

What is fishing?



"We are encouraging everyone to share their experiences and tell their story on social media this summer," said Brian Worley, a member of the chamber's board of directions. Those who do are



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

arine police Sgt. Kim Collins and her 19-foot SeaArk are a familiar sight on Logan Martin Lake, and she's enjoying serving the boating public this summer, although it will be her last. She is retiring February 1, 2019.

"This will be my last summer on the water, and I still can't believe they pay me to do this job. It's probably the coolest job you can have in law enforcement," she said.

She has been patrolling the waters

of Logan Martin and Neely Henry lakes since May 30, 1996.

Before that, she worked two and half years with the

Calhoun County Sheriff's office.

But this job was her first choice.

"I met lake patrol officer Jerry Roach one day, and I asked him what his job was like. He invited me on a ride along, and I loved it, so I took the test. It just took the state two and a half years to hire me," she said with a laugh.

For 23 years, she has enjoyed every aspect of her job – from conservation of natural resources, to emergency and disaster response, to education and community outreach.

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

enforcement in the state of Alabama, and I am now a national instructor in this field. So, we have a validated field sobriety test that we didn't have when I first started. It's a battery of tests we perform in a seated position on the boat, and I helped develop that program. That's what I leave this agency," she said.

This summer, she is training two marine police officers. Trooper Josh Cox and Trooper Robert Ping are riding with her and learning from her.

"These guys are coming to us from highway patrol, so I'm not teaching them about law enforcement, they already have that experience, but there are a lot of nuances in operating the boat and making sure you are a positive example to other boaters out here," she said.

"Every boating violation is a misdemeanor crime, and we are aware of what a ticket from us costs, but we are also the

ones who have to work the collisions. So we're trying to strike a positive balance between boater education and law enforcement. To make things work out here you have to have both," she said.

Ping said the training is a valuable experience for him.

"I've spent 10 years in highway patrol and everything is very rigid. You drive up and down the highway, and you have your center line and your dotted lines and everything is very straight. But out here, you have an open body of water, and there are no lines. But there are rules. So it's just a matter of learning the rules so I can properly enforce them," he said.

Sergeant Collins wants boaters to know that the marine police are there to help them and they are not a killjoy.

"We're not just the ones writing the tickets. We're also the ones with the spare gas and tow lines. So, we want to be approachable. They need to think of us as people who are out here doing a job, and doing it for a really good reason," she said.

Her future plans include moving to South Carolina and taking a job as a ferry boat captain there. But until then, she is going to savor every sunset, help as many people as possible and enjoy the time she spends with her co-workers. She is thankful for the opportunity she had to serve and protect the people on Logan Martin Lake and she will miss them.

"Everybody knows who Miss Kim is," she said. "After 23 years out here, everybody has a Kim story. Regardless of what the Kim stories are, I feel like I've been awarded people's trust and respect out here."

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AVING SLAME

Social media, Alabama Power, Tradesman Co. work together to preserve shoreline

t isn't easy to locate School Bus Island on a detailed lake map or GPS navigator.

David Smith knows how to find it, as do many longtime Logan Martin residents. The secret, they'll tell you, is all in a name.

"The official name of the island is Grissom Island," Smith said, "That's how you'll see it on a map or GPS. It's a mile and half upstream from the dam on the Talladega side. But those who are familiar with the folklore call it School Bus Island."

And the folklore does involve a school bus.

"There was an old abandoned school bus that had been parked on what is now the island," Smith said. "When the lake was flooded in the 1960s, the bus was just stuck there, and it stayed there for years until one of the floods carried it off."

The erosion that led to the sinking of the storied school bus has concerned Smith for many years. The owner of Star Aerial, a low-altitude photography, videography and survey business, he resides near School Bus Island and has watched its shoreline gradually recede.


"I'm 62, and I've been playing on this lake for over 40 years, much of that time right here in front of this island. I can see it from my deck, and over the


years I've seen it slowly dissolve to its current state. Every time it floods, it seems like we lose another tree, and the shoreline gets softer."

In May, Smith started what he describes as "an idle conversation about doing something to save it" in the All Things Logan Martin Lake Facebook group. He had in mind a grassroots fundraising and volunteer campaign involving "contributions from property owners and business owners and imagined a lot of backbreaking work."

But Alabama Power Company had other ideas. In early June, Smith learned that the utility provider would take up the cause.





Some are serene, tranquil islands









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



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
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
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
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







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
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
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
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














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

For Talladega couple, life on Logan Martin Lake is pretty close to

Searching for a weekend getaway spot 20 years ago, the couple literally had the keys to another property in hand when they decided to view one more house. Mike's father had told a church friend they were looking for a lake house, and the friend said he had one they should see.





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


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

The couple knew they would buy it before they ever walked in the door.

"One of the most important things for us was to find a lake home with a beach because we had four small children at the time," said Peggy, executive secretary of Media Visions Inc. "The first thing we saw was that view and then that it had a beach. It was definitely love at first sight."

Since then, the split level home that, according to Mike, is "small but not a tiny house" has undergone extensive renovations in all areas except the bathrooms, and there's a story there. Peggy has wanted to update for years, but Mike urged her to leave the wallpaper and a few other remnants as reminders of how things were when they bought it. They






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have reached a compromise, however, and in the next few years will add a master bedroom and bath that Peggy will decorate as she chooses.

While the home's footprint is small, nestled among maple trees and neighbors on a 1½-acre spot with

approximately 80 feet of shoreline, it has undergone big changes. One of the most noticeable of all was the removal of two prominent maple trees that had obscured more of their sightlines than they realized.

"We had to take them down because they messed

up our septic system," Peggy said. "He called me and said, 'the trees are coming down' and I cried. I said, 'No, those trees are so beautiful.' Then I got here and looked out and said, 'What other trees can we take down?' It was just amazing."

This allowed Mike to remove a kitchen wall that opened the area up to give Peggy a direct view of the western sky -- and its many brilliant sunsets -- through sliding glass doors that open onto a refurbished, expanded deck. Underneath the deck, Mike has converted an area previously used for parking a tractor and golf cart into a comfortable patio that also affords spectacular views of the lake, the sunsets...and Alabama football games.

Also inside the house itself, the Cruces have turned one of three bedrooms into a combination closet/ office/laundry room that is stunning in its compactness, simplicity and functionality.

Another eye-catching addition is a 30-foot by 40-foot "barn" that on various occasions becomes the hub for holiday dinners, musical jam sessions with family and friends, pool and ping pong tournaments and much more.

Designed around the central idea that Mike and Peggy wanted to shoot 8-ball without their sticks hitting any walls, the "barn" is a showplace area that includes a full kitchen and bath, three bedrooms, a vintage 1980s video game console and a working jukebox. It

also houses lots of memorabilia from their 25-year ownership of Media Visions Inc, a company that provides professional video, sound and lighting services for concert tours, music festivals and large performance venues, including mementos from many recognizable musical groups and recording artists, and other antiques.

Last year, Mike also built his bride of 32 years a "she" shed and laid out a small area for gardening using wooden pallets that produced a nice harvest of fresh vegetables and should continue to do so in the future.

On January 1, 2016, after a series of life's twists and turns they credit solely to God's providence, the Cruces moved into their forever home for good.

Since then they have continued a tradition that took hold some years back among their neighbors and friends on the

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water and along the shore -- many of whom they introduced to lake life as well.

"Every evening when the sun hits the horizon, we count down from 10 and then say, 'Good night Mr. Sun. See you in the morning, good Lord willing and the creek don't rise.'" Peggy said.

"Then we go 'Woo hoo' and my buddy will throw in a 'Roll Tide' and anybody else can throw in whatever else they want," Mike said. "It's become a lake thing."

And one more part of perfection, Peggy said.

"I literally wake up every morning, and I have to pinch myself," Peggy said. "There is something so magical and serene about this area. That we get to live here every day is truly amazing."

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Logan Martin CARDBOARD BOAT REGATTA

hether you're looking for a spectator event that's in a category all its own, or you're one of the adventurous types who take on the challenge, the 2018 Logan Martin Lake Protection Association Cardboard Boat Regatta is a sure bet to delight.

This one of a kind lake event takes off at 10 a.m. July 28 at Pell City's Lakeside Park and entries, spectators and sponsors alike are all being invited to share in the absolutely unpredictable outcomes it brings.

One thing's for sure, the Regatta will entertain, and organizers are encouraging all who love fun on the water to get out and enjoy and be part of the organization's second year hosting the occasion.

There are categories for everyone, eight altogether, that offer opportunities to take home a medal from the light hearted competition.

These include those for single paddlers age 13 through 17, multi paddlers age 13 through 17, parent and child teams for ages nine through 12, a single paddler event for ages 18 through 54, a multi paddler race for ages 13 and up, a battle of the big boats for entries over 18 feet in length and even a paddle with your pet category.

LMLPA will also award its Pride of the Regatta honor to the most creative design of all entries.

It is advised to enter as soon as possible and entry forms and information are available from the organization's website, but event chair Deborah Cearley said entries will be accepted on site the day of the event.

Entry fees are \$30 for families, individuals, and youth and school groups. Fees are \$50 for clubs and organizations

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and \$250 for corporate teams. Corporate entries receive two event t-shirts and a sponsor booth. Clubs and organizations will receive two event t-shirts.

LMLPA began hosting the regatta last year, and had a great crowd on hand to cheer on the entrants, Cearley said.

"We hope it continues to grow and that each year we have more entries," she said. "Ideally, I hope the event can generate enough funds to support a scholarship for students pursuing biologic and environmentally related careers."

Sponsors for the regatta are a huge addition to its success, and these, as well as entries, may be obtained by calling 205-515-1915.

Entries downloaded from the website may be mailed to LMLPA, along with fees made out to LMLPA, to LMLPA, attention Deborah Cearley, 207 Blue Springs Trail, Cropwell, AL, 35054.

Organizers advise boats and crafts be built using manila folders or heavy cardboard and using duct tape to seal adding caulk to edges along with silicone or construction adhesive.

And a few tips include remembering that flat bottoms are recommended for their less-likely-to-tip

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












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factor; longer crafts are faster but are hard to turn.

There are even more tips for building offered on the LMLPA website.

A complete set of event rules is available on the LMLPA website, but it is required that all competitors wear a personal flotation device and shoes.



cooktop, built-in dishwasher, electric self-cleaning oven, built-in microwave and stainless appliances.



"We are very fortunate to be able to live on the water," she said. "It is nice to sit on the deck and enjoy the scenery."



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
