Let the 'big picture' help guide management at cow-calf level

The U.S. beef industry is unique in the independence of its hundreds of thousands of producers who calve out well over 31.4 million beef cows annually.

Unlike most other "protein industries" that are more vertically-integrated, cow-calf producers often like to operate apart from backgrounders, feeder operations and feed yards.

Consolidation in the beef industry is undesirable to a lot of folks, but the independent nature leads to some challenges for beef producers across all segments, said Dr. Jess Hinrichs, DVM for Zoetis.

Those challenges include the large diversity of producers, geographical diversity, lack of veterinary availability, lack of labor, transporting calves to feed yards and the reality of commingling.

"If you look at the average size of a cow-calf operation in the U.S. and compare it to the average size of the feed yards, there is a vast difference in those numbers," Hinrichs said. "Because of that, we are strictly forced to find ways to bring cattle together from many different operations in the cow-calf industry into larger feeding entities."

He asks that each cattle producer think about the ways they prepare their cattle for the next phase in the feeding out process to ultimately produce high quality products for the beef consumer.

"I'd like to talk about some ways to hopefully overcome those challenges as we move forward," Hinrichs said. "Each system operates independently at times, but we all need to work together to prepare our calves to move on to the next phase of production.

"If we handle things the right way in the beginning, they should finish the right way in the end," he added.

He identified a few areas of "influence" that help bring calves to their best potential in the next phases of production.

These include making certain each calf can reach their genetic potential regarding growth, efficiency, and carcass traits.

Hinrichs wants to see more emphasis placed on genetic potential for good health, too. The dairy industry is far ahead of the beef industry in this regard, he said.

Dairy producers keep very detailed health records, and their cattle have a narrower genetic profile compared to beef animals. That has allowed dairy producers to compare the genetics of their cows to their health records, and they've developed some tools to look at the potential health outcome based on the genetic makeup of each cow.

"That would be great if we could accomplish that in beef cattle," he said, "but we're

going to need a lot of cooperation down the road from all phases of production."

In addition to genetic evaluation improvement, Hinrichs thinks the beef industry can still improve nutrition and water availability. Improving nutrition helps cattle deal better with stress and mount a better immune response to vaccinations.

"Don't overlook the micronutrient portion of nutrition," he said. "The mineral status of our cows can greatly influence their production, their reproduction and their ability to fend off diseases that they encounter."

Finally, Hinrichs asks producers to use veterinarians to assess the risks imminent to the herd based on geography and exposure.

Certain areas of the country have endemic diseases – like anaplasmosis.

When replacement cows are added to the herd, quarantines are needed to rule out new diseases that could be brought in. In addition, when animals die on the farm, it is good to have post-mortem exams.

"When we use them as a tool to determine why animals died, and potentially influence problems early on in the disease process, it can be the most cost-effective thing we can do as producers," he said.

He also encourages producers to evaluate their vaccination program from time to time and talk with their veterinarian about how well a

vaccination program is working and the goals of the program.

To support the next phase in feeding cattle, Hinrichs said that managing reproductive issues through vaccines is the top priority in the cow herd, and then moving into the calf vaccination program. In addition to preventing respiratory diseases in calves, finding the means to prepare the calves for the next phase of production is important.

Vaccines need to be given correctly, with proper equipment and timing, and at times when cattle-calves aren't stressed by other factors. Sick animals have a very poor chance of responding well to a vaccine. Following the rules for vaccine handling and administration, as well as following Beef Quality Assurance standards needs to be a given.

Proper documentation of vaccines, and then using other tools like dewormers and implants, need to be standard operating procedures on farms today.

"Ultimately, I know everyone is looking for the same thing, the same goals," Hinrichs said. "Let's do the right thing for all of our resources, for the animals, for the environment, for the next owner in the chain and also for our customers."

Powles Ranch named Gelbvieh Commercial Producer of the Year

The Powles family has a long and rich history in the Gelbvieh breed.

The commercial cow-calf operation in the Nebraska Sandhills near Bingham, Nebraska utilizes primarily Balancer genetics to produce their own home-raised replacement females and market- topping steer calves.

Powles Ranch Partnership is the recipient of the 2021 AGA Commercial Producer of the Year award, presented during the awards banquet of the 2021 AGA National Convention and 50th anniversary celebration Dec. 10 in Oklahoma City.

Don Powles first used Gelbvieh genetics in the fall of 1972 in partnership with Phil VanDervoort. The Powles ranch was running purebred Hereford cows and a crossbred commercial herd, but VanDervoort convinced Don to use some Gelbvieh semen to breed his fall calving Hereford cows. This led to Powles Gelbvieh Ranch becoming AGA member No. 224.

Don envisioned black Gelbviehs and worked to make his vision a reality, breeding the first homozygous black, homozygous polled Gelbvieh bull, POW Black Imprint 386Z, in 1992. The family sold Gelbvieh bulls for 24 years.

Don loved selling bulls and talking to customers, especially when delivering bulls. Don was a true Gelbvieh advocate and always made time to talk cattle. He is credited with giving several kids Gelbvieh heifers to start their cowherds.

In addition to the performance genetics the operation has become known for, a legacy of service is also credited to the Powles family name. Don's wife, Gretchen, served as the American Gelbvieh Gals president. Their daughter, Jana, and son, Bryon, both served on the American Gelbvieh Junior Association board of directors, and Jana served as the American Gelbvieh Ambassador. All were involved in GAIN, the Gelbvieh Association in Nebraska.

Today, the Powles Ranch Partnership includes Jana (Powles) Jensen, her husband, JC, their children, Jada and Cameron, and Bryon and Audrey Powles. The ranching operation is a family affair. Bryon takes care of the north half of the ranch and JC the south half. Jana does all the financials and bookkeeping, while Audrey keeps cow records.

Their present mission remains simple and true to the heart of the beef industry.

"We are strictly commercial cattlemen converting grass to beef," Jana said. "Our goal is to be able to retain our own heifers for replacements, while raising steer calves that perform well in the feedlot. We are a low-input operation that puts a lot of emphasis on cow production and efficiency, which includes running moderately framed cows."

Gelbvieh and Balancer genetics have been an essential element of the Powles Ranch

Partnership throughout its 49-year history.

"Gelbvieh and Balancer have been a great fit for our environment," Bryon said. "We like the hybrid vigor and the additional growth and performance that we get. We like the balance of growth combined with the great females we keep as replacements."

The AGA Commercial Producer of the Year Award honors individuals who use Gelbvieh and Balancer genetics in progressive commercial cattle operations and are proactive in their promotion of the breed. The award was presented to the Powles family by Scott Starr, Cedar Top Ranch, Stapleton, Nebraska.

Grazing on solar sites can enhance value, Center for Rural Affairs report says

As solar projects across the nation continue to expand, solar grazing has emerged as a valuable tool, according to a new fact sheet recently released by the Center for Rural Affairs.

"Using livestock to manage vegetation at solar sites can enhance site value by keeping land in agricultural use, providing new income streams for local farmers, and adding environmental benefits such as decreased erosion and enhanced soil health," said Heidi Kolbeck-Urlacher, senior policy associate for the center.

Solar grazing is the use of livestock, usually sheep, to manage vegetation at solar sites. It takes the place of traditional mowing, offering numerous environmental and financial benefits and meeting clean energy and agricultural goals simultaneously.

Solar grazing is considered a form of agrivoltaics, which is a term used to describe combining agriculture with renewable energy. Other types of agrivoltaics include producing hay, berries, vegetables, and honey at solar sites.

"Making the Case for Solar Grazing" addresses the economics and environmental benefits of solar grazing, offers steps for the planning process, what developers and farmers should consider when developing a contract, the appropriate seed mixes to consider, and recommendations to policymakers that incentivize beneficial practices.

Kolbeck-Urlacher said for project developers, contracting with local farmers to use solar grazing as a management tool can reduce operations and maintenance costs.

"Including solar grazing as a goal in the beginning stages of project planning will allow developers to tailor sites for optimal grazing management," she said. "Solar grazing is most successful when deployed as part of a strategic, rotational grazing plan."

Old, untended barbed wire fencing presents dangers

For many years, barbed wire has been a staple helping ranchers keep their livestock in. You can see the fencing for miles and miles when you drive through rural America. But what happens when barbed wire is left abandoned and unattended?

It becomes dangerous.

Animals can become entangled and suffer cuts that may lead to an infection. Cattle could ingest a piece of wire, causing hardware disease – a serious issue in their intestines and stomach. People risk getting scrapes and cuts that lead to tetanus.

Bekaert Fence Pro Van Medley had a personal example of the dangers to tell.

“We received a horse that got damaged fence wrapped around its hoof,” Medley said. “Still rideable, but it injured the tendons in its lower leg and made the horse lame.”

That is why proactive fence maintenance and the proper disposal of old barbed wire are vital. Medley shares ways you can do both to keep animals and humans safe.

When to do fence maintenance

Medley encourages producers to check their barbed wire fences multiple times a year.

“I ride my fence line every time I move cattle,” Medley said. “So two to three times a year for general maintenance. Then if a storm moves through, I’ll do a ride through after to see if there was any damage to the fence.”

So what exactly do you need to look for when checking fence?

“Watch your braces and connections at posts,” Medley said. “If you start getting slack in your lines or broken/damaged sections of fence, you need to do maintenance or replacement depending on the age of the fence. Also, check for posts starting to rot or damage in the wire.”

If a repair needs to be made, Medley recommends Gripple wire joiners: “They can splice wire back together really quick, and you don’t have to worry about getting cut or scratched. Plus, they’re a long-lasting fix.”

Disposing old fencing materials properly

When old fencing materials are ready to be disposed of, Medley encourages people to take their old wire to their local scrapyards.

“We haul it to a metal yard where they can cut it up and melt it down,” Medley said. “It’s the best option. In a landfill, the wire is going to last a long time and could pose ongoing risks.”

Medley discourages two disposal methods: piling it up and burying it.

“I know some people pile it up with the intention of hauling it off later,” Medley said. “But it’s one of those if you wait, do you get back to it?”

Other risks of leaving untended wire are potential harm to curious kids and equipment damage.

“If you get it tangled in a cutter or in a tractor it can be a real problem,” Medley said. “That will cost you quite a bit of money if it gets entangled in equipment and busts a gear box.”

Hiring fence removal

But what if you work an 8 to 5 job and are struggling to find time to remove old fence on your property? Or you inherited some land with old, untended barbed wire on it. What can you do?

“If you’re limited on time, you can get contractors to come in and take out the old fence,” Medley said. “The great thing about doing that is they often have equipment and they can level up the ground once the fence is removed. A general handyman can come in and do this as well.”

Another option is to put up new fencing

and take the old out later.

“If you are constrained on time, you can go ahead and build a new fence over a couple feet from the old,” Medley said. “It can be challenging to put the new fence up working around the old, but then you can take the old fence out at a later date. Turn it into a two weekend job. Just make sure your braces are still in great condition as braces are the backbone of your fence project.”

Hoof Care: Q&A with a farrier

from Valley Vet Supply

We sat down with longtime horse farrier John McGuire to discuss all things hoof care and a few insider tips.

John, you're a horseman yourself. Tell us more.

"I've been team roping forever, about 30-plus years. I got lucky last weekend and won four out of five ropings we were entered in and took home four buckles and a .45 pistol."

How many years have you been shoeing and trimming horses?

"Twenty-eight years."

Personally, how do you keep up your own horse's hooves?

"I use a hoof conditioner or moisturizer on my horse every day. I'm a firm believer in hoof products like Rain Maker and Hoof Flex and Horseshoer's Secret. When people say, 'I have a can of that,' I say well, you should have an empty can of that. You can't lie to a horseshoer. We can tell if you've been using it. It doesn't do any good in the can."

Let's talk about hoof care FAQs. First, how often should horses be trimmed or shod?

"A good rule of thumb is to trim or shoe a horse every six to eight weeks. Keep in mind, though, a horse's hooves can grow at different rates depending on the time of year, and different horses may experience different rates of hoof growth."

When do you know if a horse needs shoes or not?

"Well, it depends. Personally, I think if a horse can go barefoot, barefooted is always best. But some horses need shoes on them. For example, I have a good heading horse who always has to have shoes on him. My mare has super-good feet. She's so tough, she could run across rocks. If she couldn't take being barefooted, I'd have shoes on her this afternoon. Horse owners also need to consider conditions both at home and when traveling, such as concrete and gravel which can make horses more tender-footed."

Do you have customers that use hoof boots?

"I do have a lot of people that travel with them. They help, especially if horses have extended periods of time standing on hard surfaces like concrete."

Have you shod any horses with glue-on shoes?

"I shoe a lot of horses with these, especially barrel horses. If you get the hoof clean and put the shoes on correctly, it's unbelievable how well they stay on."

Are any of your customers proponents of hoof supplements for horses?

"I have several clients who use hoof supplements, and for those horses lacking in certain minerals that promote healthy hooves, you can really see a difference when they're put on a supplement."

What causes hoof cracks?

"To me, there are three main factors that can cause hoof cracks, beginning with the weather. When it's really dry, a horse's hooves are more likely to split. The horse's genetics also plays a role here, and especially important is the overall maintenance of his hooves. If you let your horse go real long, split or break off, his hooves will have a greater potential to crack, especially during dry weather."

"To me, using hoof conditioners will help prevent hoof cracks more than anything – that along with regular trimming and hoof care maintenance from your farrier every six to eight weeks, based on the horse's hoof growth and individual needs."

What is thrush?

"Thrush is a bacterial infection of the frog of the hoof and surrounding area of the

hoof. You'll notice a black, almost syrupy discharge, and you'll be able to smell it. You have got to get the hoof dried out, cleaned out and removed of any moisture.

"I recommend using Thrush Buster. It works well, but like I said earlier, you need to get it out of the can. Horses with thrush can become really sore and tender-footed. If not treated, the condition can be drastic. When it's wet, especially during the springtime and fall, this can become a real headache for people. I've seen a lot of horses with it."

What is white line disease?

"Although the technical term is white line disease, I really think of it more like a slight founder. The white line is considered the area between the hoof wall and where it meets the sole. If it becomes damaged, bacteria can cause the layers of the hoof wall to separate. What's worse is that the infection spreads inside the wall and eats away at the hoof. You have to cut away the affected hoof and hope he stays sound."

Is there a common hoof problem you're seeing lately?

"A lot of horses nowadays are thin-walled, and they don't have enough foot to nail to. When a horse becomes sore, it's often thought to be the hocks or stifle, but the majority of the time, it goes back to the foot. A lot of horse owners want a little, pretty foot, and I'm just the opposite."
