In one week, UW's skill position players went from unskilled laborers to master craftsmen. After basically going into hibernation in the second half against Michigan, the Badgers emerged to roll up 539 yards of total offense.

"It seemed like everything we tried worked," said quarterback John Stocco, who had one of the most efficient games of his career, completing 15 of 17 passes for 364 yards and three touchdowns in what was UW's largest margin of victory in a Big Ten game since 1983.

It looked about as relaxing as a backyard game of catch and could not have come at a better time for an offense and a passing game that scared nobody in the first four games. It also looked reminiscent of last year, when the passing game also hit its stride in a 41-24 victory over Indiana in the second Big Ten Conference game.

"I was our breakout point last year," wide receiver Luke Swann said. "I think it was a game that was important for us to get it rolling for the rest of the season."

If this game has the same impact on the passing game as last season — it started a string of eight of nine games in which Stocco threw for at least 200 yards, including the first three 300-yard games of his career — the Badgers (4-1 overall, 1-1 Big

Ten) could have a balanced offense after all.

Indiana coach Terry Hoogster, whose return from brain surgery he underwent a week ago was supposed to provide an emotional lift for his players, was certainly impressed
