Public invited to museum for meeting, social

BANDON – The annual meeting of the Bandon Historical Society will take place at the museum at 1 p.m. Saturday, Dec. 10. The meeting will be followed by a member's social.

The annual meeting will include a review of the past year, a preview of the coming year, a financial report and certification of the election of board members and officers for the coming year.

Like all board meetings, the annual meeting is open to the public.
