

THE GIRLS' SWIMMING ALL-STARS

Marisa Reidemeister/Bishop Feehan

The Attleboro Bluefish Swim Club and Costa Rican National Team member, this four-time all-star won the 200 freestyle (1:54.2) and took second in the 100 breaststroke (1:03.6) as Feehan won the MIAA State Division 2 Meet title for fourth successive fall season. She was also a member of the first place 400 freestyle and third place 200 medley relay teams. She won the Southern Conference Meet 200 IM (2:12.6) and took second in the 100 breaststroke (1:09.9). Reidemeister also directed the Shamrocks to the South Sectional Meet title, winning both the 200 freestyle (1:54.16) and 100 breaststroke (1:07.8), while being a member of the first place 400 freestyle team.



Kirsten Wade/Bishop Feehan

A three-time Sun Chronicle all-star, Wade guided the Shamrocks to their fourth straight MIAA Division 2 State Meet, Wade took third in the 200 IM (2:13.3) and eighth in the 100 backstroke (1:02.0), while being a member of the title-taking 400 freestyle relay team and third place 200 medley relay team. The Shamrocks won the Southern Conference Meet title with Wade having important finishes in the 200 IM (second, 2:21.2) an 100 backstroke (third, 1:04.2), while being a member of the first place 400 freestyle relay team and second place 200 medley relay team. A product of the Shamrock Swim Club, Wade then took fourth in the 200 IM (2:16.3) and fifth in the 100 backstroke (1:01.8).



Hannah Phelan/Bishop Feehan

The transfer from Walpole won the diving competition at the Southern Conference championship meet with a score of 264.20 points, the difference in a four-point win over Bishop Stang. Phelan won the South Sectional Meet title with a sectional record score of 535.45 points and then in the tank at Harvard University, she won the MIAA Division 2 State Meet diving title with a meet record score of 537.05, winning by an 86-point margin. Phelan also broke Feehan's school six-dive record (285 points) with a 285 with six dives and her first place showing at the MIAA Division 2 State Meet was her second straight individual title. She is also a club gymnast.



Colleen McDonald/Bishop Feehan

The freshman freestyler, a product of the Hay Lightning and Hockomock Area YMCA swim clubs, took third place in the 200 (2:06.9) and 500 (5:39.3) freestyle events as Bishop Feehan won the Southern Conference Meet title. She was also a member of the winning 400 freestyle relay team. McDonald delivered two key individual placements as Feehan won the South Sectional Meet, taking sixth place in the 500 freestyle (5:30.6) and eighth in the 200 freestyle (2:03.3). McDonald again came through with a pair of top 10 performances as Feehan won its fourth straight MIAA Division 2 State Meet title, taking fourth in the 500 freestyle (5:28.4) and eighth in the 200 freestyle.



Taylor Durand/Bishop Feehan

At the MIAA Division 2 State Meet at Harvard, Durand took fifth place in the 100 freestyle (55.55) and 11th place in the 50 freestyle (25.61), while being a member of the third place 200 medley relay team and title-taking 400 freestyle relay team. At the Southern Conference Meet, Durand was fifth in the 100 freestyle (58.83), sixth in the 50 freestyle (27.0) and was a member of the third-place 200 freestyle relay team. At the South Sectionals, Durand took fourth in the 50 freestyle (25.52) and eighth in the 100 freestyle (56.02). The senior is president of the Student Council, serves with the Peer Ministry and is a product of the Seacoast Swimming Association.



Maeve McGowan/Mansfield

The senior captain of the Mansfield High swimming team — a four-time all-star selection — took second place in the 50 freestyle (26.62) and third in the 100 freestyle (58.03) at the Hockomock Meet, also being a member of the 400 freestyle relay that finished fifth and the eighth-place 200 medley relay team. At the MIAA state meet, McGowan took 14th in the 100 backstroke (1:02.8) and 21st in the 50 freestyle (25.86). McGowan took sixth place in the 50 freestyle (25.89) at the South Sectionals and 14th in the 100 backstroke (1:03.4), while also being a member of two relay teams. She will attend Merrimack College, and is also a member of the Hockomock YMCA swim team.



Aidan Devers/North Attleboro

A four-time all-star selection, the Rocketeers' senior captain, headed for Central Connecticut State, was a top 10 finisher in two events at the MIAA State Division 2 Meet, sixth in the 100 backstroke (59.85) and seventh in the 200 freestyle (1:59.9), while being a member of the fourth place record-breaking 200 medley relay team. At the Hockomock League Meet, Devers won the 100 backstroke (1:01.8) and was second in the 200 freestyle (2:02.8), while being a member of the first place 200 medley and third place 400 freestyle relay teams. The Adirondack Club member then took third in both the 200 freestyle (1:59.1) and 100 backstroke (1:00.0) at the South Sectionals.



Andie Rigas/North Attleboro

A product of the HAY Lightning program, the North senior took third in the 200 IM (2:24) and sixth in the 100 butterfly (1:04.5) at the Hockomock League Meet, while being a member of the record-setting 200 medley and third place 400 freestyle relay teams. At the MIAA Division 2 State Meet, the Providence College-bound Rigas finished 12th in the 100 butterfly (1:01.7) and 19th in the 200 IM (2:19.6), while a member of the fourth place 200 medley relay team. At the South Sectional Meet, Rigas finished 13th in both the 200 IM (2:21.0) and 100 butterfly (1:08.2) events, and the record-breaking ninth place 200 medley relay team. She is also a member of the National Honor Society.



Alyssa Felos/North Attleboro

The senior finished her career with a flurry, taking 12th place in the 100 breaststroke (1:10.5) at the MIAA Division 2 State Meet, while being a member of the fourth place 200 medley relay team. Felos took second place in the 100 breaststroke (1:11.4) and fifth place in the 200 IM (2:28) at the Hockomock League meet, while being a member of the title-taking, record-breaking 200 medley and sixth place 200 freestyle relay teams. At the South Sectionals, Felos took ninth place in the 100 backstroke (1:10.9), clocked a 2:27 in the 200 IM and was a member of the ninth place 200 medley relay team. A member of the Envious Swim Club, she will attend Mt. St. Mary's University.



Jackie Dirschel/North Attleboro

The Red Rocketeers' rookie made an immediate impact, taking third place in the 50 freestyle (26.86) at the Hockomock League championship meet, fourth in the 100 freestyle (58.34), while being a member of the record-setting championship 200 medley and sixth place 200 freestyle relay teams. In her first visit to the MIAA State Meet, Dirschel finished 22nd in the 100 freestyle (57.34) and was a member of the fourth place 200 medley and 13th place 400 freestyle relay teams. At the South Sectional Meet, the Adirondack Club-trained Dirschel swam legs for the ninth place 200 medley and 12th place 400 freestyle relay teams and ranked among the top five point scorers.



Abby Martin/Norton

The Lancer rookie rewrote the record book — 50 freestyle (25.16), 200 freestyle (2:01.99), 500 freestyle (5:24.43), 200 IM (2:18.42), 100 butterfly (53.74), 100 backstroke (59.30) and 100 breaststroke (1:18.38). In addition, Martin was second in the 100 freestyle (58.57) at the MIAA State Division 2 meet. Martin broke the TVL record in winning the 100 butterfly, as well as winning the 100 backstroke. Then she went out and won the 100 butterfly (53.74) at the South Sectionals and was one of only two girls to break 1:00 in the 100 backstroke, taking second place (59.30) Martin was the runner-up for TVL Swimmer of the Year. She also competes with the Attleboro Bluefish Swim Club.



Sydney Nasson/King Philip

A three-time selection, the Tufts University-bound senior won both the 50 (26.17) and 100 (56.91) freestyle titles at the Hockomock League Meet, while being a member of the championship 200 and 400 freestyle relay team. A member of the Adirondack Swim Club, Nasson took fifth in the 500 freestyle (5:13.2) and sixth in the 200 freestyle (1:57.6) at the Division 2 State Meet, while being a member of the fourth place 400 freestyle relay and seventh place 200 freestyle relay. At the South Sectionals, Nasson took second in both the 200 (1:56.6) and 500 (5:11.1) freestyle, while also swimming with the 200 and 400 freestyle relay teams. She is one of three Nasson sisters to be all-stars.



Emily McQuaid/King Philip

McQuaid captured the MIAA Division 2 State Meet title in the 200 IM (2:08.1), also taking third in the 100 butterfly (57.35) and being a member of the fourth-place 400 freestyle relay team. At the South Sectional Meet, McQuaid won the 200 IM (record 2:05.6) and took second in the 100 butterfly (58.87), while a member of the winning 400 freestyle relay team. The Attleboro Bluefish-trained McQuaid owns five KP records and qualified for USA Swimming All-Scholastics in the 200 IM. In the Hockomock League meet, McQuaid won both the 200 IM (2:17.8) and 100 butterfly (1:00.78), while also being a member of the first place 400 freestyle and second place 200 medley relay teams.



Cara McCarthy/King Philip

The senior captain took ninth place in the 200 individual medley (2:14.5) and 10th in the 100 breaststroke (1:10.3), while being a member of the fourth place 400 freestyle relay team. The Adirondack Swim Club-trained McCarthy was second in the 200 IM (2:17.8) and third in the 100 breaststroke (1:14.08) at the Hockomock League Meet, while being a member of the first place 400 freestyle and second place 200 medley relay teams. At the South Sectionals, McCarthy was sixth in the 200 IM (2:15.6) and 13th in the 100 backstroke (1:12.4) and was on the winning 400 freestyle relay team, the Warriors finishing third overall. She is also a member of the National, Science and Art honor societies.



Callie Sullivan/King Philip

Another fabulous freshman KP program, Sullivan took fifth place in both the 100 freestyle (59.71) and 100 backstroke (1:06.3) at that meet, while being a member of the title-taking 200 freestyle and second place 200 medley relay teams. At the Division 2 State Meet Sullivan was 14th in the 100 freestyle (57.67) and 21st in the 100 backstroke (1:03.8), while being a member of the seventh place 200 freestyle relay team. At the South Sectional Meet, the HAY Lightning Swim Club member finished 13th in the 100 freestyle (57.19) and 16th in the 100 backstroke (1:03.6), while being a member of the runner-up 200 freestyle relay team as KP took third place as a team.



Samantha Nasson/King Philip

Only a freshman and third in line of sisters to receive all-star acclaim, Nasson finished third in the 500 freestyle (5:39.9) and fifth in the 100 butterfly (1:04) while helping King Philip win the Hockomock League Meet. She was trained at the Adirondack Swim Club. Nasson finished 16th in the 100 butterfly (1:02) at the MIAA Division 2 State Meet, while swimming legs for the fourth place 400 freestyle and seventh place 200 freestyle relay teams. At the South Sectional Meet, Nasson took sixth place in the 500 freestyle (5:28.6) and 15th in the 100 butterfly (1:04.2), while also being a member of the championship 400 freestyle and fifth place 200 freestyle relay teams.
