SEVEN HEAVILY DEBATED MILES

The seven-mile stretch of Moose-Wilson Road betwen the Granite Canyon and Moose entrances of Grand Teton National Park is the most polarizing roadway in the National Park Service. Constructing a path along the same route would link the 42-mile bike loop between Moose, Wilson and Jackson. It would also affect the ecology of the area, as well as carry path users directly through grizzly bear habitat, which was not yet an issue when the path was approved in 2007.
