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

Fun on the lake for a good cause

t says much about the lakeside community that so many of the major events that take place on and around Logan Martin benefit worthy causes.

One such event is the Good Works Charitable Foundation Poker Run, which returned in June for its sophomore year. Organizer Jean Speer, who organized the event and serves on the foundation's board, described it as "a huge success, and everyone had a great time."

The poker run launched from Lakeside Landing as a sellout event with 108 participants of all ages, from twenty-somethings to senior citizens. A total of 100 tickets was sold, and 8 promotional tickets were awarded during LakeFest in May.

"We limited the tickets to 100 because it keeps the odds better for the players, but it became the event everyone wanted to be at that weekend," Speer said. "We may extend entry to 200 tickets next year, because we could have sold another 100 tickets all week long."

It is noteworthy about the poker run that all proceeds from ticket sales go directly to the Good Works Charitable Foundation's efforts to help families in St. Clair County. Lemak Health donated the first place cash award of \$2,500, Lakeside Marine donated the second place

prize of a boat service and Coca-Cola donated the third place prize, which was four tickets to Six Flags Over Georgia. A number of door prizes was also donated.

"We didn't use any proceeds for prizes," Speer said. "This is the only fundraiser we do all year, and one hundred percent of it goes to our Community Table."

Held every third Monday at the 19th Street recreation hall in Pell City, the foundation's Community Table helps as many as 700 St. Clair County resident each month, providing them with a hot meal onsite and sending them home with two weeks' worth of groceries – peanut butter, meat, canned and boxed goods, bakery items and fresh fruit and produce.

"Families need groceries, more so during the summer," Speer said, "and we have the Community Table the third week of the month because by then a lot of families are struggling to get through the end of the month. We're here to help them." For more information about the foundation, make a donation or volunteer at the Community Table, call Speer at 205-369-8516.

Another benefit event last month was the Cardboard Boat Regatta, returning to the lake this year thanks to the Logan Martin Lake Protection Association, which you can read about in this issue, which also takes us on a tubing trip, into the newly-remodeled home of a Cropwell couple, offers some tasty summer beverage recipes and spotlights some favorite lakeside activities, places and products.

Summer fishing tips


Spring may get most of the attention when it comes to bass fishing, but that's no reason to ignore the summer. The following tips can help you get the most out of warm-weather fishing.

Don't overlook structures and bridges. Savvy anglers move in close and fish under man-made structures where bass often hide. A short, light spinning or spincasting outfit is handy because it allows for skipping, flipping and ricocheting a small jig or plastic worm into the tightest areas under piers, docks and boathouses. With sonar, ease along bridge pilings to spot any fish concentrations and pinpoint their depth. Back away and cast beyond the pilings before beginning a slow retrieve. Keep the lure close to the pilings, bumping them occasionally.

When a summer storm hits, bass may abruptly quit biting. With lightning or high waves, leave immediately. If it's safe to stay, though, look for bass in the thickest available cover. Position your boat so the wind blows you against the cover. Work a noisy topwater lure to the cover's edge, as close to the vegetation as possible, to draw the bass out.

Consider kayak fishing. It offers the advantage of getting to places on the water that traditional boat or bank fishing doesn't allow. The tradeoff is you can't bring as much gear with you. Pack versatile rodand-reel setups that can help you fish in any condition or with any technique.

Summer on the lake is the ideal season for spending time with family, as well as boating and sporting the latest in lakeside fashions.




Their birthdays are all on July 4, and the three-generation celebration is always a special occasion for

aura Gaddy is a self-described "curious, passionate and persistent" advocate for Alabama.

"I care about my state, and I care about good things happening here," she said during a recent morning spent lakeside. "Alabama has a lot to offer, and I'm proud of that."

As the campsite director for the Alabama Scenic River Trail, Gaddy – who is also a student of fine arts, a toddler mom and an outdoors enthusiast known to extoll the virtues of that most Southern of meals, the garden tomato sandwich with mayonnaise – helps promote the state's natural resources and the recreational and conservation opportunities they offer.

The Scenic River Trail: "It's an aquatic path through the state, the same way as we usually think of trails as paths through woods. The core path is 650 miles starting in northeast Alabama and ending at the Gulf. Most people use it for a day, maybe two, but there are about a couple of dozen people who have travelled the entire trail. Like how Lewis and Clark travelled across America on waterways, the trail offers the opportunity to explore Alabama the same way."

The initiative was started 10 years ago. More information is available at its website, www.alabamascenicrivertrail.com.

The local portion of the corridor: The Coosa River and its tributaries are part of the trail, although Gaddy said most canoers and kayakers prefer the smaller tributaries to the open water of the river.

"The purpose of the trail is to open Alabama's navigable waterways and help the public have access to them. The whole idea is to get people out on the water in paddleboats.

Powerboats too, but primarily kayaks and canoes."


Her role as campsite director: In her volunteer position, Gaddy is responsible for working with landowners and marinas to designate campsites that can be used by boaters traveling the trail. "We look for places that are located right off the water, where you can pull up your kayak, pull out your tent, sleep for the night and go on the next day."

A total of 200 campsites has been designated, but "we want to increase that number to 500, with the goal of having a campsite about every 7 to 10 miles on the river trail." Campsite locations are posted on the trail's website so boaters can map out their trips in advance and "know there's a safe place for them to spend the night along the trail."

Does offering a campsite require a financial investment on the part of a property owner? "No. All they have to do is be willing to provide a patch of grass for two campers and their tents for a night. And there are parameters that campers are expected to work within, because the trail certainly does not encourage trespassing."

It's good for the state: "The Scenic River Trail is a good thing happening here. It brings people to Alabama, which has a positive economic impact and shows off our state's natural resources. A lot of times, Alabama gets a bad rap, which is why I like to talk about the positive things it has to offer."

ever I was out on the boat, and I loved the pecan trees,"
Bill said. "I knew it belonged to Dr. Culver Lee. He was in practice with Dr. Joe Sawyer in Eden. They had one of the only one-day denture businesses in the whole country. As a kid, I worked in town at a gas station across from the courthouse, and I saw cars from Indiana, Ohio and other states.

People would come from all over, because it was relatively unheard of, at the time, to get dentures in one day."


Built in 1970, the five-bedroom, fiveand-a-half bath, two-story brick home sits on 3.5 acres of level land.

"This land used to be a pecan orchard before the lake was created," Karen said. "We have 45 pecan trees on this gorgeous lot. We love the traditional character of the house, but we wanted to open it up on the inside and update it. We wanted to be able to see the lake from every room in the house."

They renovated the kitchen first, and it became the inspiration for the rest of the home.

"The kitchen was a fourth of the

An antique chandelier, original to the home, hangs in the foyer.







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

size it is now," Bill said. "It had a little window over a sink and a sunroom on the other side of it, and the ceilings were two feet lower than the rest of the ceilings."

When they revamped the kitchen, they removed the wall that separated it from the sunroom, raised the ceilings and added a beautiful brick archway. Their new kitchen features an island capped with an impressive, solid slab of granite that measures 5 feet by 10 feet.

"We found this granite in Atlanta,"

Karen said. "It has quartz in it, and the
quartz lights up when you put lights under it.

We plan to add lights later."

The island has a deep double sink, built-in microwave and dishwasher. The paneled refrigerator blends in seamlessly with other cabinetry and matches the door to the walk-in pantry. The pantry is outfitted with an occupancy sensor that automatically turns a light on when it senses motion inside. They also incorporated a wet bar with a mini-fridge along one wall.

The old sunroom is now a beautiful living area with six new floor-to-ceiling windows. The windows provide natural sunlight and allow a breathtaking view of the lake. The space is outfitted with neutral colored furniture, recessed can lights and hardwood floors.

"There were so many things that we did keep," Karen said.

"We have two chandeliers that are original to the house. When we took them to be cleaned and rewired, they told us the chandeliers were from the late 1800s and were originally candelabras. They were wired for electricity sometime in the 1900s."

In the dining area, the natural grasscloth wall covering is also original to the house. "The contractors worked really hard when we were removing walls, not to mess it up. In the seventies, every room was its own separate room. So we took out walls and doorways and opened up the dining room," Karen said. One of the antique chandeliers hangs over the dining table.

The kitchen, foyer and formal living room are visible from the dining room. "We added a fireplace and mantel to the formal living room," she said.

The foyer is painted a magnificent teal color, and it was an easy decision for Karen to make.

"When we started, I said I wanted a beautiful color for the foyer. The guy at Sherwin Williams showed me this color first, and I said, 'That's it,' she said, laughing. This teal color is incorporated in various ways throughout the home, adding pops of color to the neutral palette. The other antique chandelier hangs from this ceiling, and a curved staircase leads upstairs.

In the master bedroom down the hallway, a king-size bed faces large windows overlooking the lake. "When you wake up in the

middle of the night, and the moon is shining, it is such a pretty view," Karen said.

The bedroom features his and hers separate bathrooms and a luxurious steam shower in the middle that is accessible from both sides. "Other than the lot, this is what made us love this house," she said. Their separate bathrooms have built-in drawers and space to hang their clothes, so they also serve as dressing areas. Television screens behind the mirrors allow them to watch their favorite programs while getting dressed.

One of the most interesting features they added to their home is an elevator. "It really worked out great when we were moving in, because I recently had knee surgery, and I couldn't climb up and down the stairs," Karen said.

Bill and Karen said they had some ideas of what they wanted when they started the remodel, but there was no strict plan. "We never had plans drawn up," Bill said. "We just went with what we had in our minds, and sometimes we changed our minds as we went along.

The steam shower offers a spa-like experience. It is outfitted with a large rainfall shower head.








THE REGATTA RETURNS

day before the regatta. Their boat came together after four hours of work and 7 rolls of duct tape.

Finishing second was *The Joker*, paddled by Joe White and his grand-children.

"It started out as a Batman boat

for the grandkids," White said. "My brother said that it would be just jokers that were driving it, so we decided decorate it like the Joker. The grandkids would rather see him sink than Batman, anyway."

White added that his creation



ecently, I overheard my friends discussing "floating the creek" at Talladega Creekside Resort. They were talking about tubing and kayaking, and it sounded like something I had to try. So a couple of Saturdays ago, I put on my water shoes, grabbed the sunscreen and headed over to the campground on Lake Whitland Road for a fun-filled day.

I had every intention of renting an inner tube, but my friends persuaded me to rent a kayak instead. My friend Beth brought her own kayak, her 10-year-old grandson Jaylan and enough ham sandwiches to feed all of Alabama. Keith and Susan rented kayaks, and Lindsey and Sean rented inner tubes and a floatation device for their cooler. Resort staff members loaded these onto the back of a trailer that was hauled by a shuttle bus.

We boarded the bus, and a driver took us about 3 miles up the road to a drop-off point with a floating pier. He made sure we all had life jackets and paddles, and we put our rentals into the shallow, crystal clear water of Cheaha Creek. When everyone was in, I sat down in the






Cabins at Talladega Creekside Resort are ideal places to unwind and spend a relaxing night after a long day paddling in the kayak.

kayak and picked up my paddle. It had a curved blade at each end and foam rubber grips about shoulder-width apart.

Paddling the kayak was relatively easy, once I got the hang of it. Paddling on the left made the front of the kayak swing right, and vice versa. A steady rhythm of left, right, left, right, propelled me straight forward. I practiced my technique in the shallows, and feeling confident with this new skill, I let the gentle current take me downstream.

I followed my friends as closely as I could, but because this was the first Saturday without rain in a while, there were about 30 other people on the water, too. I maneuvered my kayak, bumping into more people than I care to admit. They were all forgiving and very understanding when I apologized and told them I was "new." I eventually caught up with my friends, and we floated together as the sun peeked from behind the clouds.

Lush, dense greenery lined the banks of the creek. A variety of hardwoods and wild, flowering bushes lent a sweet, woodsy fragrance. Tall trees on both sides of the creek bent over the water as if they were trying to embrace high above me. Further downstream, the water was deeper and the current was faster, but it was never too deep or too fast for me.

We beached ourselves on a small strip of sand and pebbles on the left side of the creek. We ate the sand-wiches and fruit Beth brought in her cooler. While we relaxed, Keith taught Jaylan to skip rocks on the surface of the water.

Other people were beached there as well. I spoke to a family from Anniston. The mother said she had been bringing her three children there for three years, and they all loved it. Everyone I encountered was laid-back and friendly. One man even offered to help me shove off when I got back in the kayak to continue downstream.

As I paddled, I completely lost track of time. I enjoyed the sunshine and being outdoors with my friends. Lindsey pointed out a freshwater turtle sunning himself

on a tree branch sticking out of the water while another turtle swam nearby. Sean said horses from a nearby pasture sometimes come to the creek to drink.

I only paddled to keep myself in the middle of the creek. The current did the rest. At one point, I briefly got stuck on a submerged rock outcrop in waist-deep water. I tried pushing against the rocks with my paddle, but the kayak did not budge. Keith turned around and came back to help. He gave it one good push with his hand, and I was freed.

As we approached the end of the trip, Susan mentioned we had been in the creek for four hours. I couldn't believe time had passed so quickly. We all paddled to the dock with a big red EXIT flag, and waited our turn to get out of the water. I climbed a metal ladder onto the dock while Beth and Keith held my kayak. The staff at Talladega Creekside Resort took over from there, loading our kayaks and inner tubes back onto the trailer.


Hot summer days are definitely here, and I am glad to know there's another way to experience a day on the water. I can't wait to go back again.

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
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






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



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Cropwell home offers plenty of indoor and outdoor amenities

ituated in a picturesque setting, the property at 240 River Oaks Drive in Cropwell offers plenty of amenities for prospective homebuyers looking for the full lakeside experience.

The 4-bedroom, 3.5-bathroom home features a den/family room with vaulted ceilings and wood-burning fireplace, office/study, laundry room, a bay window, security system, wet bar and hardwood floors throughout the main level. A spacious dining room is adjacent to the kitchen, which has solid-surface countertops, an island and a pantry.

The master suite is on the main level, accompanied
