On August 15, 2023, at approximately 7:00 p.m, the Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI), was requested to investigate an Officer Involved Critical Incident (OICI) that occurred in Ashland County. The OICI involved officers from the Ashland County Sheriff's Office and the Mellen Police Department. The incident resulted in the shooting death of Jay Allen Claremboux, DOB Ashland County made the request to DCI and it was determined DCI would lead the investigation.

The preliminary information provided to DCI included the following:

At approximately 6:00 p.m., the Ashland County Sheriff's Office Dispatch Center received a 911 call from a female reporting she was assaulted by a male subject with a knife (later identified as Jay Claremboux). The caller reported there was an ongoing domestic dispute between Claremboux and his girlfriend in a camper trailer on the property at 33695 N Foley Rd, Town of Morse, Ashland County. The caller said she was not near Claremboux at that time, but he was still armed with a knife in the camper trailer with his girlfriend and was threatening to kill her.

Ashland County deputies responded to the scene, along with a Mellen police officer. Deputies arrived and shortly thereafter, Claremboux was reportedly shot one time by Ashland County Sheriff's Sergeant Jason Janecek in the camper trailer.

DCI Special Agent in Charge (SAC) Michael Haverley spoke with Ashland County Sheriff's Detective Zach Pierce, who advised that Sergeant Janecek and a second deputy made initial entry into the camper trailer where the shooting occurred. Detective Pierce reported there may have been two additional deputies standing perimeter.

Claremboux was removed from the camper trailer where lifesaving measures were performed by law enforcement and EMS, but were unsuccessful. Claremboux was pronounced dead at the scene by the Ashland County Coroner.

The two female victim/witnesses were examined by EMS personnel on scene and found to have sustained superficial wounds caused by Claremboux with a bladed instrument. It was believed that one of the injured females was renting the camper trailer from the property owner. There were no reported injuries to any law enforcement officers on scene.

Ashland County District Attorney David Meany was notified and responded to the scene.

DCI Special Agents from the Eau Claire and Wausau Field Offices responded to the scene and to the Ashland County Sheriff's Office that night. DCI's Digital Evidence Specialist Ryan Kelleher and Crime Response Specialist Lisa Seidel also responded. DCI Special Agent Shawn Sutherland was assigned as the lead investigating agent.

The Wisconsin State Patrol Technical Reconstruction Unit responded to the scene to assist with scene mapping.

Jay was threatening to kill while on the phone with Deputy Petroski. said Deputy Petroski continually tried to calm Jay and tried to get him out of the residence so they could talk. said Jay hung up the phone and would no longer answer the calls. |
| said one of the officers then yelled that the camper door was open and all of the officers rushed to the open door. said she heard them yelling "show me your hands" and "put your hands up" multiple times and then she heard a single "pop". said she ran away as she didn't know what was happening and shortly after was being walked out of the camper with a Deputy. said she ran to said she ran to said she ran to say and they went to the end of the driveway where saying "they shot him". |
| said every time would leave for rehab he would threaten suicide and she felt as though this incident was Jay's way out without committing suicide himself. said she has never seen Jay like this before as he was stiff with bulging eyes and he was in an evil trance. | SA Zassenhaus took photos of injuries. Those photos were placed into the critical incident folder associated with this case and report. While photos were being taken, the recording was unknowingly stopped for a short time. The recording was restarted once it was noticed. also signed a consent form for her cell phone to be searched. 



On August 16, 2023, at approximately 12:30 A.M., DCI Special Agent's (SA) Lance Maske and Maloree Zassenhaus interviewed at the Mullen Public Library, 106 Iron Street, Mellen, Wisconsin. The interview was conducted inside the main portion of the library.

This is a synopsis of the interview and not a verbatim account. The below does not memorialize all statements made during the interview. The interview was audio recorded and electronically uploaded to the critical incident folder under this case and report number.



On Tuesday, August 15, 2023, Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation (WI DOJ-DCI) Special Agent (SA) Floyd Lindsey was contacted by Special Agent in Charge (SAC) Shane Heiser. - One (1) Sig Sauer P320 9mm handgun, serial number 58J425857, with a Streamlight TLR-1 weapon light in a holster
- One(1) latex glove pouch
- One(1) Conductive energy weapon (Taser 7) in a holster

Deputy Bowe was later interviewed by DCI Special Agents Timothy Gensler and Shawn Sutherland. That interview was documented in DCI report number 23-6366/13.

During the OICI Deputy Bowe wore an Ashland County Deputy Sheriff uniform which consisted of a black long sleeve uniform shirt, black load bearing uniform vest carrier, duty belt and black uniform pants. On Wednesday, August 16, 2023, at approximately 2:05 A.M., Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) Special Agents (SA) Wade Beardsley and Floyd Lindsey, interviewed City of Mellen Police Chief Larry Koivisto, at the Ashland County Sheriff's Office (ACSO), located at 220 6th St E, Ashland, Ashland County, Wisconsin 54806, in an office space identified as the Squad Room. Also present during the interview was Wisconsin Professional Police Association (WPPA) Business Agent Rich Burghaus.

SA Beardsley explained the purpose and scope of the interview to Chief Koivisto and advised that the interview was completely voluntary. SA Beardsley advised Chief Koivisto that he was not required to give a statement to DCI. Chief Koivisto advised he understood and wished to continue with the interview. Chief Koivisto advised he did not want the interview recorded; as such, the interview was not audio or video recorded.

EDUCATION / EXPERIENCE

Chief Koivisto began working for the Iron County Sheriff's Office as a Correctional Officer in 2005 and began working full-time for the jail in 2008. Chief Koivisto attended the Gogebic Community College in Ironwood, Michigan in 2006 for Criminal Justice. Chief Koivisto next attended the law enforcement academy at the Chippewa Valley Technical College in 2011 in Eau Claire. In 2011 Chief Koivisto began working as a road Deputy for the Iron County Sheriff's Office. In 2012 or 2013, Chief Koivisto attended an Instructor Development School. In 2016, Chief Koivisto began working for the Mellen Police Department. In April of 2023 to current, Chief Koivisto was promoted to Chief for the Mellen Police Department.

ASSIGNMENT

Chief Koivisto described his position as a "working chief" and stated he typically worked 40 hours per week and as-needed for weekends or for call-outs. Chief Koivisto stated his radio identifier was 16-3. Chief Koivisto was not working a shift when he responded to the incident on N Foley Rd.

LAW ENFORCEMENT VEHICLE

Chief Koivisto described his vehicle as an unmarked, black Dodge Durango, with no external light bar. The vehicle had visor mounted emergency lighting in the front, back and both sides. The emergency vehicle was equipped with an audible siren and has no dash-mounted camera.

EVENTS PRIOR TO INCIDENT

Chief Koivisto was off-duty at his residence when he received a phone call from Ashland County Sheriff's Office Sergeant Jason Janecek, requesting mutual aid for an incident involving a knife. Sergeant Janecek requested Koivisto respond until the Sheriff's Office could bring in more personnel.

INCIDENT

Chief Koivisto advised he received the phone call from Sergeant Janecek on August 15, 2023 at 5:59 P.M. after reviewing his call records from his cell phone. Chief Koivisto stated that Sergeant Janecek told him there was some sort of incident involving a knife taking place at an address on N Foley Road. Chief Koivisto stated he began putting his duty gear on and turned on his radio. Chief Koivisto stated he radioed to ACSO Deputy Alex Petroski, asking if the situation involved a hostage. Chief Koivisto stated Deputy Petroski responded stating something similar to "I believe so." Chief Koivisto stated he arrived on scene approximately seven minutes later, as he did not live far from the scene.

Upon arriving on scene, Chief Koivisto stated he observed a male, later identified as Charles Schroeder, running on the road near the driveway of the incident. Based on the proximity of the male to the incident, Chief Koivisto stated he took the male at gun point and ordered him to the ground. Chief Koivisto stated the male complied and while getting on the ground, threw a large knife away from himself. Chief Koivisto stated he radioed to other Officers that he had one male subject at gunpoint. Chief Koivisto stated Deputy Petroski responded over the radio, advising that the male was not the suspect and could be let go. Chief Koivisto allowed the male to leave the area but secured his knife inside his squad in case it became relevant later on. SA Beardsley later asked DCI SA Shawn Sutherland if this knife was needed as evidence. SA Sutherland advised SA Beardsley the knife was not needed.

Chief Koivisto began making his approach on foot with his patrol rifle towards the residence from the driveway, when he encountered Deputy Petroski with one of the victims, identified as Chief Koivisto described as having three distinct marks or cuts on her stomach area. The reported to Chief Koivisto, Deputy Petroski, and ACSO Deputy Austen Bowe who had just arrived, that Jay Claremboux was trying to kill her and was threatening everyone with a knife inside the camper. Chief Koivisto described as in shock and talking extremely fast. Chief Koivisto believed there was at least one additional female still inside the camper.

Chief Koivisto stated the three of them briefly spoke about their approach to the residence. They all agreed their main priorities were to first establish a perimeter and attempt to make verbal contact with Claremboux. Chief Koivisto described the property as a "compound" that contained multiple campers and / or trailer homes and vehicles. Chief Koivisto stated they made their way down the driveway and walked towards an old trailer home on the left hand side of the driveway. Chief Koivisto stated that Claremboux was barricaded inside a camper perpendicular to that trailer home. Chief Koivisto stated he was near the back of the old trailer home when he heard Deputy Protoski say "drop the gun" from a nearby location. Chief Koivisto stated the male was later identified as Charles Schroeder, another resident on the property. Schroeder complied with Deputy Protoski's command to drop the gun, which Chief Koivisto described as a black, 20 gauge single-shot shotgun. Chief Koivisto stated he took the weapon from Schroeder and secured it.

Schroeder advised Officers that he retrieved the weapon from on the property.

Chief Koivisto positioned himself near a lawn mower and a large rock adjacent to the old trailer home. Chief Koivisto described the camper that Claremboux was in as directly across from his location. Chief Koivisto stated he could see from his position the front door to the camper, which he described as the "west side" of the camper. Chief Koivisto stated the door was partially open to the camper where Claremboux was believed to be inside.

Chief Koivisto stated he could hear law enforcement personnel attempting to communicate with Claremboux using a PA system and by telephone. It was Chief Koivisto's understanding that law enforcement personnel was also attempting to get a SWAT team and K-9 out to the scene as well. Chief Koivisto stated his primary objective at this point was to cover the door to the camper and maintain his position at the perimeter.

At some point while maintaining his position, Chief Koivisto switched spots with ACSO Deputy Steven Lipke. Chief Koivisto described this new position as the opposite end of the old trailer home, "near the back corner." Chief Koivisto stated this new perimeter position covered the camper's front and side windows where the suspect was believed to be. Chief Koivisto stated he could hear a female screaming and crying inside the camper and a male voice yelling statements similar to "Fuck you guys!" Chief Koivisto stated some of the statements were very muffled and difficult to make out due to where he was positioned. Chief Koivisto could also hear loud noises coming from inside the camper. Based on what Chief Koivisto witnessed up to this point, he believed that the female inside the camper was in danger.

Chief Koivisto stated that while in his perimeter position, he briefly saw Claremboux come to the front door of the camper, which was when Sergeant Janecek and Deputy Lipke began making their approach to the front door of the camper to make their entry. As the pair began making entry, Chief Koivisto repositioned to a truck that was parked adjacent to the camper. Chief Koivisto described the pair's entry as slow, tactical, and methodical. Chief Koivisto stated he believed the pair moved slowly and carefully due to the fact that Claremboux had just injured two victims with a knife. As the pair made entry, Chief Koivisto stated he could hear Sergeant Janecek yell "Drop the knife, drop the knife!" Chief Koivisto stated he next heard one gunshot followed by someone stating "Shots fired." Immediately after that, a female, identified as was quickly ushered out of the camper. After was outside of the camper, Chief Koivisto took her by the arm and quickly escorted her to the end of the driveway where was. Chief Koivisto called for EMS to assess the injuries of both females. Chief Koivisto stated he did not visually witness any law enforcement personnel fire their weapon.

Chief Koivisto described as hysterical. told Chief Koivisto that Claremboux had cut her with a knife. Chief Koivisto observed an approximately three to four inch long cut to left forearm that appeared to be bleeding. also advised Chief Koivisto that Claremboux had also strangled her inside the camper.

Chief Koivisto stated he made sure to keep and separate and asked them not to talk to each other about the incident until law enforcement could interview them. Chief Koivisto stated that after EMS cleared the pair, he transported and to the Mellen Library where they met with a victim advocate.

PRIOR KNOWLEDGE OF DECEDENT

Chief Koivisto stated he first saw Claremboux in town approximately two weeks ago. A few days after first seeing Claremboux in public, Koivisto identified him as Jay Claremboux. Chief Koivisto described conducting a traffic stop on a van that contained , and Claremboux. Chief Koivisto believed the traffic stop occurred last Saturday, August 12. Claremboux was in the back seat of the van, while the two females were in the front. Chief Koivisto described Claremboux during the traffic stop as upset, rambling and very agitated. Chief Koivisto advised the traffic stop resulted in a citation to the driver and nothing more.

At the end of the interview, Chief Koivisto drew a rough diagram of the property, including where he parked his squad and his general movements on the property. The diagram has been electronically attached to this report.

The interview concluded at approximately 3:09 A.M.

On Tuesday, August 15, 2023, the Ashland County Sheriff's Office (ACSO) and the Mellen Police Department (MPD) were involved in an Officer-Involved Critical Incident (OICI) at 33695 North Foley Rd, Town of Morse, Ashland County, WI. The OICI resulted in the fatal shooting of Jay Allen Claremboux, who was shot by ACSO Patrol Sergeant Jason Janecek.

The Ashland County Sheriff's Office requested the Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) lead the investigation of the OICI.

On August 16, 2023, from approximately 12:13 a.m. to 12:50 a.m., DCI Special Agents Shawn Sutherland and Timothy Gensler conducted a uniform and weapon inspection of Sergeant Janecek at the Ashland County Sheriff's Office. Wisconsin Professional Police Association (WPPA) Business Agent Rich Burghaus was present during the inspection.

At the time of the OICI, Sergeant Janecek was wearing his department issued uniform which consisted of a black, long-sleeve uniform shirt and black uniform pants. His uniform shirt had Ashland County Sheriff's Office patches on both shoulders with a Sergeant stripe patch affixed below each shoulder patch. On the left chest he wore a gold Ashland County Sheriff's Office badge and on the right chest he wore a gold pin with his name "J. Janecek" on it. In the center of his chest he wears a Motorola body-worn camera in a mount affixed to his uniform shirt.

After arriving on scene, Sergeant Janecek donned a "chest rig" which is a multi-camouflage vest-like carrier. On the carrier there were four 30-round rifle magazines which contained 28 rounds, 29 rounds, 31 rounds, and 20 rounds respectively. Also on the carrier were two 17-round handgun magazines each containing 17 rounds. Additionally, Sergeant Janecek had a gray camouflage colored medical kit affixed to the right side of the vest with "JANECEK" in black letters on the front.

During the OICI, Sergeant Janecek wore the following items on his duty belt going clockwise from center:

- One (1) pouch which contained a canister of oleoresin capsicum (OC) spray.
- One (1) double handcuff case.
- One (1) Glock 17, Gen 5, 9mm handgun with a Streamlight TLR-1 HL tactical light, serial number BGMH636, in a holster.
- One (1) key ring holder.
- One (1) pouch which contained a Leatherman multi-tool.
- One (1) pouch which contained latex gloves.

Sergent Janecek carried his department approved, personally owned, handgun, which is a Glock 17, Gen 5, 9mm with a Streamlight TLR-1 HL tactical light mounted on it. The magazine in the weapon carried sixteen (16) rounds and there was a single round removed from the chamber for a total of seventeen (17) rounds. Sergeant Janecek carried two additional handgun magazines on his duty belt and two additional handgun magazines on his "chest rig". All four of the extra magazines each carried seventeen (17) rounds. The ammunition was stamped "9mm Luger Speer".

Sergeant Janecek also carried his department issued rifle, which is a DPMS Panther Arms, .223-5.56 caliber, serial number FF 013186. The rifle had an Aimpoint red-dot optic mounted on top and a tactical flashlight mounted to the barrel in front of the forearm. There was one 20-round magazine inserted in the magazine well. Sergeant Janecek thought he had 18-20 rounds of ammunition loaded in the magazine at the time of the OICI.

Sergeant Janecek did not believe the Aimpoint red-dot was operational during the incident. Upon inspecting the optic, it was determined that the single battery compartment cap was not completely tightened, which prevented the battery from making the necessary connection to illuminate the red-dot. Sergeant Janecek surmised that over time, the battery compartment cap simply vibrated loose during everyday transport in his squad. Sergeant Janecek demonstrated that his front and rear iron sights on the weapon were visible allowing him to aim the weapon properly without the red-dot functioning. The weapon-mounted light was operational.

SA Sutherland removed the 20-round magazine from the rifle and ejected one unfired round from the chamber. The 20-round magazine carried sixteen (16) rounds for a total of seventeen (17) rounds. On Tuesday, August 15, 2023, the Ashland County Sheriff's Office (ACSO) and the Mellen Police Department (MPD) were involved in an Officer-Involved Critical Incident (OICI) at 33695 North Foley Rd, Town of Morse, Ashland County, WI. The OICI resulted in the fatal shooting of Jay Allen Claremboux, who was shot by ACSO Patrol Sergeant Jason Janecek.

The Ashland County Sheriff's Office requested the Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) lead the investigation of the OICI.

On August 16, 2023, from approximately 1:25 a.m. to 1:43 a.m., DCI Special Agents Shawn Sutherland and Timothy Gensler conducted a uniform and weapon inspection of Deputy Petroski at the Ashland County Sheriff's Office. Wisconsin Professional Police Association (WPPA) Business Agent Rich Burghaus was present during the inspection.

At the time of the OICI, Deputy Petroski was wearing his department issued uniform which consisted of a black, short-sleeve uniform shirt and black uniform pants. His uniform shirt had Ashland County Sheriff's Office patches on both shoulders. Deputy Petroski was wearing a black vest carrier over his uniform shirt. On the left chest he wore a silver Ashland County Sheriff's Office badge with a "SHERIFF" patch in white letters below it. In a pouch below the "SHERIFF" patch he had a pen and a handcuff key. On the right chest he wore a name patch with "PETROSKI" in white letters on it. In a pouch below his name patch he carried an Olympus brand audio recorder, which Deputy Petroski activated during the OICI. There was a flashlight affixed to his right shoulder lapel. There was a portable radio lapel mic affixed to his left shoulder lapel with an ear piece clipped to his vest carrier. On the back of the vest carrier there was a large "SHERIFF" patch in white letters.

Deputy Petroski wore the following items on his vest carrier going clockwise from center:

- One (1) pouch which contained a canister of oleoresin capsicum (OC) spray.
- One (1) pouch which contained an expandable baton.
- One (1) handcuff case.
- One (1) pouch which contained a portable radio with a lapel mic.
- One (1) double-magazine pouch which held two extra .40 caliber handgun magazines.

Deputy Petroski wore the following items on his duty belt going clockwise from center:

- One (1) key ring holder.
- One (1) Glock 23, Gen 4, .40 caliber handgun with a Streamlight TLR-1S tactical light, serial number BDDX757, in a holster.
- One (1) flashlight ring.
- One (1) TASER holster which contained a TASER with one cartridge attached.

Ashland County Sheriff Sergeant Jason Janecek's Body-Worn Camera files from OICI

On August 16, 2023, Ryan Kelleher, a Digital Evidence Specialist (DES) with the Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) obtained three audio/video files from the Ashland County Sheriff's Office. The audio/video files were downloaded from Ashland County Sheriff Patrol Sergeant Jason Janecek's body-worn camera, which he was wearing during his normal patrol shift on August 15, 2023.

When DES Kelleher acquired the three video files he determined only two of the video files were relevant to the Officer Involved Critical Incident (OICI), which resulted in the fatal shooting of Jay Claremboux. The third video file documented an unrelated call for service that Sergeant Janecek handled just prior to responding to the OICI.

During his preliminary review of the two video files, DES Kelleher discovered Sergeant Janecek's body-worn camera was deactivated for a large portion of the OICI. See SA Sutherland's case report number 23-6366/17 for his review of the video files.

Ashland County Deputy Alex Petroski's audio recording of OICI

On August 16, 2023, Ryan Kelleher, a Digital Evidence Specialist (DES) with the Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) obtained one audio file from the Ashland County Sheriff's Office. The audio file was downloaded from Ashland County Sheriff Deputy Alex Petroski's Olympus digital audio recorder, which he was wearing during his normal patrol shift on August 15, 2023. AUTOPSY OF JAY CLAREMBOUX

On Tuesday, August 15, 2023, the Wisconsin Department of Justice - Division of Criminal Investigation (WI-DOJ/DCI) was requested to investigate an Officer Involved Critical Incident (OICI) which occurred at 33695 North Foley Road, in the Town of Morse, Ashland County, WI. The OICI occurred in the evening hours of Tuesday, August 15, 2023, and involved the fatal shooting of Jay A. Claremboux who was shot by Sergeant Jason Janecek of the Ashland County Sheriff's Office during a police response incident.

Eau Claire Field Office Special Agent-in-Charge (SAC) Michael Haverley requested a Special Agent (S/A) from the Madison Field Office attend the autopsy of Claremboux. S/A Alexander Agnew was subsequently assigned to attend the autopsy, which took place at the Dane County Medical Examiner's Office located at 3111 Luds Lane, McFarland, WI. The autopsy occurred on Thursday, August 17, 2023, between approximately 9:00 AM and 2:30 PM. Dane County Deputy Medical Examiner - Forensic Pathologist Dr. Vincent Tranchida, conducted the autopsy of Claremboux and was assisted by Autopsy Technician Brigid Vickerman.

Post-mortem radiography was conducted by Dane County Medical Examiner's Office staff prior to the start of the autopsy.

The following evidentiary items were obtained at the aforementioned autopsy and subsequently collected and packaged by Dr. Tranchida and Autopsy Technician Vickerman:

At the conclusion of the autopsy, Dr. Tranchida provided S/A Agnew with a 'Property Evidence Release' form which listed each item individually and documented the DNA swabbing's that were obtained during the autopsy. The 'Property Evidence Release' form has been electronically attached to this report in ACISS.

S/A Agnew took possession of the evidentiary items and transferred them to temporary evidence locker # 1 at the Madison Regional Field Office on the same date.

On Monday, August 21, 2023, S/A Agnew retrieved the items of evidence from temporary evidence locker # 1 to further process the evidence. S/A Agnew properly packaged, labeled, and sealed all items of evidence and placed them back into evidence locker # 1 for the evidence to be transferred into long-term DCI secure evidence storage.

During the autopsy of Claremboux, Dr. Vincent Tranchida provided S/A Agnew with his preliminary findings and diagnoses'. Dr. Tranchida advised the following:





Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) Special Agent (SA) Shawn Sutherland, reviewed an audio recording that Ashland County Sheriff's Deputy Alex Petroski obtained during the Officer Involved Critical Incident that occurred at 33695 N Foley Rd, Town of Morse, Ashland County, on August 15, 2023.

The audio recording is 48 minutes and 48 seconds in duration. The following is a summary of the recording and is not intended to be an exact transcript of the recording. Involved subjects mentioned in the report include the following:



Another male approached Deputy Petroski on foot and identified himself as Jaysen Thorsen. Another deputy can be heard talking to another male but eventually the deputies told them to leave the property for the time being.

Page 1

Deputy Petroski asked to call cell phone in an attempt to make contact with Claremboux. Deputies began to approach the camper to cover the doors and establish a perimeter around the camper.

Deputies made contact with another male on foot named Charles, who had a firearm. (Charles was later identified as Charles E. Schroeder.) Schroeder said he had the firearm for "self preservation" because "he" (Claremboux) threatened to stab him with a knife. A deputy recognized Schroeder as Ed's cousin and they directed him to put the gun down and he complied. Schroeder said it was "Chuck's" gun. They directed Schroeder to stand by

Deputy Petroski spoke with the other officers to devise a plan. Deputy Petroski said he could hear yelling from within the camper, which can be heard on the recording. Sgt. Janecek was on scene and directed Deputy Petroski to drive his squad car up the driveway and park closer to the camper in order to utilize his public address (PA) system to order Claremboux out of the camper.

Deputy Petroski did so and began the announcements at the 17:21 mark of the recording. He identified himself as the Ashland County Sheriff's Department and requested Claremboux come out of the house with his hands up a few times, but received no response. Deputy Petroski requested Claremboux acknowledge him but Claremboux did not respond. Deputy Petroski announced they wanted Claremboux to come out so they could talk with him, but received no response. Deputy Petroski asked Claremboux if there was a cell phone they could call him on, but received no response.

Sgt. Janecek can be heard on the radio saying he can hear the female crying and the male yelling within the camper and believed they (law enforcement) had limited time to act. This was approximately 10 minutes into the time frame of Deputy Petroski's announcements. Deputy Petroski, again, announced directly to "Jay", come out and speak with them so they can work it out.

Moments later, Claremboux is on speaker on cell phone talking with Deputy Petroski. Deputy Petroski identified himself as being with the sheriff's office and Claremboux stated, "I don't give a fuck who you are!" He continued to yell and say things like, "Shut the fuck up!" and "Shut your fucking lip bitch!" to Deputy Petroski attempted to talk Claremboux out of the camper in order to resolve the matter peacefully. Claremboux was extremely upset and would not comply with Deputy Petroski's requests for him to come out of the camper or send of the camper. Claremboux said something like, "Fuck you! I'll slit her throat!" and began counting "One, two". can be heard crying in the background. Deputy Petroski told Claremboux to "Stop" and asked what was going on. Claremboux yelled, "Listen here motherfucker! You're going to shut your fucking lip!" and said something like, it was between him, her and her cousin. Deputy Petroski continued to ask Claremboux to come outside and talk with him and said this was a bad situation. Claremboux responded, "If you don't leave here, it's going to be a bad situation." Deputy Petroski asked Claremboux to send said she wasn't going anywhere. Claremboux yelled that he was done talking and hung up.

attempted to call cell phone two more times but he did not answer. On the third call Claremboux answered. He, in part, referenced something going on with his kids and He said law enforcement can leave and let him deal with it or there will be dead bodies coming out of the camper. He said those are the choices and "Go fuck yourself you fat piece of shit" and hung up. This was at the 31:05 mark of the recording.

Deputy Petroski continued to attempt to make contact with Claremboux over the PA. Deputy Petroski was also updating Lt. Joe Eder by telephone, who was responding to the scene.

Deputy Petroski asked what was causing Claremboux to do this and she said he recently had his children taken away from him.

At the 34:00 mark of the recording, Sgt. Janecek can be heard on the radio saying they haven't heard the female (meaning in the camper for a while and felt they had to take action soon. Seconds later Deputy Petroski called Chief Deputy Nathan Delegan. Sgt. Janecek took the phone and began briefing Chief Deputy Delegan. During the call one of the deputies on the perimeter reported he could hear noises coming from within the camper and thought Claremboux may be actively assaulting Deputy Petroski made an immediate announcement over the PA, again, ordering Claremboux out of the camper so they could talk.

At the 37:53 mark of the recording an officer announced over the radio, "He's coming". An officer can be heard saying, "Come on out", and then at 38:00 Deputy Petroski stated, "He just shut the door".

At 38:08 Deputy Petroski stated, "We're going. We're going." and sounded like he was moving on foot.

At 38:13 an officer can be heard yelling, "Show us your hands!" several times and each behard crying/wailing in the background. Other commands were also being given by law enforcement.

At 38:25 a loud pop, like a gunshot, can be heard.

Deputy Petroski immediately stated, "Shots fired!" and other commands of, "Drop the knife!" and "Drop it!" were being shouted. The crying and wailing became louder. An officer can be heard shouting, "Get her out of here!"

While officers were evacuating out of the camper other officers were talking about securing the knife and handcuffing Claremboux.

On Tuesday, August 15, 2023, Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation (WI DOJ/DCI) Special Agents were requested to investigate an Officer Involved Critical Incident (OICI) which occurred at 33695 North Foley Road, in the town of Morse, Ashland County, Wisconsin. The OICI occurred in the evening hours of Tuesday, August 15, 2023, and was regarding the fatal shooting of Jay A. Claremboux who was shot by Sergeant Jason Janecek of the Ashland County Sheriff's Office.

On Wednesday, August 16, 2023, at approximately 12:56 a.m. Special Agent (SA) Timothy Gensler and SA Shawn Sutherland of the WI DOJ/DCI met with Deputy Steven Lipke who was present during the OICI. Also present for the meeting was Business Agent Rich Burghaus from the Wisconsin Professional Police Association (WPPA). The purpose of the meeting was to document the uniform and equipment Deputy Lipke had been wearing at the time of the OICI. The meeting took place in the Ashland County Sheriff's Office, which was located at, 220 6th Street East, in the City of Ashland, Ashland County, Wisconsin.

SA Gensler took overall photographs of Deputy Lipke which documented how Deputy Lipke had been dressed and equipped at the time of the OICI. Deputy Lipke was not wearing his uniform top which Deputy Lipke reported was soiled with blood from performing lifesaving measures on Claremboux. Deputy Lipke had his uniform top in a plastic grocery bag which was later photographed by SA Sutherland and collected for evidence. SA Gensler also photographed Deputy Lipke's duty weapon, patrol rifle, spare magazines, and ammunition. Deputy Lipke did not report any physical injuries as a result of the OICI.

Deputy Lipke was wearing an authorized Ashland County Sheriff's Office uniform shirt, black in color with Ashland County Sheriff's Office patches affixed to both shoulders. Deputy Lipke wore a black external ballistic vest carrier which on the right chest he wore an American flag patch and a name tag which displayed in white letters over black, "LIPKE." Below his name tag Deputy Lipke wore a silver-colored SWAT pin. On the left chest he wore a silver-colored Ashland County Sheriff's Office Badge and a patch which read in white letters over black, "SHERIFF." On the back of the vest carrier, Deputy Lipke wore a patch which read in white letters over black, "SHERIFF."

Deputy Lipke was wearing black uniform cargo pants. In the right cargo pocket, he carried a tourniquet, extra batteries, Narcan, and earplugs. In the left cargo pocket, he was carrying a wallet and a note pad. Deputy Lipke was wearing black boots.

The following items were on Deputy Lipke's duty belt going clockwise from center:

• One (1) double magazine pouch containing two (2) Glock magazines, each of which held fifteen (15) rounds of .40 S&W ammunition which was stamped "40 S&W SPEER"

- One (1) Glock G22, Gen 4, caliber .40 S&W handgun, serial number SWS333 inside of a holster.
- On the rear of Deputy Lipke's duty belt was a glove pouch.
- One (1) pouch which contained a canister of oleoresin capsicum (OC) spray which was not used during the OICI.
- One (1) pouch which contained a flashlight.
- One (1) rifle retention lanyard.

The following items were on Deputy Lipke's external vest carrier, going clockwise from center:

- One (1) pouch which contained an extendable baton.
- One (1) pouch with portable radio with an attached lapel microphone.
- One (1) double handcuff pouch containing one (1) pair of handcuffs. Deputy Lipke stated the other set that belonged in the pouch were placed on Claremboux at the scene of the OICI.
- One (1) TASER holster containing one (1) TASER with TASER cartridge attached (not used).
- In the front pocket of the vest carrier Deputy Lipke carried an audio only recording device which he stated was not activated during the OICI. Deputy Lipke was not wearing a body camera.

Deputy Lipke removed his duty weapon from the holster, removed the magazine from the weapon, and removed a live round of ammunition from the chamber. The handgun was a Glock, model G22, Gen 4, semi-automatic, caliber .40 S&W. The magazine in the weapon had fifteen (15) unfired rounds of .40 S&W ammunition. One (1) additional round of ammunition was removed from the chamber for a total of sixteen (16) rounds loaded into Deputy Lipke's Handgun. Deputy Lipke had two (2) spare magazines, each containing fifteen (15) rounds of ammunition. All the ammunition recovered from Deputy Lipke's duty weapon and spare magazines appeared to be consistent and was stamped with "40 S&W SPEER."

Deputy Lipke was also armed with a patrol rifle during the OICI. The rifle was a Rock River Arms LAR-15, caliber 5.56-millimeter, serial number CM117643. The rifle had iron sights, a sling, and a mounted Streamlight TRL RM2 flashlight. Inserted in the magazine well of the rifle was a thirty (30) round magazine which contained thirty (30) rounds of mixed brand/type ammunition. There was no round in the chamber of the rifle. Deputy Lipke reported that after the

OICI another law enforcement officer on scene took the rifle from him and unloaded the round from the chamber.

The uniform inspection of Deputy Lipke concluded at approximately 1:20 a.m.

SA Gensler electronically uploaded the photos SA Gensler took of Deputy Lipke and his weapons, magazines, and unfired ammunition to the DCI records repository.

On Tuesday, August 15, 2023, Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation (WI DOJ/DCI) Special Agents were requested to investigate an Officer Involved Critical Incident (OICI) which occurred at 33695 North Foley Road, in the Town of Morse, Ashland County, Wisconsin. The OICI occurred in the evening hours of Tuesday, August 15, 2023, and was regarding the fatal shooting of Jay A. Claremboux who was shot by Sergeant Jason Janecek of the Ashland County Sheriff's Office.

On Wednesday, August 16, 2023, at approximately 3:07 a.m. Special Agent (SA) Timothy Gensler and SA Shawn Sutherland of the WI DOJ/DCI completed an interview with Deputy Austen Bowe of the Ashland County Sheriff's Office, who was present during the OICI. Present for the interview was Business Agent Rich Burghaus from the Wisconsin Professional Police Association (WPPA). The interview took place in the Ashland County Sheriff's Office, which was located at, 220 6th Street East, in the City of Ashland, Ashland County, Wisconsin.


Prior to the commencement of the interview, SA Gensler and SA Sutherland introduced themselves to Deputy Bowe. Deputy Bowe consented to all parties being present during the interview. Deputy Bowe acknowledged he understood the WI DOJ/DCI was conducting a criminal investigation regarding the OICI and Deputy Bowe did not have to provide a statement to investigators and was free to take a break from the interview or stop the interview at any time. Deputy Bowe agreed to provide a voluntary statement regarding the OICI which occurred on Tuesday, August 15, 2023. Deputy Bowe requested the interview not be recorded.

Education / Experience:

Deputy Bowe obtained an associate degree in criminal justice from Chippewa Valley Technical College (CVTC) in Eau Claire, Wisconsin, and graduated in 2020. Deputy Bowe then attended the police academy at CVCT and graduated from the police academy in 2020.

Deputy Bowe began his law enforcement career as a Deputy Sheriff for the Ashland County Sheriff's Office on October 5, 2020, and was assigned to the patrol division.

Assignment:



On the morning of Tuesday August 15, 2023, Deputy Bowe completed his shift at approximately 5:00 a.m. He then went to the gym and exercised until approximately 6:30 a.m. Deputy Bowe then went home, ate, and went to bed at approximately 7:30 a.m. Deputy Bowe slept until approximately 3:30 p.m. which he indicated was an average amount of sleep for him. Deputy

Bowe did not take any medication that would have interfered with his ability to perform his duties as a law enforcement officer and did not consume any alcoholic beverages in the twenty-four (24) hours preceding the OICI.

Law Enforcement / Police Descriptors

Deputy Bowe was assigned a fully marked take home squad car and was dressed in full Ashland County Sheriff's Office uniform at the time of the OICI.

Prior to the interview, SA Floyd Lindsay and SA Wade Beardsley of the WI DOJ/DCI completed a uniform and weapons inspection with Deputy Bowe. Deputy Bowe stated the uniform and equipment he was wearing during the uniform inspection was consistent with what he had at the time of the OICI. Please see the report regarding the uniform and equipment inspection of Deputy Bowe for further detail.

Deputy Bowe's supervisor for his shift was Ashland County Sheriff's Office Sergeant Jason Janecek.

Deputy Bowe's radio call number was 619 and he was dispatched through the Ashland County Sheriff's Office Dispatch Center.

Events Prior to incident:

On Tuesday August 15, 2023, Deputy Bowe began his shift just prior to 6:00 p.m. in the driveway of his residence and was assigned to the "north sector" of Ashland County. Upon starting his shift, Deputy Bowe heard the initial radio dispatch for the call for service that resulted in the OICI. Deputy Bowe recalled dispatch advising there was a female 911 caller who indicated there was a disturbance involving a knife in the Town of Mellen, Ashland County, Wisconsin.

Deputy Bowe proceeded towards the address of the disturbance "10-33" (lights and sirens) and estimated the drivetime to the call to have been approximately eight (8) minutes. While enroute to the call, Deputy Bowe overheard radio traffic from Deputy Alex Petroski of the Ashland County Sheriff's Office who was on scene, that there was a possible hostage situation involving a male armed with a knife and a female hostage.

Deputy Bowe also heard radio traffic from Chief Larry Koivisto of the Mellen Police Department, indicating he was on scene and had contact with an unknown male individual who was running. Chief Koivisto later advised the unknown male was not the suspect and was from a nearby trailer on the same property trying to find help.

Incident:

Deputy Bowe was the third law enforcement officer to arrive at the scene. Upon arrival Deputy Alex Petroski and Chief Larry Koivisto were already on scene. Deputy Bowe parked his squad car in between Deputy Petroski's and Chief Koivisto's squads approximately fifty (50) yards

north of the driveway to the residence. Deputy Bowe could not remember the name of the road the OICI occurred on.

Once on scene Deputy Bowe located Deputy Petroski and Chief Koivisto. Deputy Bowe could observe an unknown female standing outside the trailer the OICI later occurred in. Law enforcement officers were able to make verbal contact with the female and call her back to their location. Deputy Bowe described the woman as the taller of the two woman involved in the OICI and described the other female who was still in the trailer as

Upon contacting the woman, Deputy Bowe observed lacerations to the woman's abdominal area that were approximately six (6) to eight (8) inches in length and appeared to be the depth of a paper cut and were slightly bleeding. The female indicated "he did this to me." Deputy Bowe believed the female was referring to Claremboux. Based on information from the taller woman it was believed there was still a male and female subject in the trailer and the male who was armed with a knife was not allowing the female to leave.

Deputy Bowe and the other officers had a brief conversation about their tactical approach. Deputy Bowe then traveled along a tree line on the north side of the trailer, crossed a fence, and found a vantage point on the backside of the trailer near a brush pile approximately ten (10) to twelve (12) yards from the trailer.

From the vantage point, Deputy Bowe was not able to see inside but was able to hear some of what was occurring inside the trailer. Deputy Bowe heard two voices, one of a female crying and one of a male telling the woman to "shut up" and making various other aggressive and threatening statements to the female. Deputy Bowe heard the male voice calling out stating "you guys better leave or she's going to lose a finger." The male was threatening that if they didn't leave once the male counted to five (5) he would cut one of the females fingers off. Deputy Bowe heard the male begin counting several times, but he did not count all the way to five (5). Deputy Bowe never heard the male directly address law enforcement but based on the noise Deputy Bowe was making on approach and the nature of the comments, Deputy Bowe believed the male either knew or suspected law enforcement was present and was directing the threats towards them.

Deputy Bowe then observed the male come to an open window that faced Deputy Bowe's position and cover the window with a blanket. While the male was covering the window, Deputy Bowe observed in the male's hand a long shiny object that Deputy Bowe believed to have been a knife.

After approximately fifteen (15) to twenty (20) minutes, Deputy Bowe heard radio traffic from Sgt. Janecek and Deputy Lipke indicating they had arrived on scene. Sgt. Janecek was using the radio to check on the locations of the law enforcement officers already on scene.

Deputy Petroski then pulled his squad car approximately twenty-five (25) to thirty (30) yards from the trailer and used the squad car's public address system (PA) to announce the presence of law enforcement and directing "Jay" to exit the trailer. Deputy Petroski made approximately two (2) to three (3) announcements over an approximate six (6) to seven (7) minute time frame. After the first announcement Deputy Bowe heard a male voice inside the trailer respond, "fuck you!" Deputy Bowe heard subsequent responses to the announcements from the male stating "I'm going to die either way," and threatening to cut the females head off. The male was also making comments that appeared to have been directed at the female, to the effect of, "you left me when I needed you the most" and "I can't believe you would do this to me."

Deputy Bowe then observed the male exit the trailer, yell something and then go back inside the trailer. Deputy Bowe then observed Sgt. Janecek, Deputy Lipke, and Deputy Petrosky follow the male to the trailer and make entry into the trailer. Deputy Bowe then left his vantage point and began approaching to assist in the entry. While still approaching and outside the trailer, Deputy Bowe heard multiple commands from law enforcement inside the trailer announcing they were law enforcement and commanding the male to show his hands. Deputy Bowe then heard a single gunshot from inside the trailer and then heard radio traffic from Sgt. Janecek advising dispatch there were shots fired.

Deputy Bowe then entered the trailer and evacuated the female who was inside and turned her over to Chief Koivisto who was outside, Deputy Bowe did not observe any visible injuries to the female. Deputy Bowe then re-entered the trailer and observed Sgt. Janecek and Deputy Lipke securing the male subject. Deputy Bowe observed a single wound in the male's upper chest area and observed Sgt. Janecek and Deputy Lipke apply pressure to the wound to control the bleeding. Deputy Petrosky went to get the medical kit from his squad car.

Deputy Bowe was handed a rifle by Deputy Lipke, Deputy Bowe later removed the magazine and cycled the action to eject the round from the chamber, however Deputy Bowe did not observe a round come out of the chamber. Deputy Bowe secured the rifle in Deputy Lipke's squad car.

The male subject was removed from the trailer and further medical aid was rendered to him by law enforcement. Emergency Medical Services (EMS) personnel had staged earlier, near the address of the call and were on scene almost immediately and took over lifesaving efforts on the male subject. Deputy Bowe later overheard conversation between EMS personnel that the subject was deceased.

Deputy Bowe then observed multiple Ashland County Sheriff's Office administrative personnel arrive at the scene, to include, Sheriff Brian Zupke, Chief Deputy Nate Delegan and Lieutenant Joe Eder. Deputy Bowe remained on scene for a period for scene security and was later dismissed by administrative personnel and drove himself back to the Ashland County Sheriff's Office in his squad car.

Deputy Bowe was not injured during the OICI.

Deputy Bowe stated he had no conversations with others about the OICI prior to speaking with SA Gensler and SA Sutherland.

Deputy Bowe had no direct observations of the male subject being shot but theorized when asked, that Sgt. Janecek had been the officer who fired his weapon. Deputy Bowe believed this based on conversation he overheard at the scene and the fact Sgt. Janecek was removed from the scene by administrative personnel.

Previous Contacts with the Subjects or residence:

Deputy Bowe did not know the male subject's name (Claremboux) until during the OICI when it was being used to address him and never had contact with him or the two females who were on scene. Deputy Bowe had never been to the residence prior to the OICI.

The interview concluded at approximately 4:15 a.m.

On August 21, 2023, Wisconsin Department of Justice - Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI), Special Agent (SA) Jay Greeno began reviewing twenty (20) non-emergency phone calls received by or made by Ashland County Dispatch during the Ashland County officer involved death (OID). Of the twenty (20) recordings, there were seventeen (17) different conversations that SA Greeno reviewed. This is because some of the separate recordings were call backs or continuations of conversations that had to be cut short due to other calls coming in. This OID occurred on August 15, 2023, at 33695 North Foley Road, Town of Morse, Ashland County.

Below is a brief synopsis by SA Greeno of the outgoing and incoming non-emergency calls that were recorded by Ashland County Dispatch. The order of the calls is the order in which DCI received the files from Ashland County.

- 1. Ashland dispatch calling Jake Vosters to request assistance from DCI.
- 2. Life link 3 (med flight) calling into dispatch and then being canceled by Ashland County.
- 3. Ashland dispatch confirms cancellation of Life link 3.
- 4. Ambulance/Medic's call into dispatch for information.
- 5. Ashland County Coroner calling in to dispatch for information.
- 6. Wisconsin State Patrol calling in to dispatch for information.
- 7. Dispatch asked to advise hospital that a blood draw is coming in.

- 10. Dispatch calling unknown unit asking for assistance.
- 11. Unknown individual contacts dispatch asking them to contact DCI for assistance.
- 12. Dispatch calls Life link 3 to request a helicopter for medical evac.
- 13. Ashland County Coroner's Office calling dispatch for information.
- 14. Ashland County Coroner's Office asking for directions to the scene.
- 15. Mike Haverley from DCI calling for contact information of Ashland County Sheriff.
- 16. Ashland dispatch calling unknown unit for assistance.
- 17. Unknown deputy calling into dispatch with witness identification information.

On August 16, 2023, Ryan Kelleher, a Digital Evidence Specialist (DES) with the Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) obtained three audio/video files from the Ashland County Sheriff's Office. The audio/video files were downloaded from Ashland County Sheriff Patrol Sergeant Jason Janecek's body-worn camera, which he was wearing during his normal patrol shift on August 15, 2023.

When DES Kelleher acquired the three video files he determined only two of the video files were relevant to the Officer Involved Critical Incident (OICI), which resulted in the fatal shooting of Jay Claremboux. The third video file documented an unrelated call for service that Sergeant Janecek handled just prior to responding to the OICI.

During his preliminary review of the two video files, DES Kelleher discovered Sergeant Janecek's body-worn camera was deactivated for a large portion of the OICI.

On August 18, 2023, Sergeant Janecek was interviewed by DCI Special Agents Shawn Sutherland and Timothy Gensler. Sergeant Janecek was informed about his body-worn camera not recording for the entirety of the OICI. Sergeant Janecek was certain he activated his camera prior to the incident but was unsure why the camera wasn't operational for the duration of the call. It was discussed that his exterior "chest rig", which held extra magazines for his rifle and handgun, inadvertently made contact with the body-worn camera power button.

SA Sutherland reviewed the two OICI related audio/video files and made the following observations:

Video file - "...0000516905 video0"

This video begins with a date/time stamp of 8/15/2023 at 18:12:51 hours and ends at 18:14:21 hours. It captured Sergeant Janecek's initial arrival on scene. He exited his squad car, charged his department issued rifle, and began walking up the driveway. The video ends when he makes contact with a male subject who is driving an ATV off of the adjacent property. It was determined he was not involved in the OICI.

Video file - "...0000521196 video0"

This video begins with a date/time stamp of 8/15/2023 at 18:48:47 hours and ends at 18:49:30 hours. This captured Sergeant Janecek outside of the camper trailer after the shooting. EMS personnel were providing medical care to Claremboux. The video ends while Sergeant Janecek is waiting for his supervisors to arrive on scene.

These videos were previously archived by SA Sutherland in the DCI Critical Incident folder and can be found under case report number 23-6366/8.

DES Kelleher restricted the 3 video files exported—it should be mentioned that DES Kelleher was logged in under the account, Jason Janecek, Ashland County Sheriff's Office Sergeant, in which his account has permissions to view media placed into the "restricted" status.

DES Kelleher was notified by Ashland County Patrol Lieutenant Joe Eder that Ashland County Deputy Alex Petroski had utilized an audio recording device to capture audio of the officer involved critical incident. DES Kelleher copied the audio file of investigative interest to USB media.

On August 16, 2023, DES Kelleher provided S/A Sutherland with one USB Media containing 3 video files from a Motorola V300 Body Camera (Preview Item 1) and one audio file from Deputy Petroski's audio recording device.

On Tuesday, August 15, 2023, Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation (WI DOJ/DCI) Special Agents were requested to investigate an Officer Involved Critical Incident (OICI) which occurred at 33695 North Foley Road, in the Town of Morse, Ashland County, Wisconsin. The OICI occurred in the evening hours of Tuesday, August 15, 2023, and was regarding the fatal shooting of Jay A. Claremboux who was shot by Sergeant Jason Janecek of the Ashland County Sheriff's Office.

On Friday, August 18, 2023, at approximately 11:18 a.m. Special Agent (SA) Timothy Gensler and SA Shawn Sutherland of the WI DOJ/DCI conducted an interview with Deputy Steven Lipke of the Ashland County Sheriff's Office who was present during the OICI. Present for the interview was Attorney/Executive Director James Palmer and Business Agent Rich Burghaus from the Wisconsin Professional Police Association (WPPA). The interview took place in the Ashland County Sheriff's Office, which was located at, 220 6th Street East, in the City of Ashland, Ashland County, Wisconsin.

Prior to the commencement of the interview, SA Gensler and SA Sutherland introduced themselves to Deputy Lipke. Deputy Lipke consented to all parties being present during the interview. Deputy Lipke acknowledged he understood the WI DOJ/DCI was conducting a criminal investigation regarding the OICI and Deputy Lipke did not have to provide a statement to investigators and was free to take a break from the interview or stop the interview at any time. Deputy Lipke agreed to provide a voluntary statement regarding the OICI which occurred on Tuesday, August 15, 2023. Deputy Lipke requested the interview not be recorded.

Education / Experience:

Deputy Lipke obtained a bachelor's degree in psychology from the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities (UMN) where he attended from 2009 and graduated in 2013. He then attended the three (3) month police academy in South Dakota.


Deputy Lipke began his law enforcement career at the McPherson County Sheriff's Office in South Dakota where he was employed from 2016 through December of 2020. While employed for McPherson County Sheriff's Office Deputy Lipke was a member of a seven (7) county multi-jurisdictional narcotics task force for several years. While on the task force Deputy Lipke assisted with narcotics investigation, interdiction, and enforcement within the task force region on a part-time basis in addition to his normal patrol duties.

In January of 2021, Deputy Lipke became a deputy with the Ashland County Sheriff's Office where he was currently employed as a patrol deputy. In addition to his patrol duties Deputy Lipke was assigned to the Native American Drug and Gang Initiative (NADGI) task force. Deputy Lipke had been assigned to the NADGI task force for approximately two (2) years.

Having been a member of several task forces Deputy Lipke had attended multiple courses in narcotics interdiction. Deputy Lipke also attended a Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) basic course in 2022, in Lafayette County, Wisconsin.

Deputy Lipke was enlisted in the United States Marine Corps from 2002 through 2013 when he was honorably discharged. Deputy Lipke served in a variety of capacities, including active duty, active reserve, and reserve. Deputy Lipke operated artillery for four (4) years, was a chief martial arts instructor where he taught the Marine Corps Martial Arts Program and performed physical security. From March 2008 through August 2009 Deputy Lipke was assigned in Germany to the Command Control Center where he coordinated and arraigned training for U.S. Marines station in Europe, Africa, and parts of the Middle East.

Assignment:



On August 14, 2023, Deputy Lipke worked a normal day shift and completed his shift on time. Upon arriving home Deputy Lipke had dinner and went to bed around 9:30 p.m. sleeping until approximately 5:15 a.m. on the morning of August 15, 2023. Deputy Lipke stated this was a normal amount of sleep for him. Deputy Lipke did not take any medications that would have interfered with his ability to perform his duties as a law enforcement officer and did not consume any alcoholic beverages in the twenty-four (24) hours prior to the OICI.

On August 15, 2023, Deputy Lipke's supervisor was Sergeant Jason Janecek. Deputy Lipke was dispatched through the Ashland County Sheriff's Office Dispatch Center.

Law Enforcement / Police Descriptors:

Deputy Lipke was assigned an unmarked 2019 Ford Explorer police vehicle which had a roof mounted emergency light bar, an exterior front mounted push bar, and bore Wisconsin Official, gold colored license plates. Deputy Lipke was assigned the squad car and all the equipment within it. No other deputies operated the vehicle unless necessary.

Deputy Lipke's call number was 628.

At the time of the OICI, Deputy Lipke was wearing an authorized Ashland County Sheriff's Office uniform shirt, black in color with Ashland County Sheriff's Office patches affixed to both shoulders. Deputy Lipke wore a black external ballistic vest carrier which on the right chest he wore an American flag patch and a name tag which displayed in gray letters over black, "LIPKE." Below his name tag Deputy Lipke wore a silver-colored SWAT pin. On the left chest he wore a silver-colored Ashland County Sheriff's Office Badge and a patch which read in gray letters over

black, "SHERIFF." On the back of the vest carrier, Deputy Lipke wore a patch which read in gray letters over black, "SHERIFF."

Deputy Lipke was wearing black uniform cargo pants. In the right cargo pocket, he carried a tourniquet, extra batteries, Narcan, and earplugs. In the left cargo pocket, he was carrying a wallet and a note pad. Deputy Lipke was wearing black boots.

The following items were on Deputy Lipke's duty belt going clockwise from center:

- One (1) double magazine pouch containing two (2) Glock magazines, each of which held fifteen (15) rounds of .40 S&W ammunition which was stamped "40 S&W SPEER"
- One (1) Glock G22, Gen 4, caliber .40 S&W handgun, serial number SWS333 inside of a holster.
- On the rear of Deputy Lipke's duty belt was a glove pouch.
- One (1) pouch which contained a canister of oleoresin capsicum (OC) spray which was not used during the OICI.
- One (1) pouch which contained a flashlight.
- One (1) rifle retention lanyard.

The following items were on Deputy Lipke's external vest carrier, going clockwise from center:

- One (1) pouch which contained an extendable baton.
- One (1) pouch with portable radio with an attached lapel microphone.
- One (1) double handcuff pouch containing one (1) pair of handcuffs. Deputy Lipke stated the other set that belonged in the pouch were placed on Claremboux at the scene of the OICI.
- One (1) TASER holster containing one (1) TASER with TASER cartridge attached (not used).
- In the front pocket of the vest carrier Deputy Lipke carried an audio only recording device which he stated was not activated during the OICI. Deputy Lipke was not wearing a body camera.

Deputy Lipke was carrying a Glock, model G22, Gen 4, semi-automatic, caliber .40 S&W. The magazine in the weapon had fifteen (15) unfired rounds of .40 S&W ammunition. One (1) additional round of ammunition was removed from the chamber for a total of sixteen (16) rounds loaded into Deputy Lipke's Handgun. Deputy Lipke had two (2) spare magazines, each containing fifteen (15) rounds of ammunition. All the ammunition recovered from Deputy

Lipke's duty weapon and spare magazines appeared to be consistent and was stamped with "40 S&W SPEER."

Deputy Lipke was also armed with a patrol rifle during the OICI. The rifle was a Rock River Arms LAR-15, caliber 5.56-millimeter, serial number CM117643. The rifle had iron sights, a sling, and a mounted Streamlight TRL RM2 flashlight. Inserted in the magazine well of the rifle was a thirty (30) round magazine which contained thirty (30) rounds of mixed brand/type ammunition. There was no round in the chamber of the rifle at the time of the uniform inspection. Deputy Lipke reported during the uniform inspection, that after the OICI Deputy Austin Bowe, who was on scene at the time of the OICI, took the rifle from Deputy Lipke and unloaded the round from the chamber. The uniform inspection was conducted on Wednesday, August 16, 2023, at approximately 12:56 a.m. by SA Gensler and SA Sutherland.

Events Prior to Incident:

On Wednesday August 15, 2023, Deputy Lipke began his shift at approximately 7:00 a.m. at the Ashland County Sheriff's Office. Deputy Lipke took several calls for service throughout the day including civil issues and a minor car accident. Deputy Lipke also completed a juvenile referral from a call he took on his previous shift.

Incident:

On August 15, 2023, Deputy Lipke was traveling toward the Ashland County Sheriff's Office near the end of his shift and was a few blocks away when he heard the radio dispatch for the call that resulted in the OICI. Deputy Alex Petroski of the Ashland County Sheriff's Office was dispatched to North Foley Road for a report of a man with a knife who was threatening to kill a female if law enforcement was called. Due to the serious nature of the call and the limited on-duty staff Deputy Lipke responded to the call.

Deputy Lipke proceeded lights and sirens to the address and estimated his drive time to have been approximately twenty (20) minutes. Upon arrival, Deputy Lipke parked near the other squad cars that were on the road near the driveway to the residence and got his patrol rifle out of his squad. Sergeant Janecek, Deputy Austen Bowe, and, Deputy Petroski of the Ashland County Sheriff's Office along with Police Chief Larry Koivisto of the Mellen, Wisconsin Police Department were already on scene. Deputy Lipke was talking to Deputy Petroski on the radio trying to determine where he was needed as there were several trailers on the property.

Deputy Lipke saw Deputy Petroski taking cover by a truck that was parked on the back side of the trailer approximately twenty-five (25) feet from the trailer where the OICI later occurred. Deputy Lipke joined Deputy Petroski by the truck where Deputy Lipke could hear a female crying and a male yelling at the female. The male subject was also yelling out to law enforcement, stating something to the effect, "fuck you, I'm not coming out, you're going to have

to come in and get me" and, "you're going to have to shoot me," and other incoherent comments. Deputy Lipke could also hear the male counting out loud several times.

Sergeant Janecek instructed Deputy Petroski to pull his squad up to the residence to utilize the public address system (PA). Deputy Petroski began PA announcements identifying the presence of law enforcement and their desire to resolve the situation. Deputy Petrosky was also asking for proof the female occupant was unharmed. The male occupant was uncompliant and approached the open door of the trailer and responded with "a lot of fuck you's" indicating he was not coming out of the trailer. The male then retreated into the trailer. Deputy Petroski was attempting to make phone contact with the occupants of the trailer.

Sergeant Janecek was taking cover on the front side of the trailer by a van and motioned to Deputy Lipke to come join him by the van. Chief Koivisto took the position Deputy Lipke was leaving by the truck on the back side of the trailer. Once Deputy Lipke got to Sergeant Janecek's position, Sergeant Janecek went to Deputy Petroski's squad and was attempting to contact Ashland County Sheriff's Office administrative personnel to advise them of the situation.

Deputy Lipke could hear from inside the trailer what he believed was the male subject assaulting the female. He heard approximately four (4) bangs and each time he heard the bang it was followed by a scream from the female. Deputy Lipke yelled back to Sergeant Janecek and Deputy Petroski "he's hurting her." Deputy Petroski then repeated "he's hurting her" confirming he heard Deputy Lipke. Sergeant Janecek returned to Deputy Lipke's position by the van on the front side of the trailer, took a position in front of Deputy Lipke and said, "when I move stay with me." Seconds later Sergeant Janecek began moving towards the trailer. Deputy Lipke was not certain what prompted Sergeant Janecek to begin moving, Deputy Lipke just followed him. Sergeant Janecek made entry into the trailer and Deputy Lipke followed him, the interior of the trailer was narrow, and they entered single file. Deputy Lipke didn't remember saying anything upon entry but could recall Sergeant Janecek yelling commands but couldn't recall what he was saying. Deputy Lipke could see the male subject seated on a bed in the room at the end of the hallway. The subject turned toward the approaching officers. The subject then turned away from them, as the subject turned Deputy Lipke could see what he believed to be the "flash" of a knife blade in the subject's hand. Deputy Lipke heard Sergeant Janecek fire one round from his rifle.

When the subject turned and Sergeant Janecek fired, Deputy Lipke could not see the female in the room but believed based on the totality of the circumstances that the male subject was turning to injure or kill the female.

Sergeant Janecek and Deputy Lipke entered the doorway of the room, Deputy Lipke pulled a female subject out of the room. The female was inside the room to the left, standing in front of where the subject was seated and in the direction the subject turned before Sergeant Janecek fired. Deputy Lipke handed the female off to a deputy who was behind him. Deputy Lipke also handed his rifle off to the deputy. Deputy Lipke entered the room and secured the subject in

handcuffs. The subject was laying on the side of the bed but was falling off. Deputy Lipke and Sergeant Janecek pulled the subject onto the bed and began a medical assessment.

Deputy Lipke observed a single gunshot wound to the left side of the subject's chest below the nipple line.

Due to the tight quarters in the trailer, they were not able to properly render medical aid, so the subject was moved to the ground outside the trailer.

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) was staged nearby, approached the scene, and took over lifesaving measures.

Deputy Lipke later saw the knife on the floor of the trailer in front of where the subject had been seated on the bed. Deputy Lipke described the knife he saw in the subject's hand as a hunting or fishing style knife eight (8) to ten (10) inches in total length with a blaze orange handle.

Deputy Lipke walked over to where Deputy Petroski's squad was parked and joined Sergeant Janecek. After a period, Chief Deputy Nate Delegan of the Ashland County Sheriff's Office arrived and took Sergeant Janecek away from the scene. Chief Deputy Delegan returned a short time later and took Deputy Lipke down to the road and advised that Sergeant Janecek had been taken back to the Sheriff's Office and offered Deputy Lipke a ride as well. Deputy Lipke declined the ride and drove himself back to the Sheriff's Office in his squad.

Deputy Lipke initially was unaware there was anyone behind him, but later learned Deputy Petrosky was behind him while they made entry.

Deputy Lipke did not fire his weapon and was not injured during the OICI.

Deputy Lipke described the lighting conditions during the OICI as normal daylight conditions outside and diminished lighting inside the trailer, with most of the windows being covered Deputy Lipke needed to use his flashlight while in the bedroom of the trailer.

During the interview, Deputy Lipke was provided an aerial photograph of the scene and an overhead photograph of the interior of the trailer that were generated during the digital scene reconstruction efforts. Deputy Lipke marked on the scene photographs the approximate locations of where Deputy Lipke and other law enforcement officers were located during the OICI and signed the photographs. SA Gensler electronically attached the scene photographs utilized during the interview to this report.

Past Contacts at the Residence and With Subjects Involved:

Deputy Lipke did not know the name of the subject (Jay Claremboux) and had no recollection of past police contacts with Claremboux or either of the females involved in the OICI. Deputy Lipke had no prior police contact at the residence.

The interview with Deputy Lipke concluded at approximately 1:08 p.m.



Conclusion:

On Monday, August 28, 2023, at approximately 11:00 a.m. SA Shawn Sutherland and SA Lance Maske met with Deputy Lipke, Attorney/Executive Director James Palmer and Business Agent Rich Burghause at the Ashland County Sheriff's Office. The purpose of the meeting was to review SA Gensler's draft report of the statement Deputy Lipke provided to SA Gensler and SA Sutherland on Friday, August 18, 2023.

Attorney Palmer was provided with three (3) draft copies of the report; one (1) for Attorney Palmer, one (1) for Business Agent Burghaus, and one (1) for Deputy Lipke to review. Attorney Palmer, Business Agent Burghaus, and Deputy Lipke verified the information within Deputy Lipke's statement, as being accurate after minor clarifications, and some minor spelling and grammatical corrections were made. The corrections made did not affect the content of the information Deputy Lipke provided in his initial statement on Friday, August 18, 2023. SA Sutherland collected all three (3) draft copies and shredded them. SA Gensler attended the review telephonically and made the minor corrections to the report.

SYNOPSIS

On August 15, 2023, at 7:00 PM, Special Agent (S/A) David Kleinhans was contacted by Special Agent in Charge (SAIC) Mike Haverley requesting assistance with an officer involved shooting in Ashland County that resulted in the death of one subject.

SAIC Haverley requested S/A Kleinhans respond to the scene at 33695 N Foley Road, Town of Morse, Ashland County. S/A Kleinhans arrived on scene at approximately 11:30 PM. Upon arrival, S/A Kleinhans received a briefing from S/A Randy Stearns and S/A Jason Christenson who arrived on scene prior and had already received a briefing from the Ashland County Sheriff's Office (ALSO). S/A Kleinhans, S/A Stearns, and S/A Christenson were assigned to conduct scene processing and documentation. The Wisconsin State Patrol (WSP) Technical Reconstruction Unit (TRU) was on scene prior to DCI's arrival. DCI was requested to assist with scene processing and evidence collection and the WSP-TRU was requested to assist with documenting the scene utilizing surveying and laser scanning equipment.

SCENE CONTROL/SECURITY

Control and security at the scene were maintained continually from the time of the initial response to the conclusion of the scene examination. Yellow police tape lined the perimeter and ALSO maintained a scene log.

Control and security at the scene were maintained through the constant presence of ALSO, WSP, and DCI agents conducting the scene examination.

SCENE EXAMINATON/PROCESSING

On August 15, 2023, at approximately 7:00 PM, the Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI), was requested to investigate an Officer Involved Critical Incident (OICI) that occurred in Ashland County. The OICI involved officers from the ALSO and the Mellen Police Department. The incident resulted in the shooting death of Jay Allen Claremboux. ALSO made the request to DCI and it was determined DCI would lead the investigation.

At approximately 6:00 PM, the ALSO Dispatch Center received a 911 call from a female reporting she was assaulted by a male subject with a knife (later identified as Jay Claremboux). The caller reported there was an ongoing domestic dispute between Claremboux and his girlfriend in a travel trailer on the property at 33695 N Foley Road, Town of Morse, Ashland County. The caller said she was not near Claremboux at that time, but he was still armed with a knife in the travel trailer with his girlfriend and was threatening to kill her.

ALSO deputies responded to the scene, along with a Mellen police officer. Shortly thereafter, Claremboux was reportedly shot one time in the travel trailer by an ALSO Sergeant.

DCI SAIC Haverley spoke with ALSO Detective Zach Pierce who advised Claremboux was removed from the travel trailer where lifesaving measures were performed by law enforcement and EMS, but were unsuccessful.

On August 15, 2023, ALSO requested the WI DOJ-DCI complete the OICI investigation. SAIC Haverley received the request as DCI Coordinator for this OICI investigation. S/A Shawn Sutherland was assigned as DCI Lead Investigator for this OICI investigation.

Prior to DCI's arrival, law enforcement officers, EMS, and Coroner John Harding of the Ashland County Coroner's Office confirmed Jay A. Claremboux was on scene and deceased.

Upon arrival S/A Kleinhans contacted S/A Stearns and S/A Christenson. S/A Stearns confirmed that when he arrived on scene Claremboux had been removed from the travel trailer prior to DCI's arrival. Claremboux was lying in the yard south of the travel trailer and was covered with a sheet.

S/A Kleinans spoke with Sgt. Pierce of the ALSO on scene. Sgt. Pierce advised the law enforcement officers and their duty weapons had been transported to the ALSO Office. Sgt. Pierce confirmed all of the officer-involved vehicles had been removed from the scene.

Upon completing the on-scene briefing, S/A Kleinhans contacted S/A Sutherland to obtain additional details about the scene. S/A Sutherland advised the involved deputies would not be completing initial interviews or a scene walk through on the evening of August 15, 2023. S/A Sutherland confirmed the involved deputy's firearm had been collected at ALSO. On August 15, 2023, S/A Theodore Indermuehle responded to the ALSO to pick up the involved deputy's firearm to bring it back to the scene so S/A Kleinhans could transport it to the Eau Claire field office evidence room.

Upon completing the briefing and a walk through, S/A Kleinhans conducted a scene search in a systematic manner beginning from the exterior of the travel trailer involved in the incident and worked through the interior of the travel trailer. S/A Kleinhans documented the scene with photographs. The Wisconsin State Patrol-TRU was on scene prior to DCI's arrival and had started documenting the scene. Trooper DeVries confirmed he would send the scene diagrams to S/A Sutherland.

The location of the domestic incident was at 33695 N Foley Road, Town of Morse, Ashland County. The travel trailer where the incident occurred was on the north side of the property. The south side of the travel trailer had a trailer hitch attached and had one window. (See figure 2)

The east side of the travel trailer had three windows. The north exterior side of the trailer was not able to be accessed due to a large pile of debris stacked up. (See figure 3)

The west side of the travel trailer had two windows and two doors. The primary entrance was on the south end of the travel trailer. The primary entrance door had a set of wood steps with a wood railing that allowed access into the travel trailer. (See figure 4)

The layout of the interior of the travel trailer was as follows. The primary entrance door allowed access into the sitting area of the travel trailer. The sitting area did not have any furniture but had lots of personal property to include tools. (See figure 5)

The central quadrant of the travel trailer had a bench with a table on the west wall and the kitchen appliances were on the east wall. The central quadrant of the travel trailer also had lots of personal property with a narrow walkway allowing access to the north end of the travel trailer. 


(Figure 6-DCI Photo 0117 Central quadrant of interior of travel trailer)

The north quadrant of the travel trailer had a bed centrally located on the north wall and night stands on both sides of the bed on the north wall. The bedroom also had lots of personal property to include clothes. (See figure 8)

Upon completing the photos and initial walk through, investigators conducted an examination of the crime scene and travel trailer to identify potential evidentiary items associated with the incident. Prior to commencing the scene examination, investigators conducted a preliminary crime scene assessment of both the exterior and interior of the travel trailer to locate and protect items of evidentiary value while establishing safe areas of ingress/egress for crime scene personnel. The crime scene examination was conducted in a systematic and methodical manner, working from the exterior of the structures to the interior.

Evidence items #1 was an empty brass shell casing located in the bathtub of the travel trailer. The casing had REM 223 FG on the head stamp. (See figure 9)




(Figure 10 -DCI Photo 0175 Evidence #2 interior of travel trailer)

EVIDENCE COLLECTED

Once the initial photos were taken and the evidence was identified, the ALSO contacted the Ashland County Coroner office to respond to the scene. Coroner John Harding returned to the scene with Tim Bratley of the Bratley Funeral Home on August 16, 2023, at 2:00 AM. Claremboux's body bag was sealed on August 16, 2023, at 2:15 AM.

All evidence was collected, labeled, and sealed by S/A Kleinhans.

S/A Kleinhans transported the evidence to the Eau Claire field office on August 16, 2023 and secured it in the evidence room. S/A Kleinhans sealed the evidence at the Eau Claire field office on August 22, 2023.

SCENE DOCUMENTATION

During the scene examination, the Wisconsin State Patrol obtained measurements and scans for the completion of scene diagrams. The Wisconsin State Patrol reports were sent to S/A Sutherland. S/A Kleinhans captured 202 digital images utilizing a digital SLR camera and a copy of the photos was submitted to DCIR.

A copy of the scene log which was maintained and by the ALSO is attached to the report.

On Tuesday, August 15, 2023, Wisconsin Department of Justice / Division of Criminal Investigation (WI DOJ/DCI) Special Agents (SA) were requested to investigate an Officer Involved Critical Incident (OICI) which occurred at 33695 North Foley Road, Township of Morse, Ashland County, Wisconsin. The suspect, Jay A. Claremboux, was fatally shot during the incident. The WI DOJ/DCI was requested to be the lead investigative agency for the OICI.

On Thursday, August 17, 2023, Wisconsin State Patrol – Technical Reconstruction Unit (WSP-TRU) Trooper Kyle DeVries transferred to WI DOJ/DCI SA Justin Bender the forensic mapping scene data and digital photographs collected by the WSP-TRU on August 15, 2023, regarding the OICI. The data SA Bender received consisted of Trimble X7 3D scanner files (capture & hash file) and two-hundred and forty-four (244) digital photographs. As a result of the provided data, SA Bender took over as the lead reconstructionist for the OICI.

SA Bender electronically uploaded the Trimble X7 data and digital photographs SA Bender received from Trooper DeVries to the DCI electronic records repository.

The primary responsibility of the investigation is to document and preserve all available physical evidence. The following reconstruction is limited to the subjects stated herein. The author and the Wisconsin State Patrol reserve the right to conduct a more extensive analysis of the available material on a later date as necessity dictates.

REQUEST FOR ASSISTANCE:

On August 15, 2023, at approximately 8:30 PM, Wisconsin State Patrol (WSP) Sergeant Joshua Mauer contacted this author reference a forensic mapping request from the WIDOJ – Division of Criminal Investigation regarding an officer involved critical incident in Ashland County. Ashland County Sheriff's Office (ALSO) deputies had responded to 33695 North Foley Road, in the Morse Township for a domestic violence incident that resulted in the death of a male suspect by law enforcement. Ashland County Sheriff's Office investigators, along with special agents from the Department of Criminal Investigation (DCI), were conducting the investigation. DCI requested the WSP's Technical Reconstruction Unit (TRU) to assist in forensically documenting the exterior and interior of the camping trailer. This author responded to assist. The purpose of WSP's involvement was limited to documenting the interior and exterior of the camping trailer and the evidence associated with this incident.

INITIAL SCENE EXAMINATION:

At approximately 10:13 PM, this author arrived at the scene. ALSO deputies directed me to the DCI special agents conducting the on-scene investigation. The DCI special agents walked me around the exterior of the buildings/camping trailer involved.

FORENSIC DOCUMENTATION:

This author, with the assistance of Trooper Kyle DeVries who is assigned to the TRU, utilized a Trimble X7 3D laser scanner to document the exterior scene and the interior of the camping trailer. The X7 scanner, as shown in Figure 1 on the following page, is a 360-degree scanning instrument that uses natural geometry to create large scale point

cloud projects of an environment. The instrumentation documents millions of data points with three-dimensional coordinate values. These scans were downloaded from the Perspective software program, through the Capture software program. The file is then imported in the Realworks software program. Realworks Scan Explorer is then used, along with an identified key plan, to create a file that allows end users to view the scanned scene from the perspective of the scanner locations through the taken panoramic photographs.

On Tuesday, August 15, 2023, Wisconsin Department of Justice / Division of Criminal Investigation (WI DOJ/DCI) Special Agents (SA) were requested to investigate an Officer Involved Critical Incident (OICI) which occurred at 33695 North Foley Road, Township of Morse, Ashland County, Wisconsin. The suspect, Jay A. Claremboux, was fatally shot during the incident. The WI DOJ/DCI was requested to be the lead investigative agency for the OICI.

On Thursday, August 24, 2023, WI DOJ/DCI SA Justin Bender and WI DOJ/DCI SA Theodore Indermuehle responded to the incident scene to complete additional forensic scene mapping and a small Unmanned Aerial System (sUAS) flight mission for the OICI. SA Indermuehle had previously obtained consent from the owner of the property to complete a detailed search/mapping (reference narrative report 23-6366/21 by SA Indermuehle).

Forensic Scene Mapping:

SA Bender documented five (5) ground control points at the incident scene utilizing a Trimble R10 Global Navigation Satellite System (GNSS) survey instrument and TSC3 data collector. The Trimble R10 unit connects via portable Wi-Fi to the Wisconsin Continuously Operating Reference Stations (WISCORS) Network and its base stations located throughout the state. The 360-degree receiver supports signals from all existing and planned GNSS constellations and augmentation systems. The Trimble R10 combines the GNSS coordinates with the corrections from the WISCORS Network. The data was stored electronically for future processing and analysis.

Due to unfavorable weather conditions, a sUAS flight mission was not done and will be completed at a later date.

SYNOPSIS

On Tuesday, August 15, 2023, the Ashland County Sheriff's Office (ACSO) and the Mellen Police Department (MPD) were involved in an Officer-Involved Critical Incident (OICI) at 33695 North Foley Rd, Town of Morse, Ashland County, WI. The OICI resulted in the fatal shooting of Jay Allen Claremboux, who was shot by ACSO Patrol Sergeant Jason Janecek.

Ashland County Sheriff Brian Zupke requested the Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation (WI DOJ-DCI) complete the OICI investigation.

OFFICER INTERVIEW

On August 18, 2023, WI DOJ-DCI Special Agents Shawn Sutherland and SA Timothy Gensler interviewed ACSO Sergeant Jason Janecek at the Ashland County Sheriff's Office. SA Sutherland and SA Gensler introduced themselves and informed Sergeant Janecek that WI DOJ-DCI would be conducting the OICI investigation. Sergeant Janecek was informed that he did not have to make a statement and the interview was voluntary. Sergeant Janecek was informed that he could stop the interview at anytime or take a break at anytime. Sergeant Janecek agreed to make a statement but requested the interview not be recorded. Wisconsin Professional Police Association Business Agent Rich Burghaus and Attorney Jim Palmer were present during the interview.

Sergeant Janecek completed a 40-hour Crisis Intervention which was put on by the Duluth Police Department.


Sergeant Janecek performed his last handgun qualification shoot in May or June of 2023. He participated in a department rifle shoot in the fall of 2022.

ASSIGNMENT



On August 14, 2023, which was Sergeant Janecek's day of his day rotation, he started his shift between 11:00 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. and ended close to 10:00 p.m. After going off-duty he ate, did some reading and went to bed sometime between 11:00 p.m. and 1:00 a.m. He woke up between 8:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. on August 15, 2023.

On August 15, 2023, which was Sergeant Janecek's day of his rotation, he started at 12:00 p.m. Sergeant Janecek's area of responsibility includes the entire county and he is responsible for supervising the deputies that are on duty during his shift. He was the shift supervisor and there were two deputies on duty when he checked on. Deputy Steven Lipke was assigned to the north sector/Bad River Reservation area and Deputy David McGuire was assigned to the south sector.

Sergeant Janecek does not take any prescribed medications that would affect his ability to do his job as a law enforcement officer. Sergeant Janecek did not consume any alcohol within 24 hours of the OICI.

LAW ENFORCEMENT/POLICE DECRIPTORS

Sergeant Janecek is assigned a take-home squad car which is an unmarked, black Ford Explorer with interior emergency lights and a siren. His badge/call number is 676.

At the time of the OICI, Sergeant Janecek was wearing his department issued uniform which consisted of a black, long-sleeve uniform shirt and black uniform pants. His uniform shirt had Ashland County Sheriff's Office patches on both shoulders with a Sergeant stripe patch affixed below each shoulder patch. On the left chest he wore a gold Ashland County Sheriff's Office badge and on the right chest he wore a gold pin with his name "J. Janecek" on it. In the center of his chest he wears a Motorola body-worn camera in a mount affixed to his uniform shirt. After arriving on scene, Sergeant Janecek donned a "chest rig" which is a multi-camouflage vest-like carrier. On the carrier there were four 30-round rifle magazines which contained 28 rounds, 29 rounds, 31 rounds, and 20 rounds. Also on the carrier were two 17-round handgun magazines each containing 17 rounds. Additionally, Sergeant Janecek had a gray camouflage colored medical kit affixed to the right side of the vest with "JANECEK" in black letters on the front.

On August 16, 2023, SA Sutherland and SA Gensler conducted a uniform and weapons inspection of Sergeant Janecek after the OICI.

During the OICI, Sergeant Janecek wore the following items on his duty belt going clockwise from center:

- One (1) pouch which contained a canister of oleoresin capsicum (OC) spray.
- One (1) double handcuff case.
- One (1) Glock 17, Gen 5, 9mm handgun with a Streamlight TLR-1 HL tactical light, serial number BGMH636, in a holster.
- One (1) key ring holder.
- One (1) pouch which contained a Leatherman multi-tool.
- One (1) pouch which contained latex gloves.
- One (1) flashlight in a holder.
- One (1) portable radio with a lapel mic.
- One (1) double magazine pouch which contained two handgun magazines, each of which held seventeen (17) rounds.

Sergent Janecek carried his department approved, personally owned, handgun, which is a Glock 17, Gen 5, 9mm with a Streamlight TLR-1 HL tactical light mounted on it. The magazine in the weapon carried sixteen (16) rounds and there was a single round removed from the chamber for a total of seventeen (17) rounds. Sergeant Janecek carried two additional handgun magazines on his duty belt and two additional handgun magazines on his "chest rig". All four of the extra magazines each carried seventeen (17) rounds. The ammunition was stamped "9mm Luger Speer".

Sergeant Janecek also carried his department issued rifle, which is a DPMS Panther Arms, .223-5.56 caliber, serial number FF 013186. The rifle has an Aimpoint red-dot optic mounted on top and a tactical flashlight mounted to the barrel in front of the forearm. The 20-round magazine that was removed from the weapon carried sixteen (16) rounds. There was one round removed from the chamber for a total of seventeen (17) rounds. All of these rounds had a purple polymer tip and were stamped "FG 20 223 REM". Sergeant Janecek carried four additional 30-round magazines in his "chest rig".

At the time of Sergeant Janecek's uniform inspection on August 16, 2023, SA Sutherland took four photographs of Sergeant Janecek to document how he appeared in full uniform at the time of the OICI. SA Sutherland showed Sergeant Janecek the four photographs, and Sergeant Janecek said the photographs were an accurate representation of the uniform and equipment he was wearing at the time of the OICI.

PRE-INCIDENT INFORMATION

The first half of Sergeant Janecek's shift was generally non-eventful that day. After checking on-duty he started toward Glidden to mediate a property exchange. While enroute to Glidden he handled a motorist assist. After handling his calls, he remained in the Glidden area until Deputy McGuire checked off around 5:00 p.m. and Deputy Alex Petroski checked on at 5:00 p.m.

INCIDENT

Sometime after 5:00 p.m., Sergeant Janecek was handling a trespass complaint on Leo's Rd when he heard Ashland County Sheriff's Dispatch received a 911 call regarding an active disturbance involving a woman running out of a trailer; and a male with a knife was threatening a third party (female), at 33695 N Foley Rd, Town of Morse, Ashland County. Deputy Alex Petroski was assigned as the primary officer.

Sergeant Janecek cleared from the trespass call and responded emergency mode using his lights and sirens. While responding, Sergeant Janecek called Mellen Police Chief Larry Koivisto and asked him to respond to the scene considering the nature of the call. Sergeant Janecek also requested Dispatch to place EMS on standby.

Upon arrival Deputies Petroski and Austen Bowe, and Mellen Police Chief Larry Koivisto, were already on scene. Sergeant Janecek arrived on scene from the south and parked on N Foley Rd,

near the south driveway access to the property. He was unsure of his response time, but thought he was the last or second to last unit to arrive.

Sergeant Janecek observed an unoccupied vehicle parked on N Foley Rd and ran the license plate. Upon receiving the registration information, he knew the person was not associated with that address and was, likely, uninvolved. That person left in their vehicle shortly after he was on scene.

Sergeant Janecek put on his chest rig, which holds extra rifle magazines and handgun magazines, and retrieved his department issued rifle. Sergeant Janecek began walking up the south side of the driveway loop. He knew there was a male with a knife in a camper on the property and was attempting to contact Deputy Petroski over the police radio to ascertain where the target camper and other deputies were positioned.

Sergeant Janecek contacted Chief Koivisto, who was positioned near the vacant mobile home across the driveway from the target camper. Chief Koivisto pointed out a shotgun that was lying on the ground but said it was not in play or a concern for them. Sergeant Janecek did not see the shotgun.

When Sergeant Janecek arrived on scene there had been no communication with Claremboux yet. Sergeant Janecek requested Deputy Petroski drive his squad car to an area in the driveway near the camper to make announcements from his public announcement (PA) system to identify themselves as LE and attempt to make contact with Claremboux.

Sergeant Janecek momentarily moved from his location by the abandoned trailer home to check on Deputy Lipke, who was positioned to the north of him, behind a truck which was on the camper side of the driveway. After speaking with Deputy Lipke he went back to his original position with Chief Koivisto by the abandoned trailer home.

Deputy Petroski announced over the PA they were with the Ashland County Sheriff's Office.

Deputy Petroski ordered Claremboux to come out so they can talk and to come out with his hands up. Sergeant Janecek asked Deputy Petroski to have Claremboux send out of the camper, but Claremboux did not comply.

Sergeant Janecek could hear Claremboux respond from within the camper but couldn't understand what he was saying. Chief Koivisto did hear him and relayed to Sergeant Janecek that Claremboux said, "Fuck you!"; he wasn't coming out; and this doesn't concern you.

At some point, brought her cell phone to Deputy Petroski and made telephone contact with Claremboux. During this time, Sergeant Janecek was continuing to reposition himself in an effort to communicate with Deputy Petroski and others to come up with a plan.

Deputy Petroski said he made contact with Claremboux by phone but there was no progress and Claremboux hung up.

Sergeant Janecek knew that Deputy Petroski spoke with other sheriff's office administration by telephone to brief them on the situation. While on the phone with the Chief Deputy Sergeant Janecek said the situation was spiraling.

Sergeant Janecek heard Claremboux make comments in response to the PA announcements and Deputy Petroski's phone contact with him like, "Bring your guns", "Go away this doesn't concern you", and a variety of non-compliant comments. Sergeant Janecek heard someone crying from within the camper, but Claremboux would not come out of the camper or allow exit the camper.

Sergeant Janecek heard a banging noise coming from within the camper for about five or six seconds. Deputy Bowe radioed that he heard movement or activity in the camper. Deputy Bowe said he saw the male in the camper, and he did something to obscure his vision through the camper window.

Sergeant Janecek was unsure of the sequence but heard Claremboux from within the camper make a serious threat to He didn't remember what or when the threat was made but it was a serious threat to

Sergeant Janecek felt they were running out of time, and he had serious concerns for safety. He was concerned because Deputy Petroski was not making any progress in getting Claremboux to surrender or comply by phone or over the PA. Claremboux wasn't allowing to exit the camper as requested. Additionally, Sergeant Janecek heard noises from within the camper that may have been an active assault against

Sergeant Janecek asked Chief Koivisto to switch places with Lipke. Sergeant Janecek was taking cover behind a vehicle, possibly a van, which was the last point of cover and/or concealment near the camper. He had Deputy Lipke join him in preparation to enter the camper.

Around that time, Claremboux came to the open door of the camper. He was shirtless and agitated. Sergeant Janecek could not see both hands clearly so he couldn't see if he had a weapon at that time. Claremboux placed his hands on either side of the door frame and said something to

the effect, "Shoot me, you're going to have to shoot me!" Claremboux reached outside to grab the door with one hand; he shut the door; and retreated into the camper.

At that moment Sergeant Janecek felt they couldn't let that door remain closed, so he made the decision to enter the camper. He and Deputy Lipke approached the door. Sergeant Janecek activated his weapon mounted light and entered first with Deputy Lipke behind him. They went left and advanced down the hallway. Janecek could see into the bedroom area where Claremboux was seated on the edge of the left side of the bed. He could see who was possibly wearing something white, standing up against the wall within arm's reach of Claremboux. appeared to be terrified and was screaming. Claremboux looked at Sergeant Janecek and he could see Claremboux had a large shiny blade in his hand but wasn't sure which hand. Sergeant Janecek believed he was giving Claremboux commands, but he couldn't recall what he said. Claremboux said something non-compliant to Sergeant Janecek but also couldn't recall what Claremboux said. Claremboux began bringing the blade up while looking at Janecek and Janecek fire his rifle one time at Claremboux. After firing, Claremboux rose, twisted, and fell.

Sergeant Janecek felt was in imminent danger of great bodily harm or death. Sergeant Janecek saw no other option but to shoot Claremboux because Claremboux was an imminent threat to Sergeant Janecek said, due to close proximity to Claremboux, he

Sergeant Janecek ordered a deputy to immediately get out of the camper. Sergeant Janecek radioed dispatch twice and reported shots were fired and the male offender was down. He thought Deputy Petroski took out of the camper. Deputy Lipke handcuffed Claremboux while in the bedroom. Sergeant Janecek and Deputy Lipke rolled him over and could see Claremboux had a gunshot wound to his upper left chest area. He recalled Claremboux was bare chested but couldn't recall what else he was wearing.

Sergeant Janecek said Claremboux was still breathing and decided they couldn't provide sufficient first aid to Claremboux in the confined space of the camper, so he and Deputy Lipke carried him outside. Sergeant Janecek was asking if someone had a bag/valve mask but nobody did.

They continued this until EMS arrived, which was within minutes, and EMS took over medical care.

Sergeant Janecek thought Deputy Petroski took his rifle after exiting the camper. He thought he left his chest rig, with his extra rifle and handgun magazines, on the ground outside of the camper. He believed Chief Deputy Nathan Delegan took custody of his rifle and chest rig at the scene.

Sergeant Janecek said during the incident it was normal, daylight outside of the camper. Inside the camper, the lighting was darker, but he had no problems seeing due to the ambient light. He thought he used his weapon mounted light when he entered the camper.

PRIOR CONTACTS WITH THE SUBJECT AND/OR PROPERTY LOCATION

Sergeant Janecek did not have any prior contacts or historical knowledge of Claremboux other than simply recognizing the name Claremboux from working in the community for 20 years.

Sergeant Janecek did have prior contacts at the location of the incident, 33695 N Foley Rd, Town of Morse, Ashland County. Prior to 2019, he attempted a welfare-check of an individual at a camper on the property but he was unsuccessful in locating them. He also recalled being there for other attempt-to-locates (ATLs) for other subjects, but he couldn't specifically remember for whom.

Body-Worn Camera video review

Sergeant Janecek was wearing a newly issued body-worn camera during the OICI. However, when DCI Digital Evidence Specialist Ryan Kelleher recovered the available footage on August 16, 2023, there were only two related video clips. Sergeant Janecek was told about this during the interview. He was certain he activated his camera prior to the incident but was unsure why the camera wasn't operational for the full duration of the call.

The first video clip begins with a date/time stamp of 8/15/2023 at 18:12:51 hours and ends at 18:14:21 hours. This captured Sergeant Janecek's initial arrival.

The second video clip begins with a date/time stamp of 8/15/2023 at 18:48:47 hours and ends at 18:49:30 hours. This captured Sergeant Janecek outside of the camper after the incident while EMS was tending to Claremboux.

Sergeant Janecek was given an opportunity to watch both video clips with WPPA Business Agent Rich Burghaus and Attorney Jim Palmer. After reviewing the videos Sergeant Janecek did not have any additional information to provide.

Visual Aids

During the interview, SA Sutherland provided Sergeant Janecek two visual aids which were provided by DCI Special Agent Justin Bender as part of his digital scene reconstruction efforts. The aids were provided for Sergeant Janecek to better demonstrate certain locations as the

incident occurred. One aid was an aerial view of the property located at 33695 N Foley Rd and the other was an overview of the interior of the camper where the incident occurred.

Property Overview

Sergeant Janecek used this aid and made the following hand-written notations on it:

- The dot represents the door of the camper where they made entry.

- The circle with the initial "JC" represents Jay Claremboux's location when Sergeant Janecek fired his rifle.
- The circle with the initial "V" represents fired his rifle.

SYNOPSIS

On Tuesday, August 15, 2023, the Ashland County Sheriff's Office (ACSO) and the Mellen Police Department (MPD) were involved in an Officer-Involved Critical Incident (OICI) at 33695 North Foley Rd, Town of Morse, Ashland County, WI. The OICI resulted in the fatal shooting of Jay Allen Claremboux, who was shot by ACSO Patrol Sergeant Jason Janecek.

Ashland County Sheriff Brian Zupke requested the Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation (WI DOJ-DCI) complete the OICI investigation.

OFFICER INTERVIEW

On August 18, 2023, WI DOJ-DCI Special Agents Shawn Sutherland and SA Timothy Gensler interviewed ACSO Deputy Alex Petroski at the Ashland County Sheriff's Office. SA Sutherland and SA Gensler introduced themselves and informed Deputy Petroski that WI DOJ-DCI would be conducting the OICI investigation. Deputy Petroski was informed that he did not have to make a statement and the interview was voluntary. Deputy Petroski was informed that he could stop the interview at anytime or take a break at anytime. Deputy Petroski agreed to make a statement but requested the interview not be recorded. Wisconsin Professional Police Association Business Agent Rich Burghaus and Attorney Jim Palmer were present during the interview. Deputy Petroski was comfortable with all those who were present.

EDUCATION / EXPERIENCE

Education

From 2011-2016 Deputy Petroski attended the University of Wisconsin - Superior where he graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice.



Deputy Petroski does not take any prescribed medications that would affect his ability to perform his job as a law enforcement officer. Deputy Petroski did not consume any alcohol within 24 hours of the OICI.

LAW ENFORCEMENT/POLICE DECRIPTORS

Deputy Petroski is assigned a take-home squad car which is a marked, black Dodge Durango with interior emergency lights and a siren. His squad is marked with Ashland County Sheriff's Office graphics. His squad is also equipped with a public address (PA) system. His badge/call number is 616.

SA Sutherland and SA Gensler performed a uniform and weapon inspection of Deputy Petroski on August 16, 2023, after the OICI. At the time of the OICI, Deputy Petroski was wearing his department issued uniform which consisted of a black, short-sleeve uniform shirt and black uniform pants. His uniform shirt had Ashland County Sheriff's Office patches on both shoulders. Deputy Petroski was wearing a black vest carrier over his uniform shirt. On the left chest he wore a silver Ashland County Sheriff's Office badge with a "SHERIFF" patch in white letters below it. In a pouch below the "SHERIFF" patch he had a pen and a handcuff key. On the right chest he wore a name patch with "PETROSKI" in white letters on it. In a pouch below his name patch he carried an Olympus brand audio recorder, which Deputy Petroski activated during the OICI. There was a flashlight affixed to his right shoulder lapel. There was a portable radio lapel mic affixed to his left shoulder lapel with an ear piece clipped to his vest carrier. On the back of the vest carrier there was a large "SHERIFF" patch in white letters.

Deputy Petroski wore the following items on his vest carrier going clockwise from center:

- One (1) pouch which contained a canister of oleoresin capsicum (OC) spray.
- One (1) pouch which contained an expandable baton.

- One (1) handcuff case.
- One (1) pouch which contained a portable radio with a lapel mic.
- One (1) double-magazine pouch which held two extra .40 caliber handgun magazines.

Deputy Petroski wore the following items on his duty belt going clockwise from center:

- One (1) key ring holder
- One (1) Glock 23, Gen 4, .40 caliber handgun with a Streamlight TLR-1S tactical light, serial number BDDX757, in a holster.
- One (1) flashlight ring.
- One (1) TASER holster which contained a TASER with one cartridge attached.

In Deputy Petroski's right cargo pocket of his uniform pants he carried a knife, keys, a lighter, search gloves, PPE masks, and handcuffs. In his left cargo pocket of his uniform pants he carried two (2) doses of Narcan, a lighter, a tourniquet, and handcuffs.

Deputy Petroski carried his department issued handgun, which is a Glock 23, Gen 4, .40 caliber handgun with a Streamlight TLR-1S tactical light mounted on it. The magazine in the weapon carried thirteen (13) rounds and there was a single round removed from the chamber for a total of fourteen (14) rounds. Deputy Petroski carried two additional handgun magazines on his vest carrier and each carried thirteen (13) rounds. The ammunition was stamped "40 S&W Speer".

At the time of Deputy Petroski's uniform inspection SA Sutherland took four photographs of Deputy Petroski to document how he appeared in full uniform at the time of the OICI. During this interview, SA Sutherland showed Deputy Petroski the four photographs. Deputy Petroski confirmed the photographs were an accurate representation of the uniform and equipment he was wearing at the time of the OICI.

PRE-INCIDENT INFORMATION

After Deputy Petroski checked on-duty at 5:00 p.m. he started patrolling his south sector between Butternut and Mellen. He was not dispatched to any other calls before the OICI.

INCIDENT

Deputy Petroski said the Ashland County Dispatch Center received a 911 call just before 6:00 p.m. The female caller was reporting a male subject, who was armed with a knife in a camper, was with a different female who was also in the camper, at 33695 N Foley Rd. The female caller was not in the camper at the time of the call.

Deputy Petroski was assigned as the primary investigative officer and was within one mile of the incident location when he was dispatched to it.

establish a perimeter around the camper. Deputy Bowe went into the woods behind the camper. Chief Koivisto took a position of cover at the end of an abandoned mobile home which was directly across the driveway from the camper. Deputy Petroski took a position of cover behind a

Sergeant Janecek and Deputy Steven Lipke arrived on scene about the same time. Deputy Lipke parked by Deputy Petroski's squad and Sergeant Janecek parked by the south driveway entrance

on N Foley Rd. Deputy Lipke approached on foot and met up with Deputy Petroski by the truck. Sergeant Janecek approached on foot and met up with Chief Koivisto.

Deputy Petroski could here Sergeant Janecek and Chief Koivisto talking about ways to resolve this. Sergeant Janecek eventually asked Deputy Petroski to get his squad car and park it in the driveway near the camper and make announcements to Claremboux on the public address (PA) system. He told Claremboux to come out and speak with them; to come out with your hands up. Claremboux continued to yell from inside the camper but did not comply with Deputy Petroski's orders and requests. Deputy Petroski continued to make similar announcements to Claremboux about two or three more times with a couple delays in between.

approached Deputy Petroski while he was in his squad. handed Deputy Petroski her cellular phone which had an open line and was on speaker. Deputy Petroski took the phone and could hear a male voice who he assumed to be Claremboux. Deputy Petroski introduced himself as a deputy with the sheriffs' office. Claremboux said, "Get the fuck out of here! It's none of your business! If you don't leave I'm going to kill her!" Deputy Petroski tried to maintain a conversation with him but Claremboux refused to come out. Claremboux kept saying, "Fuck you! It's none of your business!" and eventually hung up. Deputy Petroski continued to use the PA to ask and order Claremboux to come out of the camper and talk with them.

Deputy Petroski asked to call again and Claremboux answered. Claremboux continued with the same threats that he was going to kill her if they didn't leave. While on the phone with Claremboux, Deputy Petroski could hear sounded afraid and distressed. Deputy Petroski asked Claremboux if he could show them to ensure she was unharmed, but Claremboux became more agitated. Claremboux began counting down so the cops would leave and then hung up. Deputy Petroski said Claremboux continued to yell from within the camper and he could hear the female crying and in distress.

Deputy Petroski relayed over the radio that Claremboux began to countdown and Deputy Petroski felt that they needed to take action soon. He was communicating his concerns to Chief Deputy Nathan Delegan and Lieutenant Joe Eder by phone.

While Deputy Petroski was talking with Chief Deputy Delegan on the phone, Sergeant Janecek came over to him. About that same time, Claremboux appeared in the doorway of the camper and said, "Shoot me! Shoot me!" Deputy Petroski estimated Claremboux was in the doorway for about seven seconds and then he retreated into the camper. Deputy Petroski did not see Claremboux with a weapon at that time.

Sergeant Janecek went back over to Deputy Lipke's position behind the vehicle and then they quickly advanced to the camper door. Sergeant Janecek and Deputy Lipke cleared the doorway and then entered the camper. Deputy Petroski joined them and entered the camper behind Deputy Lipke. Deputy Petroski said it was very loud in the camper. He could hear Clarmboux yelling and was screaming and crying from the back of the camper. At the same time, Sergeant Janecek and Deputy Lipke were shouting commands at Claremboux. They were yelling, "Sheriff's Office! Sheriff's Office!" Deputy Petroski wasn't sure if he made any commands.

During the yelling, Deputy Petroski heard, "Drop the knife!" about three times and then he heard a single gunshot. Deputy Petroski broadcasted "Shots fired!" over the radio. Deputy Petroski couldn't see into the bedroom at any time because he was third in line behind Deputy Lipke (who was second) and Sergeant Janecek (who was first).

Sergeant Janecek ordered Deputy Lipke to secure Claremboux and do a pat-down search of him. Deputy Lipke handcuffed and briefly searched Claremboux.

Deputy Lipke assisted get out of the bedroom and then passed her onto Deputy Petroski. Deputy Petroski then accompanied her to the camper door and another officer assisted her.

While assisting get out of the bedroom, Deputy Petroski observed two knives lying on the bedroom floor. They were between the bed and the wall, very near where was standing, and, very near and below Claremboux, who was lying on the bed after the single gunshot.

Deputy Petroski thought one of the knives may have been a folding knife.

After Deputy Petroski safely escorted out of the camper, he went back in and saw Deputy Lipke struggling to provide medical care on Claremboux because he still had his rifle slung. Deputy Petroski took Deputy Lipke's rifle and handed it off to Deputy Bowe.

Deputy Petroski retrieved a medical bag and returned to assist in removing Claremboux from the camper. They eventually removed Claremboux from the camper to continue to provide care to him until EMS arrived soon after. Deputy Lipke took the lead in providing medical care. Deputy Petroski observed a gunshot would to Claremboux's sternum area while Claremboux was lying on the ground outside.

Deputy Petroski went back into the camper to do a final security sweep. After doing so, he checked on Sergeant Janecek and Deputy Lipke. Deputy Petroski returned to the front stairs/porch of the camper to provide scene security so nobody went in or out of the camper.

Sheriff Zupke and Chief Deputy Delegan arrived on scene and met with Deputy Petroski. They asked him to tape off the scene which he did. He remained at the scene until he was requested to

go to the sheriff's office. WPPA Business Agent Rich Burghaus arrived on scene and gave him a ride to the sheriff's office. Deputy Petroski's squad remained at the scene.

Deputy Petroski did not fire his handgun during the incident.

While on scene, Deputy Petroski confirmed that Sergeant Janecek was the officer who shot Claremboux. He is confident Sergeant Janecek is the only officer that fired their weapon.

Deputy Petroski did not sustain any injuries during the incident. He has not had any conversations with other officers since the incident.

Deputy Petroski said the lighting conditions outside were normal daylight. He said the lighting inside the camper was darker than outside, but sufficient to see what was going on.

Deputy Petroski did not notice any injuries on when he ushered her out of the camper. He did not interview her and she did not make any statements to him.

Deputy Petroski did not observe any other injuries on Claremboux other than the gunshot wound.

PRIOR CONTACTS WITH THE SUBJECT AND/OR PROPERTY LOCATION

Deputy Petroski knew of the Claremboux name from being around town, however, he did not have any prior law enforcement contacts with Jay Claremboux.

Deputy Petroski did not have any prior contacts at the location of the incident, 33695 N Foley Rd, Mellen, WI.

Audio recording review

On August 16, 2023, DCI Digital Evidence Specialist Ryan Kelleher obtained the audio recording from Deputy Petroski's Olympus audio recorder that he had activated during the OICI. The audio file is 48 minutes and 48 seconds in length.

At the end of the interview Deputy Petroski was given an opportunity to listen to the audio recording with WPPA Business Agent Rich Burghaus and Attorney Jim Palmer. Deputy Petroski chose not to listen to the recording at that time.





Schroeder stated neither or Claremboux helped at all, and they were nothing but trouble. Schroeder stated that and Claremboux were on drugs and up at all hours of the night. and Claremboux would have music blaring and be yelling and screaming Schroeder stated at each other all the time. Schroeder stated the and Claremboux would constantly be arguing and Claremboux appeared to be very abusive toward Schroeder stated that on August 15, 2023, at about 5:30 -6:00 PM was running around yelling that Claremboux had stabbed her and was stabbing and someone needed to call 911. Schroeder stated he went over near the camper trailer that Claremboux was in with and Claremboux came to the door and told Schroeder he would gut him alive. Schroeder stated trailer and retrieved a shotgun to protect himself. Schroeder stated that he wasn't going to approach Claremboux again but wanted a gun in case Claremboux came after anyone else.

Schroeder stated the Mellen Police Chief Larry Koivisto arrived at the property and ordered Schroeder to put the shotgun down, which Schroeder stated he did immediately. Schroeder stated he was then ordered to leave the property and wait on the road to allow the police to handle the situation.

Schroeder stated he waited on the road and watched the police for approximately 1 and half hours attempting to negotiate with Claremboux and have him surrender and come out of the trailer. Schroeder stated he thought the police gave Claremboux more than enough opportunity to come out and the police did a good job trying to talk to Claremboux. Schroeder stated he heard a shot and believed the police had shot Claremboux. Schroeder made several comments that if the police wouldn't have arrived to handle the situation, Claremboux would've killed someone. Schroeder stated in his opinion the police were more then justified using force against Claremboux.

Thorsen stated on August 15, 2023, around 5:30 PM he heard a lot of commotion going on and Thorsen walked from his camper trailer towards Claremboux and camper trailer. Thorsen saw Schroeder who told Thorsen to get out of the area as Claremboux was going crazy and threatening to kill everyone.

Thorsen stated he went to the neighboring property to tell co-property owner Edward J. Tafelsky DOB that there were problems with Claremboux and Thorsen stated by the time he returned to the property at 33695 N. Foley Rd, the police were on scene, and he waited on the street until everything was over. Thorsen stated Claremboux was crazy and got what he deserved.

Tafelsky stated he grabbed a billy club and was going to go next door and see what was going on. Tafelsky stated when he got next door the police were already there, and he was told to go wait on the roadway in front of 33695 N. Foley Rd.

Tafelsky stated he waited on the road for about and hour and a half while the police attempted to get Claremboux to come out of the camper he was holed up in. Tafelsky stated they gave Claremboux more then enough opportunity to come out and surrender. Tafelsky stated Claremboux is a dangerous person and was a meth head. Tafelsky stated he heard a gun shot and figured the police were forced to shot Claremboux. Tafelsky stated the police were more than justified to shoot Claremboux and Tafelsky stated the police did a good job keeping the other people on the property safe.

Tafelsky stated Claremboux and his girlfriend had come to the property a couple of weeks prior, and they were bad news. Tafelsky stated they were meth heads and up at all hours of the day making racket and arguing and fighting. Tafelsky stated Claremboux had been observed beating on on multiple occasions and on one occasion Tafelsky told Claremboux to stop and if it happened again Tafelsky would intervene.

Tafelsky stated on August 15, 2023, he was going to be kicking and Claremboux off the property, but the incident happened before they were able to kick them out.

WI DOJ/DCI SA Justin Bender completed the forensic data processing of the Trimble X7 data collected by Wisconsin State Patrol – Technical Reconstruction Unit (WSP-TRU) Trooper Kyle DeVries and WSP-TRU Trooper Tim Larson at the incident scene on August 15, 2023. SA Bender processed and registered the data utilizing Trimble RealWorks (point cloud processing and registration software).

• Trimble R10 Global Navigation Satellite System (GNSS) and Skydio Small Unmanned Aircraft System (sUAS) Data Processing:

SA Bender completed the forensic data processing of the GNSS and sUAS data collected by WI DOJ/DCI SA Theodore Indermuehle and SA Bender at the incident scene on August 24, 2023 (GNSS collection) and August 30, 2023 (sUAS collection). 




Figure 1: Orthomosaic and the corresponding sparse Digital Surface Model (DSM) before densi ication.





Figure 2: Top view of the initial image position. The green line follows the position of the images in time starting from the large blue dot.




Figure 4: Number of overlapping images computed for each pixel of the orthomosaic.








Figure 6: Camera movement estimated by the rolling shutter camera model. The green line follows the computed image positions. The blue dots represent the camera position at the start of the exposure. The blue lines represent the camera motion during the rolling shutter readout, re-scaled by a project dependant scaling factor for better visibility.

On August 29, 2023, Special Agent (SA) Shawn Sutherland with the Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) requested video surveillance footage from the Walmart Supercenter, located at 2500 Lakeshore Dr E, Ashland, Wisconsin. SA Sutherland learned through this investigation that Jay Claremboux may have assaulted in or near the minivan that they rode to Walmart in, while traveling with 2023.

SA Sutherland spoke with Don Porter, who is the Asset Protection employee at that store, and requested video surveillance footage from August 15, 2023. SA Sutherland described the minivan and the three subjects he was interested in getting video of which included was driving. SA Sutherland provided Mr. Porter a time-frame of approximately 4:00 pm to 4:30 pm on August 15, 2023, which is when he believed they were at the store.

Mr. Porter later notified SA Sutherland that he located the minivan and the three subjects in question. He estimated they were at the store or in the lot for almost two hours.

On September 1, 2023, SA Sutherland met with Mr. Porter at the Walmart Supercenter at approximately 11:20 am. Mr. Porter showed SA Sutherland some of the video surveillance footage of the subjects and the minious and SA Sutherland confirmed it was the footage he was interested in.

Mr. Porter previously saved the video surveillance footage to a DVD disk and created a duplicate copy of that disk. Mr. Porter provided SA Sutherland with both disks.

On September 5, 2023, SA Sutherland viewed the video footage on both DVD disks and ensured they were identical and played properly. SA Sutherland found eight (8) video files and a VerintVideo SolutionsCodecs player file and file shortcut on the disks. He uploaded all ten (10) of the files from the DVD disk into the DCI Critical Incident folder under this case number. SA Sutherland gave DCI SA Jay Greeno the disk and he submitted it into temporary evidence storage at the DCI Eau Claire field office. SA Sutherland destroyed the other duplicate disk.

On September 5, 2023, SA Greeno agreed to review the video footage to determine if the alleged assault of by Claremboux was captured on any of the surveillance cameras. See SA Greeno's report for additional details regarding the video footage.

subjects at the end of the driveway. As I walked up the driveway, I observed the EMS personnel from the Mellen Ambulance Service and a male subject. I then observed Chief Deputy Delegan, Sgt. Janecek and Deputy Lipke standing nearby and approached their location.

Once by Chief Deputy Delegan, Sgt. Janecek and Deputy Lipke, I was advised that Sgt. Janecek had fired his duty rifle during the incident. Chief Deputy Delegan then took Sgt. Janecek away from the immediate area and I spoke with Deputy Lipke.

Deputy Lipke advised me that he and Sgt. Janecek could hear what they believed to be a woman being beaten inside a trailer that was located on the property. He said that due to what they were hearing they decided they needed take immediate action and enter the trailer. Deputy Lipke said that Sgt. Janecek was the first to enter the door and he was right behind him. He said that once inside the trailer, he observed a male subject with a knife holding a female subject against her will. He said that Sgt. Janecek fired his weapon striking the subject with the knife. Deputy Lipke said that the subject that was shot gave Sgt. Janecek no choice. He said that immediately after the shot was fired they began to provide medical attention the to male that had been shot.

After speaking with Deputy Lipke who was visually shaken from the incident, I spoke with Chief Deputy Delegan and Sgt. Janecek who was also visually shaken. It was determined that I removed Sgt. Janecek from the scene at this time. Sgt. Janecek and I then left the scene and I took Sgt. Janecek to his residence so that he would advise his wife and family that he was ok. After a brief period of time at his residence I took Sgt. Janecek to the Ashland County Sheriff's Office. We remained at the Sheriff's Office for a short period where I met with Deputy Lipke and checked on his wellbeing.

I then took Sgt. Janecek to Memorial Medical Center for a blood draw and at approximately 10:10 P.M. I observed Sgt. Janecek provide a blood sample to the lab technician. The blood sample was then placed into a sealed blood kit and I later placed the kit into an evidence locker at the Ashland County Sheriff's Office. Sgt. Detective Pierce later retrieved the sample from evidence on August 16th and sent it to the Wisconsin State Lab of Hygiene.

After Sgt. Janecek and I left the Memorial Medical Center we returned to the Sheriff's Office where Sgt. Janecek, Deputy Lipke, Deputy Bowe, Deputy Petroski and City of Mellen Police Chief Koivisto who were on scene at the time of the shooting met with agents from the Wisconsin Department of Criminal Investigation (DCI).

While at the office, I obtained Sgt. Janecek's body cam from Chief Deputy Delegan. I also obtained Deputy Petroski's digital voice recorder from him as he advised he had it activated while he was on scene and that it was on at the time of the shooting. Both the video and audio files were then turned over to DCI agents.

I then arranged to have EAP services provided to all deputies that were on scene at the time of the shooting.

In the morning hours of August 16th I met with IT Director Foley and requested that he lock the department system used for uploading body cam footage so that no one could access or view body cam footage until further notice. IT Director Foley later advised me that this task had been completed.

On Tuesday, August 15, 2023, at approximately 6:30 p.m., the Ashland County Sheriff's Office (ACSO) and the Mellen Police Department were involved in an Officer-Involved Critical Incident (OICI) at 33695 North Foley Rd, Town of Morse, Ashland County, WI. The OICI resulted in the fatal shooting of Jay Allen Claremboux, who was shot by ACSO Patrol Sergeant Jason Janecek. The Ashland County Sheriff's Office requested the Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) lead the investigation of the OICI.

DCI Special Agents (SAs) Shawn Sutherland and Timothy Gensler responded to the Ashland County Sheriff's Office to be briefed on the incident while several other agents responded to the scene.

Upon arriving at the sheriff's office, SA Sutherland and SA Gensler were assigned to conduct interviews of the officers involved. Sergeant Janecek was at the sheriff's office with his union representative, Wisconsin Professional Police Association (WPPA) Business Agent (BA) Rich Burghaus.

At approximately 11:45 p.m., after Sergeant Janecek met with BA Burghaus, Sergeant Janecek agreed to provide a brief statement to SA Sutherland and SA Gensler to aid in identifying items of evidence and their locations within the scene where the shooting occurred. Sergeant Janecek provided his statement through BA Burghaus, who stated the following:

After Sergeant Janecek arrived on scene, he and another deputy eventually made entry into the camper trailer where a male had a knife and was threatening to kill a female, who was also in the camper trailer. Sergeant Janecek was first to enter and Deputy Lipke was behind him. As they moved toward the back bedroom of the camper trailer Sergeant Janecek was making verbal announcements and commands. As Sergeant Janecek reached the bedroom doorway, he observed a male subject sitting on the edge of the bed who had a bladed weapon in one of his hands. He described the blade as being shiny and approximately six to eight inches in length. He observed a female in front of the male and she was within arms reach of the male. The male subject was looking at Sergeant Janecek and did not drop the bladed weapon. The male subject started to stand up and Sergeant Janecek fired his department issued rifle one time at the male subject. The male fell onto the bed and the bladed weapon fell onto the floor. As they were assisting the female out of the room and securing the male with handcuffs, they observed a second bladed weapon on the floor near the initial bladed weapon the male dropped after being shot.

This concluded the statement provided by Sergeant Janecek at that time.

SA Sutherland provided this information to DCI Special Agent David Kleinhans, who was assigned to processing the scene.



At approximately 11:15AM on September 2, 2023 SA Trowbridge received a text message from At approximately 11:29AM a second message was received. Finally, at approximately 1:42PM the third, and final, message was received. The messages documented concerns had related to this investigation. The fact that the messages were received by SA Trowbridge was communicated to Case Agent SA Sutherland.

SA Trowbridge did not reply to the messages until September 7th, 2023 at 11:20AM. SA Trowbridge sent one message to indicating that her messages related to this investigation would be documented, and that if any further concerns arose Crime Response Specialist Lisa Seidel should be her point of contact.
