Kansas participates in reverse trade mission from Costa Rica

U.S. cattle are moving to warmer climes — or at least that's the result of a trade partnership being fostered between the Kansas Department of Agriculture, American International Charolais Association and a delegation of Costa Rican beef sector stakeholders.

Costa Rican delegates visited Kansas in early December 2019 as part of a trade mission to improve and expand the Costa Rican beef cattle herd while increasing the opportunity for the sale of U.S. beef cattle genetics.

The Charolais association has been working since 2013 with the Kansas and Montana departments of agriculture and the Costa Rican National Institute of Innovation and Transfer in Agricultural Technology (INTA).

The project used Charolais and Red Angus semen for artificial insemination of native Costa Rican cattle, primarily Brahmans and Nelores, to create F1 crosses. Performance data including birth weight, weaning weight and carcass weight were collected on the calves in order to compare the U.S.-sired calves with the Costa Rican-sired calves.

"The U.S.-sired calves had faster rates of growth and higher quality carcasses compared with the native calves," said Suzanne Ryan-Numrich, international trade director for the Kansas Department of Agriculture. "Higher quality beef is increasing in popularity because of a growing number of middle-class consumers and booming tourism sector. By utilizing U.S. genetics to produce F1 crosses, Costa Rican cattlemen can improve the efficiency of their calves while producing more desirable and higher quality beef."

The team started the trade mission by attending a beef cattle industry educational seminar at AICA and ended the week at the Wright Charolais ninth annual female sale in Kearney, Missouri. Other ranch

Hay and Forage Minute: Feeding alfalfa as a protein supplement

Feeding more protein than cattle need can get expensive. Alfalfa can be a less expensive protein source, especially if you feed just enough alfalfa to provide the protein your animals need.

Cattle often need extra protein when their winter diet is based on corn stalks, prairie hay, straw, or winter range. The protein supplement you chose is important, both in its effectiveness and its cost. Many cheap protein sources contain mostly urea and other forms of non-protein nitrogen. These supplements often are not used very effectively when cattle are eating mostly low energy winter forages.

Supplements containing mostly allnatural protein may be better. All-natural protein feeds the microbes in the rumen so they can digest more fiber from your forage. And many times the cheapest natural source of protein is alfalfa, especially when hay price is reasonable.

Keep costs down further by determining how much extra protein your cows actually need. Both a forage test for protein and a close estimate of how much your cows are actually eating are needed to be accurate. Then you can work with a local Extension educator, a nutritionist, or use your own skills to calculate how much more protein is needed.

Many winter forage diets need between one-half and one pound of extra protein per day. Since the forage test of your alfalfa will tell you how much protein it contains, you can calculate how much alfalfa to feed each day, or every other day, to keep cows healthy and productive. This could come from as little two pounds of hay when feeding high protein alfalfa to cows needing just a little extra protein to as much as eight to 10 pounds when using lower quality alfalfa to cows after calving.

It may not sound like a big difference, but when you feed just two or three pounds each day per cow, the savings add up fast.

K-State meat judging team finishes as national runner-up Three students named to All American teams

MANHATTAN, Kan. — The Kansas State University meat judging team completed the 2019 season with a runner-up finish at the International Intercollegiate Meat Judging contest in Dakota City, Nebraska recently.

Three team members also earned All American honors based on their individual finishes throughout the year and academic achievements.

"The students on the team this year are a great representation of what this program is about: hard work, teamwork, and success," said the team's coach, Travis O'Quinn, an associate professor of animal science. "You could not put together a group of students who better personified all of the values that this program stands for. I am honored and humbled to have had the opportunity to work with them this year, and cannot wait to see all of their future successes in their lives and careers."

Texas Tech earned the overall team title, while K-State was the reserve national champion, followed by Texas A&M, Oklahoma State and Colorado State.

K-State's All Americans included first-teamers Michaela Musselman of Clay Center, Kansas (fourth overall at the national contest) and Lane Egger of Columbus, Nebraska (fifth overall); and second-teamer Hannah Williams of Kearney, Nebraska.

Meat judging requires students to judge 10 classes of beef, lamb and pork carcasses and cuts and rank them on value. Then, they must defend their rankings to judges with written reasons.

"Additionally, the students have to apply USDA yield and quality grades to 15 beef carcasses and evaluate a set of 10 sub-primal cuts for cutting defects," O'Quinn said.

"The learning experiences these students receive on these teams is second to none," he added. "The level of critical thinking, communication, time management and life skills gained as a part of the team goes well beyond what is possible in a traditional classroom. These programs make a monumental difference in these students' lives and expose them to countless career opportunities that they otherwise would have never been exposed to. There is no doubt that being a part of a judging team positively impacts these students for the rest of their lives."

Other members of this year's team include Greyson Collins of St. John, Kansas; Kimmi Doran of Whiteford, Maryland; Katie Lybarger of Garnett, Kansas; Jake McCall of Greenville, Virginia; Luke Prill of Wichita, Kansas; Hannah Seymore of Visalia, California; Adelyn Smith of Corinth, Texas; and Cheyenne Swoope of Kilgore, Texas.

Good things can happen when marbling leads selection criteria

What happens to a commercial Angus herd after 23 years of selection led by marbling? No worries, really, just premium opportunities.

That's the nutshell from veteran Iowa State University animal scientist Dan Loy, whose team recently authored a white paper based on data from their quality-selected Angus herd.

In November, Loy reminded producers at the Angus Convention in Reno, "Reproduction in the cow herd is very complex. There's a genetic component that's the big box across the top - but it's impacted by the environment and nutrition at different stages. There are a lot of moving parts.'

Noting past studies and literature reviews, he then focused on ISU's Angus cow herds. first set up in 1996 as a means to use ultrasound-based selection for either high marbling or high yield. In 2002, the latter herd was dispersed when American Angus Association's statistical tools had improved. The breed's expected progeny difference (EPD) for marbling (MARB) has guided the 400-cow herd at the fescue-based McNay Farms in south central Iowa since then (see sidebar).

Loy compared the Angus MARB versus the ISU herd's EPD over time, simplified with trend lines that currently show the average ISU cows now higher than 1 while the Angus average nears 0.6.

Looking at interactions with other EPDs, he pointed out the Iowa cows lagged behind on heifer pregnancy early on.

"We've been improving that through the years so that, currently, we're about breed average," he said, adding the same can be said for the milk and weaning weight EPDs.

An unusual feature of the Iowa herd is the internally raised crop of breeding bulls. They allow for "a unique dataset," Loy said, that includes the ability to track the scrotal circumference EPD, slightly above breed average, and within the Angus breed, slightly positive in its correlation to marbling.

The ISU herd phenotype in terms of carcass performance can be seen in the finished steers and heifers marketed in the last five years, currently at 93% or more qualified for the Certified Angus Beef (CAB) brand, including 57% Prime.

"I like to say Prime is the new Choice," Loy remarked, "because working with feedlot nutritionists, and in the research, you always see quality expressed in terms of percent Choice.

"With these cattle, that's a meaningless number, because they're all Choice," he said. A guiding principle now is, "We just need to figure out how not to screw that up."

Average ribeye area, fat thickness and yield grade within the ISU herd "very typical of the industry," Loy said, although the carcass weights are a little lighter.

The research setting and quality goals open research doors into the timing of marbling deposition as well as how brood cows deplete and build up intramuscular fat during a production year.

Serial harvest of steers has found weanling steers that could already grade Choice.

"We know marbling starts much earlier in life than was thought, and it's a slower process," Loy said. The ISU team has just started monitoring marbling levels in cows during gestation to see how much it may draw down or increase with body condition scores.

Other datasets include calving intervals and reproductive success over time, compared to marbling. Simple correlations found significant, slightly positive relationships with heifer pregnancy, number of calves produced and even numerically favorable in terms of calving interval.

"So that's in the right direction," Loy noted.

"Overall, it's kind of like a broken record and a little bit boring, but we found very little relationship between marbling and reproduction," he concluded.

Leading up to ISU herd data analysis

Genetic improvement in beef cattle means jumping hurdles or "antagonisms" among the traits.

When animal scientist Dan Loy signed on with Iowa State University (ISU) as a feedlot specialist 40 years ago, he brought along a commercial Angus background. Best practices for the herds supplying feedlots then were crossbreeding and balanced selection for maternal and growth traits.


Stockmen had to use single-trait "heifer bulls," because there weren't many bulls with calving ease along with growth. If anybody paid attention to marbling, they probably noticed some bulls above average there had little else to recommend them.

Science charted and measured the antagonisms for decades, and the Certified Angus Beef (CAB) brand sponsored a literature review at Kansas State University in 1999, updated in 2007. That was revisited by researchers at Virginia Tech in 2013. The consensus has always found little or no correlation between marbling and other traits.

That lack of correlation says marbling, maternal function and growth should all fit together in the same cow.

Before those studies, in 1996, Loy and ISU began gathering data on calves from the University's two Angus herds, built on either marbling or ribeye emphasis. Early on, results were not much publicized and after six years, the ribeye herd was discontinued when an ultrasound technician moved on.

It took many years to build up enough volume to achieve significance in data from the McNay Farms herd near Chariton, Iowa. But that time has come with the white paper's publication, now available online at https://www.cabcattle. com/about/research/relationship-betweencarcass-merit-and-maternal-traits-in-beefcattle/.




