New DuBois business to open in near future

DuBOIS — The opening of Doc G's Brewing Company, a brewery and family-friendly restaurant, located at 208 W. Long Avenue in DuBois, is getting closer.

The 15 brew tanks were delivered last week which means the brewing of the six flagship craft brews is about to begin, said Sales and Marketing Manager Jennifer Shugar.

"Now that we have the tanks in, basically it was the last essential piece before we are up and running," Shugar said. "I know that through Downtown DuBois Grapes & Hops Walk in September, everybody wanted to know when we are going to open."

Shugar said Doc G's was anticipating a Black Friday opening but, unfortunately, that date has been extended.

"We still don't have a date yet," Shugar said. "We are striving for hope-

fully before Christmas but definitely before the new year."

"We are really striving for perfection when we open," Shugar said. "We have the tanks here so we are ready to go."

The City of DuBois, which has a rich

tradition of brewing, has gone decades without seeing beer brewed on an industrial scale - a dry spell which will come to an end.

Boasting of a 15-barrel brew system with the capacity to output 18,000 kegs

Doc G's is the 205th brewery in the state of Pennsylvania. Without another brewpub between DuBois and State College or Pittsburgh, owners Jeff and Jen Gilbert, of State College, think the brewery will fill a void in the last beer desert in the state. Jeff is a cardiolo-
