
# THE BOYS' INDOOR TRACK ALL-STARS


### Justin Ireland/Norton


### Isaiah Rodriguez/Attleboro


### Jake Affanato/Mansfield

## Camden Cleathero/Norton

Cleathero earned his third Sun Chronicle All-Star selection in the winter season. The senior helped the Lancers win the Tri-Valley League title, posting a first-place performance in the high jump with national-qualifying, personal-best of 6-foot,

Cleathero was a division and TVL champion in the 55 hurdles and a member of the division-best 4x200 relay squad. Delasanta was among the state's best in the 55 dash and 300 meters. Delasanta was a state 300-meters champion, posting a personal-best 34.63 time at the MIAA All-State Championship. He also took first at the MIAA Division 3 Championship (34.83) and Eastern Athletic Con-



ference Championship along with wins at both events in the 55 dash. He was runner-up in the dash at the state meet (6.52) and in the 300 at the New England Indoor Championship (35.15). Competing at the New Balance Indoor Nationals, Delasanta claimed third in the 400 meters (49.02) in the Emerging Elite class. A senior repeat Sun Chronicle All-Star, he plans to attend the University of Rhode Island.


### Andrew Pearl/Bishop Feehan


### Abu Ceesay/Norton

Crawford earned his second career Sun Chronicle All-Star selection by claiming first place at the Hockomock League Championship in the 1,000 meters with a 2:40.91 mark, helping earn him a league allstar nod in the process. He set a personal-best 2:36.14 time at the MIAA

Division 2 Championship, finishing fifth. He finished 16th at the MIAA All-State Championship (2:36.90). Crawford was a member of the Hornets' 4x800 relay squad, which set a school record at the New England Indoor Championship Meet in placing fifth (7:58.66). 
