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




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
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Editor's Note

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NOVEMBER: A GREAT MONTH FOR BASS FISHING

Logan Martin's water temperatures are cooling, and the bass are feeding. Major feeding windows present themselves in these shorter days. Spotted bass, largemouth bass, and striped bass are actively feeding in preparation for the winter, making this a great time to throw a multitude of different baits.

My top three favorite baits for November are jerk baits, shallow-running squarebills, and scroungers.

The jerk bait is exactly what it sounds like: a bait that ierks and has erratic action. This is especially important in late fall when baitfish will act very erratic because the shad are under constant stress from gamefish attacking them. The jerk bait is perfect for the situation. Some of my favorite jerk baits are the KVD 200 and Spro McStick. I opt for the smaller, two-hook models in November. Pair these lures with a medium bait cast rod and bait cast reel. You can also use medium spinning reels for this setup. Your line of choice will be 10-12-pound fluorocarbon. Monofilament will work as well.

Any shad-colored squarebill

will catch fish this month. The common KVD 1.5 squarebill is tried and proven. These squarebill cranks will need to be fished on a medium rod with medium to heavy line. I always upsize my line when fishing a square bill

because of the abrasion from rocks and wood. Best targets for this lure will be isolated wood near or on flats and shallow rock or seawalls.

Categorized by its unique profile, the scrounger has a plastic lip that makes it dance and move erratically like a small shad or baitfish. This is a great lure to use in open water. Schooling fish and suspended fish will be your main targets for

the scrounger. There are several different companies that make these baits, but my favorite is the Davis Bait Company Shaky Fish. Pair this with your favorite minnow style jig, and it will for sure be a fish-catching machine. This bait is very light and versatile. Spinning equipment or light bait cast equipment will work just fine.

When targeting bass In November, I'll always start at the creek mouths. Small cuts and pockets off the main river will hold bass and baitfish as well. If you can find the baitfish, you will find the bass. Always keep an eye out for schooling fish. Busting action on top of the water is a dead giveaway. Isolated targets will hold fish as well. These three baits will keep you covered when you're on the water this month.

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


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Wood + Rosemary

Strength and support are symbolic of charcuterie business created on the banks of the Coosa River

"These are so good," Candice Hightower said, placing some pickled okra spears on the circular platter on her kitchen counter.

The okra was followed by some cheese cubes, olives, and a small bowl of corn salsa. She was preparing a charcuterie board for her husband and two sons, but her attractive and flavorful presentations are available to the public for holiday parties, office parties, showers, and wedding receptions through her business, Wood + Rosemary.

"Wood represents strength, and rosemary represents friendship," Candice said, placing













two sprigs of the herb next to the okra, one leaning against a rose petal made of peppered salami. "And in order to get to reach my goal, I needed to be strong, and I needed those friendships and supportive women. Ultimately, I did reach my goal, and that's what got me there."

Her goal was to earn a graduate degree in organizational leadership at Samford University, which she has completed and paid for debt-free through the vehicle of Wood + Rosemary.

"A good friend of mine, Jacqueline, owns an event coordination company. She had a wedding coming up and asked if I minded assisting her with a grazing table for the reception. So I did, but I wasn't really sure if I would love doing it. I just wasn't sure that I was really good at it. But people started complimenting and saying that I had an eye for detail, and I just started getting phone calls. Before long, I realized that this could be something that could pay my way back through school.

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What really made it take off is when I started a Facebook page, which now has close to 5,000 followers."

For clients, Candice does her prep work in a health department-licensed commercial kitchen. Her creations can range in size from individual charcuterie boards and boxes to lengthy grazing tables. "The largest I've done so far was a 36-foot table that served hundreds of people at a wedding. Just setting it up took four or five hours."

Such a large project could seem daunting, but she's developed a process that works smoothly. "I start by sketching out something, especially if it's a table or a board for an event that has a theme or color scheme. Then I make a grocery list and shop. I love supporting local farmers markets whenever possible. Then it's cleaning and cutting the fruits and vegetables, cutting the cheeses, packing the cooler and serving utensils, and picking up the florals. I like to mix flowers and greenery as a garnish. It's all about presentation. You eat with your eyes first."

Candice's creations can indeed be described as colorful feasts for the eyes. Purple grapes, blue cheese, green olives, ginger snaps, rye crackers, pepper jelly, chicken salad, spinach artichoke dip, pepperoni, and roast beef are some of

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her favorite visually appealing charcuterie ingredients. A favorite with clients is always peppered salami shaped into rose petals. "Nobody wants to be the first person to pull the petals part, but once someone does, it goes fast. Thankfully, I haven't delivered anything where they said we really didn't have enough. It's always been more than enough, which is what I want to hear. I don't want anybody to feel like they didn't get their money's worth."

With the holidays approaching and football season still underway, Candice recommends Wood + Rosemary as a means a reducing the stress often involved in holiday or tailgating gatherings. "Everything in the South is centered around food," she said. "The occasion doesn't have to be anything special. Any time we can be together is a time to celebrate. Call, tell me what you want, and I'll set it up so you can be present for the moment."



Sailing for the Leukemia-Lymphoma Society

LOGAN MARTIN HOSTS BENEFIT REGATTA FOR MORE THAN THREE DECADES

The annual Leukemia Cup Regatta returned to Logan Martin Lake this fall to a large and welcoming crowd. The event, which is hosted by the Birmingham Sailing Club, has provided the sailing community of Logan Martin with an equally enjoyable and inspiring sailing experience since 1988. While to passersby, the event may seem like a usual day of sailors enjoying time on the water, the event has deeper roots to the community – and the nation.

The regatta is a fundraiser to benefit the Leukemia Lymphoma Society. It has been held every year since its inception without fail and has raised millions of dollars dedicated to blood cancer research and helping those impacted by the diseases.

David Reich, the club's commodore, has been involved with the regatta for years. He said the race has undergone several recent changes given the COVID-19 pandemic and other factors, but the heart of the fundraiser has always remained the same.

The regatta includes online fundraising set up by the organizers, a live auction, a silent auction, and a gala dinner all centered around the sailboat race.

"We use that basically to gather the people so they have something to go out and really participate behind the cause," Reich said. "After the race, it really doesn't matter who wins or loses. It's all about the cause."

The commodore said 100 percent of the costs for the event are all set by contributions so that every cent of the donations can go to the





LLS. He added that he thinks the local aspect of the event increases people's devotion to coming back year after year.

"I think one of the great things that helps people contribute is 100 percent of what we raise here stays here in Alabama," Reich said. "Even though the LLS is a national program, 100 percent of what we raise here stays in Alabama and primarily in the Birmingham area. And the reason for that is because the money is used for patient advocacy, patient copays, family support, and research."

Reich said that recently an enormous grant was donated by the LLS to UAB for leukemia research, and that grant is going towards research on blood cancers in children. Over the years, the regatta has grown to a national level of recognition, surpassing the Southeast and gaining attention across the country, though Reich said it's always been about Alabama.

"This community right here is where







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the regatta began," he said. "It began at Birmingham Sailing Club in 1987, but what's interesting is that this was not a national event, and the local sailing community here on Logan Martin Lake made a donation of \$5,000 in memory of a friend of theirs, and that made it to the U.S. National Sailing Symposium, and so a lot of people realized they could take it nationally."

This year's regatta was very successful, Reich said. "Being able to see everyone gather for such an important cause is a very special thing that should be relished. When people get together and they have the enthusiasm and the intentionality and the heart behind a particular cause and to combine it with something other people can participate in, our community really embraces this."

He feels a personal attachment to the



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fundraiser because "I had a brother who was a sailor and was a captain of the Tulane sailing team. He passed away from leukemia about the time this regatta was being conceived. It's always near and dear to my family. We will always support it."

Reich said the support of the local sailing community means everything to the cause, and he and the event's other organizers are grateful for their continued support year after year.

"It makes me proud of our sailing community on Logan Martin Lake," he said. "There's so many people here who don't know about it, but it's really important to me that we're able to represent those this regatta is for and the people who started it."







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AT THE ST. CLAIR COUNTY FAIR

Inaugural festival proves to be the perfect fall family event

As the calendar turned from summer to autumn, thousands of local residents flocked to the St. Clair County arena in Odenville to attend the St. Clair County Fair.

After soon as I heard about about the event, I knew I couldn't miss it.

When my boyfriend Corey and I arrived, the weather could not have been more perfect. I immediately noticed all of the different tents lined up in a row. I was eager to check out each one, not realizing at that moment that the jam-packed weekend event was the first of its kind, and organizers said they hope to have it for many more years to come.

"This is something the community has talked about doing for years," Jodi Shirley, district coordinator for the St. Clair County Soil & Water Conservation District, told me a few days later. "We finally made it happen. We had almost 4,000 in attendance and hope it continues to grow."

She described the fair as a complete team effort by members of several county organizations and volunteers.

"We formed a committee earlier in the year to help plan everything out," said Holly Killian, who is also a coordinator for the St. Clair County Soil & Water Conservation District.

Along with Shirley and Killian, the committee included representatives of the St. Clair County Soil & Water Conservation District, St. Clair County 4-H, St. Clair County Extension System, St. Clair County Farmers Federation, Odenville Chamber of Commerce, Visit St. Clair, the St. Clair County Arena & Event Center, and the St. Clair County Commission.

The fair was the first I had been to in nearly a decade, but no matter how many years pass, county fairs are the perfect mix of fall and nostalgia. And that's what the committee wanted: to make sure the fair had an old-time feel, which it certainly did.

"We wanted it to feel very old-fashioned and not too overwhelmed with rides," Killian said. Committee members said they were proud of how the fair brought people together.

"The St. Clair County Cowboy Church had a booth open to veterans where they could talk about local resources or just fellowship with one another," Shirley said. "We have a large veteran population, and it was important for us to give back in some way."

Before making my rounds of the booths and tents, I couldn't resist stopping to see the cattle. In





traditional county fair fashion, the event provided a platform for area 4-H students and farmers to participate in shows.

"We had dairy, beef, and lamb shows," Shirley said. "We had winners in several scoring categories including showmanship, market, and best in class."

After getting my share of a mood boost by petting the cows, Corey and I decided to walk the grounds. Our first stop was at one of the many food trucks on hand. We opted to try a candy corn lemonade, which was delicious and the perfect thirst quencher.

Keeping up with the old-fashioned theme, there was a dunking booth and several carnivalstyle rides. It felt like a modern-day scene from Charlotte's Web, one of my favorite childhood books.

Corey and I browsed several of the more than 20 vendor booths, which included crafts, candy, and a variety of homemade gifts. The fair also provided plenty of entertainment, including live music from multiple local acts.

After making a few more laps, we decided to get some food and enjoy some bluegrass by the band Blue Heart.

While they played "I'll Fly Away" and other

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traditional favorites, we chowed down on fried corn on the cob and fried Moon Pies, every bite of which was worth all the calories and saturated fat. I mean, have you truly experienced a fair if you don't eat something fried?

My favorite event of the day was the greased pig contest. I must admit, I never knew such a thing existed, but I encourage everyone to see it at least one in their lifetime.



WILLING HEARTS DEVOTED TO HEROES HELPS THOSE IN NEED OF BENEFITS

About a year ago, Samantha Hennings was ready to leave the Miss Alabama organization behind to focus on law school. A close family friend encouraged her to give it one more year, so she did.

"The preliminary was not my best performance," Hennings remembered, chuckling, "I was tripping over my dress, but

somehow it worked out." Enough to be named Miss Leeds Area 2024-25.

Hennings believes the interview portion of the competition in which she spoke about her veteran-assistance initiative, Willing Hearts Devoted To Heroes, aided her toward claiming the crown. She is proud to use her community service

initiative as Miss Leeds Area to help veterans find camaraderie and obtain all the benefits they're entitled to by their military service.

"I am very grateful, especially since Leeds is the City of Valor," said Hennings.

The name Willing Hearts Devoted To Heroes is a tribute to her dad, William Dennis Hennings.

Her devotion to veterans stems from a family tradition of military service, including her father, grandfather and brother-in-law. She has considered joining the military as well—the Navy in particular.

"I have always been obsessed with world politics and the way something that happens in Russia can affect 65 other countries," Hennings

said. "However, I cannot swim, and apparently that is a big part of basic training and fitness," she added with a laugh.

After graduating from high school at Victory Christian in 2021, Hennings moved to Nashville to pursue music.

"I started singing with my dad in restaurants and other venues when I was 14 years old.

When I moved to Nashville, I was kind of being thrown band to band," she said. "I would sing five to six nights per week for about two years, and I started working a full-time night shift job. I have performed at American Legions and veterans homes, my band has performed here and in Florida and in Nashville, and my dad







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

and I have performed all over the Southeast."

She began undergraduate studies at Middle Tennessee State University and completed her bachelor's of science degree in political science with a minor in Spanish at the University of North Alabama. Having graduated in August, Hennings is currently in a gap year and working at a law firm as a legal assistant helping veterans with disability claims while applying to law schools.

"It is always disheartening to see people not take their disability claims, or sometimes, they aren't even aware of everything that they're

eligible for because of their service," she said.

She recently virtually attended the National Organization of Veteran Advocates conference with her employer, the Friedman Law Firm. "I am very blessed to work at a firm where I can help people," said Hennings.

She started by helping her dad with his claims. "He said, 'If anything, you can get practice with mine. We [veterans] didn't do this to get

something back, we did this to help our country."

As Miss Leeds Area, Hennings plans to host a talent show early next year called "City of Valor's Got Talent" for St. Clair, Jefferson and Shelby counties, with the goal of giving back to veterans.

"I am working really hard on promotions and marketing for veterans events," she said. "The VA website has a calendar, and I've been trying to







stay on top of posting events in Alabama. Some of these events are for people who take care of veterans and their emotions or how to help your veteran apply for benefits."

She has also hosted creative arts classes to allow veterans to be in community with people who have experienced the same things they have.

Hennings is certified with Veteran Buddy Check, a program where participants are responsible for reaching out to veterans in their communities to establish and maintain a line of communication for the veterans.

"I just want them to know that they are heard," she said.

Veterans or caregivers of veterans may reach out to Hennings via Facebook for advice about how to start their claims or if they need information about activities at local VFW or American Legion posts. 
The white countertop in the kitchen seems to glow as the morning sun streams through the windows, making me squint as I read Psalms, soaking in the stillness of the day.

The kitchen island is where I do my devotionals, like Grammy used to do at her kitchen table, enjoying a piece of homemade bread or toast with a mug of coffee, spiced hot chocolate, cider, or lemon water. I need this quiet after chasing deadlines. Do deadlines ever stop being deadlines? I thrive on them to stay productive, yet I still carve out moments for peace. The sun warms my arms in the crisp autumn air. The smell of leaves, smoke from grills, and apples—not pumpkin spice—reminds me of football.

Football season this year has been unpredictable, and social media is a noisy clash of complaints and cheers. Last week, I went home to attend the Auburn game with my cousin, who is expecting twins. Our seats were close to where War Eagle VIII (known to us diehard fans as Aurea) would be released,

soaring in circles over Jordan-Hare Stadium before swooping down to its handler on the 50-yardline of Pat Dye Field. The rising battle cry of "Waaaaarrrrrrr" crescendoed, more than 80,000 voices lifting us to the clouds, ending with a triumphant "Eagle! Hey!" as the golden eagle gracefully landed on the handler's arm.

Whenever Aurea is not flying, Independence—Indy for short takes to the sky. Independence is a fitting name for the bald eagle. Another bald eagle at the Southeastern Raptor Center – Spirit – remains an integral part of Auburn's tradition, though now



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retired from flying and serving as an ambassador for wildlife conservation.

I grew up either attending the games, watching the eagles soar over the stadium, or seeing their proud profiles with sharp, curved beaks stand out against a sea of burnt orange and navy shakers on the TV screen. It is the eyes that captivate me—their intelligence is undeniable. The bald eagle can carry prey weighing up to a third of its weight in its talons.

The only animal bold enough to ride and bully the bald eagle is the crow. Sometimes, a crow will hitch a ride on the bald eagle's back, pestering and pecking at its neck in an act called mobbing. But the eagle remains unfazed, calmly soaring higher until the crow is forced to let go, unable to gasp for breath in the increasingly thin air.

Feeling the sun's warmth on my arms grow more intense, I shift in my white leather counter barstool and reach for my mug of hot lemon water. The sun's brightness makes coffee unnecessary. Its heat pulls me away from thoughts of Auburn football games and our eagles, refocusing me on my devotional reading. Taking a sip of the lemony warmth, I let my eyes adjust before returning to the tissue-thin pages. My gaze settles on the words: "...so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's" (Psalm 103:5).

Youth renewed like the eagle's, I muse, picturing a small eaglet—a fluffy, greyish ball of downy feathers. Its vulnerability tugs at my heart. When it hatches, the egg tooth, a sharp point on its developing beak, breaks through the shell in a process called pipping. Pipping, to me, symbolizes a person's first attempt to break free and navigate a challenging world, as his or her determination grew in crescendo.

Youth renewed like the eagle's? As I read back through Psalm 103, searching for the key to this renewal, I realize how hard it can be to accept such a freeing



gift. Having faith, holding onto hope—it's not easy. From my own experience, letting go of what weighs me down is terrifying. Holding onto anxiety, the need to prove myself, the need to control it's like clinging to a weighted blanket that brings a strange comfort. But what if by letting go of that metaphorical blanket, I could experience true energy, freedom, and lightness? What if I no longer had to work so hard, drink more coffee, or constantly strive? What if I could simply be instead of always worrying about doing?

With respect to the doing part, eaglets undergo their own flight training in the nest, gradually gaining strength and honing their skills before taking to the skies. The innate strength and flying intuition are already present in the eaglet's subconscious; all it needs is the faith

to leave the nest and embrace its hunting prowess, another inherent quality. The plumage of the eagle transforms from downy, grayish feathers to speckled white and brown, eventually achieving the classic appearance of a fully matured bald eagle. The youthful aspect of the bald eagle—and any other eagle—is that once it matures after five seasons of plumage transformation, it becomes difficult to assess its true age based solely on outward appearances.

Youth renewed like the eagle's may biblically signify laying our burdens at our Creator's feet, trusting that He understands and has been with us. Only by listening to His promptings can we be still while He works all things together for good, for His plan prevails.

This is what I experienced while Grammy was in the hospital. I had



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
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already made plans to be in Auburn for work and personal reasons, and those plans brought me to town exactly when Grammy was on her deathbed. God was with me, His plan prevailing over my own. I encountered this in four different ways within two weeks and am learning to loosen my tight grip on the need to plan everything out.

Things will work out, and the ease of letting go means fewer frown lines at my crow's feet—the same crow that has been pecking at the eagle's neck. When I finally release my insistence on having things my way, my trust and faith will soar like the eagle, transforming my grayish-brown mottled feathers into a classic appearance of youth renewed like the eagle's as I no longer allow things to weigh me down.

Lake, etc. However, Realtor Nicole Anderson of The Anderson Group with Lake Homes Realty got the Pomroys' attention with a little 1960s-era house in Cropwell a little more than a year ago.

Now, as they look through an entire wall of windows with a stunning view of Logan Martin Lake that's 1,700 miles away from the agitation of living in overcrowded Phoenix, the Pomroys wholeheartedly agree their place on the St. Clair County shoreline was home at first sight.

"When we got to Logan Martin, I don't know why, but I just fell in love with it," says Steve. "Nicole probably had some influence on me because she was able to tell us about the amenities that this lake had that the other lakes do not have."

The house itself wasn't much to look at after falling into disrepair over the years. The home began life as a small one-level, mid-century bungalow with a breezeway between the main house and the garage.

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


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It had been added onto several times over the years without much thought to any existing construction codes.

The natural beauty of the neighborhood struck Mary, and although the house had some problems, she could see its potential. On the other hand, she was convinced - erroneously - that her husband hated it. "Steve just stayed out in the driveway," Mary explains.

"It was just Nicole and I in here and we're looking around and I'm talking to her. I said we'll need to change some things, but this is pretty good, and I said, 'I think we have a problem. He hasn't even come in the house," she adds. "So we walked back outside to see what was going on. He said 'I'll take it.' He never came inside."

Steve explains that while the ladies were inside, he took a walk around the property and

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
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on the peninsula on which the house sits and quickly realized the property and neighborhood had everything he was looking for, including easy access to the water and well-maintained homes owned by friendly neighbors.

"While they were inside, I walked and looked at these homes and how well they were taken care of and it was like check mark, check mark, check mark, check mark," says Steve. "Everything was a check mark."

In order to accomplish their dream home, the Pomroys demolished the house mostly themselves, leaving only an L-shaped portion of the wall. They turned to Jason Jones Construction and Kristina Alexander of Olive Tree Renovations & Design to bring their concept to life. The result is a modern take on a lake house borrowing heavily from beach bungalows one might see dotted along the Gulf Coast, with an exterior color scheme dominated by seafoam green and white and a wide-open floor plan emphasizing breathtaking views of Logan Martin.

The two-bedroom house's main room features a crescent-moon shaped bar, kitchen, dining area, and living area all facing a large bank of windows looking out onto the lake. The master bedroom

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




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
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




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lies just off the main room also situated so that the water is the last thing the Pomroys see before going to sleep and the first thing they see in the morning.

Additionally, the Pomroys designed the house with plenty of outdoor living space. They are on the water in their pontoon boat at least three days a week, spending the remainder of those evenings either on the large covered patio just off the main room or the screened-in porch accessible from the bedroom.

But what really makes their lakehouse feel like home are the people they have gotten to know since relocating from Arizona to Cropwell in February. "I have better friends here – and when I say friends, I mean friends, that if you needed something they're there for you," explains Steve, "I have more friends on this peninsula in five months than I had in 32 years in my old house."
