Guest pianist Alexander Tutunov will accompany the performance with musical pieces interspersed within the poem including works by Brahms, Grieg, Bloch and Vaughan-Williams.

‘Fiddler on the Roof Jr.’ auditions to be held

BANDON – New Artists Productions founders Dan and Anita Almich will conduct auditions for their spring production, the musical “Fiddler on the Roof Junior” on Sunday and Monday, Jan. 15 and 16, at the Sprague Community Theater. Auditions will be held from 1:30-4 p.m. on Jan. 15; and 6:30-8 p.m. on Jan. 16.

“Fiddler on the Roof” is set in the small Jewish village of Anatevka, Russia, in 1905 and is concerned primarily with the efforts of Tevye, a dairyman, his wife, Golde, and their five daughters to cope with their harsh existence under Tsarist rule. The musical is part of the Broadway Junior Collection of plays designed especially for youth theater.

Youth performers enrolled in grades 3 through 12 are eligible for parts in the play. The two main characters, Tevye and Hodel, have been pre-cast so that the directors could solidify the presentation of the play and, thus, secure the per-

formance rights.

It is important for those wishing to audition to bring their school and activity schedules to the audition as these involvements oftentimes impact the casting of the play.

Auditions will consist of reading lines from the play script and singing to recorded music from the play. The selections “Far From the Home I Love,” “Matchmaker,” and “Anatevka” will be used to characterize vocal range and voice quality. Prior rehearsal to the audition music is not required.

Free discussion about fishing and seafood in PO

PORT ORFORD – Oregonians love the wild beauty of its 363 miles of coastline, but finding truly local seafood can be hard, even on the coast. The U.S. imports approximately 90 percent of its seafood and ships out nearly as much to the global market. Why aren’t we eating more local seafood, now that preserving and distribution technologies are the most sophisticated they have ever been? Why do we consider seafood more a delicacy now than it has been in the past?

This is the focus of “Fish Tales: Traditions and Challenges of Seafood in Oregon,” a free conversation with Jennifer Burns Bright at 6 p.m. Thursday, Jan. 19, at the OSU Port Orford Field Station, 444 Jackson St., Port Orford. The program is hosted by Southwestern Oregon Community College in partnership with OSU Port Orford Field Station and sponsored by Oregon Humanities.

Bright is a food and travel writer based in Port Orford. She recently retired from teaching at

the University of Oregon, where she researched desire in twentieth-century literature, led a faculty research group in the emerging discipline of food studies, and won a national pedagogy award for a team-taught, interdisciplinary class on bread. She holds a PhD from the University of California at Irvine and a Master Food Preserver certification. As a community organizer linking local producers and consumers, Bright often speaks and teaches at events. Her writing appears in *Gastronomica*, *Oregon Quarterly*, NPR’s *The Salt*, AAA’s *Via*, and *Eugene Magazine*, among others.

Registration opens for Oregon Rural Tourism Studio

The RTS professional development program offers hands-on skill-building through eight interactive workshop sessions and networking events held over a four-month period. The program is designed to assist residents and businesses in the Southern Oregon Coast region.

Workshop topics will include Community Tourism Visioning and Planning,

Adventure Travel and Outdoor Recreation Networking and Marketing, Culinary and Agritourism Networking and Marketing, Tourism Marketing and Communications, Teaming for Impact and Action, and ending with a Community Celebration Event.

To maximize the impact from the RTS program, it’s recommended that participants attend all workshops and events. Participants who attend at least four of the workshops will receive a certificate of completion from Travel Oregon.

The cost to participate in any one workshop is \$5 (and includes lunch), or \$20 for all five workshops. All networking events are free. Space is limited and is specifically designed for residents, businesses and organizations operating in the Southern Oregon Coast.
