



MESSAGE to the PEOPLE of the QUAD-CITIES

The above table lists 41 states and four territories, with a total representation of 2,014 cities and towns. There are only four states not represented up to the time this list was compiled, November 30, 1913, namely—New Hampshire, Rhode Island, South Carolina and Vermont.

These 2,014 cities and towns embrace a total of 18,714 individual orders received from WHO listeners, and represent a total maturity value in War Bonds of \$4,242,900. About 45% of these totals represent the response from radio listeners in Iowa.

The response our people have made is the one they will continue to make, because, with few exceptions, they sense the spirit of our land, which cannot be defined in words. It is a part of them, and they are a part of it. As long as this spirit endures, we shall continue to grow, and to meet our worthy needs with righteous deeds.
