

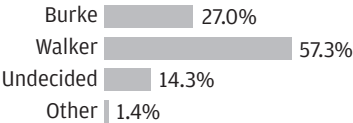
Possible key voters on Nov. 4

9.3% OF VOTERS

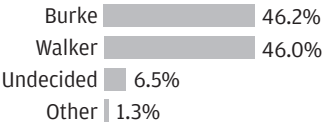
Those who approve of the job Gov. Scott Walker and President Barack Obama are doing.

6.4% OF VOTERS

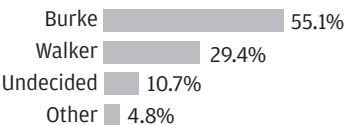
Married women between ages 30-55 living outside Madison and Milwaukee areas.

5.4% OF VOTERS

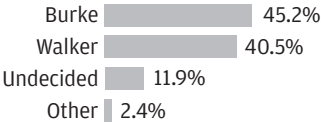
Unmarried people between ages 25-35 with some college education, but not an advanced degree.



Moderate independents

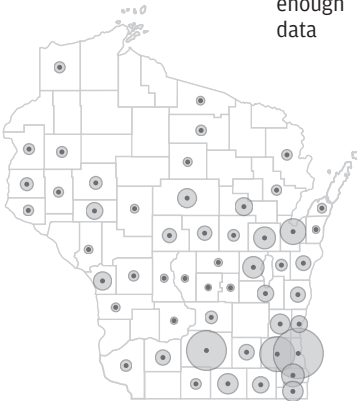
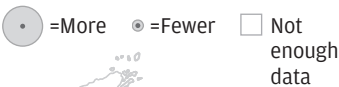
16.2% OF VOTERS
