The risks of offering wrapped hay bales to cattle

K-State beef cattle experts explain why cows need to be fed hay free of wrapping material

When driving the countryside, it is easy to spot big, round hay bales that are wrapped in plastic and ready to be fed to cattle.

When it is time to feed the bale, some producers put the hay with the wrap on in a grinder and chop it up together, while others choose to remove the wrap before offering free choice hay to the herd.

Which way is best for the cows?

That is a question that the experts at Kansas State University's Beef Cattle Institute answered on a recent Cattle Chat podcast.

The question came from a producer who discovered that one of his cows who died had a ball of plastic in her gut that likely came from eating the bale wrap and caused her to have a blockage that ultimately led to her death.

"Even chopped plastic can form a ball in a cow's gut that will accumulate over time and can in some cases lead her to die," K-State veterinarian Bob Larson said.

This has to do with how feed moves through the rumen, which is a chamber in the cow's stomach, K-State beef cattle nutritionist Phillip Lancaster said.

He shares that as the feed passes through the rumen in the normal digestion process of a beef animal, there is a liquid layer that the feed must sink through to get to the next chamber – the reticulum.

"The particles have to be dense enough to sink into the reticulum, but plastic pieces are very light so they

float and can accumulate in the rumen over time," Lancaster said.

He added that death can happen when the plastic ball

acts like a plug either preventing gas release or passage down the digestive tract.

Eating chopped plastic is a greater challenge for cows than for cattle on feed because of the years of a cow's life versus that of a feedlot steer, Lancaster said.

"A greater percentage of a cow's diet is hay, and she is consuming it over a lifetime compared to a steer who only has about 10% of his diet as hay and he is only in the feedyard for about five months before being processed," Lancaster said.

With that in mind, the experts agree that the best strategy for the herd is to remove all plastic wrap before offering the hay to the herd.

Along with the lessened risk of digestive issues, K-State Brian Lubbers added that removing the wrap is also physically safer for the cattle.

"That wrap can get stomped in the mud and get tangled around their legs, which in some cases leads to lameness for the animal," Lubbers said.

Beef a big focus in Nebraska's Czech Republic, German trade mission

This week, as Gov. Jim Pillen and state leaders embark on a diplomatic and trade mission to the Czech Republic and Germany, agricultural products, particularly beef, will be a focus.

In 2023, Nebraska exported \$111 million of beef to the European Union—more than any other U.S. state.

The mission will take place from Nov. 7-14 with a delegation that includes representatives from the Nebraska Department of Agriculture (NDA), Nebraska Department of Economic Development (DED), Nebraska National Guard, the University of Nebraska, the state's agriculture and banking industries, and the ag tech sector.

"European consumers place a high value on sustainability," Pillen said in a news release announcing the trip.

"Nebraska's low-carbon production of food, feed, and fuel can help meet this demand. We are excited to showcase our state's precision ag technologies and leadership in animal agriculture while in Czechia and Germany."

In the Czech Republic, Nebraska's delegation will meet with the national government's ministries of agriculture and foreign affairs, military leaders, and Czech agribusinesses. The goal of the mission is to deepen existing military, commercial and educational partnerships. The state will also explore opportunities for agricultural research collaboration, particularly in livestock production.

Nebraska has longstanding cultural ties to the Czech Republic. From the mid-1850s to the 1910s, an estimated 50,000

Czechs settled in Nebraska. By the early 20th century, Nebraska had welcomed more Czech immigrants, per capita, than any other state. To honor this heritage, Gov. Pillen signed LB 140 into law this year, creating Czech Heritage license plates.

Nebraska's National Guard has a 30-plus year partnership with the Armed Forces of the Czech Republic through the U.S. European Command State Partnership Program. Since 1993, the partners have cooperated on more than 300 engagements, such as joint training exercises and military expertise exchanges.

In Germany, Nebraska's delegation will recruit investment into the state's bioeconomy, meet with leaders of German state governments, and take part in

EuroTier, the largest international trade show for animal agriculture. Pillen will give the keynote address at EuroTier's International Cattle & Pig Event Nov. 11.

The state delegation will also meet with German companies doing business in Nebraska.

"German businesses are renowned for their manufacturing prowess," said DED Director K.C. Belitz. "Nebraska's world-class workforce, central location, and strengths in transportation and logistics are strong selling points as we invite manufacturers to locate or expand in our state."

Bayer, CLAAS, Continental, Evonik, and Graepel, and Siemens are among the German companies with significant operations in the Cornhusker State.

Nebraska breeder amongst new leadership elected to Angus board

Danny Poss, a first-generation Angus breeder and lifelong resident of Scotia, Nebraska was one of five newly elected members to the American Angus Association board of directors, along with Ron Hinrichsen of Westmoreland, Kansas.

Poss grew up on a diversified, family farming operation. The early foundation of the family's commercial cattle operation was established by his parents, Melvin and Elizabeth.

In 1985, as a sophomore in high school, Poss purchased his first registered Angus heifer. He attended the University of Nebraska-Lincoln where he majored in animal science. After graduating from college, Poss returned home to the family operation and began growing his Angus cow herd, while working with his parents on their farming operation. That same year, 1993, he sold his first three bulls privately.

In 2005, Poss purchased his own ground and continued to help his dad farm. Sadly, in February 2012, Poss lost his dad to brain cancer. In 2017, he and his wife Kristi moved the bull sale to their ranch in Scotia. Today, with the help of their boys, they market more than 300 bulls a year. To Danny and Kristi's 30 years of marriage, they have four children: Nolan, Nathan, Neleigh and Natalie.

Ron Hinrichsen, Kansas

Hinrichsen has been involved in multiple sectors of the beef cattle industry throughout his professional career and is a third-generation Angus breeder.

He and his wife, Lynne, established R&L Angus-Hinrichsen Ranch in the Flint Hills of Kansas upon graduating from Kansas State University. While raising high-quality cattle, they have focused on bringing in

the fourth generation, their children Cale and Eva, to continue the legacy they have established.

They raise cattle to fit the environment and sell bulls to commercial cattlemen based on their needs. With another family, they host an annual bull sale in the spring. Angus Herd Improvement Records, ultrasound data and genomic testing are used to continually improve the predictability of their cattle.

Along with the cattle operation, Hinrichsen's professional career started in semen sales and later moved into animal health sales. Today he works for Boehringer Ingelheim as a senior territory manager.

Hinrichsen has played an active role in the Kansas Angus Association, serving on the board and as president and junior advisor. Other leadership roles have included serving as the American Royal beef superintendent for 20 years, as the Kansas State Fair board president, and on the Kansas Livestock Association and National Cattlemen's Beef Association animal health committees.

Convention in Texas

The two cattlemen are new faces on the American Angus Association board, along with Mark Johnson, a lifelong cattleman from Orlando, Oklahoma. Two others were elected to their second term: Paul Bennett of Red House, Virginia, and John Dickinson of Auburn, California.

The board and new officers were announced at the 141st annual convention of delegates Nov. 4 in Fort Worth, Texas.

Jonathan Perry of Fayetteville, Tennessee will serve as president and chairman of the board.

"We have got to continue to make the American Angus Association relevant to its breeders and its members," he said in a news release. "We have got to embrace diversity. We have got to continue to create tools that touch every member. The diversity of our breeders and our breed is our greatest strength."

Vice president is Jim Brinkley of Milan, Missouri, and Darrell Stevenson of White Sulphur Springs, Montana, will serve as the treasurer for the 2024 to 2025 term.

Directors can serve up to two, three-year terms on the board and, if elected, they serve an additional one-year term in office as president-chairman or vice president-vice chairman.

the property had been neglected for more than three decades, the Leigh family was up to the challenge of making it shine again.

Accompanied by Stephanie's mother and their youngest daughter, they moved to Neligh to be closer to his parents and start their farm. Their two-story, red-roofed farmhouse and their operation, NE-Leigh Farm, is on the eastern outskirts of town.

"We envision establishing a farm-to-table enterprise that produces pasture-raised eggs, chickens, turkeys and pigs, as well as grass-raised beef for sale to our local community and online markets, while setting a standard in regenerative agriculture," Gus said.

Their main goal was to implement conservation practices and regenerative farming, and they applied for and were accepted into the Center for Rural Affairs Beginning Farmer Conservation Fellowship Program.

The program began in 2022 with eight

individuals, plus mentors. The most recent cohort began in spring 2024 with eight more beginning farmers, including Gus and Stephanie.

The Leighs are no strangers to the center's work. They've participated in other programs sponsored by the organization, including the AgVets agrotourism workshops. So when the center announced the opening of enrollment in the current cohort of conservation fellows, the couple eagerly submitted their application.

They have gone to great lengths to improve the environment and their farm. They prohibit the use of steroids, hormones or antibiotics on their livestock. Chickens and pigs roam and forage freely, and both are processed on site to ensure a zero-waste approach.

Gus and Stephanie have also committed themselves to minimizing the leaching of nitrate into the soil and groundwater through the implementation of rotational grazing practices. They are planting a diverse array of grasses in their pasture, which will enhance biomass both above and

below ground and reduce the risk of nitrate leaching deep into the soil or running off into their water supplies.

As part of the program, conservation fellows design and implement a project on their own farms or land they are farming. They present their findings at a farm tour to their mentors, project partners, and other beginning farmers.

Gus and Stephanie have seen a decline in native grasses and forbs on their land, as well as a reduction in native insects, birds and wild foraging animals like deer. For their conservation project, they are planting native grasses, forbs and wildflowers, and with the help of their livestock, they hope to increase the populations of both above-ground and below-ground species.

"We believe these plants will attract pollinating insects and birds, as well as enhance the underground soil microbiology," Gus said. "We anticipate an increase in wildlife populations

such as pheasants, turkeys and deer. We also designated a plot that will be utilized to establish a Milpa garden to produce food for local food banks."

The Milpa technique originated in Central America and involves planting the Three Sisters—corn, squash and beans—alongside other native and

cultivated plants to improve the soil and grow food.

Gus and Stephanie's project is in its initial stages, with Milpa seeds sown in a paddock that was home to their pigs for several weeks. By this fall they saw some growth of corn, sunflowers and winter squash.

Gus says one of the most valuable lessons they have learned is the realization that they are not alone in their commitment to conservation.

"The classes and in-person events we have attended have underscored the importance of soil conservation, grassland preservation and livestock rotation," he said. "Through our interactions and work with our mentor, we have gained insights into improving our pastures and enhancing our strategies for marketing and selling our finished livestock."

Looking down the road, Gus hopes they can eventually generate enough income to support their farming operation independently. He's grateful they were chosen for the conservation fellowship and wholeheartedly recommends the program to his peers.

"It is a profound honor to be selected as a fellow," Gus said. "Being awarded this fellowship has been instrumental in expanding our knowledge of conservation practices, particularly those that have proven successful in Nebraska."

And, though there aren't many other farmers and ranchers in their area that practice regenerative agriculture or employ conservation methods, Gus says he and Stephanie are staying the course.

"We are committed to applying the lessons and experiences we have gained throughout our lives to enhance our farm, better ourselves, and support other farmers, ranchers and our community," he said.

"Having worn a uniform for over 30 years, I am now ready to take on the role of my own boss and dedicate myself to improving our small family farm with my wife," he said. "With my wife as both co-owner and teammate, and guided by the good Lord and values we hold dear, I am confident that we will build a successful and prosperous farming business."
