What is "Taste on Noble"?

"Taste on Noble" is a great showcase of area restaurants. Nearly a dozen local restaurants in tents along Noble Street will serve up some teasing for your taste buds from 11:00am to 7:00pm. Enjoy modestly priced snacks, lunch and dinner while relaxing at outdoor tables in a festive atmosphere. And a portion of all the day's food ticket sales supports our donation to Calhoun County Relay for Life!



What is the Sunny King Criterium bike race?

If you haven't experienced the pro cycling event, DO check it out! It's NA-SCAR on 2-wheels! Some racers will zoom by you at speeds in excess of 35mph! Racers from amateur to Pro level will compete all day long in multiple races. It's the kick-off race on the official USA Cycling Professional Road Tour, meaning...it's a big deal! Top professional male and female athletes from across the U.S. will compete for more than \$50,000 in prize money for the weekend. "Criterium" is a bicycle race held on a one-mile or shorter course with multiple laps, so you'll see these athletes going around and around, led by the Sunny King Auto Pace Car. So make some noise! See the winners of more than 21 categorized races crowned on the Sunny King podium, located at E. 11th Street near Noble

Street. Enjoy the race by listening to the live announcers all day, or watch the action near the Start/Finish on the Jumbo-Tron. And if you can't be Downtown all day, watch the races online at www.AnnistonCycling.com.

What are the kids' bike and running races?

So popular...so fun! The Mellow Mushroom Mad Dash running race for kids is an exciting, one-lap trot around the three-quarters of a mile bike race course, with a super awesome finish before fans! The Mellow Mushroom Mad Dash starts at 4:50pm. Kids from tricycle-age to Grade 6 will pedal their bikes a few hundred yards, and cross the "big kids" Finish Line of the Sunny King Criterium course in front of thousands of cheering fans. The YMCA Kidz Bike Race will start at 5:20pm. Have your cameras ready, and get ready to post and tweet! There is a fee to participate in each race (and a discount if kids race both); register at Classic on Noble on Saturday, April 8th, from noon to 4:00pm. T-shirts for every participant (while supplies last)!

Is this a family event?

Absolutely! Kids of ALL ages will find Saturday afternoon in Downtown Anniston fun, entertaining and giggle-worthy!



Is there a cost to attend?

The 2016 Noble Street Festival is FREE to attend! Many of the activities for kids are free, including art activities and projects, performances on the Sunny King KidZone stage and more! Some kids'



attractions, such as rides, bouncy houses, face painting, and balloons do require tickets, which can be purchased from the designated BB&T ticket tent located at the intersection of 10th St. & Noble St. Cheering on the cyclists from around the world at the Sunny King Criterium is free.

Are dogs allowed?

Dogs are allowed; in fact, we will have an area in the KidZone benefiting the Humane Society, however, they MUST be kept on a leash at all times! The cyclists speed around the race course at very high rates of speed, and a runaway dog in the road would be very dangerous. Thanks for keeping your best friend close to you at your side!

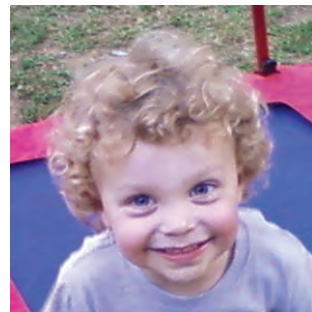

The Who, What, Where of Watching Pro Cycling Events in Anniston

The Alabama Cycling Classic combines the Sunny King Criterium, now in its 15th year, and the McClellan Road Race with the Noble Street Festival in downtown Anniston. In 2016, more than 500 cyclists competed in cycling events over the weekend, with the pro and elite riders competing for \$40,000 in prize money and national points on the prestigious USA Cycling Professional Road Tour. So who are the best pros in the races, and where are the best places on Saturday to watch the action near the Noble Street Festival?

HOW TO WATCH THE CRITERIUM:

- The start/finish line of the Sunny King Criterium will return to 11th and Noble streets in downtown Anniston, with 21 categorized races for pros and amateurs, and children, held from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m.
- There is a sound system all around the race course for the Sunny King Criterium. From any of the four turns you can follow the action from live announcing by Tour de France veteran and Olympic cyclist Frankie Andreu!
- Walk counter-clockwise around the course to see the racers pass by multiple times. Pick a spot along the way and feel the whirl of wheels when they speed by!
- Bring a camera! Not only can you take photos as the racers go by, but there is an awards stage set up near the start/finish that is accessible to all fans to watch ceremonies.
- Can't stay for the full day of racing? No problem. Go to AnnistonCycling.com and watch the live streaming powered by Alabama Power on your computer or mobile device!



WHO TO WATCH:

- The Papa John's Racing presented by TREK, UnitedHealthcare Pro Cycling Team and Visit DallasDNA Pro Cycling women's teams are stacked with talent this year.
 - Wearing red and black cycling kits are the Papa John's Racing team, which includes Tina Pic of Utah and Kim Pettit of Oklahoma. Pic has won more than 80 criterium races in her 20-year career, including on the Sunny King Criterium two times. Pettit is another veteran with six national titles in road racing.
 - Look for the "Blue Train" of UHC to include Lauren Hall of Colorado (two-time silver medalist at U.S. Pro Road Race national championships) and Kate Sherwin of Texas (state marathon mountain bike champion). Hall also played SEC soccer at Miss. St. before turning pro as a cyclist.
 - The Visit Dallas DNA team will include Katie Clouse of Colorado (19-time junior national champ in multiple disciplines) and Mandy Heinz of Texas (third at the 2016 U.S. Pro Road Race national championships)
- On the pro side for the men, three of the top teams are Cylance Cycling, Holowesko I Citadel presented by Hincapie Sportswear and UnitedHealthcare Pro Cycling Team, all bringing full squads for the weekend.
 - The defending champion for the Sunny King Crit is Travis McCabe. He returns with UnitedHealthcare this season and already has stage wins at the Tour of Langkawi in Malaysia and Herald Sun Tour in Australia.
 - The 2015 Sunny King Criterium champ, Ty Magner returns with the black kits of Holowesko I Citadel. Hewillbe supported by five teammates, including Oscar Clark, who won the 2016 McClellan Road Race.
 - Wearing the green and black kits of Cylance Cycling is Karl Menzies of Australia, who won the Sunny King Crit in 2009. His teammate, Eric Marcotte of Arizona, is a former national champion in the U.S. Pro Road Race (2014).

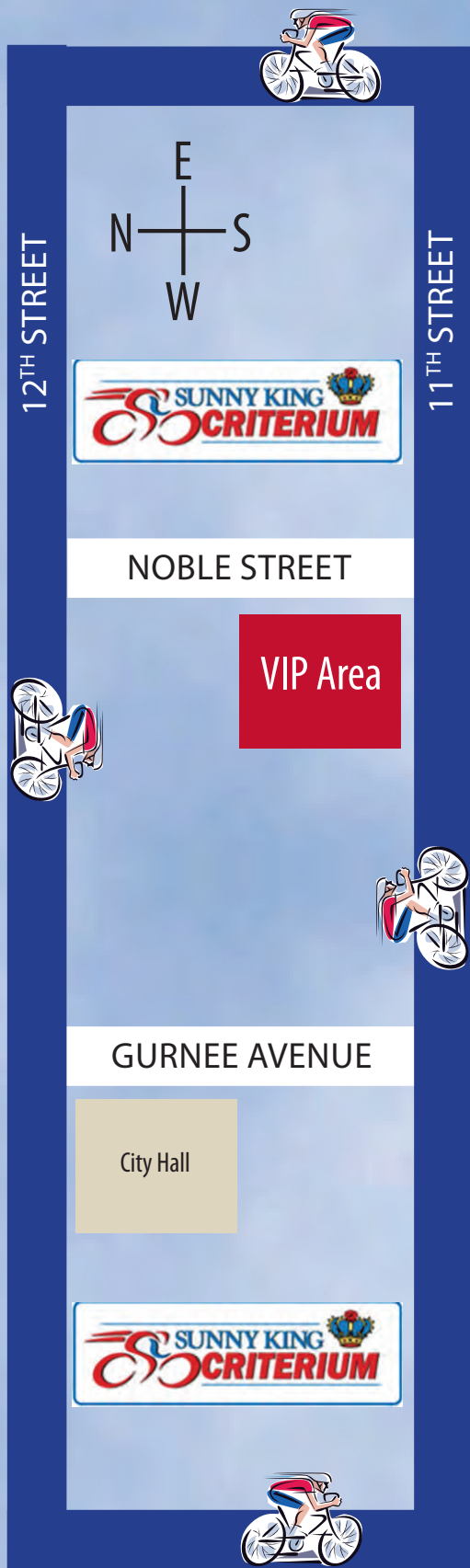

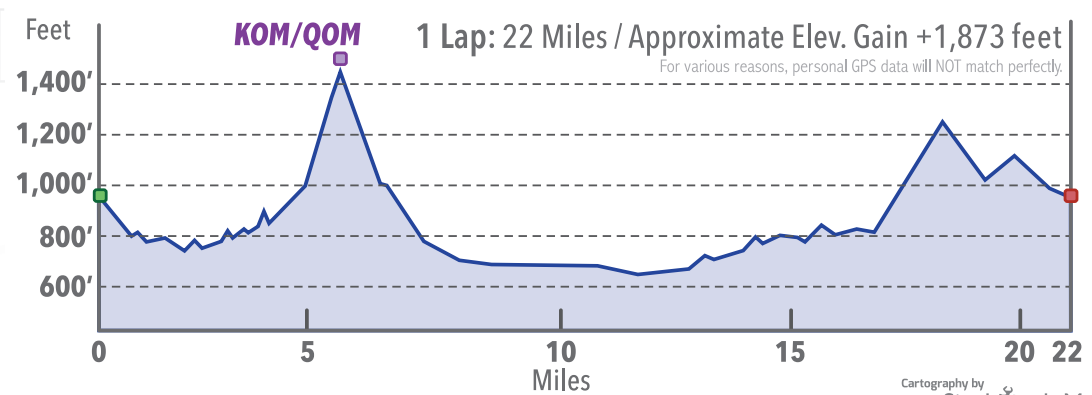

HOW TO WATCH THE ROAD RACE:

- The McClellan Road Race is exclusively for professional women and men, who travel from all across North America to compete. The challenging course includes climbs over Bains Gap.
- One of the best places to watch the races is from the start/finish area at Historic Buckner District in the area of the former Fort McClellan. Live race announcing can be heard from the awards stage all day from former Tour de France veteran Frankie Andreu.
- Parking is available along Summerall Gate Road. Check out team vehicles and meet some of the athletes!
- The tree-lined street at Buckner Circle is a beautiful place to have a picnic and cheer on the riders. Each race will pass through this area on each lap, including a ceremonial lap for the starts.
- Make sure to use the streaming app to listen to the web cast of the road races (starting at 10 a.m. CT). Brad Sohner will call the action on this broadcast, available at AnnistonCycling.com.

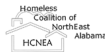

I ask my husband "What do you want for lunch?" His response is usually, "Whatever I don't have to fix myself." He and I are blessed to be able to go to the store, purchase groceries and prepare our own meals in our own home. We are only restricted in our diet by our preferences,

culinary skills and how strict we feel like adhering to our weight loss program. The clients of meals on wheels are blessed to have the entire dietary unit at Stringfellow Memorial Hospital taking care of lunch for them each weekday. Baked chicken, pork tenderloin, lasagna, baked fish, meatloaf, garden salad, fruit, vegetables, cookies, cake and more are items usually on the menu for Meals on Wheels clients in Anniston and

Oxford. While our clients do not get a menu to make selections from, they are offered an opportunity to set preferences in their meal plans. The dietary unit is able to prepare diet-specific meals for each client. Diabetic meals, cardiac diet plans, food allergies and simple food preferences are all recorded for each client and are taken into account as each tray is prepared for home delivery. Any time a client decides they prefer not to get a certain food item again, all it takes is a phone call to the Meals on Wheels office and the restriction is added to that client's specific diet plan. One thing is for sure, every meal includes love.

Who Is a Meals on Wheels Client?

The answer to the question is simple. He is your neighbor. She's the single widow living right down your street that you rarely see. They are the elderly couple around the corner, still living in their beloved family home. They are the disabled sisters

living together because they must pool their resources in order to maintain a basic quality of life. Most no longer drive. Some have no family and some have lots of family right here in the area. Meals on Wheels is a mission dedicated to bringing consistent nutrition to senior citizens aged 60 and above. Meals on Wheels in Anniston/ Oxford has been

in service for over 30 years carrying out this mission. Our clients are unable to provide this basic need for themselves on a routine basis. Many medical studies have been done on the importance of senior nutrition, and the consensus is that when

our older neighbors get a balanced diet they stay healthier and are able to remain in their homes longer. Right now we have 11 routes that deliver a hot lunch Monday through Friday in the Anniston/Oxford area. We are all very fortunate to live in a community that has such a long history of giving of our time and resources, and caring for one another. Meals on Wheels charges \$6.50 per meal, and bills clients at the end of each month. Financial assistance is available and a confidential financial assistance assessment is completed for any client who cannot meet the regular cost of the meals. Perhaps you have a neighbor, a family member, or an acquaintance from church who may be interested in Meals on Wheels. Contact the directors at 256-237-4538. If you have a group that would like information we are available to speak at meetings and gatherings. Meals on Wheels continues to be grateful and thankful for the generosity that continues to be shown to your neighbors in Anniston and Oxford.
