Ranchers seek answers as cattle prices crash

Amidst a nationwide pandemic of fast-spreading coronavirus, cattle producers experienced some panic of their own as they watched prices crash.



The price producers get for their cattle at the sale barn is down, but the wholesale cost of beef is up, and cattle producers said that's cause for concern—especially at a time they're looking to sell fat cattle to make room for newborn calves.

Dennis and Bryan Hanson saw it play out as owners of Fort Pierre Livestock Auction in central South Dakota. After considering the price they paid for the cattle, the feed and work that went into raising them, producers hoping to make a profit lost money when they sold at auction.

Cattle prices dropped significantly the week of March 16 as coronavirus-related cancellations, closures and isolation measures gripped the nation.

People were stocking up on beef and other food, and over a three-day period, boxed beef prices increased by \$40. Dennis Hanson compared it to prices of hand sanitizer and bottled water that went up in light of panic buying spurred by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Common sense says it should translate to good profits for those raising cattle, Dennis Hanson said.

"These guys with fat cattle to sell should have a spike in their market, but it's the opposite," he said over the phone March 19.

From what he's heard at the sale barn, Bryan Hanson said producers were losing \$300 to \$400 per head.

Low prices come in the middle of a three-month span when fat cattle prices are usually high. It's also a time when farmers are preparing to renew operating loans. The loss of revenue is not easily absorbed.

Many ranching families are on the brink of going under, said Sen. Mike Rounds, R-S.D., during a media call Thursday, March 19, as he announced new legislation that includes financial help for cattle producers in a COVID-19 response bill. This came after several cattle groups, including Nebraska Cattlemen, called on Washington delegates to provide relief and investigate meat packing companies.

"Because of the rapidly increasing spread between boxed beef prices and live cattle prices over the past week, our first priority is to demand USDA increase monitoring of price action and buyer behavior at the feedlot-packer interface and take swift action if undue price manipulation is discovered," Nebraska Cattlemen President Ken Herz said in a news release. "We are also pursuing a one-time 'beef stimulus' payment for cattlemen and women that have dealt

with rapid market declines and continued extreme volatility."

Under Rounds' plan, ranchers would be compensated for the gap in prices. Losses would be figured by comparing monthly average cattle prices to 2020 projections from the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Others have suggested using a formula based on prices from January — before COVID-19 erupted and started affecting markets. Some suggested a one-time perhead payment.

"There's no doubt that our cattle producers are suffering as a direct result of the COVID-19 outbreak," Rounds said. "They need relief. We want to make sure that we find a way to address this situation before we start losing these producers."

Bryan Hanson said cattle producers would rather have a fair market than a government handout. That's where Rounds is hoping the payment can provide some relief, while his other proposals work toward long-term solutions.

The senator is supporting country of origin labeling and requesting the Department of Justice investigate whether packers are breaking any pricing laws.

"These margins just don't make any sense. We just want to know why," he said

Eric Jennings raises cattle in the foothills of the Black Hills and serves as president of the South Dakota Cattlemen's Association. He's not holding his breath for an investigation into packers turning up anything substantial. When authorities have looked into prices in the past, there's always something to explain the market distortion, he said. Here, it was a case of high demand for meat and full feedlots, giving packers no trouble when it came to procuring cattle to meet demand.

"The packers are in a very good position right now," Jennings said.

He's more worried about the futures markets and the way it pulled the cash market down when futures contracts started dropping. It should be the cash market that influences futures, he said.

Jennings supports offering compensation to cattle producers in light of the current market disruption, but he said creating a livestock insurance program similar to crop insurance could be a better long-term solution.

"That would also take the government out of the disaster payment business," he said.

While producers look to Washington for some relief, Jennings reminded people to continue to check on neighbors and family and care for their own mental health, as well.

"These are pretty tough times," he said. "It's very stressful for people."

What technology can't do for cattle

I don't think much about cattle waterers, or how they've changed over the years.

Perhaps I don't go there because I'm trying to block out the memories. Growing up, it sure felt like I spent a lot of time unfreezing them on the most bitterly cold days a Minnesota winter could offer.

Then there was that cow-calf pair, drylotted for some reason I can't recall now, in a pen with a big tub and a hose I had to drag back and forth. That's when I learned how much those mamas can drink in a day. For a young girl with no patience, a 30- to 40-gallon fill seemed to take an eternity.

But earlier this year I heard a friend say to a group of cattlemen, "I would argue that automated waterers have done more to reduce stockmanship than anything." He learned to identify sick animals while waiting for the tank to fill.

That stuck with me.

I am a huge fan of technology and making things easier when we can, so every time I learn of ideas in development that will change the way we monitor and care for our animals, I get excited.

I'm talking temperature-taking ear tags or the equivalent of Fitbits for cattle, gathering activity data to predict health trends. There are cameras that allow for observation from the comfort of your living room. In many cases, we may be a long way from wide-scale use in practical production scenarios, but there are people inventing and implementing new innovations all the

But that comment about waterers? It's a good reminder: nothing can replace the human side of stockmanship. Those tools are supposed to be used in tandem with a careful caretaker.

We need to watch, to make sure the data is correct, to make sure the technology is working and to employ intuition and empathy that Siri-like artificial intelligence

When I was driving the yard with a Kansas cattle feeder last year, he said, "The cattle will always tell you what they need. The problem is that the business is so fast, we don't always have time to stop and see what they are asking for."

In an era when each animal is worth

so much, when we know consumers are looking to us to keep doing better, we must keep that stockmanship core at the heart of what we do each day.

Health impacts efficiency, quality and profit. Cattlemen trying to reach the highest quality beef grades aim for the ideal that their cattle "never have a bad day."

That's a tall task, and it means using all the tools at your disposal...including your own powers of observation.

Of course, I wouldn't trade an automatic waterer for a more labor-intensive option. But a little extra attention to the critters in our charge? I'll advocate for that all day





Minimizing antibiotic resistance in beef cattle

K-State experts discuss proper use of antibiotics in a treatment protocol

MANHATTAN, Kan. — Remember going to the doctor when you were a kid and you left after receiving a shot to cure your ailments? Contrast that to today when patients often are told that it is just a virus and they leave the office with nothing but a prescription for rest. One reason for the change of treatment protocol is addressing antibiotic resistance.

Veterinarians are also building treatment plans for livestock with that in mind, in part because of the vast number of antibiotics that are also used for humans.

"Antibiotic resistance is real," said Mike Apley, K-State professor of production medicine and clinical pharmacology in the College of Veterinary Medicine. Apley spoke with fellow veterinarian Brad White on a recent Beef Cattle Institute podcast.

"The last time a new family of antibiotics was introduced in food animals was in 1978," Apley said. "We've had new members of those families since then, but we are probably not going to get more."

Apley has seen some pathogen resistance to those antibiotics, especially in respiratory diseases where it is common practice to give a long-acting treatment.

"You expect 70-80% of the (animals) you treat to respond and not need further intervention, but that is allowing them a 5-7-day interval to respond to the initial treatment," Apley said. He also said that respiratory disease in calves may result in a 5-10% death loss in those previously treated.

He advised producers to evaluate the herd sickness and if a large percentage of the calves are ill, then it is time to reassess the treatment protocol. Apley said there are two main factors he considers when he is consulted regarding a disease outbreak.

"First is the treatment success rate and the second is the case fatality rate," Apley said, noting that producers should keep good records of treatments they give to animals so that they more clearly understand what is happening.

"It is easy to want to switch drugs when I feel that things aren't going well; however, if I start changing drugs frequently, that will impact my ability to accurately evaluate those records," White said.

Apley added: "When things are at their worst, by definition, they are going to get better. When you switch things up in the middle you tend to give credit to what you switched to."

The veterinarians stressed that using those treatments appropriately was best for both livestock and people.

"For antibiotics that are important for human use, we are under pressure to limit their use in animals," White said. "The challenge is that the drugs used for

livestock are also members of the families used for humans.'

Apley estimates that about 10 drugs used to treat livestock are not used by people. He said one class of antibiotics, ionophores, are primarily livestock focused.

White offered advice to producers: "When you are using antibiotics on the farm, you want to make sure you are

using them appropriately and one of the best ways to do that is to have a treatment protocol in place. You need to understand what you are treating and why you are treating it."

Antibiotic treatment for scours in calves

MANHATTAN, Kan. — Just as cold and flu season hits the country, seasonal sickness can also be found in young calves during the winter months. One of those main illnesses is scours. Signs of this disease include watery stools, a decreased desire to nurse and overall

For many, a common question is whether or not antibiotics should be included in the treatment strategy. Kansas State University veterinarians Bob Larson, Brad White and Mike Apley discussed this topic on a recent Beef Cattle Institute podcast at https://ksubci.org/.

"A lot of these calves really don't need antibiotics if a virus or parasite is causing the diarrhea." Larson said.

"Often what is actually causing the scours is a virus, which the antibiotics won't affect," he added. "But the virus damages the gut wall so that the calf is more likely to have a secondary

infection in the bloodstream due to bacteria that is commonly found in the gut." While antibiotics may be part of the scours treatment protocol in debilitated calves, it is not the only treatment option needed, according to Apley.

"About 30% of the calves with scours will end up with bacteria in their blood," he said. "An antibiotic might be part of the treatment, but if the calves are lying flat then there are hydration and blood acid/base problems and those calves will need intravenous fluids. The antibiotic alone will not be sufficient." "Work with your veterinarian to find out the right diagnosis and know what the pathogen challenge is. If you have a history of cases that aren't responding well then it is time to do further testing to isolate the pathogen in the lab and match it to the appropriate treatment."

Grass-Cast: A precision ag tool for livestock owners

Up until recently, most precision ag tools have been for those producing crops, but a coordinated effort with several groups has resulted in a precision ag forecasting tool that will help cattle producers predict the forage production on their range or grasslands.

Grass-Cast, a grassland productivity forecast, uses relationships between historical weather and grassland production. It combines current weather data and seasonal climate outlooks from the NOAA Climate Prediction Center with a well-trusted grassland model to predict total biomass in pounds per acre for individual counties, compared to their 38-year average, according to Bill Parton, the lead researcher at Colorado State University.

Parton has found that precipitation data can be used to estimate actual

evapotranspiration (iAET), which correlates well with the vegetative growth index (iNDVI). The iNDVI, in turn, is a predictor of above-ground primary productivity (ANPP) – a measure of plant biomass.

By using this tool, Parton's research team combines observed daily precipitation with seasonal precipitation outlooks from NOAA's National Weather Service-Climate Prediction Center to predict iAET. The final steps involves transforming the predicted iAET into iNDVI and then into ANPP for the growing season.

The resulting grassland productivity forecast map, or Grass-Cast, shows forage production forecasts for 382 individual counties in the Great Plains region. The map actually reports the average of 10 different ANPP forecasts based on various combinations of recent weather data and seasonal precipitation outlooks.

It is an optional tool that managers can use to form an educated guess about the upcoming growing season.

It can also help inform the design of proactive drought management plans, trigger dates, stocking dates and grazing rotations, according to those who have put the tool into practice. In short, it helps producers in the Great

Plains reduce the uncertainty of this important economic source – forage production.

Forecast maps

Grass-Cast provides three maps for ranchers and rangeland managers to consider. The maps show how well rangeland vegetation is expected to grow if precipitation during the rest of the growing season (through July 31) is above-average; how well rangeland vegetation should grow if precipitation during the rest of the season is nearnormal; and how well vegetation should grow if precipitation is below-average.

Below the maps, a statement indicates if the maps are equally likely, or if one map is thought to be more likely than the others, based on NOAA's Seasonal Precipitation Outlook. Within an individual map, each county is assigned a

color, which indicates whether rangeland vegetation is expected to be certain percent higher or lower than that county's 34-year history.

Not the complete answer

Producers should not rely on Grass-Cast as a sole source for making management decisions, nor should they look at Grass-Cast just once during the growing season. The accuracy of Grass-


Cast improves with time as the growing season unfolds. Ideally it should be consulted every two weeks when it is updated with newly observed weather data

Additionally, Grass-Cast should not be used as a sole source of information for things such as setting stocking rates, determining turnout dates, or other aspects of lease agreements, allotments or permits.

In addition to Parton, those who


