The Quality of Life Council, founded 20 years ago by leaders of the region's institutions of higher learning, and the One Region: One Vision initiative, launched five years ago by The Times Media Co., have become One Region: One Vision for Northwest nities together to assure Northwest Indiana's Quality of Life.

J. Guadalupe Valtierra, chancellor of Ivy Tech Community College, and Bill Masterson Jr., publisher of The Times, will serve as co-chairmen of the newly formed group.
