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# A riverside conversation with an award-winning communicator

"I love to feel the sun warming the wooden planks of a pier," Sarah Moreman remarked as she watched the Coosa River flow serenely by.

"How long did you live on the river?" I asked.

"Eleven years. I miss it. I miss waking up to see the fog embracing the river. I miss that ethereal feel of foggy mornings as I was daily reminded that I should go outside, that life is much more than the house I lived in."

"You seem to have a definite affinity for being by the water."

"I certainly do. I still come to the lake to visit family and friends. Being by the water reminds me of how 'it is well with my soul' and 'this too shall pass' due to the way water cleanses away the daily living stress. Water has its soothing qualities which inspire me to flex my creative writing skills."

Sarah's skills have been on display in recent issues of Lakeside Living. Regular readers have no doubt enjoyed her series of



features about life on the river during each of the changing seasons. I've been proud to have her as a contributor to our publication, not only for her descriptive, reflective perspectives but also because professionally she's Dr. Sarah Elizabeth Moreman, an award-winning authority on interpersonal communication.

Recently, she was named a Spear Hero Honoree during the 2021 Vulcans Community Awards presentation to recognize civic pride, leadership, accomplishment, and progress in the seven-county Birmingham region, which includes the Logan Martin Lake area. The good doctor was one of 10 award recipients this year, earning recognition for her efforts to promote disability awareness and accommodation and inspire others to become more effective and inclusive communicators.

"Being recognized reveals to me the reality of how much we need each other to gain better insight about connecting and communicating with each other," she said. "Born profoundly bisensorineurally hearing impaired, I grew up learning how to communicate effectively with others. Being deaf does not equal expertise in sign language. As any individual, I have my own communications strategy of adapting to each situation and with another person. The older I get, the more acutely aware I am about the importance of giving

others attention by adjusting to the way they communicate."

"That's probably something most of us could be more aware of," I said after a moment's thought.

"More often than not, people do not think about connecting while communicating," Sarah replied. "Communication is more than exchanging words verbally. Communication is shared through various communications strategies such as body language, facial expressions, inflections, writing, reading, and laughter. I believe in truly connecting. Stubborn is the first word that any of my close friends and family would use to describe me. I do not let a conversation go unfinished until all angles have been covered. I do not believe in incomplete thoughts, sentences, and tasks. Unfinished work needs to be finished."

# June is the perfect time for reeling in panfish

#### **GREETINGS FROM THE MIGHTY COOSA RIVER!**

June marks the beginning phases for many changes in predatory fish behavior. With these changes come many opportunities for anglers to catch large numbers of predatory fish species.

For the bass fisherman, try to focus on offshore brush and ledges directly on the main river. June is a great time



to find loads of bass stacked (aka schooled) up. Fast moving crank baits such as the Strike King 6XD are my baits of choice. If you enjoy fishing at a slower pace, your standard Shakey Head will coax the bass also.

Look for bluegills and redears (both are species of panfish referred to commonly as bream) in the shallow pockets off of the main river. A good pair of sunglasses will aid in finding the basketball-sized beds that the bream make.

The end of May and the whole month of June is the primary spawning time for these sought-after panfish. It's a great time to take the kids and truly have a blast. All you'll need is a small ultralight rod and reel setup along with a cork, small #2 panfish hook, and (my personal favorite live bait) crickets.

Don't be afraid to go old school and break out the cane pole for these big bluegills either. Have fun and don't forget to wear sunscreen!

LakeFest, slurping down the icy sweetness of a coffee-flavored snow cone, when a tiny flash of pink rushes by me.

The hot pink blur is a little girl in a ruffled sundress, maybe 5 or 6, her sunkissed curls streaming behind her as she runs towards one of the boats for sale, calling out, "Look




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at this sparkly boat, mama! It's got glitter on it!"

I smile, not caring if the shaved ice syrup has turned my tongue and teeth a scary color. I can't help myself. I look around, and people everywhere are laughing as they scramble up the ladders into the glistening new boats, leaning back into the cushy leather seats, imagining themselves on this boat at the lake every Saturday, cold drink or fishing rod in hand, living the dream. Another group grins while they admire the row of gleaming GMCs lined up like shiny soldiers down by the lake, practically blinding you with their newness.

The feeling is everywhere—under the colorful canopies of the vendors, in the line for Golden Rule BBQ—it's pure joy. Maybe even a hint of relief. You can almost see the live spark forking through the crowd like summer lightning. LakeFest is back, and it truly is better than ever.

Just ask Justin Hogeland, one of the event's key organizers. That is, if you can catch him. In be-







tween directing vendor traffic and casually riffing jokes with fellow organizer and emcee Eric Housh during the hourly raffle giveaways, Justin finds a moment to share his thoughts about this year's event.

"How does it feel to be back after having to cancel last year?" I ask, watching a smile spread across his sun-tanned face. "Fabulous." The word lingers in the air for a moment while we nod and laugh. "I wish I had better words, but you know, we think everybody was just ready to get out, as you can see by the crowds."

The good news didn't stop there. "Some years, we've had a hassle with some of the vendors moving in, but this year, everybody was gracious, much more patient. Every sponsor has already committed for next year," he reveals, "and we have another big sponsor who wants to be involved. "



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Justin and fellow organizers Eric Housh, Lee Holmes, Mark Hildebrant, and Judy Carr are already looking to make 2022 another standout year.

Before he turns to wade back into the thick of the festivities, I ask, "What do you love most about this event?"

He pauses a moment. "The ability to give back to the community. To see the growth of the event—it's been unprecedented. You know, the first year we did it, we were only able to give back roughly \$2,000 to the community and charity organizations, which I was honored to even do that, but on average now, we're probably looking at giving







back \$45-50,000 just this year. It's the 10th year of LakeFest, and we've been able to give back a quarter of a million dollars."

On that final note, he waves goodbye, heading back towards the stage, and I turn right, heading towards the mouth-watering smell of barbecue and fresh crab cakes. Swimsuit season may be upon us, but that doesn't stop me from savoring every last perfectly seasoned bite of the crab cake sandwich from Tiki Island Concessions served with crisp lettuce and a thick, red-ripe slice of tomato.

At nearby picnic tables, couples and families chow down on slow-cooked, hickory-smoked pork sandwiches drizzled with classic Golden Rule BBQ sauce while some indulge in toasted sandwiches and chili cheese fries from Traffic Jam, a food truck you don't mind having parked right

# It's time for the 12th annual Riverside Poker Run

Start those pontoon engines and polish up on your card skills for the 12th Annual Riverside Poker Run.

Hosted by the Riverside Beautification Organization (RBO), the poker run is scheduled for Saturday, June 19. Registration opens at Riverside Landing on Depot Street between 4 and 7 p.m. Friday, June 18, and registrants are encouraged to sign up then to avoid long lines when the event begins the following morning. Each participant packet is \$15.

The poker run wraps up at 2 p.m., with participants returning to The Landing to claim their prizes. To avoid too many boats docking at The Landing,





participants are encouraged to take their boats back to their own docks and return by car.

Don't have a boat but still want to play? The Coosa Queen has you covered! The riverboat will be at the ready to take participants to the various docks on the map for a \$15 fee. Call the Coosa Queen at 205-706-2319 to reserve your seat.

Inside each participant packet is a map pinpointing the 8 docks along Riverside's banks where players go to pick up the cards to make up their poker hands. To heighten the thrill, each dock -- all owned by Riverside residents -- also offers prizes that participants can bid on using the poker chips provided in the packet.

The Landing is Dock 1, but there will be a Mystery Dock not included on the map. If you can discover it, more cards can be obtained there for \$5 each to potentially better your poker hand, maybe giving you a needed ace-up-your-sleeve.

The prizes awarded to the three best poker hands will be \$300, \$200 and \$100. A \$50 consolation prize will also be presented. Hands must be turned in by 2 p.m. to be eligible for the prizes. Prizes will be given to participants who use Mystery Dock cards as well as those don't, bringing the total amount of prize money to \$1,200.

"This year, we will have a professional sound system so you can hear the awards and listen to some good music while you wait," said Julie Pounders of the RBO. "We have added a raffle this year of a paddle board and paddle. Tickets are \$5, and you can buy tickets from any RBO member, by calling 205-812-9459, or see Buck and Delores at Bucks BBQ, where the board will












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be on display."

To further celebrate the occasion, the RBO will have Riverside hats, poker run T-shirts and tank tops for sale. All fundraising proceeds go to build a new municipal playground.

"The poker run is the RBO's main fundraiser, which accounts for our operating budget and supports our projects: planting pots, flowers, bushes and trees around city buildings and the city park, providing the nativity and lit snowflakes along Main Street at Christmas," Pounders said.

The event also supports paying for signage, sponsoring an Earth Day roadside cleanup, the annual community Soup Supper, helping with the Riverside Fire Department's Fall Festival, and organizing the poker run, in addition to planning for the new playground.

The Riverside Poker Run is a fun and festive way to raise money for the RBO, all while enjoying a familyfriendly Saturday in the summer sun and fresh air on the lake. And who knows? It might just be your lucky day to reel in a jackpot.

# All other cares fade the second you set your sails on the lake.

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
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sailors, wind ruffling their hair, heel precariously to the side as they harness the fleeting breeze and skim lightly across the mirror of water.

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## Shakespeare in the Park -- and at the lake Logan Martin Lake hosts performance of classic comedy play

"I know a bank where the wild thyme blows, Where oxlips and the nodding violet grows, Quite over-canopied with luscious woodbine, With sweet musk-roses and with eglantine."

A Midsummer Night's Dream, Act 2 Scene 1







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290 Vaughan Lane | Pell City, AL 35125 205.814.7177 I know a place where the boats glide to and fro, where herons roam where the long grasses grow, and under the leafy canopy of the Chapel in the Pines, the words of Shakespeare echo to the sky.

Before I get too carried away, let me explain. On a cloudless Saturday afternoon, I've come to Lakeside Park to see a performance of Shakespeare's A Midsummer Night's Dream, sponsored by Alpha Psi Omega and the JSU Department of Theatre and Film in partnership with The Shakespeare Project.

I take a seat on one of the wooden benches, trying to lean into the least bit of shade. Looking around, I see others doing the same, but despite the heat, they stay. We may live in a world obsessed with binge-watching the latest Netflix series or content to sit glued to a smartphone scrolling through social media feeds, but Shakespeare can still draw a crowd. Even 421 years later, the original master of the sitcom is still making us laugh.

In its original performances in the early 17th century, A Midsummer Night's Dream was performed during daylight hours on the simple stage of an Elizabethan playhouse. No elaborate scenery was necessary. The actors used only a few props, with a bit of music and costumes to create a fantastical world of young love, mischievous fairies, and unfortunate playactors. If it weren't for the random airplane or two buzzing overhead, I'd almost believe I'd time-traveled back to Shakespeare's England with the Thames rather than Logan Martin rippling in the background.

Spread out on a sky-blue blanket next to the stage is an array of colorful props. While some of the actors complete their pre-show checks, two others take the stage to fill the air with the soft thrummings of the stringed guitar. Once the play begins, this cast of eight actors relies on



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simple costume changes to play the roles of 20 characters. While that might seem like it would lead to mass confusion, surprisingly, it doesn't. It's incredible what the simple change of color or the addition of a pair of woodland or homespun fairy wings can do to create the illusion of a different character.

It's not long into the play before the audience laughs at the antics of the versatile actor Trey Gresham, who portrays the characters of both Lysander and Bottom. The laughter bounces across the lake, and in the distance, I notice people on their boats pausing with curiosity, turning to look our way. Perhaps one of the most magical aspects of a live theatrical performance may be causing a group of strangers to share a laugh as if on cue.

The children behind me laugh too. They





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may not get the joke, but that doesn't mean they're not enjoying the amusing physical comedy of it all. Shakespeare can be a tough read, no matter how old you are. He did, after all, introduce almost 3,000 words to the English language. But, he's also one of the most quoted writers in English, after the Bible.

Do the quotes, "The course of true love never did run smooth" or "Love looks not with the eyes, but with the mind" sound familiar? Both are from *A Midsummer Night's Dream.* Some of that language and dialogue can fly right over your head like those buzzing planes, but seeing it acted out is a genuine treat. The centuries fade, and we find we have more in common with those people of yore than we might think.

I wonder...421 years from now, what will be the latest craze? Maybe we'll all be actors in our own miniseries, or perhaps we'll be spending our Saturday afternoons on Mars. But the one thing I wouldn't be surprised by in this far-flung future is if people are still going to see a Shakespeare play and enjoying an afternoon at the lake.







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

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## 'It's the best thing we ever did'



Logan Martin couple has no regrets about moving to the lake

It doesn't take much to get Elise and Michael Johnson to tell you how much they love their life on the lake. The first thing Elise says during our interview is, "We love living here. It's the best thing we ever did." "We should have done it sooner," says Michael. "But our girls were in school and there was just a lot going on." Both Michael and Elise love the peaceful serenity of lakeside living. The two both exude a relaxed jovial attitude that's contagious to those around them. As they both stand on their back porch overlooking the lake, they tell me about the wildlife they see on a regular basis (everything from blue egrets to a hawk flying by with a chipmunk in its clutches), how comfortable the fire pit has been with the cooler spring nights, and how they weren't looking for a pool but weren't disappointed when they ended up with one. "I don't really like the water," Elise laughs. "It took me four years, but I finally managed to get in the lake last summer. I had on two life jackets and three adults with me, but I did it."



They lived in the Bluff Park area of Hoover for 30 years, raising their children and living the typical suburban life of work, school, and home. When their children grew up, Michael and Elise began reevaluating their space.

"We had a four-bedroom, three-bath, 3,000-square-foot house, and the girls graduated and moved out, and we realized we really didn't need that space anymore," Michael says. After talking it over, they began their search for a new home.

Michael says they were looking for a "fixerupper" house. They loved going camping, so they wanted something that was reminiscent of



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that outdoorsy cabin feeling. They looked for more than six months before things finally started falling into place.

"We looked and looked, we even looked at this one twice," says Elise. "It was originally out of our price range."

The house dropped in price, and Elise had her heart set on the cabin-style home. Their luck, however, kept dropping in and out. The house sold twice to two different buyers over the course of several months, and Elise says she "gave up looking for a while" out of discouragement. "I was like, 'That was my house!'" she says with a smile. While Michael was out of town on a business trip, Elise got the call from their Realtor that the latest buyer



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
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fell through.

"The realtor asked, 'Do you still want it?' and I practically shouted, 'Yes!'" she recalls. They acted quickly, doing the paperwork with Michael on the phone, and the rest is history. The house has been through several changes in their five years there and today shows no inclination of its real age.

"It's old, but it cleans up good," says Michael. Though Michael and Elise frequently refer to their home as "a work in progress," the amount of work they've put into the home has already made a monumental difference. They've completely repainted the exterior, built a new fire pit closer to the water's edge, and replaced the windows, which Michael says were originally single-paned aluminum that rattled when







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
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the wind blew.

They've even placed a dog-house replica of the house outside for their four dogs. The biggest transformation -- and Elise's pride and joy -- has to be the front yard garden. Before we even begin the interview, Michael gives me a tour of the beautiful space Elise has created. "Before you ask us what our favorite thing is about living at the lake, I can go ahead and tell you my wife is going to say her garden," he says.

What was once "nothing but woods" is now a thriving eden of various flowers, herbs,

and other plants. A border of rocks snakes through the garden guiding guests throughout the many pockets of greenery. Elise says she spends the majority of her time in the garden. It's her stress reliever. Even the neighbors have contributed.

"I love all these rocks," Elise says. "Most of the rocks I dug up when I was starting the garden but a lot of them are from the neighbors. They bring me their old bricks and rocks and I just get so excited. Bring me all the rocks!"

The house hasn't been the only thing to go through renovations. Elise and Michael say the

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neighborhood itself has drastically changed over the past five years. "When we first moved here, most of our neighbors were weekenders," Elise says. "And the house across the way wasn't there, it was all woods. And they're building another house across the lake that's supposed to be a really big house. So there have been a lot of changes."

The view from the house is what sealed the deal. From the dining room windows, there is a stellar view of almost the entire lake. Elise and Michael spend many hours either on their back porch, down by the fire pit, or on the boat enjoying the scenery. While most people rave about the sunset and the sunrise, Elise and Michael have a different picturesque favorite.

"The moon at night is just beautiful," Elise says. "It's so big and it reflects on the water and I'm all about that stuff. I need to get a telescope so I can see the planets and stars more clearly, but oh yes, the moon is just beautiful."

Whether they're working in the yard or enjoying a cold beers on the back deck, the Johnsons are so grateful for the home they've built together on Logan Martin. They say they have a long list of things they want to accomplish or update but until then, they're priorities are to enjoy life, enjoy each other, and enjoy their home.

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#### THE MYSTERIOUS AND COMPLEX GREEN HERON

Ask most people who live near the lake if they've ever seen a green heron, and the average response is, "I've never even heard of them."

One reason you may not have noticed these hunched, stocky herons is due to how still they stand. Like lawn ornaments lining the grasses of the lakeshore, these shy, secretive birds sport built-in camouflage. Green herons may look like they' ve just clothed themselves in the latest foliage fashion designs from Bass Pro Shops, but Nature has done the job for them. The iridescent feathers on their back and cap glow a velvet-soft forest green, contrasting with the charcoal-chestnut hue of their neck and chests.

Baby green herons are a little harder to

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pinpoint because they're not green at all. Clothed in a soft down of brown and gray feathers, they practically vanish into the tree branches where you may only detect their orange beaks or the marigold yellow of their curious, bright eyes.

Hidden in the tangle of leaves and trees at the water's edge, green herons wait. Their taller, more recognizable blue heron relatives may wade the waters on long stilt legs, but green herons have devised a better plan to make up for their short stature. They make fishing lures. As one of the few tool-using bird species, these crafty herons entice fish and other prey to the surface of the water using twigs, feathers, insects, and even bread crumbs as bait. Once they drop their lure, they stand—motionless—then swiftly strike by snatching their prize from the surface with their long, dagger-shaped bills.

There's much about these mysterious herons we still don't know, like why a few have turned up as far away as England and France while the majority stay close to home here in the Americas. But the more we discover about these lure-making birds, the more being called "bird-brained" might actually be a compliment.

I would also say that I'm ambitious and an overachiever, and I can be stubborn, which are all probably related. I'm not afraid of the unknown. I embrace it. And I consider myself an earthy girl. The food she could eat every day: "That's hard to narrow down, because I like food. Seriously. I have a great relationship with food. But for everyday eating, probably chicken alfredo."
