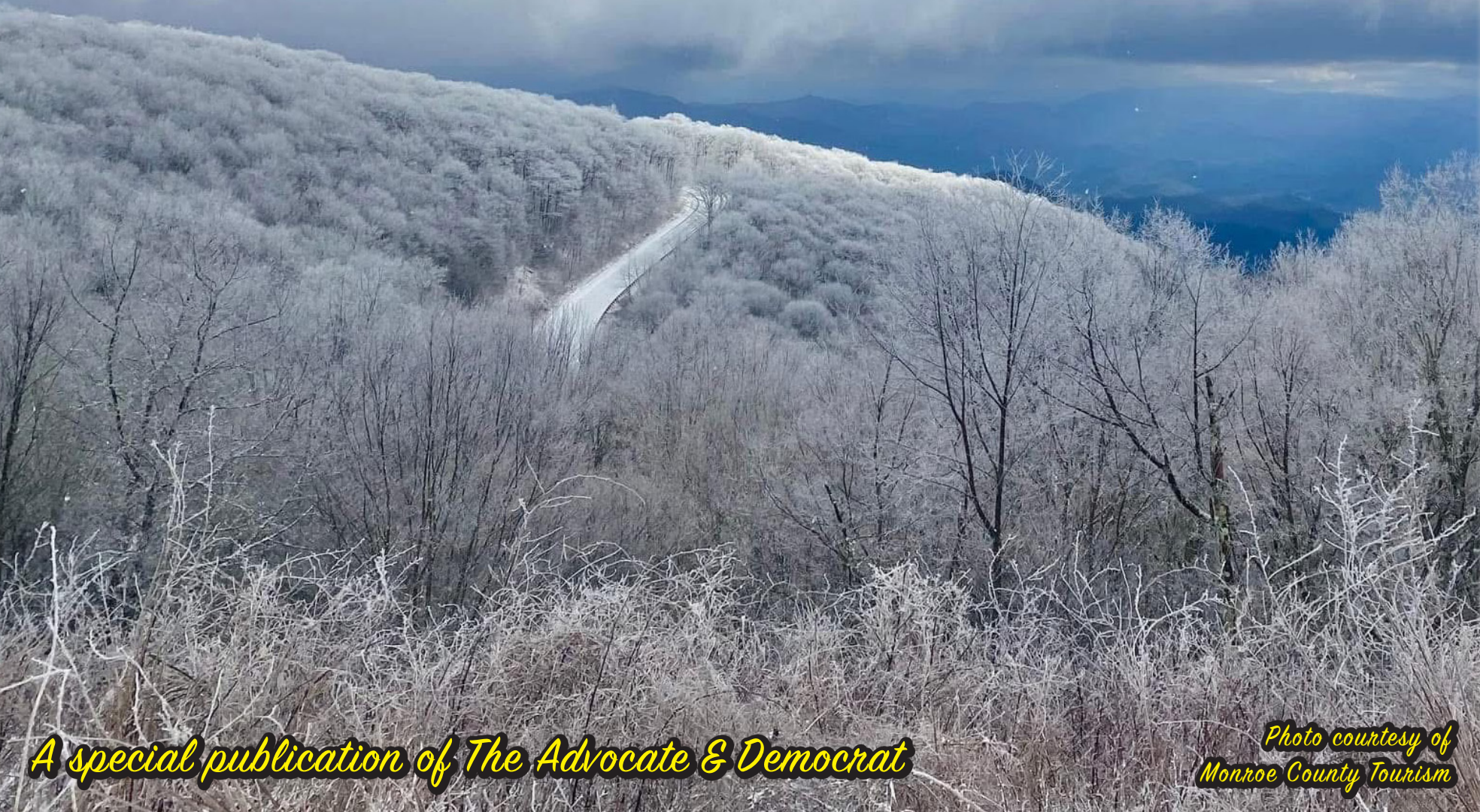

## HISTORIC ZONING COMMISSION

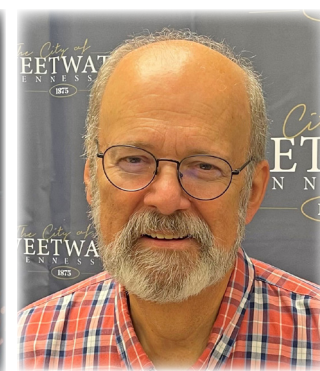

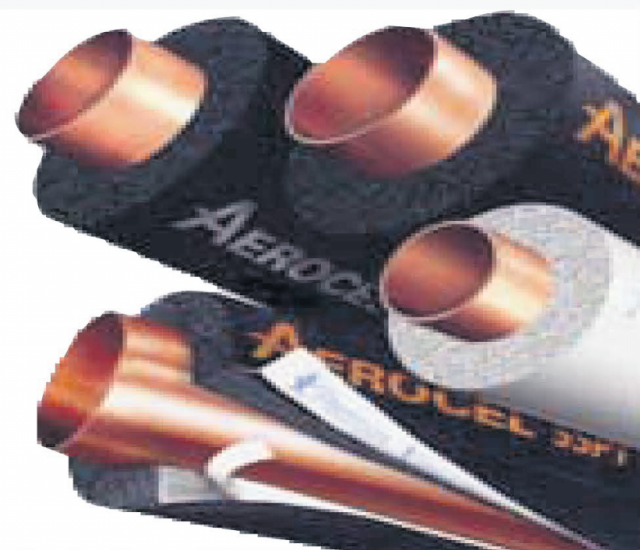

# MONROE COUNTY SCHOOLS

## Monroe County Schools

The Monroe County School System serves about 5,000 students in 13 schools. It is led by Director of Schools Dr. Kristi Windsor and a voter-elected School Board from four districts: Chairman Dr. Lon Shoopman, Vice Chair Jo Cagle, Sharin Freeman, Freddie Kelley, Bryan Kyle, Richard Bettis, John Ridgell, Mark Ingram, Dean Williams and Mitch Avery.

The School Board meets at 6:30 p.m. on the second Thursday of each month.

Monroe County Schools (MCS) has achieved the status of a Tennessee "Best for All District." This is after committing personnel and resources to improving literacy for all students in every grade. Tutoring is offered across the district to further support the efforts for English/language arts and math.

The district also boasts a very successful Career & Technical Education (CTE) CTE program for its students, with nationally recognized career clusters geared toward the ultimate goal of preparing students for post-secondary and career success.

The school system continues to lead the way in Coordinated School Health, expanding access to health care for students and teachers. The increased use of Telemedicine

enables remote diagnosis and treatment through Chota's school-based clinics.

In August 2022, the Monroe County Virtual School opened. This is a standalone school designed to serve students who have a need to learn virtually. This school has full-time certified teachers on staff who are able to provide assistance and support to the virtual

students at any time. This gives students an opportunity to learn in a way that fits them, while also having the support and encouragement of full-time teachers.

The official Monroe County Schools app allows parents access to all of the news from their child's school, no matter where it is posted, be it on social media, websites, and more. Parents can receive fast, accurate updates like school closings, bus delays, emergency situations, and more. Parents can sign up for the app and link their account to their child's school account to access a wide range of tools to help

their child succeed.

# HEALTH CARE IN MONROE COUNTY

## Health Department

The Monroe County Health Department offers a variety of services for children and adults. Most services are provided on a sliding fee based on income. The Health Department is located at 3469 New Highway 68 in Madisonville. For more information, call 423-442-3993.

## Child Health

WIC stands for Women, Infant, and Children. This is a Special Supplemental Nutrition Program. WIC is a federal program designed to provide supplemental food to low-income pregnant, postpartum, and breastfeeding women, infants, and children until the age of 5. Tennessee WIC has made it easier for clients as they no longer have paper vouchers but a card that is loaded with WIC benefits, similar to SNAP or debit card. Once they use their card, their receipt will show what grocery items they have left. Clients are also able to view current WIC balances at any time via the WIC Shopper App. Also, through the app they can use a barcode scanner to determine if an item is approved for their benefits before checkout.

Comprehensive and preventive health exams are offered for uninsured individuals under the age of 21. The Health Department does not treat issues, so TennCare clients are encouraged to see their assigned pediatrician.

## CHANT

CHANT is a program for children from birth to age 21, when they have special needs and the family financially unable to provide the necessary care. This program provides payment assistance and care coordination for children who meet specific eligibility criteria. The program includes speech and hearing services.



## Immunizations

Childhood and adult vaccinations are available to protect against many diseases. Children's immunizations include: Tdap (diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis), Hepatitis B Hib, pneumococcal conjugate, polio, rotavirus, MMR (measles, mumps, rubella), varicella, Hepatitis A, HPV, meningitis and COVID. Adult immunizations provided are Hepatitis B, Hep A, HPV, meningitis MMR, pneumonia, tetanus, Tdap, COVID and varicella. Flu shots are available in season for children and adults. Cost varies from no charge to sliding fee to pay in full, depending on the vaccine. Insurance holders are encouraged to receive vaccinations from their private provider, as insurance is not billed for payment.

## Adult Health

Services include immunizations, breast and cervical cancer screening and presumptive TennCare eligibility for breast and cervical cancer.

## Communicable Disease and STD Control

The Monroe County Health Department collects information on diseases in the community, investigates and monitors outbreaks. Also provided is confidential tests, treatment and partner notification for sexually transmitted diseases.

## Environmental Health

Specialists are responsible for inspecting food service establishments, hotels, motels, public swimming pools, bed and breakfast establishments, childcare facilities, organized camps, schools, plants, tattoo and body piercing establishments. Environmental specialists also investigate animal bites for possibility of rabies. The department is separate from ground water services that inspect septic tanks or test water supplies. Those services can be reached by calling 865-594-0981.

## Health Education

The Department of Health provides information on current health issues, conducts classes and partners with local schools and other community agencies. Healthy weight, youth nicotine, chronic disease classes and others are offered on a regular basis. A Diabetes Support Group meets the second Tuesday of each month at the Cora Veal Center.

## Vital Records

Birth certificates for those born in Tennessee can be provided for \$15 each. Copies of death certificates are issued upon request for \$15 each.

## Dental Clinic

The Monroe County Dental Clinic is located beside the Health Department. Its hours of operation are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Most all insurances are accepted. For more information or to schedule an appointment, call 423-442-8828.

## Sweetwater Hospital

Sweetwater Hospital Association (SHA) provides the community with a first-class hospital. The hospital's employees are dedicated professionals with some of the best facilities and equipment around.
