He has a forthcoming book with Willow Books to be released Fall 2011, and is presently working on a volume of poetry influenced by the recordings and travels of Alan Lomax in the Deep South. Makalani is a member of the Affrilachian Poets.



Glenn North career as a spoken word artist began in 1997 when he founded Verbal Attack, a monthly open mic poetry event. Glenn is the Director of the Urban Transcendence Poetry Project where his duties included facilitating poetry writing and performance workshops for youth in Wyandotte County as well as the adjudicated youth in Jackson County detention centers. Currently Glenn is the Poet-in-Residence of the American Jazz Museum where he organizes and hosts the popular open mic poetry competition, Jazz Poetry Jams. He is also working toward the completion of his first volume of poetry entitled, Fortunate Ad-Verse-ity.



Timothy Black's first poetic novella, Connecticut Shade, is in its second printing through WSC Press. He teaches poetry at Wayne State College, and is a Cave Canem Fellow. Timothy's work has appeared in the anthologies The Logan House Anthology of 21st Century American Poetry, The Great American Roadshow, and Words Like Rain. He has been published in The Platte Valley Review and at bringtheink.com, has poems forthcoming inBreadcrumb Scabs, Clean Sheets and Dark Gothic Resurrected Magazine and has won an Academy of American Poets' Helen W. Kenewick prize for his poem Heavy Freight. Tim is currently working with the Nebraska State poet, William Kloefkorn, on a book of interviews and a portable poetry workshop. He lives in Wakefield, Nebraska with his wife and two sons. Mr. Black received his MFA in Poetry from the NU Low Residency MFA Program cohort of UNK and UNO.
