

## It's time to fall back. Daylight Saving Time will end on Sunday Nov. 1.

When local daylight time is about to reach 2 a.m. on Sunday, Nov. 1, clocks are turned back one hour to 1 a.m local standard time instead.

Sunrise and sunset will be about one earlier than the day before, so it will be darker much quicker in the evenings.

Most of the United States will gain an hour at 2 a m

Daylight saving time starts on the second Sunday in March and ends on the first Sunday in November, with the time changes taking place at 2 a.m. local time.

One of the biggest reasons we change our clocks to Daylight Saving Time is that it reportedly saves electricity. Newer studies, however, are challenging long-held reason.

In general, energy use and the demand for electricity for lighting our homes is directly connected to when we go to bed and when we get up. Bedtime for most of us is late evening through the year. When we go to bed, we turn off the lights and TV.

In the average home, 25 percent of all the electricity we use is for lighting and small appliances, such as TVs and stereos. A good percentage of energy consumed by lighting and appliances occurs in the evening when families are home. By moving the clock ahead one hour, we can cut the amount of electricity we consume each day.

Studies done in the 1970s by the U.S. Department of Transportation show that we trim the entire country's electricity usage by about 1 percent EACH DAY with Daylight Saving Time.

Benjamin Franklin proposed Daylight Saving Time as an American delegate in Paris in 1784. The idea didn't really catch on in the United States until World War I, in an effort to save on artificial lighting costs. The same thing happened during World War II.

After the war, states individually chose whether to observe daylight savings time and when they wanted to begin it during the year. As you can imagine, this just caused a lot of confusion.

The Uniform Time Act of 1966 provided the basic framework for alternating between Daylight Saving Time and Standard Time, which we now observe in the United States. But Congress can't seem to resist tinkering with it.

For example, in 1973 Daylight Saving Time was observed all year, instead of just the spring and summer. Again in 1986, Congress declared that DST would begin at 2 a.m. on the first Sunday in April and end at 2 a.m. on the last Sunday in October.

In 2007, Congress voted to switch the end of daylight saving time to the first Sunday in November to offer trick-or-treaters more daylight time to venture into the streets, even though most children wait until after dark to go out anyway.

While most states observe the spring forward/fall back switch in time, Hawaii, American Samoa, Guam, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, the Commonwealth of Northern Mariana Islands, and Arizona do not change the clock.

However, the Navajo Nation in Arizona does participate in daylight saving time and will roll the clock back Sunday. The Hopi Reservation, entirely surrounded by the Navajo Nation, does not observe daylight saving time, creating a "donut hole" in time in the middle of Arizona

When's the next time change? Spring forward one hour at 2 a.m. Sunday, March 6, 2016.

The time change is also a great reminder to change the batteries in your smoke detectors.

# "Always ... Patsy Cline" continues at Sprague Theater

BANDON – "Always ... Patsy Cline" continues this weekend at the Sprague Theater in Bandon City Park and runs weekends through Nov. 1. The event is a fundraiser for the Bandon Lions Charitable Foundation.

Whether you like country, the Nashville sound, pop, honky tonk, swing or gospel, you'll appreciate the fact that Patsy Cline was a rare entertainer who could belt out all those genres of songs with equal bravado.

Songs such as "Crazy," written by a young songwriter by the name of Willie Nelson, or "Always," by Irving Berlin, were part of her repertoire. Cline's list of hits are so long, it doesn't seem possible a person who died so young - at the age of 30 could have accomplished so much. She recorded for only eight years before the plane crash that took her life. Three others also died that fateful day in the crash with her. Cline was married with two children.

Bandon is fortunate to have a local singer who can bring back the great memories of this talented singer and the wonderful era of feelings and clarity in songs that will last forever, said the show's producer, Jeff Norris. Coos Bay resident Shirley Kintner are doing just that in Ted Swindley's Broadway play "Always ... Patsy Cline."

The play is about the friendship between Patsy and Louise Seger, with Coos Bay resident Pam de Jong as Louise. Louise aptly spins the story of their meeting and subsequent pen-pal relationship, while Patsy sings over two dozen great hit songs.

"So many Patsy Cline fans have asked, 'When will Patsy Cline return to the Sprague Theater?' Well folks, she has returned!" Norris said.

The Bandon Lions Charitable Foundation presents the recordsetting performance of "Always ... Patsy Cline" at the Sprague Community Theater, 1202 11th St. SW in Bandon. Performance dates are Oct, 31 and Nov. 1. Saturday performances are at 7 p.m. and Sunday matinees are at 2 p.m.
