I grew up on a farm on Ward Road in Orchards, WA, living there my entire life until marrying Max. Several happy years of my early education were spent in the Hockinson School District. There I met my best lifelong girlfriend, Ann Frazier. The Evergreen School District is where I spent my high school years, graduating in 1958. Forever I will cherish the many incredible people I met there and continued to share great friendships with until I passed.

One of the happiest days of my life, September 16th, 1960, I married Max and we began building our lives here in Vancouver. Together we have four children; Dona Hall-Rogers (husband Steve), Mel Hall (wife Tamera), Debbie Richards (husband

Bob), and Floyd Hubsky (wife Michale). I very happily answered to Nana, Gammy and Coocoo by our eight grandchildren and 16 great-grandchildren.
