#### Fridayn in t football looks promising for schools through out St. Clair County

High school football season is a sacred time across the state of Alabama, and this long awaited tradition has finally arrived. For the teams within St. Clair County specifically, there seems to be promise all across the

Out of the five schools within the St. Clair County School system, three have new coaches running and reworking the program: Ragland, St. Clair County and Springville. Everyone hopes a new coach will change the dynamic of any team for the better, but actions will of course speak for themselves.

Meanwhile, Moody and Ashville along with Pell City, Victory Christian and Leeds will continue to work under the same coaching philosophy, all of which seem to be getting the

Fans will be looking closely at teams such as Leeds and Ragland, which made great strides in 2020 and were the only teams within the county to play more than 10 games.

However, I'm just as interested in the younger teams such as Moody and St. Clair to see if having more experience and maturity will translate on the playing field.

At the end of the day, however, if there is one thing that every football team across St. Clair County has in common, it's the fact that they have strong community support behind them. You can't tell me that doesn't make a difference in how a team approaches each and every game. Those athletes are not only playing for their teammates, but to make their community proud.

#### **SPRINGVILLE**

The Tigers played their first ASHVILLE year as a Class 6A school in



2020. After finishing a solid 4-5 including a big 34-35 win against Arab, the team ended things on a pretty decent note.

However, it's no secret that Quarterback Pearson Baldwin led his team in a way that is rare for any athlete. Now that Baldwin has graduated and is playing for Jacksonville State University, it will be time for new leaders to step up.

New head coach Jon Clements expressed in an earlier interview that his new quarterback Asa Morrison has shown great promise and been putting in the work. I will be interested to see how he steps into his new role as a junior QB and even after that for his senior year.

Clements has also said former head coach Michael Graben was running the program well and doesn't see that there needs to be much change. Instead, he will be bringing in multiple new assistant coaches to help him run things. With being a bigger school, Springville has the ability and man power to bring in those wins, even against the other giants in the area and hopefully improve on that 4-5 record from 2020.

Ashville finished at an even

5-5 last season. Though it was Shea Monroe's first year leading the program, it seems the head coach and the Bulldogs have one of the best group dynamics of any team in the county.

One can easily tell that it's not just a team, but a family. That in itself has proven it goes a long way in the success of their team. When talking to Monroe, he said they've set the bar higher for 2021 and hope to make it to the playoffs.

Monroe even bragged about his team's willingness to put in the work and do whatever is asked of them. This isn't the case for every athlete, much less an entire team. Through my experience as an athlete, I've noticed the biggest difference in the success of any athlete is the want and need to get better on your own — even if that means working outside of practice and doing what hasn't been asked of you in order to grow.

Because of this, I think there is a solid opportunity for the Bulldogs to make it to the playoffs this year. As long as they set that goal and work towards it everyday, there is no reason why they can't.

#### ST. CLAIR

For me, St. Clair is the most

interesting team going into the new season. Unlike Clements at Springville, head coach P.J. Wright has decided things needed to change at SCCHS. He has brought his own philosophy to the program and Saints fans are interested to see if he delivers.

The team went 0-10 in 2019 and 1-9 last year, everyone including Wright himself simply wants to see the Saints begin to collect more wins. What Wright has already proven is his passion for the sport of football and athletes who want to make it a part of their lives. Wright has mentioned that he not only wants to better the program as its coach, but improve funding so there are more resources available to his players and other athletes in order to make a name for St. Clair.



#### MOODY

I have to admit, Moody is one of the teams that I'm most excited to watch this year. While the Blue Devils didn't collect a single win last year, they also had a lot of extremely young players, including A.J. Wallace, who was only a sophomore as their starting quarterback. By his senior year, I can see him

## Hood say he's hopeful for another successful season

Coming off a nine-win season in Leeds' first season in Class 5A since 1989, third-year head coach Jerry Hood is hoping for another good year.

The Greenwave posted an eight-game win streak at one point on its way to going 9-3, finishing second in Region 6 and making the second round of the playoffs. That's Leeds' most victories since winning 13 in 2015.

The Greenwave cruised past Boaz 21-0 in the first round, but fell to Russellville a week later 35-14.

Hood said while it doesn't hurt to have success in the previous season, each team is unique.

"As I tell the kids, you have to earn everything you got," Hood said. "(This year), you're no longer going to be the bad

team that somebody didn't really prepare for as well as they should have. Now, you're a known commodity so you're going to get everybody's best punch, so we better be better than we were last year to accomplish whatever goals we might have."

The head coach emphasized that while the Greenwave lost two players on their offensive line, they have quite a few returning players and are an overall experienced team.

"They have a lot of game experience, which is why I decided not to do spring training and take an extra week in the summer," Hood said, adding his team started their first official practice Monday. "I'm interested to see how we do."

Hood added that every year, he hopes



becoming a powerhouse along with junior wide receiver Davion Dozier. Wallace and Dozier's chemistry on the field will carry their team a long way.

Not only are the players physically bigger and more experienced, but have shown signs of promise through the summer tournaments they've competed in. In the Gadsden City tournament, the team went 5-1 after falling to Opelika. They proceeded to finish runner up in Piedmont's 7-on-7 tournament including a win against Munford who went a solid 5-5 last season.

While these passing tournaments can only translate so much as to what will happen during a regular game, Moody has already shown that they can keep up with the competition. At the very least, we know the Blue Devils' passing game will be one of their strengths.

#### PELL CITY

Being one of the biggest teams in St. Clair, the Panthers certainly struggled last year as they were one of the lowest scoring teams within the 6A classification.

Of course, the team has a new offensive coordinator, who should boost the Panthers up to the level they want to play. The team is also looking to name a starting quarterback as Baylor Smith and Caleb Groce are both looking to grab the leadership position.

As an entirely new dynamic is coming into play for the offensive side of Pell City football, only when the team punts the ball will fans really be able to tell if the efforts made will work in the Panthers favor. They have county rival Springville in their area that will prove to be a tough, yet intriguing competition.

#### **RAGLAND**

While Ragland is one of the smaller schools in the county, the Purple Devils proved in 2020 that they can be big on the playing field.

New head coach Wes Tidwell will have some big shoes to fill as Derrick Sewell left Ragland to coach at West End. Sewell took the Devils to the second round of the playoffs last season ending 9-3 overall and went 15-18 throughout all three years of his time at Ragland.

Tidwell has emphasized, however, that 2020 means nothing going into this season, especially after losing some players. He added that despite last year's success, he hopes to rebuild the culture at Ragland. Once again, actions will speak louder than words, and with a team as talented as the Purple Devils, hopefully his ner coaching philosophy will push them as far if not further into the season. Either way, Ragland will certainly be one to keep an eye out for in 2021.

#### VICTORY CHRISTIAN

Like Ragland, Victory Christian is another small school that shows they can be big on the field.

They ended their season at 4-5 in Bruce Breland's second year as head coach. If Breland keeps running things the way he is, he should see great success in the upcoming season as they made significant strides in 2020.

Despite their size, the Lions proved to be an interesting team to watch. If there is one thing the team proved last year, it's that they can handle high pressure situations. Often, they found themselves down by a touchdown or two, but managed to come back victorious. During media day last year, Breland said something that would stick with me forever as it's a great mindset to keep with you in any situation: You have to learn to be comfortable with being uncomfortable.

His players have obviously internalized that as well because it shows whenever they play on Friday nights.

#### **LEEDS**

While a 5A school, Leeds played as if it was one of the biggest schools in the area last year as the Greenwave finished 9-3 before falling to Russellville in the second round of the state playoffs. Leeds is one of the biggest and most experienced teams in the county.

Much like Tidwell, Leeds head coach Jerry Hood agreed that while having previous success is great, this is a new year and they will need to prove themselves. He described it best when he said that, because the Greenwave has shown its talent, the players will get the very best from each team they compete against.

Though much of Leeds resides in Jefferson County and we only get a small portion over here in St. Clair, I think it's safe to say that the Greenwave will be a powerhouse that everyone in the area will be cheering on.


"Everyday we talk about becoming a better football player and becoming the best we can be," Wallace said, adding that he is focusing on putting in the best work

"That's one thing we struggled with last year, you know being under-sized and stopping the runs, so you know it'll be a great test for us the first game (against Elmore County) to show that we can stand up against their run game," the coach said.



## Quarterback battle in Pell City

The biggest question going into this offseason for Pell City was the offense. Last season, the Panthers struggled to produce points as they were the second-lowest scoring team in Class 6A, Region 7 as they only averaged 16 points per game.

The Panthers addressed their offensive woes in the offseason as they hired Logan Colafrancesco as offensive coordinator. Pell City has worked on finding a quarterback that can master the new offense throughout spring practice and summer workouts. The Panthers quarterback competition is between 2020 starting quarterback Baylor Smith and sophomore Caleb Groce.

Lee said it is vital for the Panthers to have solid quarterback play if they plan on competing in 2021.

"If you look at all the successful teams they have good quarterback play," Lee said. "It doesn't have to be the 6-foot-4, 215-pound kid like Oxford had last year. It is great if you have him, but you have to have good play from whoever you put back there. That's the big thing for us; we have to have good quarterback play."

The quarterbacks have shared snaps throughout the summer at 7-on-7 passing tournaments. Lee said that slitting snaps will likely continue until someone wins the position.

"It has been going good," Lee said. "It is no question that the two of them are going to be on the field. Both of them have gotten a lot of reps and will continue to get reps. We will see what happens when we put pads on. "

Wes Tidwell was hired as Ragland's head football

Tidwell has 18 years of experience and he spent the past four seasons at Bryant High School in Mobile.

Tidwell lone head coaching experience came at his alma mater Winston County. In four seasons, he went 22-21 with his best record coming in 2015 when they finished with a 7-4 record.

Tidwell takes over for Derrick Sewell, who left to take over at West End.

Sewell turned things around for Purple Devils last season. Ragland went 9-3 in 2020 and they lost to Brilliant 21-14 in the second round of the playoffs. Sewell went 15-18 in three seasons at Ragland.

"It's not something where you have to rebuild everything," Tidwell said. "Obviously, we want to build a different culture and that's not saying something happened last year. They were a good football team last year, but they are not going to give us credit for that this year. We have to win our own ball games. We lost some very good kids off that team and we have some very good kids coming back. We want to create our own path. I expect

to compete every week. I expect our kids to hit you in the mouth and I expect them to respond when you hit us in the mouth."



Clements emphasized that after working as an offensive coordinator for St. Clair County High School, he knows it won't be an easy contest.







Last year, the Saints went 1-9 under Brooks Dampeer; Wright said he hopes to improve on that record. He added, however, you don't measure success solely on wins, but rather finding the small positives.

"You have to be careful on how you judge success," he said. "You've got to find the positive in everything. "If we're going to judge success based on what it says on the scoreboard then, you know, I don't want to say we're not going to lose, but you don't want to say what's successful and what's not."

Wright said that so far, he's impressed with how hard his team has worked and adapted to his coaching style.

"They're working extremely hard," Wright said. "When they're (at practice), I believe in going 100 percent at full speed in short bursts and we are getting that from them."

Wright added that he's looking to wide receiver Jackson Linsdsey and inside linebacker Ethan Jackson to help lead his team going into the new season.

"We got beat in a 7-on-7 early (in the tournament), and I brought those two over and I said, 'It's up to you guys, are you going to let them hang their heads or are we going to say let's go, let's step back up' and we did and performed better after," Wright said.

Throughout the season, the coach said he wants to continue working on his team's overall attitudes during games.

"(On) film, I can see when things start to go badly, and things go downhill, heads drop, attitudes change and we get a lot of finger pointing," he said. "We preach, how are you going to respond when things go poorly? You are going to be successful, because I'm not going to let you fail. So, how are you going to (also) respond when that success comes?"

The Saints will travel to Springville on Aug. 27 for its season opener with kick off at 7 p.m.
