On 05-16-16 at approximately 1508 hours, I responded to Banner University Medical Center located at ***** child abuse. Prior to my arrival, I made telephone contact with the reportee who said that a four month old [REDACTED] child, [REDACTED], was being treated at the hospital for being lethargic. After evaluation, hospital staff learned from a toxicology report that the child had [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] system. Upon my arrival, I made contact with social worker / reportee, Marielle Morran, in the Children's Diamond Center on the fifth floor. The reportee stated that the child and [REDACTED] parents were currently in room [REDACTED] and the child was in stable condition. Also I met with representatives from the State of Arizona Department of Child Safety and the Office of Child Welfare Investigators. As I gathered information from the reportee, she stated that she learned from hospital staff that the child was brought into Oro Valley Hospital on Sunday 05-15-16 at approximately 1100 hours for being lethargic and not eating normally. After being evaluated, the reportee said that the parents did not want the Oro Valley hospital staff to draw blood and were being uncooperative. Sometime later, the parents then left with the child against medical advice and the child was brought to Banner University Medical Center at approximately 1400 hours. According to the reportee, the parents were again uncooperative and did not want any lab work performed on the child. The reportee said that the sometime later a urine analysis was conducted and a toxicology screen showed the presence of [REDACTED].

A short time later, Det. M. Cruce #V203 arrived and continued the investigation. I stood by at the request of Det. M. Cruce and monitored room number [REDACTED] where the parents and child were staying. I later identified the parents as Somchai P Lisaius and Krystin R Lisaius by their Arizona driver's licenses. As I stood by, Det. M. Cruce informed me that search warrants were being obtained for evidentiary purposes. I then stood by until Ofc. K. Knapp #V237 arrived and a search warrant was served on Krystin Lisaius at approximately 2100 hours, 05-16-16. I then witnessed the search warrant blood draw that was conducted by Ofc. K. Knapp. Please see other supplements for further information. This concludes my activity in this case.

On 05/16/2016 Sgt. D. Nesbitt #V124, contacted me in reference to this case. I was advised that a search warrant had been obtained for Krystin Lisaius' blood and he requested that I respond to UMC Banner Hospital to conduct the blood draw. He also asked that I serve Krystin with her copy of the search warrant. I responded to the Diamond Children's wing, of UMC Banner Hospital and made contact with Krystin Lisaius in room [REDACTED]

Blood Draw:

Prior to the draw I confirmed Krystin's identity, verbally and via her Arizona drivers license and I served her with her copy of the warrant. I then explained what I was there to do and asked Krystin the pre draw questions. I then cleansed a table and chair, which were located in the room, with disinfectant and let it completely air-dry. I sat Krystin in the chair and used a Benzalkonium Chloride swab to cleanse her left antecubital fossa with widening concentric circles. A tourniquet was applied 3-4 inches above the site. I subsequently used a 23 gauge winged infusion set to gather two grey top tubes of blood at approximately 2109 hours. The tube, tourniquet and the needle were removed. I applied pressure for approximately two minutes to ensure that the draw site had clotted properly, which it did. While I was applying pressure, I inverted the tubes of blood to ensure all of the additives were dissolved. The blood was immediately packaged, sealed and transported to the Oro Valley Police Department. On arrival I placed the blood kit into evidence and completed the DPS request for examination form.

On 05/16/16 at about 1600 hours, I was briefed on this incident which involved a 4 month old child where the presence of cocaine was found in the child's urine while at Banner Medical Center/Diamond children's Hospital. The parents were identified as Som Lisaius and Krystin Lisaius and the child was identified as [REDACTED].

Ofc. M. Cruce #V203 responded to the hospital where he conducted interviews with Som and Krystin. Det. Cruce later advised that both admitted to recent cocaine use while at their residence, ***** cocaine was aslo said to be currently inside the home. Per Det. Cruce, Krystin also made admission to breast feeding [REDACTED] 12 hours after ingesting the cocaine. Krystin also said that their friend, Thomas [REDACTED] was present when she, Som and Thomas all ingested the cocaine together. Refer to Det. Cruce' report for further information.

On 05/16/16 at about 1945 hours, Det. M. Carr #V202 and I went to Thomas [REDACTED] residence (***** incident. Upon arrival, we met with Mrs. [REDACTED] who advised that Thomas wasn't home. Mrs. [REDACTED] then called Thomas who agreed to meet Det. Carr and I at the Brueger's Bagel shop at La Canada/Naranja. We then responded to this location and met with Thomas at about 1755 hours who was already present. The following is a summary of the interview:

Thomas was advised that OVPD received information from Banner Medical Center involving Som and Krystin (Lisaius). Thomas was also initially advised that some of the allegations against Som and Krystin included drug use, specifically cocaine use. I then explained to Thomas that if he were to say that he too participated in drug use, we were not there to arrest him rather, we wanted to speak to him as a witness due to this investigation also involving child abuse.

Thomas advised that he was good friends with Som and Krystin and was at the Lisaius home on Saturday night with his wife for a party. Thomas also said Krystin's family was present. According to Thomas, Krystin laid down with [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] room after Krystin's parents left. Thomas also said that his wife went home around 2300 hours but said he decided to stay the night. While Krystin was in [REDACTED] room, Thomas said he and Som had a couple drinks as they sat on the couch watching ESPN. I then told Thomas that Krystin and Som had already said he was present with them when certain drug activity took place. Thomas then responded by saying, with that being said, "I saw her (Krystin) do one line

tops" on the master bathroom counter top. I asked Thomas if he saw Som do any cocaine and he responded by saying, yah, that's where I did mine with him (Som). Thomas said everyone snorted the cocaine through a rolled up receipt off the bathroom countertop. Thomas estimated that this was just before midnight. Thomas also said the cocaine was already at the Lisaius residence and didn't ask where it came from. Thomas advised that his wife was not present during the drug use and was 100% against it.

Thomas advised that he is [REDACTED] godfather and probably should've asked Krystin if she was gonna do this (use cocaine), did she have at least 72 hours worth of breast milk or have some baby formula? Thomas also said that if he were the husband, he probably would've made sure she had some breast milk (prior to Krystin using cocaine).

Thomas advised he texted Som on Sunday thanking him for him the party and said Som responded a short time later via text. Thomas said he also sent a text to Krystin on Sunday but said she never responded. Thomas said this made him wonder what was going on because it was unusual for her to not respond. Thomas said he was unaware that [REDACTED] was in the hospital. Thomas asked about [REDACTED] status and he was advised that it was unknown at that time. Thomas also mentioned that he had never seen Krystin do cocaine before. Det. Carr and I thanked Thomas for meeting with us and the interview ended at about 2012 hours. This interview was recorded and was placed into evidence.

On 05/16/16 at about 2041 hours, I assisted with the service of a search warrant at the Lisaius residence, ***** team and upon entry, no additional subjects were found inside. I.D. Supervisor, L. Plummer I.D. #101 was present and took overall photos prior to the search of the residence. I then assisted in searching the residence and located the following items:

Room D (Home Office-bottom right desk drawer)

1JD-Clear baggie containing a white powder substance, Hilton honors card in the name Krystin Sorich with white residue on it, and (4) 1"x1" baggies with marijuana leaf print on them. (2) of these small baggies contained a white residue and the other (2) baggies contained a white powder substance. All (4) baggies were attached to the larger baggie with a bobby pin.

These items were photographed in place and I then removed the items from the desk drawer to be photographed more closely by I.D. #101. I then turned these items over to Det. Cruce.

On 05/17/16 I assisted in packaging property in this case to be placed into evidence. As a result, the following additional item numbers were assigned due to being separated from the original item number:

1JD:Hilton Honor's card in the name Krystin Sorich with white residue on it, (2) 1" baggies with marijuana leaf print with white residue, (1) 1" baggie with marijuana leaf print with small amount of white powder (below threshold amount), bobby pin

1JD-1: Clear baggie containing white powder substance (Cocaine)

Note: I tested this substance using a field test kit and received a positive test for cocaine. The approximate weight was 1.59 grams w/o packaging which is a useable quantity.

1JD-2: 1" baggie with marijuana leaf print containing a white powder substance (Cocaine)

Note: I field tested this substance using a field test kit and received a positive test for cocaine. The approximate weight was .1 grams w/o packaging which is a useable quantity.

2ZY-Tiffany Jewelry box with rolled up dollar bill with white residue inside and Safeway club card with white residue on it.

2ZY-Baggie containing a white powder substance (removed from item #2ZY)

Note: I field tested this substance using a field test kit and received a positive test for cocaine. The approximate weight was .21 grams w/o packaging which is a useable quantity.

I placed the above items into evidence and submitted item #'s 1JD-1, 1JD-2 and 2ZY-1 for testing through the DPS lab for official results/weights. N.F.I.

I arrived on scene and began an investigation of reported child abuse and child endangerment. Oro Valley Police had been contacted by Banner University Medical Center Social Services reporting that a four month old [REDACTED] child was currently an in patient and [REDACTED]. On the 5th floor I met with the Case Officer Ofc. T. Baldwin #V159 and the following persons were also present when I was briefed; Brittney Holland (Office of Child Welfare Investigations), Kevin Perez, Tyeson Huffaker (Department of Child Safety), and Marielle Morran a Social Worker with Banner University Medical Center and the reporting party in this case. I was briefed and was informed that the victim was identified as [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] parents were named as Krystin and Somchai Lisaius. The victim and parents were currently in room [REDACTED]. The victims medical status currently was good and [REDACTED] was expected to fully recover. According to the other investigators the parents had first brought the victim to the Oro Valley Hospital on Sunday May 15th, and at the hospital had refused the hospitals request to conduct a blood draw from the victim. From the emergency room the victim was transported by ambulance to Diamond Children's Hospital on the same date. I received from Ms. Morran a 13 page two sided report that contained the medical records that were currently available for the victim. The reports include notes that the victims mother had refused all lab tests except for heel blood stick, body scans and physical exams. I was informed that the mother was and has been actively breast feeding the victim. The records include notes that the mother had found her baby at 0700 hours on Sunday and that the baby was lethargic and difficult to wake up. After the briefing I met with parents Somchai (aka Som) and Krystin Lisaius and the victim in room [REDACTED]. I digitally recorded my contact with them. I introduced myself and informed them that I was here to investigate a report made by hospital staff regarding the baby's health and welfare. I asked them both if I could conduct interviews with each of them, and they both readily agreed and appeared to be cooperative. Prior to each interview I informed them both that they were not in police custody or being in anyway detained by police. The doors to the conference room were closed for privacy reasons, and they are not in any way compelled to answer my questions.

Each of them stated that they understood and wanted to answer my questions.

I conducted digitally recorded interviews with both Krystin and Som Lisaius in a conference room on the 5th floor, present in both interviews were Kevin Perez and Tyeson Huffaker. The interviews were conducted separately. I first interviewed Krystin at approximately 1713 hours. The following is a synopsis of her statement; She is married to Som and the victim is her [REDACTED], she has breast fed [REDACTED] since birth. On Saturday May 14th she, her husband and [REDACTED] had gone to a birthday party for a friends 5 year old child, and after a few hours had returned home at approximately 1730 -1800 hours. Friends identified as Tom [REDACTED] and his wife [REDACTED] arrived at approximately 1900 hours. Her [REDACTED] had gone to sleep at approximately 2000 hours, and wakes to feed every 2-3 hours. She had fed her breast milk that evening that she had previously pumped. At approximately 0800 hours on Sunday May 15th she had fed her [REDACTED] from her breast. Approximately one half hour later, she reports that her [REDACTED] wouldn't wake up and was very lethargic and difficult to keep awake. She and her husband kept up attempts to stimulate [REDACTED] and finally decided to take [REDACTED] to the Oro Valley Hospital, which is close to their home. She was unable to provide the names of any hospital staff members that she had contact with. She denied that she refused to have the Oro Valley Hospital conduct a blood draw. She decided to have her [REDACTED] transported to Diamonds Children Hospital via Golder Ranch Ambulance. She denies that she has refused the staff at Diamonds to conduct any blood draw exams. I then discussed with her the discovery that Diamond Hospital had discovered [REDACTED] in her [REDACTED] urine in a toxicology exam. She initially denied any cocaine use herself, and denied any knowledge as to how her [REDACTED] could have been exposed to cocaine. Upon further questioning she made an admission that she had consumed cocaine by snorting it through her nose, and that her husband and friend Tom [REDACTED] also consumed with her. She states that this occurred at approximately 2000 hours on May 14th. She stated that she didn't think the baby would be affected after approximately 12 hours.

After the interview with Krystin I then conducted an interview with Som Lisaius, there was no contact between spouses during the interviews. The same witnesses were present with Som's recorded interview. The interview began at approximately 17:45, within a few minutes after Krystins ended. The following is a summary of Som Lisaius's interview; He has been married to Krystin for approximately two years and a couple of months. On Saturday May 14th he recalls that he, Krystin and their baby attended a birthday party for a 5 year old who is a friend of the family. This occurred between 1300 and 13:45 hours. All of them then returned to their home. Later that same evening they hosted a party at their house, which included a barbecue. Guests at the party included his mother

in law [REDACTED], her husband [REDACTED], Tom [REDACTED] and his wife [REDACTED], his sister in law [REDACTED] and her fiancé [REDACTED]. People began to arrive at approximately 1***** hours. The party was for [REDACTED] birthday. Between the hours of 2330 and 0030 everyone leaves the house. When confronted with the news that the Diamond Hospital had tested his baby's urine, and it tested positive for [REDACTED], Mr. Lisaius first denied use of cocaine. When told that his wife had made admissions to me that she had consumed cocaine with him and Tom [REDACTED], Mr. Lisaius eventually made admissions himself, stating that he had used cocaine on Saturday in the master bathroom, and that he uses cocaine himself every 6 weeks or so. He states that he has witnessed his wife use cocaine since they have become parents, but doesn't remember when. He denied that he had consumed cocaine with his wife on Saturday. When questioned about either he or his wife refusing both hospitals the opportunity to draw blood samples from [REDACTED], he denied that he had refused, and that he only wanted to wait to see if it was necessary.

After the interview, I again met with both Som and Krystin in the baby's room. My contact with them was recorded. I informed them that I was going to be applying for a search warrant for their home and also their cell phones. Mr. Lisaius provided me his cell phone. Krystin informed me that her cell phone was in there vehicle which was parked in the hospital garage. Som informed me that he was willing to retrieve the cell phone from the car. I then followed Som to the attached parking garage, still recording our conversation. While en route I was contacted by Officer Baldwin who informed me that Krystin had just found her cell phone in the baby's diaper bag. While en route I asked Som if he would consent to provide me his house key, so that when the warrant was obtained we could access his home. He then provided me his house key. He then without prompting told me that there was cocaine in his house and told me where it could be located. He informed me that it was contained in the right lower drawer of a white desk located in a room similar to a den. When we arrived at his car, a black four door BMW, Arizona Plate [REDACTED], at 18:50 hours I asked for consent to search his car. He was informed that it was totally voluntary and that he doesn't have to allow me. He consented and I conducted a search, with no evidentiary items found.

I later retained custody of Krystin's cell phone upon returning to the baby's room. I informed Krystin that a sample of her blood would also be included in the search warrant, and that another Oro Valley Officer would arrive shortly. See the report submitted by Officer K. Knapp V237 for details on the blood draw concerning Krystin Lisaius. All recording of contacts with Som and Krystin Lisaius were later downloaded into evidence.

On May 16, 2016, at approximately 1600 hours, I became aware of a possible child abuse investigation. The preliminary details I received was that a 4 month old [REDACTED], identified as [REDACTED] was currently at Banner University Medical Center and that [REDACTED] had tested positive for the presence of [REDACTED] in her system [REDACTED]. The parents of [REDACTED] were identified as Somchai (Som), and Krystin Lisaius. Both Som and Krystin were currently at the hospital with [REDACTED]. The report was made by a social services worker with Banner UMC. Det. M. Cruce #V203 responded to the hospital as the lead detective in the investigation.

I was later notified that both Som and Krystin made admissions to Det. Cruce of utilizing cocaine sometime in the evening of Saturday May 14, 2016, and that there was still cocaine within their residence. I later learned that they made admissions to utilizing cocaine on their master bathroom counter top. Their residence is located at ***** surveillance of the residence pending application of a search warrant. I arrived at the residence at approximately 1820 hours and noted that the lights in the residence were off and that there were no vehicles at the residence. At 1827 hours I observed a 2006 Dodge Durango bearing AZ License Plate [REDACTED] arrive at the residence. I observed a male, who later became known to me as Thomas [REDACTED] carry a golf club up to the residence and attempt contact at the door with negative results. Thomas departed the area a few moments later. I maintained surveillance of the residence until the search warrant was served.

At 2041 hours, I along with other OVPD detectives served the warrant at the residence; no persons were located within the residence. After initial overall photographs were taken, I was tasked with searching the master bathroom area, labeled as room H. On the master bathroom countertop, I observed small chunks of a white powder substance consistent with cocaine based on my training and experience. Utilizing clean, unused gloves, and a NIK test kit, I collected a sample of the white powder. The first test was inconclusive. Utilizing a new set of clean gloves and NIK test kit, I collected a second sample that was positive for cocaine. Det. M. Carr #V202 witnessed this test. Utilizing a business card, I collected the residue from the countertop (item 1zy). I then conducted a search of the right side master bathroom cabinet under the sink. In this area I noted numerous products commonly utilized by a female. In the right, rear corner of the cabinet, I located a blue/green Tiffany Box. Inside

that box, I located a clear plastic baggie containing a white substance, a rolled up dollar bill and a Red Safeway Club Card with white residue on it (itme 2zy). The manner in which the dollar bill was rolled up is in a manner that is commonly utilized to ingest narcotics. It is also common for individuals to utilize credit cards or in this case a Safeway Club Card to cut up cocaine prior to ingesting the powder. I recognized that both the club card and dollar bill are drug paraphernalia based on my training and experience. I turned over custody of all items of evidence that I located over to Det. Cruce.

At the conclusion of the search warrant I cleared the scene. This concludes my involvement in this investigation.

On May 16, 2016 I was asked to assist with a investigation involving a infant in the hospital at Banner UMC. I was advised further the infant was being treated for [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] system. I obtained information from Sgt. D. Nesbitt #V124 and Ofc. M. Cruce #V203 and authored a search warrant affidavit and then wrote a telephonic search warrant. I applied for the warrant through Judge Cornelio with Pima County Superior Court. Judge Cornelio granted the warrant authorizing a search of the residence on [REDACTED] and the blood of Krystin Lisaius.

At approximately 2041 hours, I was present at the address of

[REDACTED] as the knock and announce was conducted and the search warrant was executed. I searched the baby room on the north side of the house, the garage and the master bedroom closet. I also searched the back yard of the residence. While conducting the search, I did not discover anything of evidentiary value. I departed the residence with the other units at approximately 2156 hours. The recordings of the audio of the search warrant application was labeled as item 1WH and placed into digital evidence.

On 05/16/16 at approximately 1600 hours I was advised that Ofc. M. Cruce #V203 was responding to Banner Medical Center in reference to a child abuse investigation.

At approximately 1700 hours I was briefed by Det. M. Cruce; a four month old baby [REDACTED] was currently being treated at Banner due to her being lethargic and out of it. While treating [REDACTED] the hospital had noted the presence of [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] urine. Det. M. Cruce further explained that [REDACTED] was initially taken to the Oro Valley Hospital by her parents Som and Krystin Lisaius. While at Oro Valley Hospital they refused to allow staff to draw [REDACTED] blood in order to treat [REDACTED], eventually they agreed to allow [REDACTED] to be transported via ambulance to Banner Medical Center. During interviews Krystin admitted to consuming cocaine about 12 hours prior to breast feeding [REDACTED] and Som admitted to consuming cocaine with Krystin.

Based upon this information I completed a request for medical records in reference to a child abuse investigation. I then responded to Oro Valley hospital, *****
the nursing supervisor on duty. At approximately 1917 hours K. Jackson provided a 10 page document which documents [REDACTED] was admitted at 1046 hours on 05/15/16.

Reviewing the medical records I noted the following;
[REDACTED] was admitted at 1046 hours Sunday 05/15/16 (yesterday), [REDACTED] mom Krystin told the hospital staff [REDACTED] was "wabbly" and became limp she was unable to wake [REDACTED] up and [REDACTED] eyes were rolling back into [REDACTED] head. Krystin states these symptoms started at 0730 hours and drank breast milk. [REDACTED] went down for a nap at 0830 hours and when Krystin tried to wake [REDACTED] at 0900 [REDACTED] wouldn't wake up. Both parents tired to stimulate [REDACTED] for 90 minutes prior to bringing [REDACTED] to the hospital. Krystin described [REDACTED] as "rag doll" like and [REDACTED] eyes would roll up. The report documents that [REDACTED] was crying vigorously initially but quiets down and "begins to breast-feed". It also notes that "the baby will suck strongly from [REDACTED] mother's breast". In reference to [REDACTED] parents the report documents that [REDACTED] mother was extremely frightened and the father was very quiet. Dr. K. Erickson describes explaining to the parents that [REDACTED] episode was atypical and possibly life threatening, recommended [REDACTED] to be transferred to a pediatric hospital, and recommended a saline lock started. After talking it over the parents refused to consent to needle sticks and initially told the doctor they

would sign [REDACTED] out against medical advice. Ultimately the parents refused laboratory studies at Oro Valley hospital but agreed to the transfer to University Medical Center for further evaluation. [REDACTED] was transferred via ambulance departing at 1311 hours.

It should be noted that at no time according to the report did either parent tell the hospital staff about the mother's cocaine use the night before and Krystin continued to breast feed [REDACTED] while at the hospital.

The hospital records were placed into property as evidence item 2mlc.

At approximately 1945 hours Det. D. Jackson #V93 and I responded to Thomas [REDACTED] residence at *****

Krystin admitted to Det. Cruce that Thomas [REDACTED] was present when they consumed cocaine. Upon arrival we made contact with [REDACTED] wife [REDACTED] [REDACTED] confirmed that they were at their friends house Saturday night for a party. She also confirmed that the friends were Som and Krystin Lisaius. [REDACTED] was at the party but left around 2300 hours leaving her husband at the Lisaius residence over night. She called Thomas and he agreed to meet us at Bruegger's Bagel Shop at La Canada and Naranja.

At approximately 1955 hours Det. D. Jackson and I arrived at Bruegger's Bagels where we located Thomas [REDACTED] sitting at an outside table in front of the shop. Mr. [REDACTED] agreed to speak with us and advised he was comfortable sitting at that table. This interview was recorded and lead by Det. D. Jackson for complete details please reference the recording and Det. D. Jackson's report. The following is a brief synopsis of that interview. Mr. [REDACTED] confirmed that he and his wife were at Som and Krystin Lisaius' residence on Saturday 05/14/16. Several other family members were also present in the early evening however everyone including his wife left by around 2300 hours. Krystin laid down with [REDACTED] for a while and then came out to the living where he and Som had been drinking beers and watching TV. Around 0000 hours (midnight) or a little before all three of them went into the master bedroom bathroom and snorted cocaine. According to Thomas he only saw Krystin do "one line" on the master bathroom counter. Thomas stated the cocaine was already at the Lisaius residence and he didn't ask where it came from. He advised he has done cocaine with Som in the past but it had been several years and he had never seen Krystin do cocaine before.

After the interview with Thomas was complete we were advised that Det. W. Helvig #V87 had obtained a search warrant for the Lisaius residence at

residence was found to be unoccupied. After overall photographs were taken by

I.D. Technician L. Plummer #C101. I assisted in searching the residence and located the following item; 1mlc- small black digital scale, located inside a box inside the master bedroom closet off of the master bathroom. That item was photographed in place and turned over to Det. M. Cruce.

On 05/17/16 at approximately 0837 hours after receiving a voice message from Thomas [REDACTED] I returned his call and recorded the following conversation. Thomas advised he was 99 percent truthful with us last night but was trying to save himself from his wife. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Thomas advised he is sick about how [REDACTED] was doing and he wanted us to know they were not regular users. Thomas assumed that Krystin had pumped or bought formula if she was choosing to use. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Thomas advised from what he saw Som and Krystin didn't take any out of their own stash. He confirmed again that they used cocaine around midnight and passed out around 0200 and 0300 hours. When asked Thomas confirmed that he stopped by the Lisaius residence yesterday, which was witnessed by Det. Z. Young #V194. He stated he was trying to drop off a golf club that he had borrowed but no one answered. This conversation was placed into property as evidence item 3mlc.

On 05/17/16 I witnessed/assisted Det. D. Jackson in packaging the following items to include testing and weighin; 1JD, 1JD-1, 1JD-2, 2zy, 2zy-1. See the property sheets and narcotic test sheets for complete details.

This concludes my involvement in this investigation.

I and other officers of the Oro Valley Police Department conducted a search warrant at [REDACTED], the home of Som and Krystin Lisaius. The warrant had been obtained by Det. Wes Helvig V87, who was also present. Entry was gained accessing the front door using the key provided to me by Som Lisaius. Upon entry no one was found in the home. Prior to any search conducted I witnessed ID Technician L. Plummer C101 photograph each of the rooms within the house. My role in the service of the warrant was a recorder of the evidence found and also to retain all evidence into my possession until they were later placed into the police property room. All evidence found I recorded onto one single Property Receipt Form, a copy of which was left on the dining room table along with the premise copy of the search warrant. Under the item number I included the initials of the Detective who found the items(s), the item description and the room location. I was present when Det. D. Jackson searched the white desk, described to me earlier by Som Lisaius. I witnessed the discovery and removal of a clear zip lock baggy, containing a white powder, that based on my experience and training resembled the appearance of cocaine. This item and its contents was marked as 1JD. Three other items of evidence were discovered by other Detectives, they included 1ZY white powder residue recovered from the master bathroom counter top, 1MLC a small black digital scale and 2ZY a small green jewelry box containing a white powder wrapped in plastic, along with a rolled up dollar bill. See the reports submitted by other detectives who had discovered these items for more details. Officers secured the residence and left the scene at approximately 21:57 hours.
