PARLIAMENTARIANS PAUSE FOR BRIDGE Bridge administrators strive

to keep politics and religion out of the game. The players don't care against whom they are playing, only against which bidding system. Occasionally governments would instruct their teams not to play against certain opponents in international competitions. Happily, though, those days are in the past.
