Proper hay storage important for winter

Almost equally as important as getting hay put up for winter in the Central Plains is the proper storage of this livestock feed.

The best economic return and keeping bales at their best quality, yield and taste for cattle depends on how the bales are stored. There can be a significant amount of waste for this labor-intensive crop, depending on how it's stored. Unprotected hay stored outside is at the mercy of the elements, but covered bales suffer loss as well. The least amount of loss occurs with hay stored in a barn or hayshed.

Stacking hay property can help curb losses. Specialists gave recommendations for storing big round bales and square bales.

Large round bales

Large round bales should be placed end-to-end and in rows to minimize the exposure of the open bale face to the elements.

"If bales are not stacked tightly against each other, rain will penetrate the ends and increase damage," said Dale Blasi, Ph.D., Extension Beef Specialist at Kansas State University.

Then, it's recommended to stack bales with at least 3-5 feet of spacing between rows. This allosws sufficient air movement.

Blasi also advises positioning large round bales on a well-drained site. A gently sloping site with a southern or southeastern exposure can provide the greatest drying from the sun.

Rows should be oriented in a northto-south direction. That allows faster drying after a rain with good sunlight and air flow.

Another suggestion is to put palettes down to get bales off the ground. Others put a layer of rock down. With something beneath, moisture gets pulled away from the bale as opposed to letting the bale sit on wet soil.

Square bales

Square bales tend to soak up more water while round bales shed water. It's better if square bales are put in a shed, unless you're in an area that doesn't get a lot of rain.

"For eastern Nebraska, and areas where you have more rain it would benefit to have storage for square bales, because if they get rained on you lose some nutrients," said Randy Saner, Nebraska Extension Beef Educator located in North Platte.

For farmers in a drier climate square bales will shed enough water if stacked appropriately, Saner added.

Stacking is the best way to store square bales. To increase airflow, it's

next goes the opposite direction, then back to the long way. Continuing the pattern makes for a stronger stack. Otherwise, the same gaps would show up everywhere and they could topple over.

Saner advices stacking the squares on their cut sides with the first tier touching the surface in such a way that the baling twine does not touch the floor. If twine is lying on the ground it could rot All subsequent layers can then be stacked flat with the baling twine facing up.

Although the outside squares in the stack may get some moisture, the inside bales will stay dry if they're stacked well. Farmers could also cover the very top layer with a tarp to keep moisture out, and place a couple of tires or bales on top to hold the tarp

couple of tires or bales on top to hold the tarp down.

Proper stacking equals yield, money
Farmers put a lot of money into
growing and baling hay, but once
they put up hay too often they
forget about how they stacked
it, experts said. Some may
leave large round bales on the
side of the field where they're
underneath trees. Those
bales that are shaded from
the sun stay wet once they
get wet.

"If you do the geometry, many producers do not recognize that with a 6-foot diameter large round bale, more than one-third the weight of a bale can be found in the outer six inches and 50% of the volume is in the outer 12 inches," Blasi said.

The outer third of the bale is where it would soak in the rain. Round bales stored unprotected commonly lose up to 4 inches to be weather.

A dense bale will sag less, have less surface area in contact with the ground, shed more precipitation and protect the inner bale from weathering. The density of round bales should be at least 10 pounds of hay per cubic foot, Blasi said.

There's also the question of how to secure bales. Net wrap appears to shed water more effectively than twine, Blasi said, although twine is a viable option, too.

recommended that the very bottom layer of bales be stacked on palettes. That gets them off the ground so they don't wick moisture.

The main priority is to put square bales in a square stack, and alternate stacking so they don't topple over. Turn them so that one is facing the long way, then the

Prussic Acid And Frost

With a warmer than usual fall so far, we've been able to graze later in the year with few concerns. However, cold temperatures are not far off and with our first freezes of the year comes the risk of prussic acid in sorghum species.

When temperatures drop, freeze damaged members of the sorghum family, including Sudan grass, sorghum-Sudan hybrids, forage sorghum, or grain sorghum (milo) releases a toxic cyanide compound we know as prussic acid. Plants like pearl and foxtail millet that are not of the sorghum family don't carry this risk. If digested, prussic acid interferes with the blood's ability to transport oxygen, often resulting in death.

While deadly, prussic acid doesn't stick around for long. After five to seven days, the toxin has dissipated enough that forages are once again safe to graze. However, this doesn't mean the danger is over. Every time a new part of the plant receives damage from a frost, our timer must again be reset. This continues until the entire plant has been killed by frost.

So how do we stay safe? Pull animals from sorghum before a frost and keep them off for the five to seven days. Prussic acid also accumulates in new growth, so keep an eye out for new shoots and consider pulling animals until they reach 15-18 inches in height, or the plant dies.



Since prussic acid dissipates from dead tissues, haying sorghums won't be a concern, as long as moisture content is low enough. If harvesting for silage is an option, the proper ensiling will reduce prussic acid to safe levels.

Prussic acid is a real risk, but one easily dealt with by proper management. Don't graze sorghums five to seven days after each frost until the entire plant is killed, and keep an eye out for equally dangerous new shoots. If this prevents grazing from being an option, consider having or silage as safe solutions.

Reducing yucca in rangeland

Yucca plants, which are also called soapweed, can be quite common on rangeland in western and central Nebraska. In some areas, they can be quite thick and significantly reduce grass production. There are ways, though, to reclaim those grazing lands.

Once established, yucca plants can increase on drier rangeland sites. They produce a deep taproot that competes aggressively for the limited water in these soils. With sharp leaves protecting the plant, cattle rarely eat it during summer.

Herbicides such as Remedy, Tordon, Velpar or Cimarron Plus can control yucca, but only when each individual plant is sprayed directly. General broadcast spraying to control yucca on rangeland is cost prohibitive, although small patches can and should be controlled before they expand. Herbicides are most effective when applied in spring or summer.

When yucca covers too much land to spray, the only cost effective way to reduce its impact is to winter graze During winter, yucca often is the only green plant around. Sometimes cows actually will get down on their knees, lay their head sideways on the ground, and chew through the base of the plant to get to the moist, tender parts.

It has been observed though, that it can take some time for animals to learn to graze yucca and there may be some animals in the herd that will not graze it while others can be quite proficient. After several consecutive winters of grazing, yucca stands can be reduced so grass again thrives during summer.

Now that summer range is going dormant for the winter, grazing will do little harm to your grasses. This might be a good year to reclaim some of your rangeland back from yucca. Winter grazing is your best tool.

Fall irrigation on alflafa By Brad Schick Nebraska Extension

There have been many stressors on alfalfa fields this year, from early weevils to drought and hail and now fall armyworms and cutworms. Can fall irrigation help with stand stress?

For irrigated alfalfa, targeted fall irrigation may help the long-term strength of the stand. Although alfalfa is drought tolerant with its deep roots, it uses a lot of water. With warmer than normal projections for the fall, alfalfa will continue to grow and use water, depleting the soil profile.

Additionally, some moisture on the surface is necessary to prevent the roots from drying out and dying over the winter. With a full soil moisture profile headed into winter, soil temperature is better regulated, helping keep plants alive during the winter and initiating growth better in the spring.

Late season irrigation occurs during a time when evaporation is very low. This means little of what we supply will be lost, with most going to late season growth or filling the soil profile for strong spring growth.

In many alfalfa fields, the water supplied during the growing season may never reach beyond 4 feet, when the roots go down 8 feet. By padding the profile now, extra water will help plants better deal with stress during high heat and high water demands next summer.

Alfalfa fields that have soils with low infiltration rates may not be able to absorb enough water during peak use periods of the year, even when supplemented with irrigation. Having a full profile going into next year for these fields to start out ahead instead of playing catch-up is one more reason for fall irrigation if available.

Watering dry alfalfa fields in the fall will help recharge water in the soil profile, combat winter stress, and start plants growing strong during the spring of a dry year.

Nebraska to change how it handles branding law citations

The state of Nebraska is allowing some cattle brand violators to handle citations like they might a traffic ticket, giving them the option of paying the fee instead of appearing in court.

The so-called waivable citation is part of Legislative Bill 572, which becomes effective Nov. 1.

Also like handling a traffic ticket, if you believe the citation was given erroneously the complainant has the right to appear in the county court where the violation was issued. A date will be set, and the case will be heard before a judge.

Waivable citations will be used for several situations including sale, slaughter or disposal of a live animal or carcass without inspections; transportation of live animals without proper documentation inside the brand area; or movement of livestock outside the brand area without inspection.

The infractions will be issued only by law enforcement staff. The investigator can fine per offence or as a whole based on the situation. If an infraction is observed during a routine inspection, the inspector files a violation form with the investigator in that area that allows them to then research the situation before creating a citation.

Per the statue, the fine shall not exceed \$200 per head for each offense.

The most commonly reported violations are sales without inspection, according to a press release from the Nebraska Brand Committee. That includes such standard transactions as neighbors selling to neighbors without the brand being inspected.

These citations are expected to replace a large portion of the current violation forms that are filled out by the investigators, according to the committee. Those forms are submitted to county attorneys, who decide to take on the case or not.

Auctions for farmland generate premium prices

The land market, especially for tillable, revenue-generating land, is still growing strong and there doesn't seem to be an end to the magic beanstalk-like growth.

"It's kind of unnerving," said Joe Gizdic, director of auction services for Whitetail Properties Real Estate out of Illinois. "I don't know when the merry-goround is going to stop."

A little over a year ago, land prices began to climb. They are still climbing

and still getting stronger. According to Gizdic, over the last 12 months land sale prices have increased 20%.

With interest rates this low and commodity prices so high, he said tillable land has been at a premium, particularly at auctions. Because of competitive bidding, auctions are the most popular way for selling farms, as they tend to generate higher prices – sometimes even above market value.

"I guess if interest rates shoot up and commodity prices drop significantly it would put the brakes on," Gizdic said. "Some sellers are scared that they are in a glut."

Auctions also create excitement in the local market and often can reduce the time a property is on the market. An upcoming example is the Frager Farms auction scheduled for 6 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 27. Frager Farms is located in Washington County, Kansas, which is in north central Kansas near the Nebraska border.

Due to the interest in the land, Whitetail is holding the auction just south of Fairbury, Nebraska, at the 4-H Building on the Jefferson County Fairgrounds. The larger venue also provides wifi and better cellular reception, Gizdic said.

The auction will be conducted live and online.

"We take live bids, phone bids and online bids. We're not chasing anybody away," he said.

Frager Farms has five separate tracts, totaling 1,934 acres and ranging from 155.5 acres to 618.1 acres. While located in dryland farm country, these tracts consist of highly productive, mostly irrigated farmland, Gizdic said.

Anyone wishing to visit the tracts in person can do so by contacting the local Whitetail agent Steve Schaeffer. They can also view information about the tracts at Ranchandfarmauctions.com. Gizdic said the water rights summary, equipment reports and other pertinent reports are available on the Ranch & Farm Auction page. Online bidding is also available on Ranchandfarmauctions.com.




