The bees are coming back to Double Cove Park

observation of National Honey Bee Day, but in the meantime, Alabama Power is revamping pollinator plots at five of its recreation sites (including Double Cove Park at Logan Martin Lake), giving us something to look forward to until warm weather returns.

Five years ago, the utility provider developed the plots to promote awareness as pollinator populations of bees, birds, and butterflies have shown a general decline. A partnership between Alabama Power's Shorelines Recreation group and the Alabama Cooperative Extension Service, the goal is to see shorelines "burst with blooms of many colors in spring 2025," according to APC officials.

"When we developed these areas originally, we understood we'd have to re-do the process in five years," said Garret Parker, team leader for shoreline recreation at Alabama Power Corporate

Headquarters. "We're in the middle of that redevelopment process right now."

"The wildflowers come back every year, but over time, you get a lot of invasive weeds and grasses, and sometimes even trees," he added. "They slowly start to get into the plots and outcompete the native wildflowers. So that's what we've been doing – removing the invasive plants and starting back fresh with the native wildflowers blooming next spring and summer 2025 – looking as they did originally five years ago."

It's a two-step process that takes about three months. In mid-spring, a team removes invasive plants and species. In late spring, after treating the plot, they till the soil and plant buckwheat, a common cover crop pollinators prefer. When that planting grows up by late summer, it's time for the team to remove the buckwheat. One more time, they plant buckwheat and let it grow, then till out the plants, allowing

them to start with a blank seed bed.

The last step comes in late fall, when employees plant a wildflower mix from Roundstone Native Seed Co. in Kentucky. Soil samples from each plot are analyzed by Auburn University's Soil, Forage and Water Testing Laboratory. The sample results are sent to Roundstone to develop a pollinator seed mix tailored to each site.

"Thanks to Alabama Power, spring and summer 2025 will greet Preserve-goers with a fresh blanket of colorful, fragrant wildflowers: bergamot, black-eyed Susan, blue false indigo, butterfly milkweed, Indian blanket, iron weed, partridge pea, Plains coreopsis, purple cornflower, spiked blazing star and other varieties," Parker said, "After the plants reseed for five years, shoreline recreation employees will again re-do the plots. "It gives pollinators an area to thrive and forage in. Through the informative signage at each pollinator plot, it also gets this information out to the residents and visitors who use these sites."

Spring and summer can't get here fast enough for me, but January has to come first, and we are pleased to see you starting another year with Lakeside Living magazine. In this issue, we learn about a new local book club, look back on the legacy of a storied football coach, visit a newly renovated lake home, and go out on the lake once again with the Birmingham Sailing Club. And that's just for starters.

HOOK, LINE & SINKER

Start the new year right by properly maintaining for your fishing equipment

With Christmas over, it's time to take those old reels, rods, lures and replace them with the new.

believe it's critical to talk about maintenance and care for your expensive fishing investments. We all go through cycles of tossing old reels and rods in the trash after they have been used and abused, but I'm here this month to shed some light on keeping your equipment in tip-top shape, which will increase the longevity of your equipment and save you money.

The idea of newer is better isn't always the case with baitcast and spincast reels and rods. My absolute favorite baitcasters are the 20-plus-year-old Shimano Chronarchs and Shimano Curados. Go Google or eBay these reels. It's quite impressive to see that these old reels will bring as much as \$200. In most cases, they are worth more now than they were

The main reason these reels are so reliable is

because the older Shimano and Diawa reels were built for the long run. Great internal components have allowed these reels to withstand the tests of time. In no way am I saying that new reels can't hold up just as well. I'm just saying, through personal experience, that newer isn't always better than the older products. Whether it's an old reel or a new reel, taking proper care of your equipment is essential in getting your money's worth out of the product.

January is typically a down month for fisherman, which makes it the perfect time to grease, lubricate, and oil those reels. Stripping down the reel piece by piece and cleaning all of the components is essential. I always perform a yearly maintenance/care week for my reels and rods. Here are some things I always do:

- Read the owner's manual for each reel
- Keep the box and instructions so I can properly lubricate and oil the reel yearly
- Use YouTube and other online resources to make sure I get the proper care for my equipment

Bearings, parts, oil, and grease for reel care are relatively inexpensive, but if you're not a DIY person, I highly suggest that you look into hiring someone to clean your reels once a year. Typically, you can get a reel cleaned for \$10-\$20. This is a small investment on some very expensive equipment. If you don't use them a lot, you can do it every two years. Marks Outdoors in Birmingham, Bass

Pro Shops in Leeds, and The Tackle Box in Oxford will all have leads on reel care technicians. Bearings, worm gears, and other components can be replaced in reels, so be sure to give that a try before throwing it away.

My advice for storage of reels, rods, and fishing line is quite simple. When not in use, try to keep all three out of the sun. UV light is the biggest threat to fishing line and fishing equipment. I always store my line, lures, reels, and rods in an area where sunlight won't directly hit the equipment. For fishing line and reels, I always store both in black containers out of the sunlight during the off season. All of these simple yearly steps and procedures will help you save money and get the most out of your equipment.

CHRISTMAS ON THE SQUARE

brings people together for a one-of-a-kind celebration

T's around 4 p.m., and, as late afternoon fades into early evening, downtown Talladega simply dazzles. The decorations add touches of festive color, the Christmas lights sparkle in the darkening air and bounce off the architecture, and children try to keep their balance on the skating rink just steps away from the Talladega County Courthouse, all making The Square the perfect setting for a Christmas celebration.

Seriously, as you walk around streets, which have been closed for pedestrian-

only traffic, you would swear The Square is being staged for one of those ridiculous but infuriatingly popular Hallmark Channel Christmas movies.

(Not really, but you get the point.)
Launched in 2026, Christmas On The
Square has been the City of Talladega's
premier community event, bringing
people of all ages and backgrounds for
a weekend of food, fun, and fellowship.
It's also a chance to present the city
in the best possible light, according to
Mary Sood, the city's public information
director, and Tena Turner, owner of T.D.
Turner Interior Design.

"It's the highlight of the season for the entire community," says Sood, who begins initial planning on Christmas On The Square in February before kicking into high gear planning the fine details as soon as summer arrives.

"We adopted this eight years ago because we wanted to give back to the community, so what better way than Christmas On The Square," says Turner. One of the primary organizers of the annual event, she says it's important for city leaders and the business community to offer as many free activities as possible so parents can bring their entire families to enjoy their time together without spending an arm and leg.

"Because everything is free, it means parents don't have to say 'I'm sorry, kids, we can come this week because we don't have the money." Turner explains.







"Instead, they can come and everybody can have a good time."

The free activities were plentiful: ice skating, bungee jumping, bouncy houses, and train rides through the Square. The Historic Ritz Theatre held showings of many modern Christmas classes, including Elf, Tyler Perry's A Medea Christmas, Christmas Vacation, and Polar Express, and an accompanying Best Pajama Contest. And, of course, a visit from Santa and Mrs. Claus, all offered on the house.

To present Christmas
On The Square each
year requires hours of
volunteer work, vendors,
and, most importantly,
corporate sponsors who
step up year after year. "I
can't tell you how much







we appreciate our sponsors," Turner says, "because without our sponsors this wouldn't happen."

As you walk around the streets of downtown Talladega, it's easy to get caught up in just how picturesque The Square actually is. The Ritz Theatre (one of the last remaining Art Deco theatres from the 1930s), Michael's Men's Wear, and (across from The Square on Battle Street) the Talladega Bottling Works provide an enticing backdrop for this celebration. Like many downtowns throughout the nation, The Square has suffered its fair share of problems. However, the thousands of people who have come through The Square would indicate a pent-up desire to have a downtown experience. Sure, nostalgia is part of the draw, but is that really such a bad thing? Not if you ask Billy Davis, a long-time Talladega resident and educator at Evelyn D. Houston Elementary School.

Walking around downtown decked out in Jacksonville State gear - his alma mater - Davis spends much of his time





at the event shaking hands and talking with students he encounters. He says Christmas On The Square gives Talladegans and others coming downtown from other locales a chance to experience the city's history while also imagining what is possible for its future.

"We're trying to get back to the great Talladega we used to have in the past," says Davis. "When I was a little kid coming to Talladega from Lincoln, this place was packed on Saturdays, so this is good for the community and for bringing people together."

While preparations are being made for the official lighting of The Square's Christmas Tree, Turner takes a moment to answer one last question: How successful has the 2024 Christmas On The Square been?

"Have a look around and look at how many faces you see smiling," she says. "I think that says it all right there."

The group has been meeting on the third Thursday of the month since it started last summer. Hightower felt the once-a-month time period would give everyone plenty of time to finish their chosen book and simultaneously balance their everyday lives.

"It's really relaxed," she said. "I told the

At the first meeting, Hightower asked the members how they would like to go about choosing their books. A diplomatic approach was ultimately taken to make sure the choices were fair.

book club, so I wasn't really sure how it would work, and I wanted it to be super fair," she said. "So what we did the first meeting, we put all of the titles we were open to into a jar, and we pulled one. That's how we've kept it, and everyone likes it. There are certain genres we've decided we may want to stay away from all together, but it's really forced a lot of us to read things that we never would otherwise."

One such book was the group's October pick, the psychological thriller American Psycho by Brett Easton Ellis. Hightower said she had trouble finishing the heavy novel, but she pushed through so she could contribute to the conversation.

"We analyze the books from different perspectives, so even if you weren't necessarily entertained by it, you can always pull something from it," she said.

Coordinating such a large group of people can be difficult, but Hightower said everyone tries to touch base throughout the month to make sure everyone is on the same page.

"We've even had to extend the timing a little bit," she said. "We were reading A Little Life, and it was a really long book, kind of a hard read, so in our Facebook group we'll comment, 'How is everybody doing? Do you need a little extra time?' We'll still meet to discuss other things or discuss where we are at the time, but sometimes we have to extend because life happens, and we're all working and moms, and life just catches up to you."

Making sure everyone's voices are heard is a top priority for Hightower. Everyone present at the meetings is allowed to speak with no interruptions or judgement. She said some who are more quiet tend to stay to the back and listen, but they have expressed to her that they enjoy coming because they love the camaraderie of the group.

"I'm a pretty social person, and I started to realize that some of the

groups I was part of were more focused on







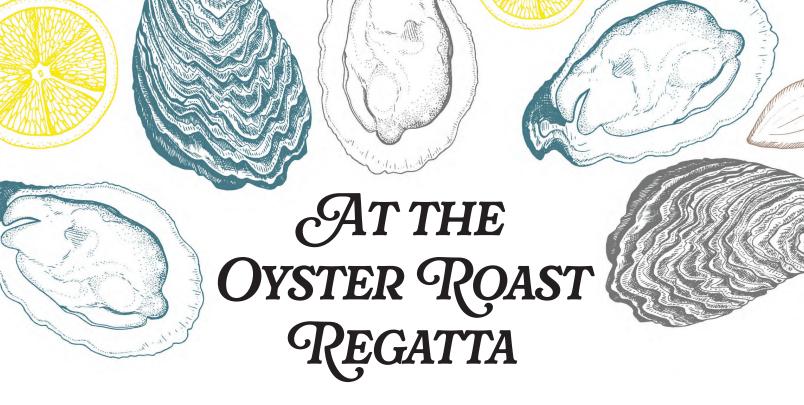


material things and gossip, and I just am at that age where I personally want a healthy group where I can go and I can share things and they can share things," she said. "It's just a place where we're uplifting each other, and it's just always completely positive. I've noticed women who didn't know each other before or they were more reserved, they're getting closer to each other and talking more. It's just so cozy. I love it."

Having such a diverse group of people who share such a strong love of reading is very special to Hightower. She said the root of the group's success is the "commonality" of a love for literature "You go into something not knowing who everybody is or knowing much about the people there but you all share that common ground," she said. "That first meeting where we had the biggest turnout show up, there were different ages and walks of life there, but everyone found someone there that they could talk to and share their opinions of different books with each other. Now, six months later, I think we would all consider each other friends, and it's gone past the love of reading."

nen I was asked to cover the Birmingham Sailing Club's third annual Oyster Roast Regatta on Logan Martin Lake, my first thought was, "Hmmm...don't think I've ever had a roasted oyster."

My second thought was, "What's a regatta?"

After a full day of sailing on a midautumn weekend, I can now say with surety that the BSC Oyster Roast Regatta is simply this: great folks, great food, and great fun.

I know now that a regatta is a sailing race or series of races, but after spending the day with race organizer David Reich and his incredible crew, I also know that the BSC's event is so much more.

For David and his brother Peter, who served as the principal race officer, it is a labor of love that has become an annual salute to their late father, Harry. The elder Reich was a charter member of

the BSC when it was formed by Sam Caldwell back in 1963, and Harry's spirit is very much alive on the BSC grounds in Vincent today.

In fact, it was Harry's passion for sailing and oysters that led to the creation of the Oyster Roast Regatta three years ago.

As his last legacy to the club before his passing, Harry helped raise the money and oversee the construction of a new patio addition to the clubhouse. When it was finished in October 2021, the club wanted to say thanks by dedicating an event to him, and the Oyster Roast Regatta was born.

"My dad loved to eat oysters, so we decided we would have an event that included sailing, which was his first love, and eating oysters to honor him," David said. "It was a huge hit and people said 'We need to make that an annual thing,' so we did."

In a short time, the event has become one of the BSC's most popular. That first year, David and company steamed up 75 pounds of shrimp and roasted 400 oysters — all of which come fresh from Pass Christian, Mississippi, provided by a longtime friend of David's in the seafood business. This year, some 120 attendees enjoyed 120 pounds of steamed shrimp and 600 roasted oysters, but more about that later.

For while the BSC folks really enjoy putting on a good spread and seeing everyone have a great time, their focus, first and foremost, is on the racing.

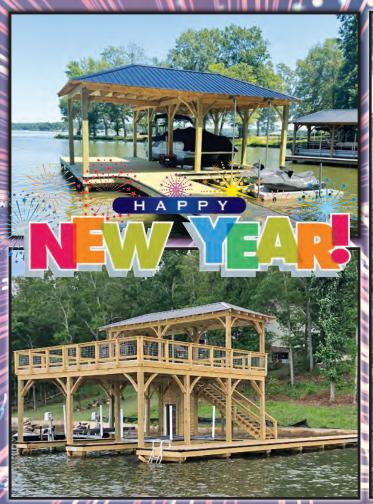

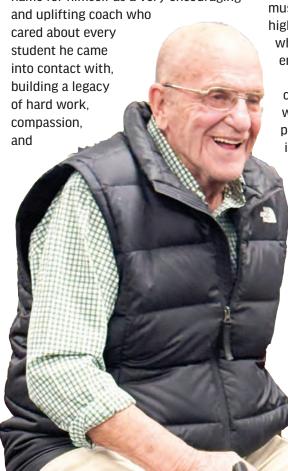
THANK YOU, COACH RICH

The Gateway to Logan Martin Lake celebrates the legacy of a beloved coach and mentor

ate in 2024, the Museum of Pell City took some time to honor a very respected figure in the city's history: Coach Pete Rich.

Rich served as the head football coach for Pell City High School from 1969-1972 and 1989-1990, and his entire coaching career spans more than 30 years. In his time coaching football, Rich made a name for himself as a very encouraging



encouragement.

"It didn't matter if you didn't have a penny to your name or if you were the president's son; he treated everybody equal," his daughter Lori said. "His main focus was that everybody was treated the same. We all bleed the same blood, and I've always admired him for that."

As a special tribute to Rich and his many accomplishments and contributions to the community, the Museum of Pell City made the decision last year to create a spot the museum just for him. The tribute is part of the museum's Digging Deeper series, which highlights people in the city's history who have contributed greatly to its enrichment and growth.

Erica Grieve, the museum's coordinator, said when they were thinking of individuals who personified the history of Pell City, Rich immediately came to mind.

"Coach Rich, he was just such an inspiration to so many people," she said. "He loved every student he came into contact with and really just poured himself into them. I think he's definitely worthy. He's such a great person."

The tribute for Rich includes a special exhibit dedicated to his time coaching as well as a video featuring an interview with him and his brother Lamont and photos from their childhood and Rich's professional career. Grieve said her face was sore from laughing

while filming the tribute video, as Rich and his brother bounced off of each other so well while

reminiscing.

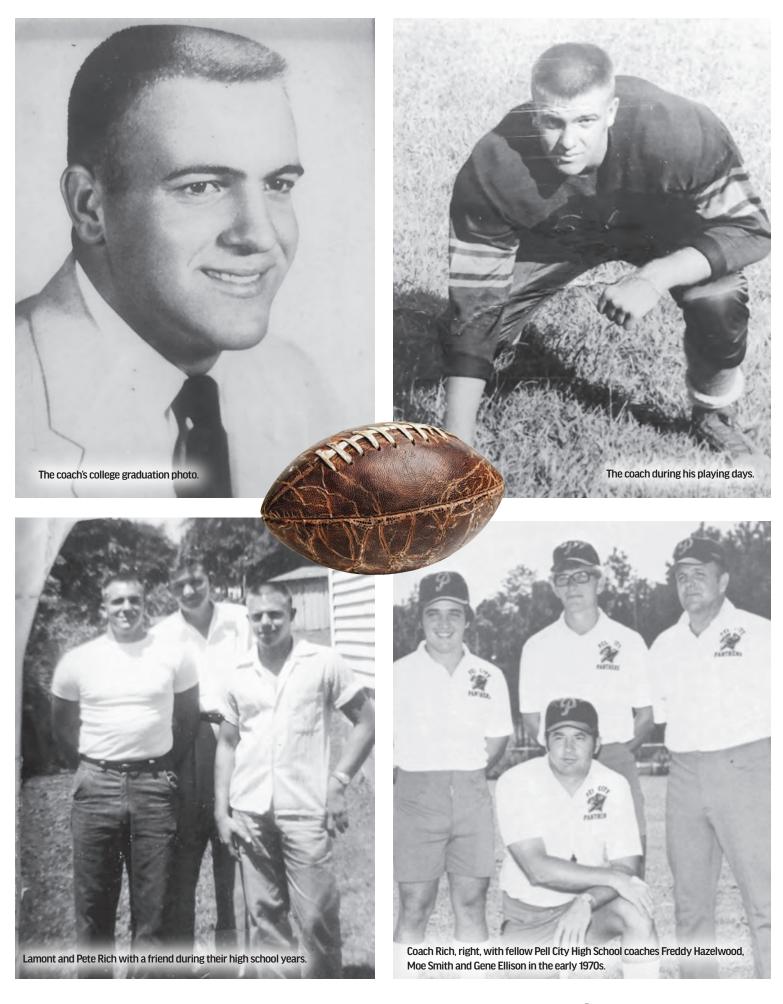

> "I don't know what I've really done to deserve this," the coach said. "I really just appreciate

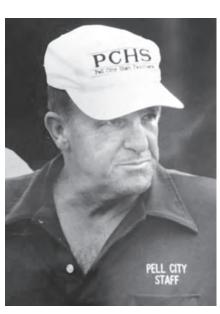

alking along the waterline on the grassy, sandy bank of the lake, I feel the crunch of dried reeds beneath my boots. The wind rushes past, carrying a sharp chill that slips through the seams of my fur-lined barn jacket, making me shiver. Overhead, the whiteness of the sky creates a contrast, its brightness seeming to crystallize the surface of the water into something glass-like. For a moment, I imagine how wonderful it would be if the water were frozen solid enough for me to ice skate in figure eight patterns.

My gaze shifts to my boots, the leather dusted with sand and fragments of broken reeds. Another thought flits through my mind: exchanging these boots for running shoes and sprinting along the lake's edge. The weather feels ideal for it, crisp and invigorating, even as the clouds darken and deepen into shades of gray. The storm is approaching. The winds pick up speed, carrying a faint, electric charge that hums through

I welcome the thought of a storm, especially in winter. The anticipation of unpredicted danger calls for heightened attention to the surroundings, reminding me to assess the need for refuge or make changes. A sudden cacophony pulls my attention to the right, where a large flock of light gray and whitish birds rises over

the tops of longleaf pines and maples. Their stark, pale forms stand out vividly against the swirling gray clouds.

I brush away strands of hair teasing across my face, clearing my view of the mix of ring-billed and herring gulls as they flutter and glide over the lake, seemingly unperturbed by the storm's growing power. The juxtaposition of both

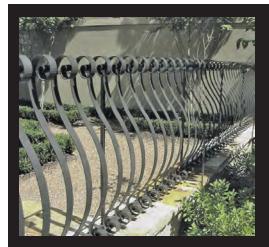

SEEING POTENTIAL IN THE PAST

1960s-era home on Logan Martin's Pell City shoreline gets a modern update

pie Norris is a man of few words. He would rather let his hard work speak for itself, and as you walk through his lakeside home, that hard work speaks volumes.

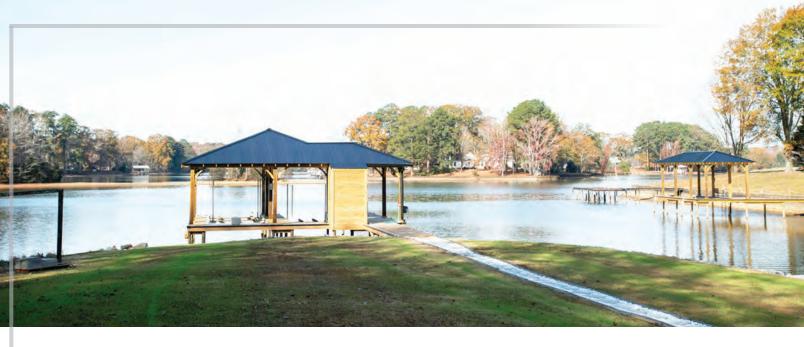
Norris bought the house in April of 2023. He owns a towing business and used to live on Coosa Island. When he decided it was time to move from the island, he reached out to Realtor Natasha O'Konski with Keller Williams Realty to see what his options would be.

"I told Natasha I wanted to get off the island, and I wanted a big lot on the Pell City side of the lake," he said. "I didn't really care about what the house looked like because the budget I was









working with was going towards a house I wanted to work on."

He sold his house completely furnished because he wanted to buy furniture that would match the home he renovated as opposed to accommodating the house around his furniture. After looking at a few fixer-upper options, Norris fell in love with what would soon become his home, though it had nothing to do with the house itself.

"I mainly bought the house because of the lot," he said. "It's on a one-acre level lot, which is hard to find."

The original house was something Norris knew would take a lot of work. It was built in the 1960s, and it definitely still "had the 60s vibe to it" with original shag carpeting, wood paneling on the walls, and bathrooms and countertops finished in the familiar pea-green color

that was so popular in the 60's and 70's.

He started doing the renovations in May of 2023 and made sure nothing of the original structure remained.

"I took it down to the studs," Norris said. "I took the walls out, moved them, added walls. I took all the windows that face the lake out and put French doors in so if you're in the bedroom or the office back there you can walk out onto the back porch."

Norris did all the work with his friend Norman Yeager, who he credits the completion of the project. He and Yeager worked relentlessly, spending as many hours as possible in the day to make the house what Norris envisioned.

"He was a huge part of the design and remodel," Norris said. "He was basically my only help."

The before and after photos of the home really are a testament to Norris's hard work and dedication. Before Norris began construction, the house really did look like something out of a 60s home magazine. Now, the house is a reflection of the best modern aesthetics blended with a captivating, welcoming farm house feel. The wood paneling has been

replaced with sleek white walls and gray marbled brick accents around the fireplace and countertops. The kitchen is much more open with a walkway around the kitchen island and the light paneling of the vaulted ceilings. Long gone is the green bathroom. Now there is stylish white and gray coloring throughout the room, including a large walk-in shower Norris designed.

"I would sit at home at night, and I didn't realize what Pinterest was until late in the project, so I would sit at home at night on Zillow and look at houses that were for sale and I would get ideas off that of modern things people were doing," he said. "One day I was trying to pick out tile, and Norman was like, 'You don't know what Pinterest is?' and so after that I would sit on Pinterest for hours and look at options on there."

He describes the house as farm house style with open lake house aesthetic. It was important to Norris that the house have an open and spacious feel to it.

"I took the beams out in the living room, and it's got a big, vaulted ceiling, and I moved the beams way up and put tongue and groove wood in the ceilings and then





white washed it. And I did the same thing in the master bedroom."

Norris said the last phase of the project that he has to finish is the garage, which is what he plans on doing this winter. Overall, Norris has put \$250,000 into the house. His favorite update, though? The renovated back porch.

"I took the back porch completely off the house and raised it up in line with the roof line and added a fully enclosed bar," he said. "It's got its own heating and air, bar, a 100x TV, refrigerator, everything you need. I always have a bunch of people who love to hangout, so I wanted to build an area they can all congregate."

Overall, Norris is more than pleased with how his home has turned out. It's well worth all the time and stress he and Yaeger put into building and perfecting every nook and cranny.

"During the demolition stage, we would get one problem fixed then find two more," he said. "Ninety percent of the











demo I did by myself, so when it's 900 degrees outside and you're in a house with no air conditioning and you're demoing, you want to ask yourself, 'Would it be easier to just bulldoze the house and start over?' I had many a meltdown in there, but it paid off in the end."

Norris said he encourages people to look at homes on the lake as renovation projects and try to see a house's potential. "A lot of the houses on the lake are older houses, but they all have good bones. People just don't usually have the vision to see what you can do with these houses."

When asked if he had any advice for people thinking about going into a demolition and remodel home project, he said there were two main points to remember.

"Don't worry about your budget," he said. "I went in there thinking I could



go in and spend \$50,000 to \$75,000 to do what I wanted to do and ended up spending \$250,000. Also, don't be intimidated by it. A lot of people don't

do things because they're intimidated or they let the fear outweigh the reward. You got to put that aside and let it play out."

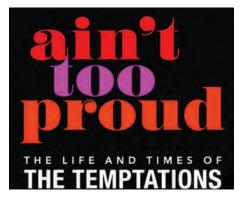

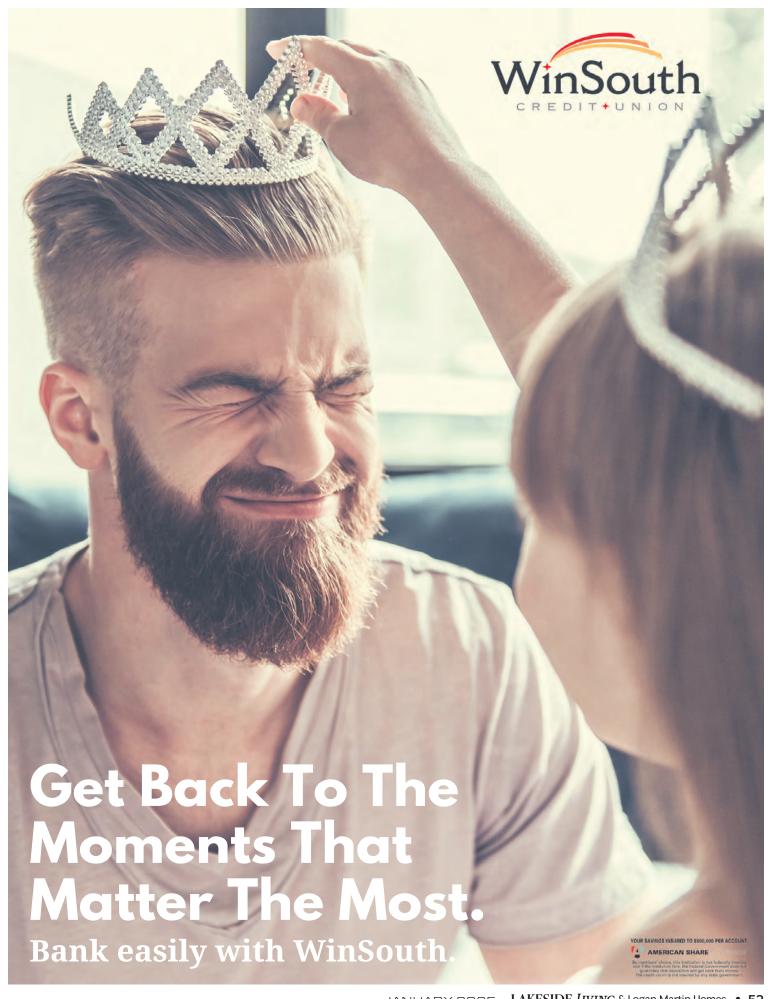

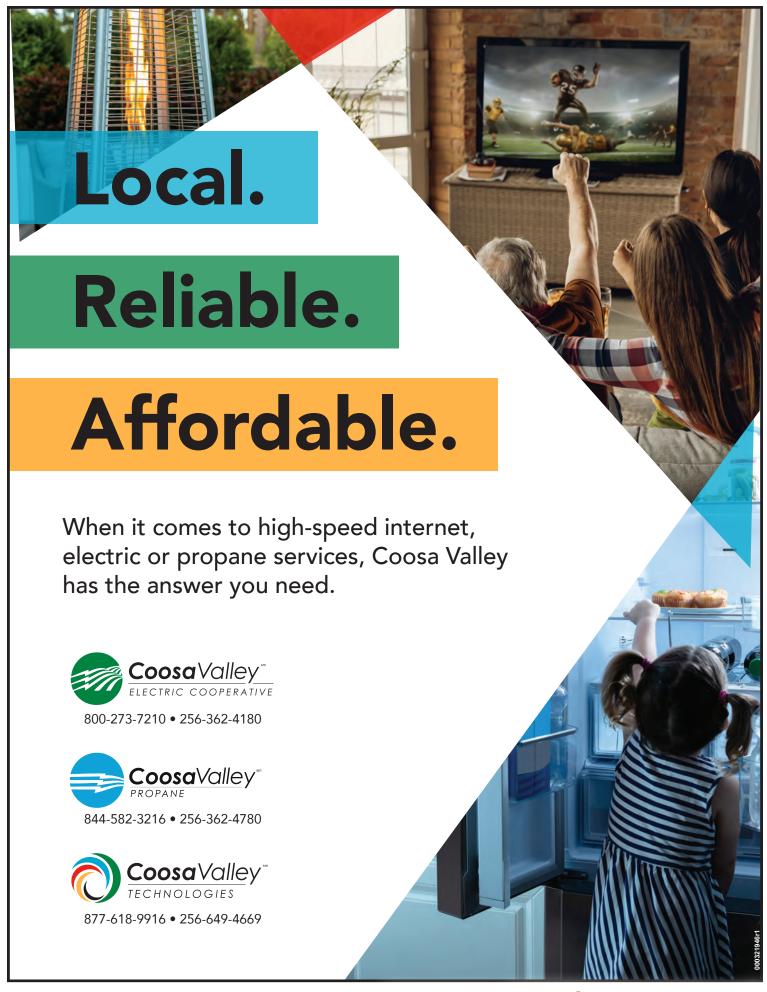

when it got dark, and you got up when it was light, and you sat on the porch listened to the water and the birds and see the animals and the amazing things God created and put here for us to enjoy."

Three things she can't live without: "God. My children. And I think I would be sad if I could never

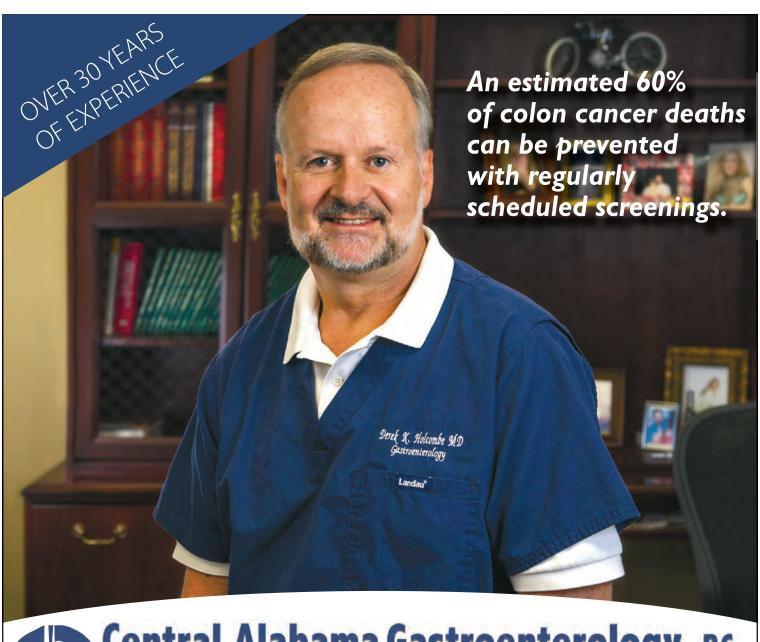
be near water. Water has been such an important part of my life."

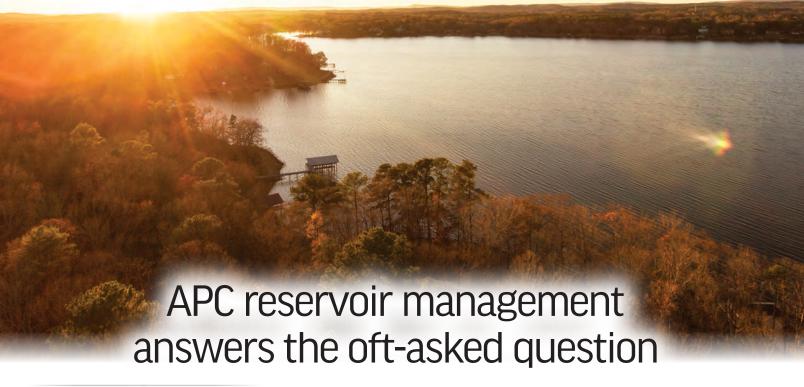

OWHY DOES THE LAKE LEVEL DROP TO WINTER POOL?

any factors go into determining when to raise and lower lake levels and by how much, more than many anglers, boaters, and shoreline dwellers realize, according to Alabama Power Company's manager of reservoir management.

Lisa Martindale and her team are responsible for moving the water in Logan Martin Lake and APC's other managed waterways in a manner that meets the required flows for license compliance, environmental factors, lake levels, rainfall, flood, drought, and navigation.

At the heart of Alabama Power's

work is its 14 hydroelectric generating plants that use the water to provide a portion of the electricity it takes to power two-thirds of the state's residents, businesses, and industry. Some of the lakes are "pass-through" lakes where the water that comes in goes out, and others (like Logan Martin) are storage lakes where dams strategically pool the water to manage its use.

Each Alabama Power hydro plant operates under a license issued by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). These licenses consider the environment and aquatic life on the water, in the water, and along the shorelines, in addition to taking into consideration residential access.

Martindale was recently interviewed about the factors that are involved in setting seasonal lake levels.

What is Alabama Power's role when it comes to lake levels?

MARTINDALE: We are responsible for managing the water within compliance of our licenses. There are two ways we manage lakes. One is, whatever is coming in at the dam is going out, which is called run of river. For example, Lay Lake is run of the river. Then we have storage reservoirs, which act as a battery for the system, and we can hold more water and use it as needed within a range. We have a summer pool and a winter pool for those storage reservoirs that is determined by our FERC license and





the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

A primary objective for us is managing flood water. We use those storage lakes as buffers to move the water down the system. The Army Corps of Engineers sets the rules, and then Alabama Power hydro is responsible for execution.

Which lakes would be an example of storage lakes?

MARTINDALE: Weiss, Neely Henry and Logan Martin on the Coosa River. On the Tallapoosa River, there are Harris and Martin, and then on the Black Warrior River, Smith. These are our storage reservoirs, and they all have a summer pool and a winter pool.

The winter pool is part of the water management plan to make room for the water during a large rain event when almost all the water from the watershed is coming into the reservoir.

How do you determine the

timing for the winter and summer adjustments?

MARTINDALE: That is based on the rule curves in our FERC license and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers water control manuals. Information about the winter and summer adjustments can be found on the Alabama Power Shorelines app and website. This is designed to be a personal lake guide providing lake level information, generation schedule and the latest news.

Why are people so passionate about the lake levels?

MARTINDALE: Higher levels may provide better recreational access. Also, residents say the lakes look better when they are full.

What are some advantages to lowering the lake in the winter?

MARTINDALE: The primary need for lower lake levels in the winter is to provide storage for flood waters. If there was no storage available, then the heavy rains could result in uncontrolled flooding. For the homeowner, the lower levels provide opportunities for maintenance on their seawall or dock.

What do you wish the average person understood about lake levels that maybe they don't?

MARTINDALE: I think education is so important. Particularly in how weather affects our hydro generation schedule and lake levels. Weather and rainfall do not always correlate to adjustments to our generation and lake levels. From my perspective, it seems like a lot of times there is a perception that

rain would drive a need for hydro generation and that is not always the case.

What about the impact on aquatic life? What is the level of concern? How is that regulated?

MARTINDALE: The licensing process contains an extensive environmental review and has requirements on our operations to mitigate for potential environmental issues. There are minimum flow requirements below some of our dams that we must meet.

We have 14 hydroelectric generating plants with 12 of these on Alabama Power lakes and dams and then two are located on U.S. Army Corps of Engineers dams, Bankhead and Holt.

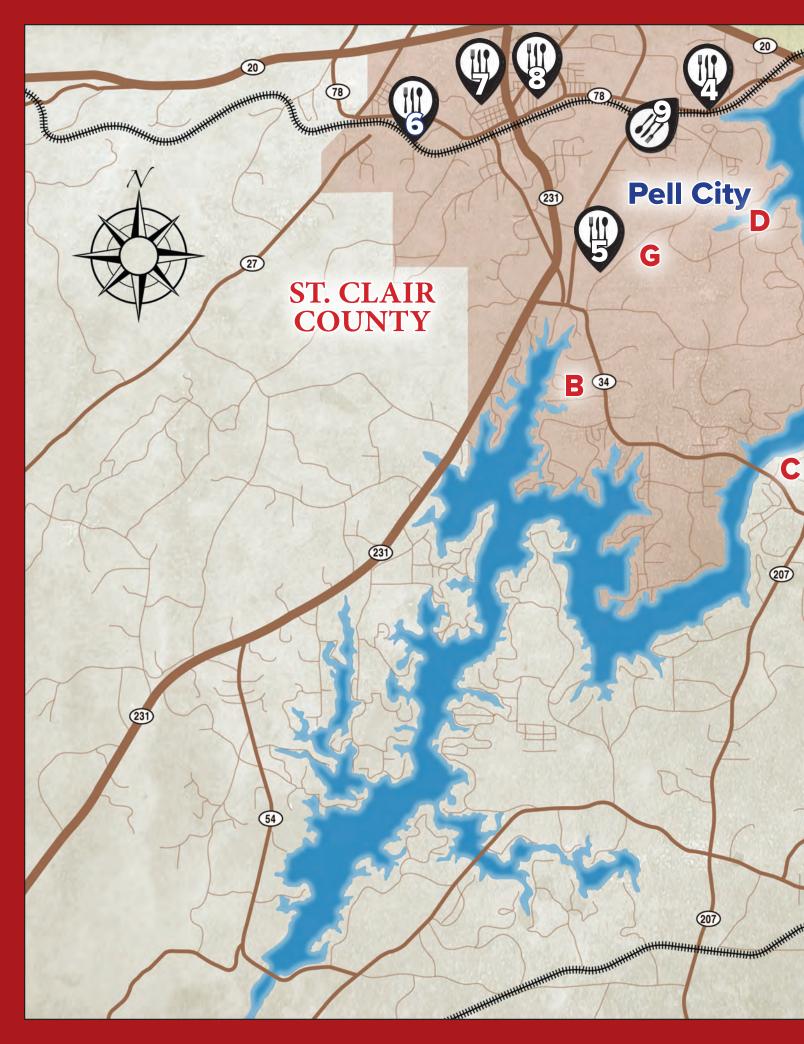
