You could say the kitchen is the heart of Chad and Stacy Pearson's new home in White Plains — specifically, the kitchen lights.

The modern pendant lights hanging over the kitchen island are attentiongrabbing, but they also lend a golden glow to the spacious rooms.

The lights were one of the first things Stacy bought, even before construction started on the house. In a way, the house was built around them.

For one thing, they dictated the size of the kitchen island. "I never thought we'd have an island this huge," Chad said. More than that, though, the golden

MUM'S THE WORD

How to care for everybody's favorite fall flower

Just as the gardener is ready to pitch the hand spade and the smelly gardening gloves, the chrysanthemums burst into bloom, causing us to smile. Mums are popping up everywhere, beckoning us with vibrant flowers. Time to remove weary summer annuals and replace them with fresh faces.

Mums are readily available at big box and grocery stores. There are several farms that grow their own mums and various organizations that sell mums for fundraisers. Wherever you shop, you will find an array of vivacious colors (the hallmark of fall mums)

When you shop, scout for healthy plants whose leaves are dark green; pass on those with yellowed leaves or broken branches. Be particular with any plant you bring into your garden, whether it be for a week or a

Purchase your mums where they are fresh and well tended. If you shop in a store with shelves of mums, ask when the mums arrived and when the next shipment will be there. Shop wisely. Stressed

mums without ample moisture or good care are not happy mums and will not provide the show you desire.

Look for mums with lots of fat buds. Choose mums that are not in full bloom; the color will last longer in your garden. Mums completely bloomed out may be past their prime. Mums which have just "cracked" (meaning that the color of the blooms has just begun to show) are the best choice

Mums can die in a heartbeat. They need regular water and, if they get really dried out, they may not recover.

Once you have your mums at home,

they will need some tender loving care to keep them perky. If the soil seems dry when I remove the

mums from the car, I soak the plants in buckets of water.

By the time mums have enough flower

By the time mums have enough flowers for the trade, they are apt to be rootbound (the roots have taken up the whole pot). Being pot bound may make it more difficult to get the water all the way through the root ball.

Repot your purchases immediately. Choose a larger container (perhaps just a size larger); fill the bottom with fresh potting soil and add the mum. If the roots are really tight, gently separate them. Surround the root ball with more potting soil. Do not fill the pot up to the top as you do not want the water to run over the top and down the outside; the water should get through to the roots.

After the mum is safely in a new container, water thoroughly, making certain the water penetrates the root ball.

Mums need at least four hours of pure sun to remain vibrant. Shorter days require more ingenuity for that special place.

Mums in full shade will not do well. Under a tree or a dark porch may not be the best places.

The most important thing to remember about mums is they do not like their soil to dry out.

If you wait until the leaves are drooping, you have waited too long to water and have stressed your plant. Use the finger check (stick a finger down into the soil) to decide whether your plant needs a drink. Many gardeners will lift the container; if it seems light, time to water.

Removing spent flower heads — called "deadheading" — will keep mums neater and encourage them to continue to bloom.

These guidelines apply to most any flowering plant, but for fall mums they are even more crucial.


I prefer to grow these mums as annuals. When their season is finished, I let them go. I have tried saving them, and they never seem as vivacious the next fall

If you decide to save your annual mums, they will require fertilization and continual pinching to make certain they will get bushier. Mine have always looked a bit skimpy — never like the freshly grown

If you want mums that keep on coming in your garden, choose perennial mums such as 'Ryan's Pink'. Give this fall charmer full sun. Two caveats; it will spread and flop. Share the extras with friends in spring when they come up, or create a new bed. About July, I give them a hard haircut to prevent them from getting too lanky. My


fall perennial mums are glorious. Remember, mum's the word.



VELVET TOUCH

"Velvet is a very misunderstood fabric. It is soft, breathable and very comfortable," said Scott Skinner, owner and interior designer at STS Decorating & Design.

According to Skinner, velvet is so versatile it can be used in almost every type of design style.

"There are even some performance velvets that can be used indoors and for outside furniture seatings," Skinner said. Skinner cautions against making the

common mistake of confusing velvet and velour. "Velour is made from cotton and polyester and is not a true velvet. Some people

think 'velour' as soon as you recommend a velvet piece," Skinner said. "There are many kinds of velvets, so when looking, make sure you look for the nap of the fabric and thickness. Some velvets even have a pattern. Velvet is not a 'one stop shop."

Skinner enjoys using velvets because the soft look and feel can show off the shape of a furniture frame. He recommends accepting one or two pieces.

"Some people think velvets are old-fashioned, but when used correctly, they can really be stunning. Velvet is also a great way to bring in texture to a design look. A velvet sofa can really show off a room," Skinner said.

Velvets come in rich hues and tones, including stunning dark golds and pale golds.

"There are a lot of dark green velvet pieces I've seen in the shops and magazines. I just used a chartreuse for a bench cushion with a deep navy velvet pillow. It's being used in a formal foyer setting with a twist of transitional touches," Skinner said.

If you have children or pets, Skinner recommends using a synthetic velvet because stains will not soak in as deeply, and the material will not fade as much in sunlight.

When selecting velvets with kids and pets in mind, note the rub count of the fabric. The higher the rub count, the better it is for heavy traffic.

'Cotton velvets tend to fade a little more, but don't let that deter you from using them. Plan carefully so your piece isn't in direct sunlight," Skinner advised.

WALLS THAT TALK

Today's wallpaper can bring a pop of color to a room

To the joy of some and horror of others,

wallpaper is back in style! Scott Skinner, owner and interior designer of STS Decorating & Design, acknowledges the stigma surrounding the use of wallpaper but says that in the right situation, wallpaper can be the most joyful

element in a design project. "Even though paint is still the most popular wall covering, when you have a lot of running walls in a home or building, it is good to break it up sometimes," Skinner said. "Wallpaper can be a diversity element

in design and a great contrast with paint." One of Skinner's favorite places to use

wallpaper in is a powder room. "A powder room is generally a small space, but wallpaper can create a huge impact," he said.

Not just for walls

Skinner has also been ahead of the

trend of using wallpaper on the ceiling. "It has always been a classic style, and while I have used it in this way a few times in the past, it seems to be a hot new trend in the decorating world," said Skinner.

He also suggests using wallpaper in the backs of bookcases or the flat part of a shaker panel door, which he has done in a nursery to bring in some color and pattern.

Skinner says a little wallpaper can go a long way to make a statement, but advises considering the furniture scale of a room. Another thing to consider when using very colorful wallpaper is the amount of natural light as opposed to bulb lighting.

New patterns, colors

Wallpaper styles vary from classic damask or stripe to the boldest in abstract and whimsical. Current wallpaper style trends are geometrics, large-scale abstracts and vintage floral. Color tones include corals,

terra cotta, sage green, red and gold tones. The most classic wallpaper is grasscloth, which never goes out of style and comes in

a variety of colors. "I've used a classic brown to a navy color. It all depends where you might need a 'wow' moment. Wallpaper also makes for a great accent wall and can reflect the homeowner's personality," Skinner said.

Removable wallpaper

One of the current trends in wallpaper is removable wallpaper. Removable wallpaper is great for children and others whose styles change frequently.

"Removable wallpapers come in many fun and urban prints and are very cost efficient. You will still need to trim removable papers, and some are even washable. They tend to be less durable and not as strong as a classic pasted paper back," Skinner said.

Once you have selected the wallpaper you want to use, Skinner emphasizes the importance of correct preparation.

"Back in the day when it seemed to be $going \, up \, every \, hour \, or \, so, \, prep \, wasn't$ necessarily at the top of the list. This is why removing wallpaper can become hard and tedious," Skinner explained. "If installed correctly and with a great backing, it will last many years and, when it's time to retire, be easier to take down."

Skinner encourages people to embrace using wallpaper to complement certain

rooms.

"Don't let wallpaper be your enemy. There are many sources online, and most of the time, for a small fee you can order a sample. Think of wallpaper like art; there is something for everyone's taste, from the most traditional to fun and creative. A clas-

sic wallpaper never goes out of style." Faith Dorn has not had wallpaper in her house in over 20 years but is beginning

Gate Builders is a gate manufacturer located in Wellington on Highway 431.

"Gates are pretty and add curb appeal, property value and a sense of security. In today's world, more and more people are looking for that. Some people like them for the 'wow' factor, and others like them for the security." said Alyson Orth, manager for Gate Builders.

"Our slogan is, 'We protect the things you love," Orth said.

Gate Builders' ability to personalize their gates for your style needs can make the gates look like artwork, Orth said. Personalization options include finials, a circle detail, custom oval insert, initials, property name, animals and more. Customers can also decide if they prefer to manually open their gates or use a gateopening system.

Orth said the Southern Bell Curve style gate or a version of it is the company's most popular gate with regard to the gates they sell through Tractor Supply Company.

Gate Builders recently built a gate 31 feet long for a marina and a gate 29 feet long for a location in Atlanta.

"A standard driveway gate is 16 feet long with two eight-foot leaves that open in the center," Orth said, "The smallest we do is a 12-foot single swing-through."

Gate Builders typically uses 11 gauge steel with zinc priming and power coating for weather resistance.

"For larger gates, starting around 24-28 feet, you will want aluminum," Orth said. All materials used by Gate Builders are

Orth came to Gate Builders as a career shift following retirement from a career in education. She was a special education



CHIMNEY CHECKUP

Make sure your fireplace is safe and efficient

Heath Burr owns Heath Chimney Services and has a few recommendations about fire safety as we move into a colder

Burr recommends using a licensed and certified chimney service. Heath Chimney Service is licensed by the state and certified by the Chimney Safety Institute of America. To find a certified company in your area, visit csia.org and enter your zip code, and the website will show you all the certified companies in your area.

"You should have your fireplace inspected annually by a professional chimney company whether it is woodburning or gas, so it burns efficiently," Burr

Another component of efficient burning is having dry and seasoned wood. To ensure that your wood is dry and seasoned, Burr suggests purchasing a moisture meter.

"It has these little probes and gives a moisture reading of the wood. You want 15% to 25% max; anything more than that you wouldn't want to use," Burr said.

Burr suggests one way to tell if your fireplace is burning properly is to go

outside and look up at your chimney while you have a fire going in your fireplace.

The smoke should be almost invisible, not gray or black," he said.

One of the main points stressed by Burr is to follow the intended use of your fireplace.

"It is a fireplace, not an incinerator. Do not burn cardboard or Christmas wrap or Christmas trees. It causes flash heat like at a bonfire, and that flash heat gets above ignition temperature," Burr explained. 'Creosote is the black stuff that gets in the flue, and that gets the fire above ignition temperature and is what starts a lot of

Burr recommends getting your chimney and fireplace looked at in the summer and not waiting until the last minute with the first cold snap.

"Right now, we are booked out through December. We have some availability, but any major jobs would definitely have to wait until December or January. For the last two or three years, I haven't really had a slow season, but the busiest time is usually after the first cold snap through the spring," Burr said. "In spring, we get a lot of calls for air conditioner duct cleaning for residential clients."

Burr says dryer vents are a leading

cause of fires, and recommends dryer vents be checked and cleaned annually.

Fireplace and chimney inspections are recommended even if you do not plan to use your fireplace. A proper chimney cap can help prevent unwanted chimney tenants.

'Chimney swifts and bats are protected, and they want to nest in chimneys without proper chimney caps. You can get histoplasmosis by breathing in bird or bat poop," Burr said.


Services offered by Heath Chimney Service include fireplace and chimney inspections, new installations for gas or wood fireplaces and wood stoves, repairs on chimneys and chimney chases, water intrusions on chimneys, brick and mortar repairs and the selling of gas logs and inserts.

"We do dryer vent inspections and installations. We do pretty much anything around chimneys and fireplaces. We do refurbishments on chimneys and fireplaces and new builds. We sell custom chimney caps, stainless steel or copper," Burr said.

BOWL GAMES

The best way to clean your toilet

Who doesn't love donning some gloves and scrubbing your porcelain throne to perfection? No, this isn't the beginning of some elaborate joke. I truly enjoy scrubbing my toilet on a regular basis.

I know this sounds odd, but I find cleaning to be extremely therapeutic especially toilets and sinks.

I like to clean my toilet once a week, and I like to clean my toilet tank every six

Given my obsession with toilet cleaning, I have tried many different products and methods, and I have perfected the following method:

Start at the top

The most commonly overlooked part of the toilet is the tank. So, we should start

Carefully remove the tank lid and place it gently on a towel on the floor.

Pour white vinegar into the tank, stopping at least an inch below the top rim. Let the vinegar-water solution sit for at least an hour — longer if possible.

Flush the toilet a couple of times to remove the vinegar from the tank.

Turn off the toilet's water valve (usually located near the floor) and flush the toilet again to completely drain the water from

Using a small scrub brush (I like to use an old toothbrush), clean the inside of the

tank's walls. Wipe down the metal parts

with a sponge to remove any rust.

Turn the water back on, flush the toilet again, and confirm the water is clear in both the tank and the bowl.

Replace the tank cover. Standard scrubbing

After your toilet tank is fabulously clean, let's move on to the fun parts: the bowl and seat. I like to begin with Lysol Lime and Rust Remover toilet bowl cleaner (the black label). I apply a generous amount to the bowl, making sure to get as close to the rim as possible. I close the seat and the lid and let the cleaner sit for about 10-15 minutes.

While the bowl cleaner sits, I like to clean the outside of the toilet. I use Lysol all-purpose cleaner in the scent "Lemon Breeze." I spray the outside of the tank, the lid, the base, and every nook I can reach. I then take a cleaning rag and wipe down everywhere I have sprayed. For the harder to reach areas, like around the seat hinges, I use an old toothbrush.

After wiping down the outside of the toilet, I raise the seat and lid and use my toilet brush to scrub the inside of the bowl. I then flush the toilet once or twice to rinse the scrub brush and then place it back in its holder.

Once finished with the bowl, I use disinfecting wipes to wipe the toilet handle, then the toilet seat and finally under the toilet seat.

If you have a rug in front of your toilet, make sure to wash the rug regularly, especially if you have men living in your


