Color, flavor and spice from the garden Sweet and hot peppers are ideal for Alabama climate

There are more than 20 species of peppers in the world, and hundreds of varieties.

Alabama gardeners, however, are most familiar with two kinds: sweet and hot.

Sweet pepper varieties include bell, paprika, pimento, banana and cherry peppers. The name is a misnomer because not all sweet peppers are sweet. This category refers to those peppers without heat. They are typically used for flavoring, cooking or

stuffing. Hot peppers include cayenne, red and green chili, jalapeño and the red-hot pepper. This variety is usually

used as a spice in food. Peppers are easy plants to grow and don't take up much garden space. Pepper plants are ideal for Southern gardeners because they favor warm temperatures. You may grow peppers from seeds or buy plants in

flats as a local nursery. Dr. Joe Kemble, an Alabama Extension specialist of commercial horticulture, said when choosing plants

recipes.

in flats, it's best to select plants with green, strong foliage.

"Be sure there are no suspicious looking spots on the leaves and stems," Kemble said. "Many diseases enter the home garden from infected transplants. Check the tag or label for additional information about the variety, shape, size and flavor."

Plant peppers in a location with full sunlight (at least 8 hours of direct sunlight). Be sure the site does not receive too much wind. A strong wind easily breaks the pepper's delicate stems after transplanting. Also be sure that the site drains well.

"The planting hole should be slightly larger than the soil ball surrounding the roots of the plant," Kemble said. "Plant the pepper slightly deeper in the garden than it was in its container. Space holes about 12 to 18 inches apart."

After planting, water the plants well and regularly check them the first weeks for wilting or drooping. Growers can also

add mulch around the plants to help conserve moisture and control weeds.

Peppers can be harvested with they are ripe or unripe. Sweet peppers become sweeter and hot peppers become hotter as they mature. Your personal taste should determine when you want to harvest peppers. Be gentle when pulling peppers off the plant to avoid damaging the plant. Plants can often be rather brittle and break apart easily.

Six to eight plants should provide a family with enough peppers to last through the summer. Peppers can be stored fresh, frozen, dried or pickled, so you don't have to worry about a bumper crop spoiling.



How to protect your yard from damaging pests

Homeowners often find evidence of animals digging in their yards. Squirrels, chipmunks, armadillos and moles are often the culprits.

According to Dr. Jim Armstrong, an Alabama Extension wildlife specialist, the first rule of protecting a yard is identifying the animal.

"Once you know which animal is causing the problem, it will be easier to come up with a solution," said Armstrong. "There are several ways to get rid of pests, but not every method will work for every pest."

Armstrong said there is one animal that is often the culprit.

"The majority of complaints about yard damage involve armadillos rooting up the yard in search of earthworms and grubs,"

Damage from an armadillo is fairly distinctive. When on the hunt, the armadillo uses its long, sharp claws to break

the surface of loose

soil. In the process, it leaves holes averaging 3 inches wide by 5 inches deep.

Another animal troubling to landscapes is the mole. Moles dig tunnels through yards in search of food. These tunnels form ridges in the soil. Moles have enormous appetites and may eat up to 100 percent of their body weight in a single day.

Armstrong said that moles might benefit homeowners, if not for the tunnels they dig.

"Contrary to popular belief, moles do not eat the roots and bulbs of flowers and vegetables. In fact, they may benefit these plants by feeding on grubs and worms that can damage them," said Armstrong. "However, the tunneling activities of moles may disfigure

lawns and gardens."

There are several options for homeowners to use to control

digging animals.

Putting a fence around your home is a cost effective way

that can keep out pests. Mesh fencing is the best option for homeowners. If the mesh does not work, adding chicken wire around the fence will provide more deterrence. Any fencing used to exclude digging or burrowing animals should be buried at

ground to discourage the animal from digging under the fence. This will make it near impossible for animals to get through.

Sometimes homeowners must use lethal traps and measures on some animals such as armadillos and moles.

should be buried at "Homeowners can least 10 inches into the trap armadillos using

a cage and a barrier of boards to help guide them into the mouth of the trap," said Armstrong. "Once trapped, armadillos should be humanely euthanized. Because they are an invasive species and should not be relocated, they should be

dispatched."
Armstrong said

that the best solution for controlling moles is by using lethal traps.

"There are several lethal traps that can be used to eliminate moles," said Armstrong. "You can find many of these traps online or at a local outdoors store."

Backyard tomato production:

What first-time gardeners need to know

Two or three well-managed plants for each member of the family will usually provide plenty of fresh, vine-ripened tomatoes from about late spring until the first frost in the fall. A small backyard tomato project can provide outside recreation for the entire family, and tomatoes are especially well adapted for 4-H Club and science projects, as well as for urban backyard garden

projects. Set plants in the sun. Select a spot in an open area where the plants will be in full sunlight most of the day (6 to 8 hours minimum). Also, for convenience, try to locate plants near the house and a water supply. However, if you have a choice of planting sites, select the spot in full sun rather than in more convenient locations that are partially shaded. Plant growth and development are more vigorous and disease control much easier on a plant growing in full sunlight.

Proper fertilization and good soil preparation are the first steps in successful tomato production. For individual plants, dig a hole 2 feet wide and 12 inches deep. Save the topsoil that was removed from the hole and use it in the growing medium for refilling the hole. Mix two to three parts of the topsoil and one part of well-decomposed manure or compost; add fertilizer according to soil test recommendations. Thoroughly mix these ingredients to make a uniform growing medium. If poultry manure is used, add one part of manure to three or four parts of soil to reduce the possibility of injury to the plants.

to varieties are available to home gardeners, but many of these have not been tested under local conditions or have performed poorly. Choose varieties that have produced well in tests and have been placed on the recommended list for Alabama. Try other varieties, but on a lim-

ited basis at first. The more common insect pests of tomatoes include fruitworms and hornworms, aphids, whiteflies and stinkbugs. Tomato fruitworms and hornworms may be controlled by sprays of Bacillus thuringiensis (Dipel, Thuricide, others) beginning just after eggs hatch when caterpillars are still small. Insecticidal soaps are effective for control of aphids and whiteflies if sprays are directed to the upper

and lower leaf surfaces. Stinkbugs may be controlled, but weekly sprays may be necessary for control.

Disease control in the home garden begins by planting disease-resistant tomato varieties in well-prepared, properly fertilized soil. Disease development is favored by wet, humid conditions, so keep foliage dry by watering in the morning and using drip irrigation. When using overhead irrigation, watering deeply once or twice a week is better than shallow, frequent watering. Stake and prune plants to increase air circulation within the

to completely cover the foliage to control diseases. Multiple applications are generally required to control most diseases. Poor disease control is probably responsible for more loss in tomato production than all other causes combined.

en here is not the only way to grow backyard tomatoes successfully. As you gain experience and develop confidence, you will develop your own system. It is not unusual for growers to agree in principle on steps for tomato production yet have widely divergent views on specific production practices.
