Offenses headline 67th Shrine game

Loaded receiving corps looking to take flight in West's spread offense

The 67th annual Montana East-West Shrine Game will have a distinctly Butte flavor when gates open at Naranche Stadium for Saturday's 7 p.m. kickoff.

But when the lights come on, fans will also get the full taste of what this year's crop of premier football athletes from both sides of the state bring to the table.

Butte High head coach Arie Grey, a Powell County High grad who played in the game himself in 1997 and was an assistant coach in 2009, has run the West club through a week of fast-paced practices on the brand new sprint turf at Montana Tech's newly named Bob Green Field inside Alumni Stadium.

While Grey led the Bulldogs to the Class AA state title this past season on the wings of his high-flying spread offense, that no-huddle attack has taken on an extra bit of juice from an enviable corps of playmakers who have left players and coaches alike giddy with excitement.

"We've got a lot of speed on both sides of the ball, that's what's going to win it for us," said Montana Western-bound Twin Bridges defensive end Max Orrin. "Our whole receiving corps, really, has stood out. There's some great receivers on our side, and our secondary is really solid. It's a great battle to watch during practice.

"Nico Graham is probably one of the quickest receivers I've ever seen. And Josh Janssen — he's a hell of a receiver. He'll catch the ball. Put it wherever and he's going to go get it."

Graham, a Missoula Big Sky product and future Griz wideout, was singled out by several of his fellow players for his immediate impact in practices. He'll join Janssen, from Missoula Loyola, in a loaded unit that includes Glacier's Kyle Griffiths and Sentinel's Jake Messerly — Class AA's receiving yards leaders from 2012 — and another all-everything future Griz wideout in Dillon's Austin Carver.

Add in Gatorade Player of the Year running back Gunnar Brekke from Helena Capital — who might play

at receiver for Montana State next season — along with versatile Butte High scatback Zach Bunney and Helena High battering ram Zach Winfield, and the West is spoiled for options in Grey's system.

"We'll run our no-huddle stuff and try to do a great job running the ball," Grey said. "We have three really talented running backs, I think, and two quarterbacks who can run the ball as well. We might not necessarily throw as much as we normally do, but we'll try to do a great job of spreading the ball out and getting the ball in those playmakers' hands because we've got some really talented receivers and a big, monstrous O-line."

Of course, the team can expect to get more than a fair fight from an East squad that features a two-headed monster at running back in Billings Senior's Nolan Saraceni — a future Tech Oredigger — and C.M. Russell's Hunter Thomsen. The duo finished atop Class AA with a combined 2,733 yards and 24 touchdowns in 2012.

The East, coached by Fairfield's Les Meyers, also features future Griz wideout and Badlands Bowl MVP Josh Horner from C.M. Russell, as well as standout quarterbacks Ryan Gallogly from Billings West and Sean Sullivan from Red Lodge.

"The East has a big offensive line and two good quarterbacks, really good running backs, they're tough there on offense," Grey said. "They've got some skill guys and a good D-line. I don't know a ton about them,

but I know they have some really great players. They're talented and they're going to come in here wanting to get after us."

Meyers has been the head coach in Fairfield for the past sixteen years, taking the Eagles to the state B championship six times in seven years and the playoffs 11 of the last 12 years, winning the title in 2011. He will get the opportunity to coach his son Tucker, who was selected to play at safety.

Another face familiar to local football fans will be leading the West defense — former Butte Central assistant Lee LaBreche. He will have a couple of familiar faces in his secondary in former Maroons cornerback Northey Tretheway and safety Joey Joyce.

"I know the defense pretty well after four years," Joyce said. "It's kind of simplified at this point, but all of these guys are football players, they know what they're doing out here."

"We're going to get some picks, and we're going to stop the East ... a lot," a confident Tretheway added. "We've got some great players on defense. When we first got here, this (Devin Jeffries), when I first saw him, I was shocked. He's a big guy and he's tearing up some people out there. He's got a great spin move and he's fast — he's just a great athlete."

Several players singled out Jeffries, a 6-foot-3, 220-pound defense lineman from Glacier, for his strong work in the trenches at practice, as well as Capital linebacker-defensive end Levi Dawes.

"Defensively, we have some guys who are really

East player touched by Shriners' help

In many states across the nation one can find a Shrine football game during the summer. The state of Montana has embraced the concept for the 67th time at this year's annual Montana East-West Shrine Game set for Saturday at 7 p.m. at historic Naranche Stadium in Butte.

Every year since 1947 the Shrine Game has raised donations for the Shriners Hospital for Children in Spokane, Wash., one of two dozen such facilities.

It is those donations — now topping more than \$1 million since Montana began holding these contests, according to the game's website — that have had long lasting effects on the numbers of children who have gotten that assistance from the hospital.

What makes a game like this even more special is that over time, players in the game come in having had a friend or loved one touched by the assistance of a Shriners facility.

Or in the case of Sidney's Jim Topp, he's had both.

The 2013 graduate and member of the East squad, comes to Butte having had both a cousin and good friend aided by the Shriners, who specialize in working with children 18 and under who are eligible and — in the opinion of their physicians — have a reasonable possibility of benefitting from the specialized services available. Acceptance is based solely on a child's medical needs, according to the Shriners' website.

Topp learned plenty about the Shriners after his selection to the game.

"I am honored, I would have never thought that I would have played there," Topp

said of his being chosen to play in Butte. "I was excited, nervous. Our team didn't do so great, but I guess I did alright. It is really cool that I was chosen, with my good friend and cousin that went through things and got helped by the Shriners hospital. You really don't know how close it hits home until you go through it.

The All-State Class A defensive tackle saw a cousin, at the time just a little girl, go through some ailments that only later did he realize were worse than he knew.

"I didn't even know she was helped by the Shriners hospital until I was going to play in the game," Topp said of his cousin Lexi Morlock. "They told me how much they helped and I didn't realize what they did until they told me. She was so young and I didn't know her very well. Finding out something like that is kind of shocking. It's great what they did."

Lexi, who just turned 8 this week, suffered from legs that wouldn't straighten and caused pain in her hips, according to her mother Monica Morlock.

"Kids are born with their legs naturally bowed and they eventually straighten, but Lexi's wouldn't," Monica Morlock said. "We were referred to the Shriners by doctors in Billings. So we went to Spokane. They are very kind people and very giving. I never had to pay anything out of pocket to visit with them. They never asked if I had insurance or not. They just wanted to help me save my daughter."

Dealing with intense pain at the age of three with growth plates not growing correctly, the family would take trips to Spokane for three years getting the proper

therapy and assistance to get Lexi's legs into a better alignment.

"Then they decided that she was starting to get on a normal growth scale," Monica Morlock said. "She still can't wear certain shoes otherwise it hurts. She still has some pain when she is on her legs a lot. It's a lot better than it was. We are not living on Tylenol anymore. You can't explain to a 3- or 4-year-old why their leg hurts."

Monica Morlock said that the Shriners still "keep tabs on Lexi," and even though her daughter still has a "slight turn to her legs" it is nothing the hospital has deemed a concern.

Topp's friend Travis Obergfell also suffered from pain in his lower extremities with a hip condition when he was 8 years old.

Obergfell said he suffered from a disease where blood got cut off to his femur bone and it started to affect the growth and form of his left hip.

"The doctors in Sidney had me on crutches for a year," Obergfell, now 18, said. "We heard about the Shriners and I would go to Spokane once a year. They took me off crutches and wanted to monitor it. They didn't use medications on it they just let it work itself out. I did physical therapy to get more movement out of it. I did it every day on my own and it was doing well enough they said I could go on with life. It still bothers me a bit like when I ride my horses, but the pain is a lot less that's for sure."

Obergfell said the Shriners made therapy suggestions and would take new measurements on each visit to monitor his progress.

"They do a pretty good job and they have experienced doctors there who know what

they are talking about," Obergfell said.

"They've done traveling clinics in Billings and I have been there a couple of times. Being a children's hospital they are professional and they knew what they were doing with my certain case."

When Obergfell found out Topp had been selected for the Shriner's game, he was more than pleased.

"I thought it was great when he told me about it," he said. "I remembered all the times going to the Shriners and I told him about it. I am honored to have him play for it. We are close friends and he knew about what I went through. He asked if that was the hospital that I had went to and I told him that it was."

Yet Lexi Morlock and Obergfell were aided by a hospital where many donations came in from football games that had already been played by athletes who most likely would never meet those they helped.

Now Topp is doing the same thing.

"It feels good to know you are helping somebody if you meet them or not," Topp said. "To help somebody is a good deal."

Topp's coach at Sidney, Roger Merritt, said that the young man being selected to a game of such significance holds a special meaning.

"Jim, to sum it up, is a hard worker," Merritt said. "He works really hard at whatever he is doing either on a job, practice field or in school. He is friendly, easy to get along with, and willing to help anyone who needs help without any question at all. He is a perfect example of what Shriners is all about. He is very appreciative for everything everyone does for him. He's all around a great kid."

Topp, who is registered to attend the North Dakota State College of Science in Wapeton this fall has seen the positive effects of what the Shriners can do for those who need their help.

"Lexi's very outgoing, that is the best way to describe her," Topp said.

playing well," Grey said. "Reid Siderius at corner is doing some really good things. Rial Gunlikson at safety from Glacier is playing well. Our inside linebackers David Anderson and CJ Holland are two tough guys.

"And D-line wise, we have guys who are very athletic and very active. The Jeffries kid from Glacier and Levi Dawes - every one of these kids deserve to be here. That's the unique thing about it. They all play hard, they all play the game the way it's supposed to be played."

Joyce, who is looking forward to playing for the first time in Naranche Stadium where his father played his prep ball, said his Shrine appearance has been a long time in coming.

"When I was a freshman, my brother was in it," Joyce said. "So I watched it that year and came to all the practices and scrimmages. From that day, I've always wanted to be in a Shrine Game. I've traveled to watch it through high school, and I've looked at this as one of my main goals.

"It's also such a great cause for what we're doing - all of the people at the Shriners Hospital, all of the money goes to helping those sick people. We have something to play for. I think that makes it a lot more special, because you're really helping people out."

Grey added that fans should make it to the game, not only for

the action, but also for the cause. The 2010 game in Butte brought in a then-record \$102,728. The Montana game - one of the longest running in the nation - has contributed more than \$1 million to Shriners hospitals over its history, according to organizers.

"It's just a premiere game, and we're going to do it at a phenomenal venue," Grey said.

"You're going to have two quality teams who are going to play extremely hard and get after it. You know they're going to hit each other and make great plays. It's going to be an exciting game in an exciting atmosphere.

"Really, fans should come help support the Shriners. It's such a great organization, we need everybody to come help and pack that stadium and let's make it loud."

Shrine game all about helping kids

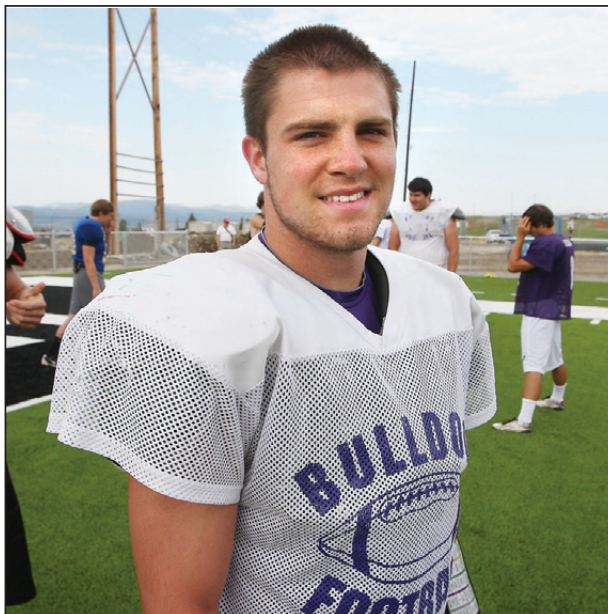
West team represented by 12 from Butte High along with Butte Central, Anaconda, Twin Bridges

Bunney, who had his own life-threatening battle with leukemia just over a year ago, is happy to be a part of this event and what it does for helping children in need.

"I am excited to represent the west side and it's a good cause," the future Grizzly Carver said. "Hopefully a lot of kids can benefit from it."

Carver believes the experience is more about having fun, having met a lot of the players he is joining forces with at last month's Montana-North Dakota All Star Game.

"It's just about going out and having a good time and meeting new people," Carver said. "It's nothing too serious, but it's for a good cause. Win or lose it's about helping kids out."

"That first day we will be putting on the same colors, be teammates, and hopefully get along and win. The past state championships from us or Butte and Twin Bridges who won it a couple of years ago shows the southwest region has good players and coaches. It is cool to see how many kids have done great things in all areas and go on to play in college. That is

Coach Grey couldn't be happier with the group of players he will work with.

"They are great kids, work hard, and obviously

deserve to be there," Grey said. "I am looking forward to getting going, and getting started. It should be a lot fun."

But it won't be easy working with or against so many players one could be unfamiliar with.

"It's a lot tougher to prepare for an All-Star game than it is in season," Grey said. "You don't know what the other guys are going to do and with the different systems they come into. We will focus on the West and do what we need to do and make the adjustments we need to make. What works for us we don't know in the beginning and as the week progresses we will adjust and go with what we grasp and move on."

One player he will work with is Gunnar Brekke, the soon-to-be Montana State Bobcat and former Helena Capital stalwart who gave the Bulldogs plenty of headaches.

This particular game has special meaning for Brekke, whose family has been affected by tragedy involving a child. His older brother died at a very young age in 1989 before Gunnar was born.

"It's an honor, and anything you get selected for is an honor," Brekke said. "I had a brother pass away and my family has been through the same thing. So knowing you are helping a little kid and family is a big honor. Football is the second part of it."

As for the football, Brekke is impressed with many of the players he will join up with and is happy to see the rise of Bulldogs football.

"It's great, and anybody who has ever been around Butte and the Butte people they are great people and they love their sports," Brekke said. "They have

Naranche Stadium and being booed there and the experience there was great. Every kid should have that experience. It is the closest thing to a college experience for any kid in Montana. It's great and a very good thing for football to have Butte playing well. I hated half these kids and played against them, but it is natural that when you play with them on the same team and get to know them more, you naturally bond with them.

"I love the Butte guys now and we text each other a lot. We were bitter rivals, but it's cool to play with kids you played against the last four years."

Butte will host the game for the second time. The Mining City's first game in 2010 raised a record \$103,000 for the hospital and had the second highest overall fundraising total in the nation for the Shriners according to West team coordinator Jeff Hartwick.

"It's great to see this many local kids on the West roster," Hartwick said. "Butte High and Anaconda are teams that have been on the rise in recent years, and the Butte High run to the state championship last year was awesome. (Beaverhead County) is a powerhouse, and is always very well represented on the team, and Butte Central consistently has two or three players on the team. We have some very good teams in southwest Montana, and our roster reflects that."

"What we stress is that we have a lot of fun and get to know each other," Grey said.

Montana Shrine Game has long history

FROM THE MONTANA EAST-WEST SHRINE GAME WEBSITE

Founders, who presented the first game on Aug. 24, 1947, didn't have the slightest inkling that what they had started would turn out to be the "granddaddy of 'em all." But that is what happened. It is one of the oldest games of its kind—the Montana East-West Shrine Game is the longest continuous Shrine game in the United States.

The game began 67 years ago when the "Big Red" of the West defeated the "Golden East" by a 33-13 margin with Missoula's Tommy Kingsford fancy-footing for the West. The colors of the uniforms had been selected by the original Game Committee, red trimmed with gold for the West, and gold trimmed with red for the East, and these colors have been maintained to this day.

After the first game was presented, under almost insurmountable odds and on a "break even" basis, the coaches urged that the Committee make the contest an annual project. The Committee agreed and the game was incorporated by the late Roger Silvernale, the game's founder and first chairman.

Incorporation didn't solve the myriad of problems that the game faced on the pitfall-laden road into the future. But it welded the determination of the game's pioneers who fostered the determination and desire during even the darkest hours.

From the standpoint of the contest itself, the game was on a pretty even basis for the first few years, but in the early 1960's the West began to dominate play. The East battled back and the record now stands at East 37, West 29.

Over the years the game rosters have read like a "Who's Who" of Montana football. Great falls' Joe Clويدt, who became an All-American for the Washington Huskies, starred in the first game. Dick Gregory, former Billings flash, scored the East's lone touchdown in the second game while Gene Carlson, former coach at the University of Montana, and Bob Yurko, a Great Falls pharmacist, starred in Game No. 3.

Big Ed Kalafat, cage star for the Minnesota Gophers and later the Lakers pro club, was a 1950 selection from Anaconda and Tom Parac of Lewiston, former athletic director of the Montana State Bobcats, also was selected.

Butte's Jack Killingstad ran 90 yards for what he thought was a touchdown during the 1951 game, only to have it erased by an offside penalty. Butte's Jim Janhunen and Fort Benton's Moe Embleton appeared in the 1952 edition. With each passing year the crowds grow bigger and the total donation to the hospitals increased.

Pat Monno of Anaconda scored three touchdowns in the 1953 game for 18 points — the most scored by an individual in the game's history. This mark was later tied by Helena's burly Bob McCullough in 1958; Billings' West's Ken Hustad in 1968; and Jody Farmer of Libby in 1986.

A star of the 1991 game was Dave Dickenson from CMR, who later became an All-American Quarterback

for the Montana Grizzlies and an MVP in the Canadian Football League in 2000. Future Montana Grizzlies and NFL stars Colt Anderson (Butte/Philadelphia Eagles) and Kroy Biermann (Hardin/Atlanta Falcons) played in the 2004 game.

In the 2006 game, Andrew Selle of Billings West and Matt Komac from Helena High staged a quarterback dual that tied a record for combined points scored (76).

In 2007, Clark Cranford from Huntley Project capped a fourth quarter comeback for the East with a game-winning touchdown late in the game.

It was in 1956 that Roger Silvernale, the man who planted the seed for the classic and nurtured it to maturity, turned over the reins to Leroy (Chink) Seymour who had worked on the contest from its beginning.

In 1961 the game's founder died and, in his name and in his honor, two fine young athlete's will be named for the the "Roger Silvernale Memorial Award." The award established in 1965 is awarded to the con-

test's outstanding performers.

This year will be the 67th Annual Montana East-West Shrine Game — may it last forever! The game has reached maturity without the loss of dedication by the countless, nameless people who share in making it a success. Over one million dollars has been donated to the Spokane Shrine Hospital.

And thanks to the young stars, coaches and officials — some of whom drive hundreds of miles for the honor of donating their services — the brilliance of the presentation has not diminished one iota from the "Good Old Days."
