What is the Sunny King Criterium bike race?

Racers from amateur to Pro level will compete all day long in multiple races. It's the kick-off race on the official USA Cycling Professional Road Tour, meaning...it's a big deal! Top professional male and female athletes from across the U.S. will compete for more than \$50,000 in prize money for the weekend. "Criterium" is a bicycle race held on a one-mile or shorter course with multiple laps, so you'll see these athletes going around and around, led by the Sunny King Auto Pace Car. So make some noise! See the winners of more than 21 categorized races crowned on the Sunny King podium, located at at E. 11th Street near Noble

Street. Enjoy the race by listening to the live announcers all day, or watch the action near the Start/Finish on the Jumbo-Tron. And if you can't be Downtown all day, watch the races online at www.AnnistonCycling.com.

What are the kids' bike and running races?

So popular...so fun! The Mellow Mushroom Mad Dash running race for kids is an exciting, one-lap trot around the three-quarters of a mile bike race course, with a super awesome finish before fans! The Who, What, Where of Watching Pro Cycling Events in Anniston

The Alabama Cycling Classic combines the Sunny King Criterium, now in its 15th year, and the McClellan Road Race with the Noble Street Festival in downtown Anniston. In 2016, more than 500 cyclists competed in cycling events over the weekend, with the pro and elite riders competing for \$40,000 in prize money and national points on the prestigious USA Cycling Professional Road Tour. So who are the best pros in the races, and where are the best places on Saturday to watch the action near the Noble Street Festival?

HOW TO WATCH THE CRITERIUM:

- The start/finish line of the Sunny King Criterium will return to 11th and Noble streets in downtown Anniston, with 21 categorized races for pros and amateurs, and children, held from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m.
- There is a sound system all around the race course for the Sunny King Criterium. From any of the four turns you can follow the action from live announcing by Tour de France veteran and Olympic cyclist Frankie Andreu!
- Walk counter-clockwise around the course to see the racers pass by multiple times. Pick a spot along the way and feel the whirl of wheels when they speed by!
- Bring a camera! Not only can you take photos as the racers go by, but there is an awards stage set up near the start/finish that is accessible to all fans to watch ceremonies.
- Can't stay for the full day of racing? No problem. Go to AnnistonCycling.com and watch the live streaming powered by Alabama Power on your computer or mobile device!



WHO TO WATCH:

- The Papa John's Racing presented by TREK, UnitedHealthcare Pro Cycling Team and Visit DallasDNA Pro Cycling women's teams are stacked with talent this year.
 - Wearing red and black cycling kits are the Papa John's Racing team, which includes Tina Pic of Utah and Kim Pettit of Oklahoma. Pic has won more than 80 criterium races in her 20-year career, including on the Sunny King Criterium two times. Pettit is another veteran with six national titles in road racing.
 - Look for the "Blue Train" of UHC to include Lauren Hall of Colorado (two-time silver medalist at U.S. Pro Road Race national championships) and Kate Sherwin of Texas (state marathon mountain bike champion). Hall also played SEC soccer at Miss. St. before turning pro as a cyclist.
 - The Visit Dallas DNA team will include Katie Clouse of Colorado (19-time junior national champ in multiple disciplines) and Mandy Heinz of Texas (third at the 2016 U.S. Pro Road Race national championships)
- On the pro side for the men, three of the top teams are Cylance Cycling, Holowesko I Citadel presented by Hincapie Sportswear and UnitedHealthcare Pro Cycling Team, all bringing full squads for the weekend.
 - The defending champion for the Sunny King Crit is Travis McCabe. He returns with UnitedHealthcare this season and already has stage wins at the Tour of Langkawi in Malaysia and Herald Sun Tour in Australia.
 - The 2015 Sunny King Criterium champ, Ty Magner returns with the black kits of Holowesko I Citadel. Hewillbe supported by five teammates, including Oscar Clark, who won the 2016 McClellan Road Race.
 - Wearing the green and black kits of Cylance Cycling is Karl Menzies of Australia, who won the Sunny King Crit in 2009. His teammate, Eric Marcotte of Arizona, is a former national champion in the U.S. Pro Road Race (2014).


