## Evers launches \$100 vaccine reward program

OSHKOSH — Gov. Tony Evers and the state Department of Health Services announced Monday that Wisconsin residents who receive their first dose of any COVID-19 vaccine from a Wisconsin provider between now and Sept. 6 can collect a \$100 Visa gift card. Wisconsinites ages 12 and older are eligible for the reward, and proof of insurance, I.D., or citizenship are not required to be eligible for the vaccine or to receive the \$100 reward.

“As our kids start returning back to school, and with the Delta variant spreading rapidly across the state, we all need to step up and stop the spread, and our COVID-19 vaccines are the best tools we have to do just that,” Evers said. “From now through Labor Day, if you’re a Wisconsin resident and you get your first COVID-19 shot here in the state, you will get \$100 bucks. It’s that simple: get vaccinated, get \$100. I’m calling on all eligible Wisconsinites who have not gotten their COVID-19 vaccine yet to step up, roll up their sleeve, and do their part to help protect our state and put an end to COVID-19.”

## Price County Fair returns this weekend

The 135th annual Price County Fair is back after a year hiatus due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and there will be some changes in place.

The fair runs from Friday, Aug. 27, through Sunday, Aug. 29, from 9 a.m. to midnight Friday and Saturday, and 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sunday, a change from past years.

Fair Board Chairwoman Michelle Drobnik said the park will not be open to everyone this year during the judging. People can still bring their exhibits and animals to the fairgrounds for judging, but they will be on display alongside an interactive butterfly and insect exhibit. All judging is face-to-face, and the judges will be certified. Open-class and 4-H entries can be dropped off Wednesday and Thursday, Aug. 25-26.

Masks are encouraged but not required, and there will be hand-washing and sanitizing stations throughout the fairgrounds.

Friday, the fair opens with the interactive displays, family entertainment by juggler Dan Kirk and Farm-

er Donnie, a speaker from the Price County Library on the county's history and the return of K&M Rides & Amusements' carnival. These events will continue throughout the weekend.

The Phillips Veterinary Clinic will sponsor a karaoke contest at 5 p.m. for cash prizes, and the market sale begins at 7 p.m. The night's music, beginning at 8 p.m., features Tom Katalin and Highway 41 from the Upper Peninsula of Michigan.

Saturday, the Price County 4-H Horse Council will have its open speed show at 10 a.m., with registration at 9 a.m. A Kids' Sawdust Dig will be held from 11 a.m. to noon, followed by a kiddie tractor pull at 5 p.m.

Live music will be by Shane Kronberger from 6 to 8 p.m., followed by Alec Davis at 8 p.m.

Sunday, the horse pulls will begin at noon in the grandstands. Elvis John will perform from 1 to 2:30 p.m., and the Farm Olympics also begin at 1 p.m.

The Ohstrom School, or Old Log School House, will be open throughout the weekend.
