

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

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

"I always have an amazing time whenever I'm performing on Logan Martin Lake," the Birmingham-based smooth jazz artist said. "It's an awesome experience performing on the water."

Coosa River cruisers can enjoy Sherry's performances from 6-8 p.m. Friday, February 14, and 4-6 p.m. Saturday, March 28. The boat has a maximum of 50 passengers, so make your reservations today."

Known for her energetic performances, Sherry released the single "Voyage" last October.

"It was written and produced by my good friend Kelvin Benion," she said. "This single is a high-energy song that's sure to

Sherry has worked as a professional musician since 1989, having studied music since she was in elementary school. "I did try clarinet and sax in grade school, but the flute was my favorite. I just wasn't a fan of the reed instruments. I did marching and concert bands in high school, and I play for my church. Wherever I'm performing, I enjoy getting out in the audience and bringing the music to them. I love it."

She began playing jazz in 2010. "Jazz flute is different from classical flute. Classical is music like Swan Lake, The Nutcracker and Ave Maria. Jazz flute is modern and up-tempo music for dancers to enjoy. Most flutists play original pieces or cover songs. I tend to take the cover songs and add my own twist to them."

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A few tips for February fishing

Fishing in February can be a hassle, as the winter weather can make it challenging to stay out on the water. Frigid temperatures can make you want to stay inside rather than visit your favorite spot on the water, and if you do go out on the water, the bass may not seem to be biting.

A few February fishing tips can help you beat the winter blues and land a monster catch.

Bass tend to stay in about 10 feet of water during the late-winter season. However, keep in mind that February has highly variable weather patterns, which will cause the bass to fluctuate their depths.

On cold, dreary days, bass tend to mope down into deeper waters, while on warmer days with lots of sunshine, bass will perk up and move into shallower areas. Regardless of the weather, you will likely find February bass hanging around boat docks and pilings, as these structures conduct heat into the water surrounding them.

Jigging is the go-to strategy for fair-weather February days when the bass move into shallower waters. It involves casting a weighted artificial bait (the jig) on to the bottom, or just above it, and then flipping or jerking it up and down. When it comes to selecting the colors of your bass jigs in February, darker is better. Some of the best choices include purple, blue, black, green and brown.

New creekside café in Lincoln celebrates history, bridges the old and the new

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
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
Friendly baristas and delicious coffee drinks await customers at the Blue Eye Café.

Lincoln was home to one of two banks in town, a fiveand-dime store, a feed-and-seed business, a dry goods store and a mercantile. It was bustling with foot traffic.

But the stock market crash in 1929 closed both banks and suffocated local businesses. That same year, U.S. Hwy 78 was constructed through Lincoln. It diverted traffic away from Crawford Street, and in the following years, new businesses

located along the highway and at exits 165 and 168 of Interstate 20.

Now, a small cafe is bringing people back to Crawford Street. Blue Eye Cafe opened in December



storefronts. Taking its name from the nearby creek (a tributary of the Coosa River), it offers a terrific new option for enjoying the sights and history of the lakeside community.

Soon after it opened, several of my Facebook friends checked in and wrote

positive comments about the food and service, but one particular post caught my eye.

Debra Bryant was my first friend in Talladega. We

met in 1976 when my newly divorced mother moved me, my brother and my sister from the rural Stockdale community to Talladega Downs Apartments on the west side of the city. Debra's father, Steven, managed the complex.

Debra was my age. We bonded over teen magazines, backyard baseball and homework assignments. We wore satin track shorts and knee-high tube socks. We giggled and whispered in the dark during sleep overs, and we loved going to her aunt's house on the lake. Her friendship was an integral part of my early teens, but 40 years later, our only connection was on social media.

I wanted to revitalize our friendship. I knew she lived nearby, so I invited her to have coffee with me at Blue Eye Cafe. I also knew she was a budding photographer, so I asked her to bring her camera.

We arrived on a Wednesday morning around 9:30. We chose a table in the front because every table except one in the back was occupied. People were eating, sipping and talking. One man was reading the newspaper. A few were watching the president speak on the mounted TV while a couple of preschoolers played in the Kids Korner.

I stepped up to the counter and ordered French toast with sides of sausage and hashbrowns and a Blue







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Eye espresso. A barista, Alivia, and the owner, Gabriel Hackney, were working the front, and the chef, Bierick Saxton, was in the kitchen. Gabriel said he is new to the restaurant business, and he is happy that customers are enjoying the place and the food.

"I just wanted to try and help build community, so my wife and I decided to create this place to do that. I

think we are in a great location, and we are trying to be kind of deli oriented." he said. "So for lunch, it's sandwiches and soups, and we've added a homemade pizza to the menu, and we have homemade baked goods

The coffee was fresh, and conversation with Debra flowed naturally in between bites of breakfast. The cafe was a great place to reconnect and reminisce, and we continued our visit outside in the park behind the buildings.

Blue Eye Creek Fishing Trail was constructed in 2014. It has two concrete and three wooden handicap accessible fishing stations. A pedestrian bridge crosses the creek, and a concrete sidewalk provides access.

A lighted pavilion with amphitheater seating provides a venue for performances, and it is available to rent for birthday parties, family reunions and other social gatherings. A boardwalk connects the pedestrian bridge to the new deck built adjacent to the pavilion.

We walked and talked. The laughs came so easy.

The tears did too. We shared stories about our children. our families, marriage and divorce. deaths, illnesses, addictions and events that have affected us and shaped who we are today. We agreed that adulthood is hard, and iobs and bills and stress were not what we thought our lives would

be, and time brings changes, both good and bad, that divert your attention and energy away from great friends.

But things always have a way of coming back around. Old buildings can be renovated for new businesses, historic streets can see a resurgence of traffic and old friendships can be revived in the midst of it.



Skewer each strawberry through the leafy end, making sure you have a good grip on it.

Dip in the chocolate about halfway through (or three-quarters). Let the excess drip off, without shaking. Place on parchment paper and wait until the chocolate sets and hardens, then remove the skewer (or present them with the skewer).

Keep in a cool, dark place until serving, but don't store in the fridge, which will make the chocolate lose its temper.

Gold Leaf Champagne-Poached Pears

This fabulous recipe for luxurious fruit decorated with edible gold leaf and caramelized nuts looks



glamorous, but it could not be easier to make.

6 firm pears, peeled and with the stems in

3 cups champagne

3 cups water

1 cinnamon stick

zest and juice of ½ lemon

zest and juice of 1 orange

1 cup apricot jam

½ cup white sugar

23k edible gold leaf

Peel and trim the pears to make them flat on the bottom so they will be standing while cooking and in the plate when you serve them.

In a large cooking pot or saucepan, heat champagne and water, cinnamon, lemon juice and zest, orange juice and zest and the apricot jam and the sugar. Bring to a boil. Place the pears carefully, trying to keep them standing upright.

Cook uncovered for 15 to 25 minutes until pears become tender (cooked but not overly soft), then remove and place on a platter. Let cool and cover with transparent film. Reserve the liquid by straining it into a different pot.

Boil at low heat to evaporate liquid and reduce to almost half, achieving a syrup texture.

Plate the pears, drizzle with the champagne syrup and sprinkle with caramelized nuts. Decorate with edible gold paper.

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Red Velvet Cake Balls

Lovely and very easy to make, these are the perfect festive treat for a romantic celebration.



9×13 inch pan of Red Velvet Cake, baked and cooled

8 oz. Mascarpone cream cheese + 2 tbsp.

1 lb. white chocolate chips

red sugar, as needed to decorate (optional)

Prepare your favorite red velvet cake recipe.

Crumble into small pieces into a large bowl. Add the mascarpone cream cheese and mix well.

The mixture should be nice and soft. Add one or two more tablespoons of mascarpone cheese if needed.

With a small cookie scoop or a small spoon, divide the mixture into portions and form small balls (about the size of a quarter), then place them on a baking sheet covered with parchment. Refrigerate for 3 hours until cold and firm.

Take them out let them stay at room temperature for 10 minutes. Melt the white chocolate chips in the microwave or double boiler,

then dip each cake ball with a fork, carefully setting them back on the tray. Sprinkle with red sugar and serve.

Heart Shaped Mousse Cake With Chocolate Ganache Recipe

A silky mousse topped with a glistening ganache, all on top of a brownie crust, decorated with luxe edible gold.



Crust:

1 brownie, baked on a sheet cake pan

Mousse:

1 tsp. powdered gelatin

2 tbsp. water

1/2 cup whole milk

6 Oz. baking chocolate, finely chopped

1 1/4 cup heavy cream


Ganache:

3.5 oz. bittersweet (70% cacao) chocolate

3 tbsp. cream

Special tools:

Heart-shaped springform pan and clear



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acetate sheets

After you have baked your favorite brownie recipe, remove from the pan and cut to the size of your heart-shaped pan. Line the pan with acetate paper. The brownie layer will be your crust.

Place the chopped chocolate in a heat-proof bowl.

Dissolve the gelatin in a small bowl of warm water. It typically takes about five minutes.

In a small pan, heat the milk until just about to boil. Turn off the heat, then add the gelatin and whisk until fully incorporated.

Pour the mix onto the chocolate chips, and let the heat from the preparation melt the chocolate. Whisk until well incorporated.

Using a hand or stand mixer, whip the cream to soft peaks.

Add the whipped cream into the chocolate mix by thirds - one third at a time. Fold, making sure to scrape the sides of the bowl. Once the mix is fully incorporated, add the next third until using up the mix. Pour the mix onto the heart-shaped mold (on top of the brownie crust). Refrigerate for 2 hours or until firm.

For the chocolate ganache topping, melt chocolate using bain marie method or double boiler and add the cream. Pour or spread over the cake.

Refrigerate until set, at least 1 hour. Remove from cake pan, remove acetate sheet and serve chilled.

Decorate with shredded edible gold.

Raspberry White Chocolate Panna Cotta Recipe

This decadent dessert with white chocolate and delicious raspberry preserves is layered beautifully and garnished with fresh mint.

8 oz. fresh or frozen raspberries + 6 oz. for garnish7 oz. raspberry jam or preserves



1/4 cup of water

2 tsp. powdered unflavored gelatin

7 oz. white chocolate, chopped

2 ½ cups heavy cream

3/4 cup white sugar

1 bunch fresh mint

With a blender, puree raspberries (reserve 6 oz. for the garnish). Mix with the preserves and pout into six glasses, covering about 1/4 of the glass. Place in the fridge to chill.

Hydrate the gelatin with water, whisking, and reserve.

Place the chocolate in metal bowl, then boil the cream over medium heat and pour onto the chocolate. Mix until dissolved, with a wooden spoon, then add the gelatin mix and the sugar, stirring until well mixed. Let it cool until it is thick and creamy.

Pout this mix - panna cotta - slowly onto the glasses that you were storing in the fridge, leaving about 1/4 of the glass empty for the next layer.

Reserve in the fridge until firm. Then add the rest of the marmalade. Garnish with a few fresh raspberries and mint leaves. Refrigerate until ready to serve.

Mr. Willingham goes to Washington Advocacy Corps Lakeside college student lobbies for new federal policy Written by SAM PRICKETT Submitted Photos ones Willingham has been back at home on Logan Martin Lake in recent weeks, but a large part of the past year has kept him traveling between Birmingham and Washington D.C., advocating for policies that could have an impact on the entire country. Willingham is nearly halfway through a yearlong fellowship with the Advocacy Corps, the young-adult branch of the Friends Committee on National Legislation (FCNL), a nonpartisan, faith-based lobbying group focused on peace and justice advocacy. He is one of 20 students nationwide selected to organize constituent lobbying efforts supporting Jones Willingham with two fellow student members of bills that can prevent the Advocacy Corps lobbying group



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
instances of mass shootings and deadly violence, he said.

The opportunity came through the political science department at Samford University, where Willingham is a pre-law student. "They're really, really good at putting opportunities in the hands of their students," he says. "Dr. Fred Shepherd, who's the chair of the poli-sci department, told me about the Advocacy Corps because he knows that gun violence is an issue that I'm passionate about and am personally connected to. I've had friends that have been lost to gun violence. And Dr. Shepherd said, 'I think you'd be a good fit for this, and FCNL is a good and highly reputable organization to work with.' And I think he was completely right, because I've loved it since I've been involved."

Willingham's work with the Advocacy Corps involves organizing outreach efforts to the Birmingham area's three national representatives, Senator Doug Jones, Senator Richard Shelby, and U.S. Rep. Gary Palmer. In particular, his efforts have focused on Senate Bill 42, which establishes universal background checks, and House Bill 1236, which would allow courts to temporarily confiscate guns from people considered to be an "extreme risk."

Both bills have mostly been mired in Congressional committees since they were introduced earlier this year, and so far are considered largely partisan bills. Only one Republican senator has endorsed SB42, compared to 41 Democrats, and just two Republican representatives have sponsored HB1236, along with 208 Democrats. Despite this, Willingham insists that the issue is not a partisan one.

"The numbers are there," he said. "Ninety percent of the country supports universal background checks. An issue like this never finds that much support, but it's clear the country wants it and is ready for it. And in Alabama, close to 80 percent support universal background checks for concealed-carry weapons. I think what the media wants to believe is that it's red versus blue in every issue, including gun violence. And while that can be true in some cases, I've had so many conversations with staffers in Republican offices that are shockingly sympathetic to the issue.





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
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aside from the daily chaos that comes out of the White House, we actually have a Congress that has worked hard to listen to the American people and pass bills that will assist all. Even if our processes are a little gummed up now with the hype of impeachment and the Trump presidency, our government is still functioning, and it's important for all Americans to look past the headlines and take part in their government."

Still, Willingham says, gun control laws can be "a really hard sell in Alabama," even with Alabama's sole Democratic senator, Doug Jones.

"It's really difficult to get meetings with officials, even Senator Jones, because of different things in the political climate right now regarding this issue. It's kind of easy to forget that in the age of special interest groups and the Republican Party's loyalty to the president, but constituent lobbying — and actually just saying what we want as the people of America — carries significant power. The thing I've learned the most is, literally the power can be in our hands as constituents and, quite frankly, as young people. We just have to take it."

Willingham will return to Washington late next month for Spring Lobby Weekend. "Over this weekend, thousands of delegates from across the country will join the FCNL to lobby Congress on the issue of climate change. While it's a little different from the issue I'm working on now, climate change poses a severe threat to my generation and beyond, and I look forward to meeting with Congress members to hopefully help the



United States be a leader on this issue."

Despite the difficulties and frustrations involved, he says that his experience with the Advocacy Corps has "almost made me more optimistic" about politics.

"This program has made me want to work inside the world of advocacy and focus on issues that mean a lot to me. And who knows, maybe even elected office one day. I don't know if I'm crazy enough to want to do that, but this has definitely opened my eyes to the possibility."



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Renew Our Rivers kicks off 21st year

Local effort set to begin in late March

he Renew Our Rivers initiative marked its 20th anniversary in 2019 and shows no signs of slowing down as its 21st year begins this month with cleanup efforts on the Alabama and Warrior rivers.

The effort comes to Logan Martin Lake and the Coosa River March 28-April 4. The annual local cleanup is coordinated by the Logan Martin Lake Protection Association (LMLPA).

During 2019, more than 4,500 Renew Our Rivers volunteers removed more than 316,000 pounds of trash and debris from waterways throughout the state.

"We had an increase in the number of volunteers and pounds of trash removed in 2019 from the previous year," said Mike Clelland, environmental affairs specialist for Alabama Power Company and Renew Our Rivers coordinator. "We hope to continue that momentum into 2020 and beyond."

The initiative began in 2000 as a community river cleanup organized by Alabama Power employees at Plant Gadsden who were concerned about litter in and along the Coosa River.

"A lot of our operations were founded on hydroelectricity and power generation around our waterways, so from the very beginning, we've had a natural instinct to want to conserve and



preserve our waterways for future use," Clelland said.

In its 20 years, Renew Our
Rivers volunteers have collected
more than 15.5 million pounds of
trash and debris from waterways
across the Southeast. According
to Dr. Donn Brascho, a longtime
Logan Martin volunteer, most of the
collected trash is small enough to
put into the garbage bags that are
provided to volunteers, although
some large items are recovered
every year.

"We find a lot of tires," he said, "and one of the biggest and most unusual things I've ever recovered was a refrigerator."

Such unusual items as soft

drink vending machines, toilets, Halloween decorations and even a prosthetic leg have been recovered during Renew Our Rivers cleanups.

"One of the greatest legacies of the program is how it has created connections among volunteers, marinas, businesses and other organizations across the state," Clelland said. "The lake residents say partnerships between Renew Our Rivers and local groups allow the cleanups to become more effective and cover more ground."


Lakeside area family shares the love and care that helped build their home

Janna, along with her parents and brother, are the owners and operators of Goodgame Company, a commercial construction company that celebrates its 65th anniversary this year. Though residential design and building is different from commercial, they were all determined to approach every aspect of the process with as much attention to detail as possible.

"My father is a man that pays attention to detail. Every detail in this house, my dad had his hand on it," Janna says.

The details, according to Adrick, are vital in the home building process. "With building a house, once you establish something, it's really hard to go back."

The Masters were fortunate to have a supportive and

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hard-working crew helping them create their dream home. "We were so blessed to do this project with such great people that really cared about getting us to where we want," says Janna.

Candacey Brown is the interior designer Janna credits with bringing their vision of the house to fruition. "We could not have done it without her," she beams. The superintendent on the construction of the house, Jackie England, has been with Goodgame Construction for approximately 20 years and played a pivotal role in the building process. "He's a man, like my father, who really pays attention to details and cares about putting out a really good product."

For Janna, being able to embark on the journey with her father was the real pleasure. "It was an honor to get to do this with my dad," she says.

Their property is 285 acres and spreads out as a sea of green that meets a wall of trees at the start of a large area of woods. Mark points out two deer making their way along the tree line. "We get quite a few animals that come out and show themselves," he says. Candacey adds that during the design process, it was important for every room to have access to the outside so that even from within the family could be close to nature.

Though they live in very close proximity to Logan Martin Lake, the family says they prefer their landlocked area. "For myself and my wife, we used to be on the lake with the young people all the time," says Adrick. While the family still loves spending time at the lake, Janna's daughter Logan feels their location suits everyone better than a lakeside

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
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
community and everyone who ever had the pleasure of meeting her," Janna says.

property. "My mom grew up riding horses and around farm life, and that's always been a big deal for us, so it just made more sense to live here than on the lake. But we're really only like three minutes from the lake."

The design was inspired by French country homes, and Candacey says the goal was to make the house appear as if it had been there for a long time. "We took painstaking effort to make sure that the brick looked aged and the roof looked aged, really making all of the finishes look aged to make sure that it looked like an older home that had been here a long time instead of a brand new shiny home."

While home designs sometimes make owners choose between comfort and functionality, the Masters' home has a unique balance between the two. Every item in the home serves a purpose while emphasizing the warmth the family brings to the space. In the dining

room, there are two hutches picked out by Janna that were once in an actual French country home. Their kitchen has two islands that provide an exceptional amount of counter space for kitchen prep and cooking, yet the kitchens till feels open and spacious.

Everything in the house was handpicked by Janna and Mark themselves, from the wrought iron front door to the hand painted crests engraved with the family initial M. Janna's love of horses is evident throughout the house, most notably in a wall-mounted horse sculpture, aptly named Noble Steed, that overlooks the foyer. "I always tell my clients, 'Don't pick something out just to make do. Make sure it's what you want and speaks to you,'" says Candacey.

Throughout the house guests will find many representations of Pell City artists and businesses. It was important to the family that they support as many local artists and businesses as possible. Throughout the house are cabinets made by Switzers' Cabinets that are handcrafted to represent the individual personalities of each room. In the dining room, guests dine under a Michelangelo-style ceiling mural by local painter,


Laurel Darnell. Each room sporting a different style of doors, crafted with care and stained to maintain an aged aesthetic. All of these touches, Janna says, help exemplify the feeling of love and care that went into making the home special.

It was also important to Janna and Mark that every room have its own unique personality while also reflecting the personalities of the family members. This goal was achieved most prominently in the individual bedrooms throughout the house. The master bedroom represents Mark's strong and supportive nature with an enforced, arched ceiling while reflecting Janna's love for family, with her grandmother's vintage portrait hanging on the north wall. Logan's room is more modern, with chic French design and nods to high fashion and shades of Janna's favorite color, French blue. Braeden's room embodies the hunter's lifestyle with dark wood paneling and mounted deer heads that he shot himself on the property.

Perhaps the most surprising area of the house is the baseball room, located on the second floor. "This was originally going to be attic space," Candacey says. "Mr.















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Above: The entertainment room

Adrick came up to me one day and said, 'Candacey, we gotta do something with this room,' so I thought to myself, 'Well, what can we do?'" The answer was an indoor baseball field equipped with turf, a batting cage and a pitcher's mound. Braeden, a Detroit Tigers fan, practices his pitching and invites his friends over to play cornhole there.

Making sure Braeden and Logan's friends feel welcome was another vital goal to Janna and Mark. The ultimate goal, they say, was to have a home where friends, family, and future generations could feel safe and welcome. Everyone, Janna says, is welcome. "That's how it was growing up for me. That's what my home life was like. My parents always opened their home and allowed friends to come, and every meal my mom was like, 'We can add more, come on!' I just wanted to emulate that and give that to my children."

At the end of the day, Janna says it's all about family and love. "There's a lot of love here. That's what we're all about."
