The children in Mrs. Johnson's class at the Early Learning Center enjoyed exploring sand as they started a unit on the desert.





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
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BHS AP science students conduct studies

Oak Hill celebrates Black Excellence





JMA students play Name the Continents




JMA first-graders recently studied map skills including the seven continents and the major oceans. Pictured is Mrs. Smart's class playing Name the Continents.

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
Eagle Ridge class marks 100th day of school
