City Council approves site plan, development agreement for apartment complex

OSKALOOSA — The Oskaloosa City Council unanimously approved the site plan and development agreement for a 48-unit apartment complex on High Avenue West at its meeting Monday night.

The Reserves at Ironwood will be located at 1302 and 1320 High Ave. W. on a 4.09 acre plot in a Multiple Family

The housing complex will include three twostory apartment buildings each 9,900-squarefeet along with a 1,725square-foot, one-story clubhouse community for a total of 31.425 square feet. The complex also will have 109 stand parking spaces and seven handicap-accessible parking spaces, according to Oskaloosa city documents.

The Planning and Zoning Commission city to require additional

Residential (R3) district. approved the site plan on Sept. 8 with some stipulations — The Water Department needs bring in an 8-inch water main; additional right of way needs to be dedicated to the city along South L Street for a proposed sidewalk; quarterly inspections and clean out of a detention basin; site impervious area shall be 70 percent or less; add ADA ramps; the landscape plan should include the right for the

barrier to block vehicular lighting; the water section of the cover sheet should read "Oskaloosa" and not "Washington"; and the east wall of Building B must be at least 13 feet from the adjacent property line.

Oskaloosa City Manager Michael Schrock Jr. said the developers worked very closely with city staff on the planning for the pro-

"We're pleased to see this," Schrock said.

City Councilman Tom Walling asked about the income guidelines for the occupants.

Development partner Brett Johnson Overland Property Group said that incomes could range from \$38,000 for a family of three down to someone who makes \$15 per hour. Rent for a one-bedroom apartment could range from \$425 to \$675 per

"We're not Section 8," he said.

"We're ready to close now," Johnson said.

Council member Doug Yates asked when people would see activity at the site.

Johnson said that abatement would take two to three weeks from the time of closing. Demolition would take another two to three weeks, he added.

Little comfort in Obama's poll-tested resolve to destroy 'ISIL' the speech is reduced on the usual list of enti- conflict. It will simply be why he then uses the

want to believe. I want to believe that President Obama wants to win a war even more than he wants to get a bounce in the polls to help Democrats hold at least one house of Congress in this fall's mid-term elections.

I want to believe that he is truly resolved not just to degrade, but to destroy the terrorists who call themselves the Islamic State and who he calls ISIL - the Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant.

Obama did project serious resolve when he spoke to the nation recently, calling ISIL a terrorist organization with "no vision other than the slaughter of all who stand in its way."

That's an overdue and welcome change from his scornful dismissal of the group last January as a "JV team" after it had taken over Fallujah.

But once the aura of the presidential delivery and tone is removed, and simply to the words spoken, it does not inspire confidence that by this time next year, ISIL will be crushed and some form of stability will return to the Middle East.

And that is largely because this was clearly a poll-tested event, designed more to prop up the president's sagging popularity than to confront and defeat a terrorist threat and a fascist ideology.

The president's opening made that obvious. Instead of focusing immediately on the threat at hand, he had to spend a few minutes bragging about the killing of Osama bin-Laden and ending the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan.

After which, he said, "America is safer."

Really? If we're safer, why the need for major military action, especially in Iraq, which he declared was "sovereign, stable and self-reliant" when he pulled out American troops?

Why spend more blood and treasure there, when that money could tled groups – the middle class, the "children" and the "most vulnerable among us"?

The president also couldn't resist trying to convince us how robust the economy is under his stewardship. "Our businesses are in the longest uninterrupted stretch of job creation in our histo-

ry," he said. Whaaat? Is job creation going to defeat ISIL?

And when it came to the professed purpose of his speech, Obama once again told Americans what he believes they want to hear. After the gruesome beheadings of two American journalists and declarations from top military commanders and Defense Secretary Chuck Hagel on what an extreme threat ISIL poses, polls show that a majority of Americans, while weary of war, favor military action against ISIL.

So that's what the president served up: We are not going to war. This will not be another Iraq or Afghanistan. This will surely be used at home not even be an armed

"counter-terrorism campaign." The only military actions will be from manned airstrikes or the more antiseptic drones.

There will be no ground troops. America will simply send a few hundred, non-combat forces to provide support and intelligence to local armies and militia.

Little pain, big gain. But there are multiple holes in the president's assurances that all will

be well. He claimed that this "campaign" would include a "broad coalition." How broad? He didn't say, probably because as analysts on both sides of the political divide have noted, so far that includes only nine nations, which compares poorly with the 37-nation coalition assembled by the George W. Bush administration in 2003.

The president continued to turn rhetorical backflips to avoid offending Muslims. He claimed that ISIL has nothing to do with Islam, which prompted a blizzard of comments on

acronym ISIL, since the first letter stands for "Islamic."

He announced that the United States will now provide additional arms and training to Syrian rebels, never explaining why he had changed his recent view that it was a "fantasy" to think that more support for those rebels would make a difference since they were simply "former doctors, farmers, pharmacists and so forth."

What happened? Have they suddenly morphed into the kind of highly trained, bloodthirsty warriors that they will be

confronting? The president, while claiming America is safer, never addressed the reality that hundreds of disaffected Americans have joined ISIL and are highly motivated to return to the United States and slaughter as many of their fellow citizens as possible in a blaze of suicidal glory.

So what if their passports are revoked? Is the how porous American borders are thanks to his

"compassionate" stance toward illegal immigra-

He said his strategy of "support" for local forces committing without American combat troops has worked successfully in Yemen and Somalia for years.

Not according to most neutral observers, who point out that al-Qaida in the Arabian Peninsula (Yemen) and al-Shabaab (Somalia) remain credible terrorist threats.

Even the president's declaration that "if you threaten America, you will find no safe haven" was undermined by his claim that this has been "a core principle of my presidency." If it is, he has kept it well hidden.

Countries always get to decide if they are at war or not. The one facing us now is not one we sought or chose. But ISIL leaders know they are at war with us. It doesn't show much resolve - or intent to win - to say we are not at war with them

ARTIFACT

Dou know what this is?

OSKALOOSA — This past week's artifact from the Nelson Pioneer Farm is a stereo amplifier.

Some people made a guess as to the identity of the artifact.

Dorothy Vos wrote via email "This is strictly a guess, but could that be the PA system that Milo Steele from Washington, Iowa donated to the museum when they first started using a sound system (early 80's) for what was at that time called The Nelson Pioneer Farm Crafts Festival.'

Dan Kalbach also wrote via email: "This appears to be a 60's-vintage tube-type stereo audio amplifier viewed from the rear of the chas-

Nelson Pioneer Farm Curator Kelly Halbert did some research on the artifact. She wrote: "Stereo Amplifier

The artifact is the back view of a 1963 48 Watt Stereo Amplifier. It was built from a kit supplied by H.H. Scott, Inc. of Massachusetts along with several other components of a complete

stereo system. The tubes and transformers were of the latest design for the time, but were replaced within a decade as technology advanced.

This Scott Stereo Amplifier has tape monitoring facilities, earphone jacks and a switch to shut off the stereo speakers. Most stereos had two speakers, but this amplifier allowed the owner to connect a third speaker to the system. Sales points from the advertising brochure promote massive output transformers and nonmagnetic electrolytic aluminum chassis that reduces hum.

Hermon Scott was instrumental in providing components for stereos, radio equipment and audio instruments. In 1946 he developed a noise suppressor that effectively opened the high fidelity sound industry. The first FM-AM tuner was invented in 1955 and ready for the listening public when the FCC approved stereo transmissions of FM stations in April 1961."

Runovers are preventable

A farm tractor is an essential piece of equipment that no farmer could do without. It serves many functions pulling the trailers, balers, plows and shredders needed to prepare the land and harvest the crops. But because of its size and weight, it is also potentially dangerous, and should be handled with care.

In fact, about 44% of child fatalities on a farm are caused by runovers. Small children, especially, may not be visible from the cabin of the tractor. Before moving a tractor, walk around the vehicle to make sure youngsters are not playing nearby, or have another person as a guide when working in areas where there are likely to be children.

Even better, create a fenced-in play area for children so they are less likely to venture close to operating machinery. Before dismounting from a tractor, turn off

the ignition. This will ensure that a child who leaves the play area can't accidentally put it in gear. Runovers can also be caused if the vibration from an idling tractor engages the transmission.

It's not only children at risk. The noise of the machine may make it difficult to hear nearby co-workers. About one in four farm-related deaths, and one in eight hospitalizations, are due to runovers.

One solution is to adopt the habit of using hand signals on the farm. This will put an extra set of eyes to work for the driver. Besides preventing injuries, it may also reduce the likelihood of accidental damage to equipment. Use the industry standard hand signals to ensure that, no matter where you work, you can be easily understood!
