Museum to present program on 1936 fire

BANDON – “Remembering the 1936 Bandon Fire” will be the subject for a special program at the Bandon Historical Society Museum at 1 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 25. The museum will open at noon and the program will be free and open to the public.

This year marks the 80th anniversary of the fire.

Bandon mayor and museum board vice president Mary Schamehorn will be master of ceremonies for the program. The presentation will be generously illustrated by photographs.

Survivors of the fire and their families have been invited. The chance to meet fire survivors is always a highlight of the annual event.

This year’s program will give special emphasis to the aftermath of the fire. The story of how the community coped with the disaster and rebuilt in 1937 will be told through accounts in the *Western World* and excerpts from first-hand survivor accounts.

“Even though the museum has shared this story many times,” said museum board president Jim Proehl, “we are amazed at how many new stories emerge and how our perspective on the fire and its impact on Bandon’s history continues to evolve.”

The museum is located at the corner of U.S. Highway 101 and Fillmore Avenue. Regular museum hours are 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Monday through Saturday.
