Review of Wyoming's Economy



Economic Update as of March 31, 2014

The MACRO Report is a quarterly publication comprised of charts focusing on energy, employment, state revenues, and other indicators pertaining to the state of Wyoming.




Summary: Employment and energy indicators point to a modest start in 2014.

- Employment Slow job growth for the start of 2014; leisure & hospitality and retail trade created most of the new jobs in February (SA); all 23 counties saw improved jobless rates in February; WY rate at 4.8% vs. U.S. rate of 7.0% (NSA).
- Energy Oil rig counts have remained stable for several months while February oil & gas jobs declined by 300 since January. Opal natural gas price for March averaged a \$1.25 per mcf higher in 2013 than a year ago; WY coal production pace for 2014 running 0.8% behind 2013 after two months; Powder River spot prices improved to \$12.50 per ton in March.
- Revenues For the first 9 months of fiscal 2014, sales and use tax collections
 7.2% better than last year; 19 out of 23 counties reported gains. After 8 months, severance tax revenues outpaced last year by \$76.4 million.
- Enplanements, house price appreciation, and personal income Air travel in the state up by 3.1% but only Jackson and Laramie showing year-over-year gains; house prices steadily improved for the state and the region in 2013; personal income growth in fourth quarter of 2013 ranked 7th best in the U.S.



Coincident Index: WY, CO, NE, & U.S.


Year-over-Year Percent Change in Index Values

Nonfarm Employment: Casper, Cheyenne, WY, & U.S. Seasonally Adjusted — Through February 2014





Seasonally Adjusted — Through February 2014






Total WY and U.S. Nonfarm Employment

Year-over-Year Percent Change; Seasonally Adjusted






WY Employment Change: Feb 2014 vs. Feb 2013 Year-over-Year; Seasonally Adjusted






Wyoming Employment Change: Number of Jobs

Year-over-Year; Not Seasonally Adjusted






Casper and Cheyenne Employment Year-over-Year Job Change; Not Seasonally Adjusted






WY Jobless Rates by County










WY Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims Statewide — Through February 2014






WY Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims Mining Sector — Through February 2014






Natural Gas and Crude Oil Prices






WY Oil & Gas Jobs and Rig Counts



WY Rig Counts and Applications for Permit to Drill (APDs) [Through March 2014]




WY Coal: Production, Prices, and Jobs





Year-to-Date Fiscal 2014 vs. Fiscal 2013 — Nine Months of Collections



WY Statewide Severance Tax Collections




Quarterly Personal Income: WY, Rocky Mtn. Region, & U.S. Percent Change from Preceding Quarter


Quarterly Personal Income: WY, Rocky Mtn. Region, & U.S. Percent Change from Preceding Quarter



House Price Appreciation Purchase and Refinance Mortgages: Casper, Cheyenne, & WY




Residential Building Permits Units Statewide – Through February





Cheyenne - Units Permitted





