Senior living complex planned in Clarion

CLARION — Ground breaking for a \$16 million senior living complex is expected to take place in August.

The United States Department of Agriculture approved a longterm, low-interest loan of nearly \$14 million for the project, allowing WRC to move forward for a project that was conceived about two and a half years ago.

The Villas at Water Run, a 20-acre senior living complex includes a 60-bed assisted living building and 31 surrounding villas or homes. Bids for the \$16 million project in Monroe Township were released earlier this week and construction is projected to take 18 to 20 months.
