

Jimsonweed

Datura stramonium

toxins	Atropine, scopolamine
species	Cattle, pigs, sheep, horses
habitat	Feeding areas and corrals that are heavily disturbed, cultivated fields
symptoms	Decreased respiratory and heart rate, muscle weakness, dilated pupils.
toxic plant parts	All parts are toxic, but seeds have the highest toxicity. Drying forage does not reduce toxicity of seed. Largest risk is from ingestion in contaminated hay due to extremely low palatability.
poison details	0.1 to 0.3% of body weight eaten results in poisoning. Larger amounts can be fatal. Symptoms are apparent within minutes to a few hours.
