AREA SKI AND SNOWBOARD PROGRAM

Ski lessons have been taught for 60 years at Skyline / Pebble Creek Ski Area. A program to teach skiing to area students as part of physical – life sports education began over 20 years ago. Today, the program also includes snowboarding.

We realize the need for a strong, structured educational program. Physical conditioning prior to ski/board lessons is strongly suggested.

Basic Program

SKI AND SNOWBOARD PROGRAM GOALS:

- To introduce students to a wholesome life time sport and leisure time activity.
- To promote exercise for a healthy lifestyle.
- To provide an atmosphere of learning while having fun.
- To introduce non-skiing/boarding students to the sport and to bring them to a novice skill level.
- To improve the skiing/boarding ability of students already familiar with the sport.

THE PROGRAM INCLUDES:

- An orientation session.
- Lift passes.

- Two-hour lessons.
- Afternoon practice time.
- Equipment rental for students who do not have their own equipment.
- Students are required to be in lessons and wear a ticket identifying the school. (Season Passes and the Fifth Grade Passport are not valid for this program.)

THE COST:

Lesson & Lift Ticket \$ 8 per day.

Rental Skis \$ 9 per day.

Rental Snowboards \$ 9 per day.

Parent lift tickets \$15 per day Parent rental \$ 9 per day

 $$8.00 \text{ per day } \times 4 \text{ for lessons} = 32.00

\$9.00 per day \times 4 for equipment rental= \$36.00

(\$3.00 per day x4 for helmet rental) *optional

AFTER PROGRAM COMPLETION:

Students who rent equipment for this program receive a card to use rental equipment free of charge for up to 4 visits with the purchase of a lift ticket.

Recipe Corner

Made this for **Thanksgiving** and we loved it. A perfect addition to the Christmas Table.

Sweet Potato Casserole

 $4\frac{1}{2}$ cups cooked and mashed sweet potatoes

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup butter, melted

1/3 cup milk

1 cup white sugar

† tsp vanilla extract
2 eggs, beaten
1 cup light brown sugar
† cup all-purpose flour
1/3 cup butter
1 cup chopped pecans

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Grease a 9 x 13 inch baking dish. In a large bowl, mix together mashed sweet potatoes, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup melted butter, milk, sugar, vanilla, and eggs. Spread mixture into the prepared baking dish. In a small bowl, mix together brown sugar and flour. Cut in 1/3 cup butter until mixture is crumbly, and then stir in pecans. Sprinkle pecan mixture over the sweet potatoes. Bake for 25 minutes in the preheated oven, or until golden brown.

(From Kathy Gasper) This time of year can be busy for us, so here is a recipe that you can have on the dinner table in about a half hour! (woohoo!!) I also like to make this for a hot lunch on a cold day.

Cowgirl Beans

First, start a pot of <u>rice</u> going to serve with this. Next, take out your trusty large skillet. Put in 1 lb <u>hamburger</u>, 1 finely chopped <u>onion</u>, and 1 minced <u>garlic</u> clove. Fry everything over med heat, break up hamburger as it cooks, and drain off fat. Add salt and pepper to taste, 1 TBS each <u>Worcestershire</u> sauce and <u>vinegar</u>, (1) 8-oz can <u>tomato sauce</u>, and (2) 15-oz cans of <u>pork-n-beans</u>. If it seems dry, add some water for simmering. Cover the skillet and cook for about 10 minutes until everything is hot. Serve over rice, with fruit salad and a vegetable (like corn).

He then pulled out from his bag an <u>ornament</u> of HIMSELF. Teach the Children that <u>Santa Claus</u> symbolizes the generosity and good will we feel during the month of December.

He reached in again and pulled out a HOLLY LEAF. Teach the Children the holly plant represents immortality. It represents the crown of thorns worn by our Savior. The red holly berries represent blood shed by Him.

Next he pulled out a GIFT from the bag and said, "Teach the Children that God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son. Thanks be to God for His unspeakable gift. Teach the Children that the wise men bowed before the holy

babe and presented Him with gold, frankincense, and myrrh. We should give gifts in the same spirit as the wise men."

Santa then reached in his bag and pulled out a CANDY CANE and hung it on the tree. Teach the Children that the candy cane represents the shepherd's crook. The crook on the shepherd's staff helps bring back strayed sheep from the flock. The candy cane is the symbol that we are our brother's keeper.

He said, "Remember, teach the Children the true meaning of Christmas, and not to put me in the center, for I am but a humble servant of the One who is, and I bow down and worship Him, our Lord, our God."
